AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

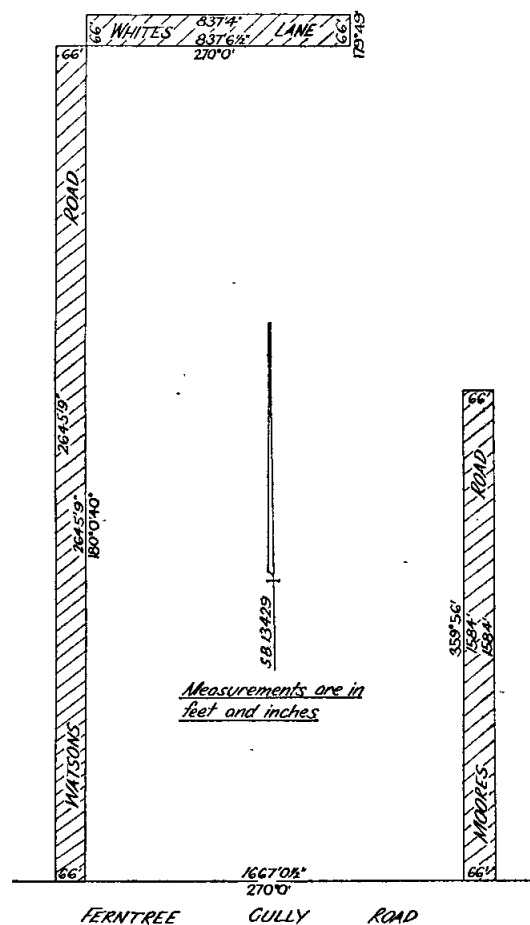

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1958, as amended, section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

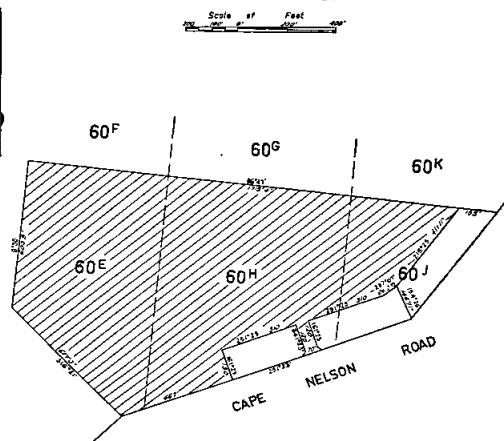

NOTICE TO ATTEND FOR RADIOLOGICAL EXAMINATION.

To all persons aged twenty-one years and over enrolled or resident in the Subdivisions specified hereunder in the State Electoral District of Toorak.

PORT OF GEELONG.

1. Pier Established.
2. Lights Established.
3. Beacons Established.
4. Dredged Channel.

Former Notice.—No. 16 of 1964.

General.—As from 1st March, the Point Henry Pier and Channel will be open to shipping.

1. Position.—Point Henry Signal Station, Lat. 38 deg. 07 min. 51 sec. S., Long. 144 deg. 25 min. 28 sec. E. (approx.).

Commencing at a position on the shore 140 deg. 45 min. 10.7 sec. distant 1,180.9 feet from the above position, a concrete pier extends in a 065 deg. 20 min. 27.5 sec. direction for a distance of 3,831 feet to the berthing head, which extends a further 500 feet in the same direction with a width of 51 ft. 3 in. A mooring dolphin is situated a further 139 ft. 3 in. from the seaward end of the pierhead, connected to it by a catwalk. The total distance from the shore point to the centre of the mooring dolphin is 4,470 ft. 3 in.

2. Lead Lights have been established as follows:—082 deg. 12 min. 57.7 sec., distant 4,110.2 feet from the position above, Front Lead at a height of 47 feet. 233 deg. 44 min. 35.1 sec. distant 4,060.3 feet from the front lead, the Back Lead at a height of 85 feet.

