AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 916A of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of Part XLIX. of the said Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

AND WHEREAS by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th August, 1948, the operation of the said Part was extended to part of the municipal district of the Shire of Mortlake.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Mortlake has requested that the operation of the said Part be extended to a further part of the municipal district of the Shire of Mortlake.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Mortlake defined hereunder:

All that portion of Crown Section A (Mt. Shadwell P.R.), Parish of Mortlake, County of Hampden, commencing at the road intersection at the north-eastern corner of Lot 19 on L.P. 4917 lodged at the Office of Titles and bounded on the East by the road shown on that plan, being the Eastern boundaries of Lots 19, 18, 17 on L.P. 4917 aforesaid and bounded on the South and West by the Terang-Mortlake Railway Line and bounded on the North by the Government-road being Northern boundary of Crown Section A to the point of commencement.

And order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above described part of the municipal district of the Shire of Mortlake on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 20th January, 1966, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 20th January, 1966.

Hiring Rates and Fares Specified for Metropolitan Taxi-cabs and Private Hire Cars.

TAKE notice that, pursuant to powers conferred on the Board by the provisions of Regulation 45 of Part III. of the Transport Consolidated Regulations 1960, the Board hereby specifies, in accordance with the provisions of Regulations 5 of Part I. of the said Regulations, hiring rates and fares to be charged for the carriage of passengers in vehicles the licences issued in respect of which are classified as Metropolitan Taxi-cabs or Private Hire Cars as the case may be.

- (b) The fare to be charged for each passenger on each journey shall be the fare specified in this Part related to such journey;

- (d) With the exception of Melbourne Cup Day, such vehicles shall not occupy loading stands specified in this Part before 9 a.m. on days on which sporting events are being held at the destinations related thereto.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS
BY-LAW No. 89 RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS (hereinafter called "the Board") pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon the Board by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958* (as amended) and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in anywise enabling the Board in that behalf doth hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. 81 duly made and passed by the Board on the 18th day of September, 1962, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of October, 1962.

2. The said By-law No. 81 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In clause 2 for the word "it" where first appearing in the definition of "Proper Officer" there shall be substituted the expression "the Engineer-in-Chief".

(b) For clause 38 (b) there shall be substituted the following:—

"38. (b) The size of a service pipe for the supply of water for domestic purposes to any tenement other than a building occupied as business premises or as flats or as a place of public recreation or entertainment or by an institution shall be permitted in accordance with the following, that is to say:—

(i) A $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. service pipe for a tenement rated on a valuation of not more than £400 and having an area of less than 1,000 square yards;

(ii) A 1-in. service pipe for a tenement rated on a valuation of more than £400 or having an area of more than 1,000 square yards;

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Car Act 1958*, doth by this Order specify that portion of the Old Timboon-road within the Town of Camperdown and the Shire of Hampden lying between the rail crossing and the old Geelong-road as a highway in respect of which any motor car may, without being subject to the application of the said sub-section (2) of section 83 of the *Motor Car Act*, be used for purposes of trials of speed under the control of the said Camperdown Motor Sports Club on Sunday the fifth day of December, 1965, and Sunday the sixth day of March, 1966, between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon on each day provided that the Officer in Charge of Police in attendance is satisfied that the highway is in a satisfactory condition for racing purposes and that adequate arrangements have been made for the safety of the public.

And the Honorable Arthur Gordon Rylah, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

IN pursuance of the powers aforesaid the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Brighton order as follows:—

1. The fees to be paid to the Council for each registration or renewal of registration of the several classes of food vending machines hereunder specified shall be those set opposite to such classes respectively, namely:—

- (i) Machines operated by one to two pennies or cents a sale—5s. or 50 cents.

(iv) Machines operated by coins in excess of sixpence or five cents in value—40s. or 4 dollars.

- (b) Cause such manure pit to be emptied and thoroughly cleaned out and the contents thereof to be disposed of at least once during every period of four consecutive days in such a manner as shall not constitute any nuisance.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Mordialloc.

2. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“City Engineer” means the City Engineer for the time being of the City of Northcote.

“Council” means the Council of the City of Northcote.

“Dry refuse” means dry and hard refuse, dry and hard waste and garden refuse but does not include household refuse or garbage as herein-after defined.

“Household refuse” means household refuse and rubbish including food waste and discarded food ordinarily used for human consumption.

