**CLOSING OF STATE SAVINGS BANK OF VICTORIA TO
THE PUBLIC TO PREPARE FOR THE INTRODUCTION
OF DECIMAL CURRENCY.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 14 of the *Decimal Currency Act 1965* provides amongst other things that the Governor by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* may specify a day or days earlier than the 14th day of February, 1966, during which the Departments of the corporation known as "The Commissioners of the State Savings Bank of Victoria" established pursuant to the *State Savings Bank Act 1958* may be closed to the public to enable the corporation to prepare for the transaction of business in decimal currency.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation specify the 10th and 11th days of February, 1966, to be the days when the said corporation may so be closed.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—



WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating the street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.



INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

2. Any application for a permit to use or develop any land or to erect construct, or carry out any buildings or works, shall be accompanied by a sketch plan or copy of certificate of title of the land and a description of the proposed use or development, and type and construction of any buildings or works proposed to be erected, constructed or carried out and such other particulars relating to the application as the Responsible Authority may require.

3. This Interim Development Order shall not prevent the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purposes for which such land or buildings were lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

4. tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the nett annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined in the manner provided in the Sewerage Districts Acts.

- (6) Such person or persons as The Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate and charges.