Each lead consists of a fixed green vertical strip light 10 feet in length, mounted on a white painted triangular day mark, the front being apex upward and the rear apex downward.

A fixed white light is also established on the mooring dolphin at an elevation of 20 feet.

3. Position.—No. 13 Beacon Wilson Spit Channel, Lat. 38 deg. 07 min. 14 sec. S., Long. 144 deg. 27 min. 26 sec. E. (approx.).

Four pile beacons surmounted by red battery houses, on which is situated the beacon light at a height of 20 feet above the water, are situated as follows:—

- (a) No. 1. 245 deg. 26 min. 09.1 sec., distant 1,796.3 feet from the above position Int.QK.Fl.R. 5 sec.
- (b) No. 3. 239 deg. 45 min. 37.5 sec., distant 3,472.7 feet from the above position Int.QK.Fl.R. 5 sec.

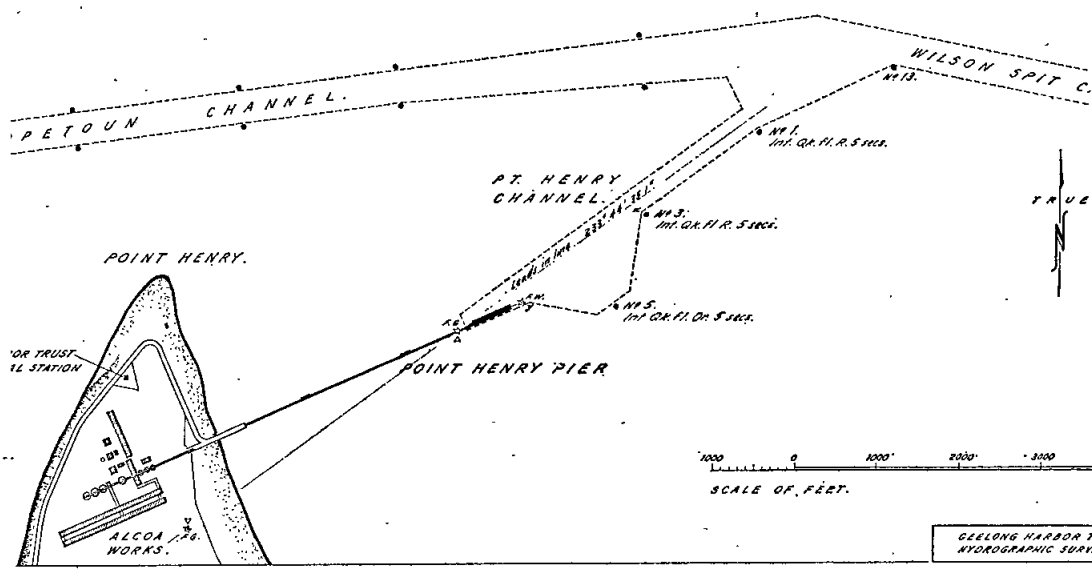

THE WESTERN METROPOLITAN MARKET TRUST.

BY-LAWS FOR OR WITH RESPECT TO THE MATTERS REFERRED TO IN SECTION 24 OF THE WESTERN METROPOLITAN MARKET ACT 1938 AND THE SUB-CLAUSES OF THE SAID SECTION FOR THE REGULATION AND GOVERNMENT OF THE WESTERN METROPOLITAN PIG AND CALF MARKET SITUATE AT MARKET-ROAD, BROOKLYN, IN THE CITY OF SUNSHINE.

1. The Market shall be open for the reception and delivery of pigs and calves on all lawful days between such of the hours between 4 o'clock a.m. and 7 o'clock p.m. as the Western Metropolitan Market Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust") may from time to time appoint. Notice of all hours so appointed shall be posted and kept posted in some conspicuous place upon the market premises.

