AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION



Men's Hairdressing,
Ladies' and Men's Hairdressing,
Watch Making,
Clock Making,
Watch and Clock Making.

(II.) By proclamation made on the 13th day of April 1954 and published in the Government Gazette on the 23rd day of April 1954 the Governor in Council specified certain wars and hostilities for the purposes of the said Act.

The operations in Malaya and/or Malaysia and Singapore from 28th June 1950.

The operations in Brunei from 8th December, 1962.

The operations in Vietnam (Southern Zone) from 1st July 1962.



- 2. No person upon any public highway shall make or cause to be made any violent shout, out-cry, noise, disturbance, or sound such as may be calculated to cause annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such highway, or in any premises abutting thereon, or adjacent thereto.
- 3. (a) No person shall on any land or premises make or cause to be made any noise materially interfering with the reasonable comfort (having regard to the time at which such noise is made or caused to be made) of any person in any adjacent premises or in any adjacent street or road.
- (b) No person shall use or cause to be used any premises or any part of any premises so that there emanates therefrom any noise materially interfering with the reasonable comfort (having regard to the time at which such noise is made or caused to be made) of any person in any adjacent premises or in any adjacent street or road. or road.
- (c) The owner or occupier of any land or premises permitting any person on such land or premises to contravene the provisions of this clause shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 4. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing clauses by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.
- 5. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten Pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of Five Pounds for each day on which the offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by
