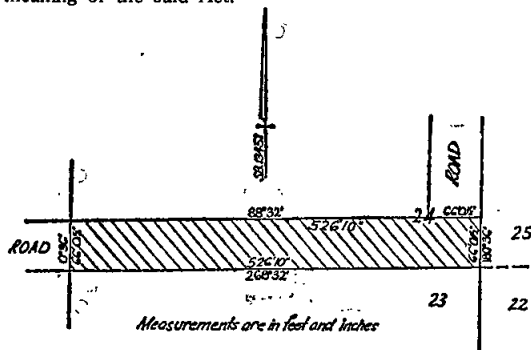
PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, reserved for a street, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that portion of Main-street, Whittlesea, shown hatched on the plan hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

RATES OF CONTRIBUTION—DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, intituled the *Superannuation Act 1965* (No. 7357) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may upon the recommendation of the Board by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, amend vary or substitute all or any of the tables of rates of contributions set forth in the Fourth, Fifth or Sixth Schedules of the *Superannuation Act 1958*, AND WHEREAS any such proclamation may provide for the operation of the whole or any part or parts of the Fourth, Fifth or Sixth Schedules to continue in relation to any particular class or classes of contributors and may provide different tables of rates of contributions for any different class or classes of contributors, AND WHEREAS any rates of contribution fixed by proclamation pursuant to Section 17A of the *Superannuation Act 1958* shall be such rates as are certified by the Actuary who is a member of the Board as being adequate to enable the Fund to provide for that portion of the benefits that may be payable under the *Superannuation Act 1958* that is not required for the purposes thereof to be provided by the Treasurer out of the Consolidated Revenue, AND WHEREAS the annexed schedules contain the rates so certified by the present Actuary of the said Board, AND WHEREAS the Board now recommends that the annexed schedules be proclaimed and published in the *Government Gazette* to come into operation on Monday the fourteenth day of February, 1966; NOW THEREFORE I the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do by this my proclamation proclaim the rates of contributions as set out in the annexed Schedules and fix Monday the fourteenth day of February One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six as the day upon which the Schedules shall come into operation.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.
BY-LAW NO. 5524 FOR PROTECTING WATERWORKS AND ALL LANDS UNDER THE CONTROL OR MANAGEMENT OF THE STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION AGAINST INTERFERENCE AND DAMAGE, AND FOR MAINTAINING GOOD CONDUCT BY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission (hereinafter called "the Commission") makes the following By-law under section 332 of the Water Act 1958 and all other powers enabling it to make the By-law:—

1. (a) This By-law shall be substituted for By-law No. 5228 which is hereby repealed.

(b) This By-law shall extend and apply to and in relation to lands and works vested in or under the control of the Commission wherever situated.

(c) In this By-law "Commission land" means land vested in or under the control of the Commission.

General.

2. (a) A person shall not on Commission land—
(i) cause any nuisance or disturbance;
(ii) light or maintain a fire other than in a fireplace provided by the Commission for that purpose;
(iii) deposit rubbish or refuse;
(iv) cause damage to works or otherwise.

(b) A person shall not discharge firearms on from into or over Commission land.

(c) A person who has not been previously authorized to do so by an officer of the Commission in writing shall not—

(i) operate or interfere with any works vested in or under the control of the Commission;
(ii) cut down remove damage or destroy on Commission land any tree shrub or plant;
(iii) remove any soil gravel or rock from Commission land;
(iv) erect any booth, hut or other similar structure on Commission land.

Camping.

3. (a) A person may after—
(i) obtaining the permission of the officer of the Commission in charge of any Commission land; and
(ii) paying to that Officer an amount calculated at the rates set out in the schedule hereto for the period in respect of which he has received the permission of the officer—

set up and occupy a camp or caravan in a portion allotted to him of an area of that land set aside for camping purposes (in this By-law called "a camping area").

(b) A person shall not occupy a camp or caravan site in a camping area for a continuous period of more than 60 days.

(c) A person shall keep the portion of a camping area allotted to him in a clean and tidy condition.

Swimming and Boating.

4. A person shall not swim in any water stored on Commission land other than within an area marked as an area which the Commission has set aside for swimming.

5. A person shall not allow a boat to pass over or remain on water stored on Commission land which is within an area marked as an area within which the Commission has prohibited boating.

Regattas and Other Features.

6. A person shall not hold a carnival fête sporting fixture regatta or other similar function on Commission land without the permission in writing of the Commission.

Penalty.

7. A person who in any way contravenes any provision of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

SHIRE OF BET BET-DUNOLLY WATER SUPPLY.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1965/66.

THE Council of the Shire of Bet Bet, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Fourteen cents in the \$ on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Dunolly Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Thirteen Dollars, and in respect of land on which there is no building, less than Four Dollars.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of October, 1965 and ending the 30th day of September, 1966, and shall be payable on the 15th day of February, 1966, at the office of the Council, Dunolly.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year, without further charge to any property rated by the Council, is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Twenty cents per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Fifteen cents per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at Twenty cents per 1,000 gallons and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed, at 65,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Council, Dunolly.