2. The Trust shall appoint for such Market an officer to be called the Supervisor thereof whose duties shall be defined by the Trust and shall include the following:—

- (a) To see that these By-laws are duly observed.
- (b) To demand and receive the Market dues.
- (c) To preserve order and cleanliness within the Market and the approaches thereto and to summarily eject therefrom any person creating any disturbance, using obscene, blasphemous or indecent language, guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein or whose presence on the said Market or the approaches thereto is in the opinion of the Supervisor prejudicial to the best interests of the Market and the business carried on therein.
- (d) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of the parties bringing pigs and/or calves to the Market in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such Supervisor to be most convenient.
- (e) To appoint the times at and order in which the respective auctioneers shall sell by auction in the Market between the hours during which the same shall be open for the sale of pigs and/or calves.

3. The following shall be the tolls and dues which shall be demanded paid and taken by the Trust at the Market for all pigs and calves sold or exposed for sale therein:—

For every pig sold at the Market for a price in excess of \$6	20 Cents
For every pig sold at the Market for a price not exceeding \$6	10 Cents
For every pig exposed for sale at the Market but not sold	10 Cents
For every calf sold or exposed for sale at the Market	10 Cents

4. For every pig and/or calf brought prior to the date of sale to the Market for sale there shall be demanded paid and taken by the Trust at the Market a fee of Five cents for every twenty-four hours in respect of which each such pig and/or calf is on the Market premises prior to the day of the sale next following the day on which such pig and/or calf is brought on to such Market premises.

5. All pigs and/or calves offered or exposed for sale in the Market shall be removed therefrom on the day of sale unless such removal is prevented by the non-provision of railway trucking facilities or unavoidable accident. For every pig and/or calf not removed from the Market on the day of sale there shall be demanded paid and taken by the Trust at the Market an additional fee of Five cents for every twenty-four hours until such pig and/or calf has been removed therefrom.

6. The owner of any pigs or calves in the Market and the person in charge of any such pigs or calves which shall have been there for a period of twenty-four hours without having been furnished with sufficient food and water shall for every such offence forfeit and pay for each such pig or calf a sum not exceeding Ten dollars and in addition thereto shall also be liable to pay to the Trust the full cost to the Trust of supplying food and water to such pig and/or calf.

7. The person placing any pigs or calves in the Market for sale shall be responsible for all Market dues and tolls accruing thereon and in no case shall any such pigs or calves be taken out of the Market without a written pass-out check signed by the Vendor or his Agent nor until all dues tolls and charges demandable on such stock under these regulations shall have been first fully paid and satisfied.

8. All pigs and calves brought to the Market for sale shall be at the sole risk of the Vendor until the fall of the hammer or otherwise disposed of and thereafter at the sole risk of the Purchaser until removal therefrom.

9. Any person who shall obstruct the Supervisor or his assistants in the performance of his or their duty or release any pig or calf from the Market otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws or remove the same from one part of the Market to another without the authority of the Supervisor or shall wilfully break down or damage any of the gates fences or premises of the Market shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten dollars and in addition thereto shall also be liable to pay to the Trust the full cost to the Trust of making good any such damage.

10. Any person who shall within the Market or the approaches thereto be found drunk or disorderly or use indecent obscene abusive or blasphemous language shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten dollars.

11. All auction sales of pigs and calves in the Market shall be held by the respective auctioneers at such times and in such order as the Market Supervisor shall appoint and any person who shall contravene this By-law shall be liable to a penalty for every such offence not exceeding the sum of Four dollars.

12. For every offence against any of these By-laws for which no specific penalty is herein prescribed the offender upon conviction shall be liable to a penalty of not more than four dollars.

13. Should the Market Supervisor be of the opinion that the presence of any person in the Market or the approaches thereto is undesirable and prejudicial to the best interests of the Market he shall request such person to forthwith leave the Market and/or the approaches thereto. If any person shall fail to comply with such request he may be summarily ejected and excluded from the said Market and/or approaches thereto and shall not without the express consent of the Market Supervisor again enter or attempt to enter the same. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law shall on conviction be liable to a penalty for each such offence not exceeding the sum of Ten dollars.