“Occupier” means and includes the occupier, owner, tenant, the person in charge or having the management or control of property.

“Property” means house, building or premises.

3. The occupier of every property within the City of Northcote shall provide or cause to be provided and kept a receptacle or receptacles as herein prescribed and shall cause all household refuse produced, collected or accumulated on such property to be from time to time deposited and kept in such receptacle or receptacles. Every such receptacle shall be kept in a clean and inoffensive state and shall be kept constantly covered by a lid described hereunder except when household refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom.

4. Every receptacle for the keeping of household refuse shall be:—

- (a) strongly constructed of galvanised iron of not less than 24 gauge or approved plastic;
- (b) cylindrical in shape;
- (c) of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet;
- (d) provided with a tight fitting lid and properly fixed side lifting handles;
- (e) constructed so as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man; and
- (f) watertight and flyproof.

5. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in any such receptacle, nor shall deposit therein any refuse unless such refuse has been previously effectively wrapped in paper.

6. No person shall place any ashes in any such receptacle unless such ashes are securely wrapped in paper and were not sufficiently hot at the time of wrapping to ignite or scorch the paper in which they are wrapped.

7. The occupier shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and condition.

8. At such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the City Engineer receptacles containing household refuse for collection and disposal may be placed on the footway adjoining the property used by the occupier near to the street channel or in such other location as may be approved by the City Engineer.

9. No person shall remove from any such receptacle any substance except for the disposal of the whole contents of such receptacle in a manner and at a place approved by the Council.

10. (a) The Council may from time to time place in streets throughout the said municipal district vehicles for the reception of dry refuse.

(b) No person shall deposit any dry refuse for removal by the Council in any place other than in any vehicle placed in any street for the collection of such dry refuse.

(c) No person shall deposit in such a vehicle any refuse rubbish or garbage other than dry refuse.

(d) No person other than a person duly authorized by the Council shall remove any dry refuse deposited for collection as hereinbefore provided.

11. Subject to clause 10 hereof no person shall deposit any refuse or rubbish upon any street in the municipal district of the City of Northcote or other land or place under the control of the Council except at an authorized garbage depot.

12. Any person who is guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and not less than Two pounds for every such offence, or in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each and every day during which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

(2) By-Law No. 25 of the Shire of Berwick relating to the leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets or land and By-Law No. 30 of the said Shire relating to rubbish receptacles are hereby repealed.

(3) No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street road lane or passage.

(4) No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land (other than land set apart for the purpose by the council) unless the same is deposited in such a receptacle and in such manner as it is hereinafter provided.

(5) (a) The Council may by notice in writing under the hand of the Shire Secretary or Health Inspector require the owner or occupier of any land to remove or destroy (within the time limited to such notice) all refuse on such land (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under Section 48 of the *Health Act 1958*).

(b) Any owner or occupier to whom any such notice shall have been given shall comply with the terms thereof within the time therein limited.

(6) The occupier of every premises shall provide and at all times keep at such premises a receptacle constructed in accordance with the provisions of the next succeeding clause hereof for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish or so many of such receptacles as may be necessary to contain all refuse and rubbish from such premises and shall cause all such refuse and rubbish to be placed in such receptacle or receptacles with the least possible delay.

(7) No such receptacle shall exceed three cubic feet in volume and every such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight or of strong and impervious plastic material and shall be fitted with handles for convenience in lifting or moving and emptying the same and shall be provided with a close fitting metal or plastic cover so constructed and fitted as to exclude the entry of rats mice flies and other vermin and insects.

(8) All refuse or rubbish likely to become offensive shall be wrapped in paper before being placed in any such receptacle.

(9) The occupier of every premises shall on the day of which the Council notifies him that refuse and rubbish shall be collected from such premises place the receptacle or receptacles provided by him immediately inside the gate of such premises leading to a street upon which such premises adjoin or abut.

(10) The occupier of every premises shall cause every such receptacle on his premises to be kept at all times clean and disinfected and properly covered with such close fitting cover provided as aforesaid.

(11) The occupier of every premises shall cleanse and at all times keep clean the footway and pavement adjoining such premises.

(12) Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to clause 3 or clause 4 of this By-Law shall for a first offence be liable to a penalty of not more than £20 and for any second or subsequent offence contrary thereto be liable to a penalty of not less than £10 nor more than One hundred pounds.

(13) This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal district.