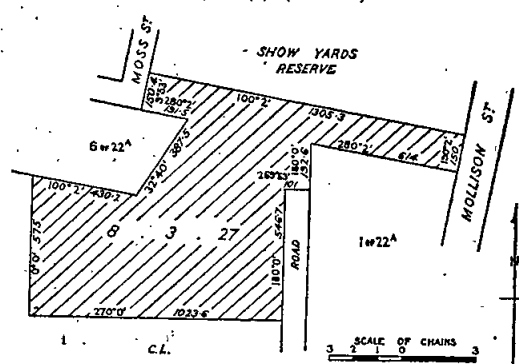

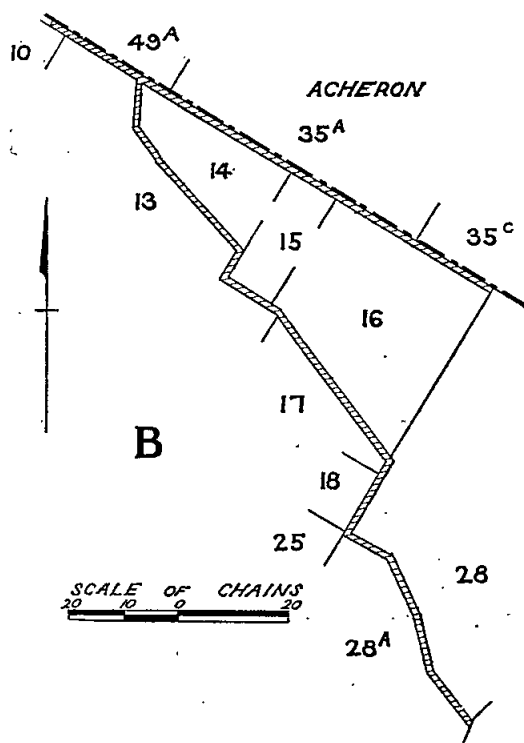

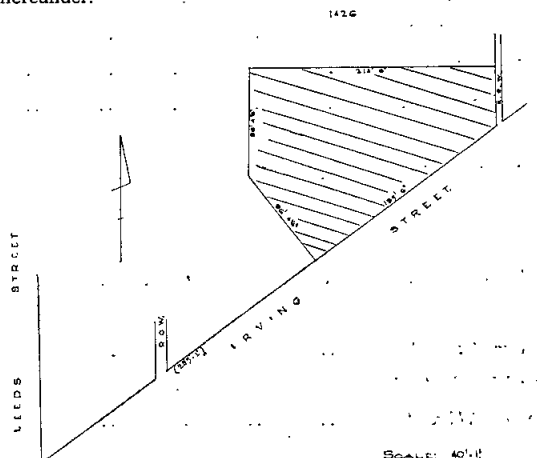

DECIMAL CURRENCY (CHIEF SECRETARY) ORDER No. 2, 1966.

ALEXANDRA SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.—SEWERAGE DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AND AUTHORITY CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Act and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the construction of works for the sewerage of Alexandra as set out in the description and general plan accompanying the application of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust for the Proclamation of a Sewerage District and for the constitution of a Sewerage Authority to carry out the said works for the sewerage of Alexandra in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and doth hereby appoint as follows:—

- (a) That a Sewerage Authority is hereby constituted and its corporate name shall be Alexandra Sewerage Authority.
- (b) That the members of the said Sewerage Authority shall be the Commissioners for the time being of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust.
- (c) That the lands within the boundaries described in Portion I. of the Schedule hereto are hereby proclaimed to be the Sewerage District (to be known as the Alexandra Sewerage District) of the said Sewerage Authority.
- (d) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the said Sewerage Authority shall consist of reticulation sewers, main sewers, outfall sewer, treatment works and disposal works.
- (e) That the amount of money which the said Sewerage Authority may borrow for the purposes of the said Act shall be Two hundred thousand pounds (£200,000) and the amount which may be borrowed by way of overdraft is Four thousand pounds (£4,000).
- (f) That the lands outside the said Sewerage District which may be compulsorily acquired by the said Authority for construction of the said works shall be those within the boundaries described in Portions II. and III. of the said Schedule.

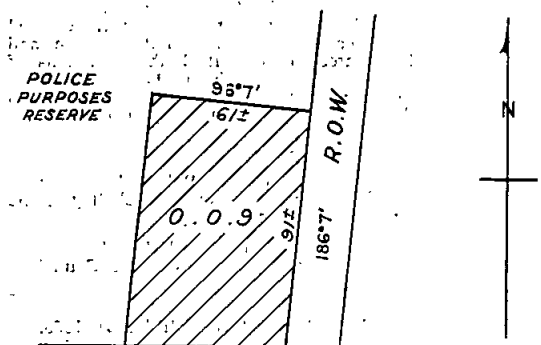

CITY OF GEELONG WEST.

BY-LAW No. 80.

A By-Law of the City of Geelong West made under Section 197 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 80, requiring that land which the Council has declared to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood shall be enclosed with a sufficient fence.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Geelong West order as follows:—

1. Every owner or occupier of land within the municipality on being served with a notice in writing from the Council declaring such land to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood shall enclose

such land with a sufficient fence of such material and in such manner as is hereinafter prescribed, within 30 days of the service of such notice.

2. Every such fence as is hereby prescribed shall be of the materials and construction following:—

- (a) Posts: not less than 5 inches by 3 inches Redgum or Jarrah at least 2 feet in the ground and not more than 9 feet apart.
- (b) Rails Top and Bottom: 3 feet 2 inches hardwood—centre rail 3 feet by 1½ feet.
- (c) Plinth: 6 feet by 1 inch hardwood.
- (d) Paling Fence to be covered by sawn palings in good condition not less than one half inch thick lapped 1 inch on each side.
- (e) Height: not less than 6 feet above ground level trimmed to a line on top, all palings being vertical.

Provided fences situated at the intersection of two streets shall not be erected contrary to the requirements of By-Law No. 71, and in this respect the specifications above set out shall be adjusted accordingly.

3. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £20 (\$40), and to a further penalty of not more than £5 (\$10) for each day on which such offence is continued after conviction or order is made by any Court.

4. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Geelong West.

Dog Act 1958.