14. In these By-laws the words "the Market Supervisor" shall mean and include the person for the time being in charge of the conduct of the Market business.

15. No person shall bring on to the Market or the approaches thereto any dog and in any prosecution for an offence under this By-law the fact that the person made defendant thereto was present within the Market or the approaches thereto with or in apparent charge or control of a dog shall be prima facie evidence that such defendant brought such dog on to the Market premises or the approaches thereto.

16. From and after the coming into operation of the foregoing By-laws numbered 1 to 15 inclusive, the following By-laws of the Western Metropolitan Market Trust are hereby rescinded:—

By-laws Nos. 1 to 13 inclusive approved by the Governor in Council on the 20th June, 1939.

By-law amending By-law No. 4 approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th September, 1939.

By-law No. 14 approved by the Governor in Council on the 3rd August, 1942.

By-law No. 15 approved by the Governor in Council on the 23rd December, 1943.

By-law No. 16 approved by the Governor in Council on the 13th September, 1950.

By-law No. 17 approved by the Governor in Council on the 31st March, 1953.

By-law No. 18 approved by the Governor in Council on the 6th September, 1960.

By-law No. 19 approved by the Governor in Council on the 22nd January, 1963.

These By-laws numbered 1 to 16 inclusive for or with respect to the several matters mentioned and referred to in section 24 of the *Western Metropolitan Market Act 1938* and the sub-clauses thereof were made by the Trust on the ninth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six.

Marine Act 1958.

AMENDMENT OF PILOTAGE RATES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 79 of the *Marine Act 1958*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine as follows:—

That on and after the 14th day of February, 1966:—

(A) PORT PHILLIP.

1. The Pilotage Rate for ships from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, shall be \$0.024 per ton, calculated on the ship's gross tonnage, subject in any case to a maximum charge of Four hundred dollars (\$400) and a minimum charge of Thirty dollars (\$30).

2. The Pilotage Rate from an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay to an anchorage or pier in Corio Bay, or vice versa, shall be \$0.0104 per ton, calculated on the ship's gross tonnage, subject in any case to a maximum charge of One hundred and thirty dollars (\$130) and a minimum charge of Thirty dollars (\$30).

3. The Pilotage Rate from one place to another in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay; from Hobson's Bay to a Melbourne wharf or vice versa; from Newport, Footscray or Yarraville to a Melbourne wharf or vice versa, or any

intermediate distance, shall be \$0.0042 per gross ton, calculated on the ship's gross tonnage, subject in any case to a maximum charge of One hundred and ten dollars (\$110) and a minimum charge of Twenty dollars (\$20).

(B) WESTERNPORT.

1. The Pilotage Rate from without Westernport Bay to an anchorage or the Refinery pier within Westernport Bay, or vice versa, shall be \$0.024 per ton, calculated on the ship's gross tonnage, subject in any case to a maximum charge of Four hundred dollars (\$400) and a minimum charge of Thirty dollars (\$30).

2. The Pilotage Rate from one place to another in Westernport Bay shall be \$0.0042 per ton, calculated on the ship's gross tonnage, subject in any case to a maximum charge of One hundred and ten dollars (\$110) and a minimum charge of Twenty dollars (\$20).

(C) PORTLAND.

The Pilotage Rate into or out of the Port of Portland shall be \$0.0166 per ton, calculated on the ship's gross tonnage, subject in any case to a maximum charge of Fifty dollars (\$50) and a minimum charge of Fourteen dollars and fifty cents (\$14.50).

(D) SPECIAL RATES.

1. The Pilotage Rate for a pleasure yacht or other ship not being a Ship of War resorting to port only for or on account of one or more of the following purposes or causes, namely, pleasure or seeking cargo or calling for orders or effecting repairs or docking or obtaining provisions or through stress of weather or undergoing survey or being otherwise in distress, subject to the proviso that should the ship subsequently discharge or load any cargo, or land or take on board any passengers in the port for the purpose of, or incidental to earning freight or passage money the ship and those concerned shall be liable to pay and shall pay the ordinary full rates of pilotage in respect of the ship both inwards and outwards:—

1. From without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier within the Ports of Port Phillip, Geelong or Melbourne, or vice versa, \$0.01 per ton, calculated on the ship's gross tonnage, subject in any case to a maximum charge of Sixty dollars (\$60) and a minimum charge of Twenty dollars (\$20).

2. Ships of War which have had the Services of a Pilot for any port shall only be required to pay the minimum pilotage charge laid down for that port.

3. The fee for the delayed departure of a ship, which occasions the detention of a Pilot on board such ship for more than two hours, as determined by clause 34A of "The Pilot Regulations 1931", shall be Ten dollars (\$10) for such detention and shall be paid in the same manner as and in addition to any pilotage at the prescribed rate which is or may become payable for pilotage services rendered to such ship, and in addition to any liability under section 81 of the *Marine Act 1958*.

(E) GENERAL.

1. The foregoing rates and sums, so far as relates to the Ports of Port Phillip, Geelong and Melbourne, shall be charged only on ships exceeding (100) tons gross tonnage, and, so far as relates to all other ports, shall be charged only on ships exceeding fifty (50) tons gross tonnage.

2. When the services of a Pilot have been received in respect of any ship in relation to a service not expressly provided for by the existing scales, the pilotage shall be computed and paid at such rate (calculated on the gross tonnage of the ship, but not in any case to be higher than the rate prescribed by the existing scales for a ship of like tonnage in respect of some service provided for in such scales which in the opinion of the Board most closely resembles the service in question) as the Board may fix as just having regard to the nature of the service and the circumstances of the case.

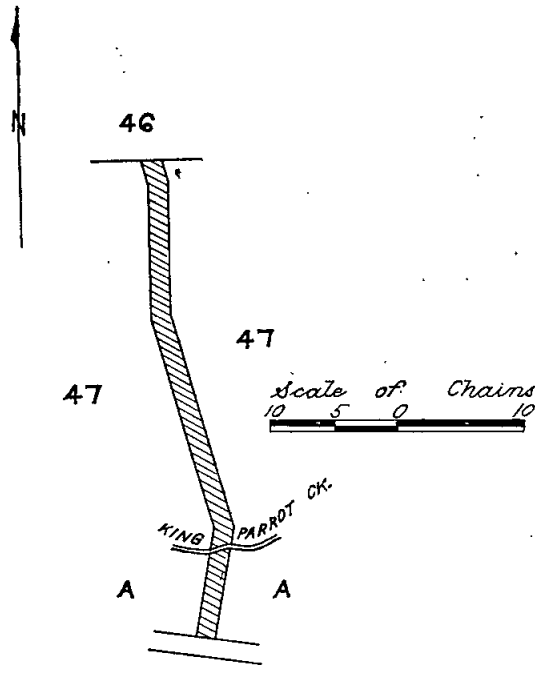

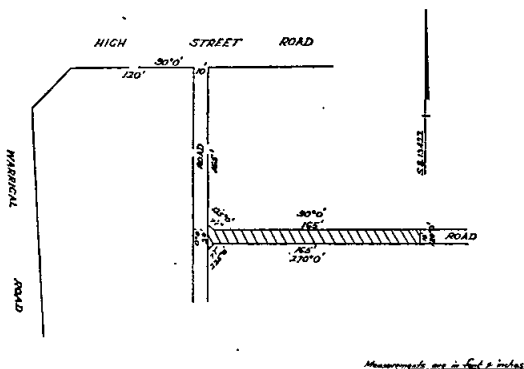

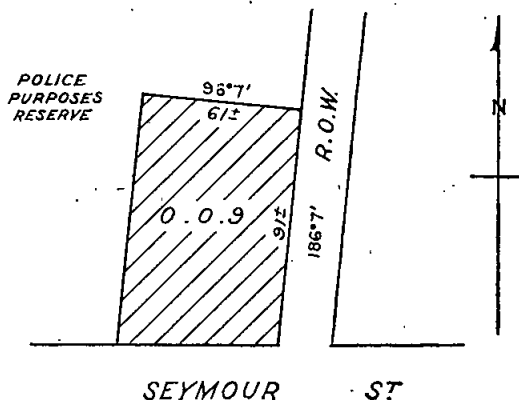

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE McLOUGHLIN'S BEACH RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Balloong and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the 31st day of March, 1965, were reserved as a site for Public Purposes: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter called the Committee) with power and authority to enforce the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twenty-six (26) in any one year, as any portion of the Reserve exclusive of the beach may be set aside for purposes consistent with the reservation and with the consent of the Committee of Management.

2. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

3. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, marram grass or flowers in the Reserve.

4. No person shall remove from the Reserve any gravel, stone shell grit, sand or loam.

5. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or on the Reserve without the consent in writing, of the Committee.

6. No person shall commit a nuisance in any public or private bathing box, boat shed or other building or erection in the Reserve.

7. No person shall carry or discharge firearms or airguns in the Reserve.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. (a) No person, without the consent, in writing of the Committee shall cause or suffer, or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge, to enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog be and continues to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee, or bring into the Reserve any dog for training or exercising for coursing, or other purposes of sport.

(b) Any dog found in the Reserve except as provided in these Regulations, shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the Committee, and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and may be required to make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.

10. No person shall drive on to the Reserve or park thereon any motor car or other vehicle except at such places as are set apart for this purpose by the Committee.

11. No person shall park or leave any motor vehicle or other vehicle on any part of the Reserve except in an area set apart for the purpose by the Committee.

12. No person shall leave or deposit any fish or fish offal on the Reserve.

13. (a) No person shall light or use fires including appliances using petrol, kerosene, methylated spirit, LP gas or any other fuel except by special permission or direction of the Committee.

(b) Break glass of any kind, and

(c) Deposit or leave any bottle, glass, tin can, fruit peel, waste paper, garbage or litter of any kind, except in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.

14. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.

15. No person shall play or perform in any band or deliver or read any public speech, prayer or address of any kind sing any song or enter into any public discussion on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall bet publicly on any part of the Reserve and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and the Reserve.

17. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing of the Committee first obtained.

18. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

19. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve unless by consent of the Committee.

20. No person shall erect any bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure or erection or booth on any site on the Reserve without the permission, in writing of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee consistent with these Regulations, but no person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building structure or erection or booth for residential purposes.

21. The Committee may, subject to the payment of a fee prescribed by it, allow the transfer of any permit, but no person shall sublet any site or structure without the permission in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

22. The granting, withdrawal, renewal or allowance of the transfer of any permit or the subletting of any site or structure shall at all times be at the absolute discretion of the Committee.

23. If the owner of any bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth erected on any site on the Reserve neglects for a period exceeding twelve months to pay to the Committee the fee payable in respect thereof, then and in any such case it shall be lawful for the Committee in such manner as it thinks fit to sell such bathing box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth, and to recover from the proceeds of such sale the arrears of rent and the costs and expenses of such sale.

24. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserve of any bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth which has been placed, erected or established without its consent or which has not been properly erected or properly painted, or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair, or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.

25. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth, erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserve within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building structure, erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the Chairman or Secretary for the time being of the said Committee.

26. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14 days) the Committee may pull down and/or remove and/or sell such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth, and recover the costs and expenses thereof from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

27. No person shall offer for sale any article within the Reserve or within any structure thereon without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

28. No person shall camp or erect any tent or other structure on any site on any portion of the Reserve except on such portion or portions thereof as may be specially set apart for the purpose by the Committee, and then only with the consent, in writing, of such Committee and on payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

29. Any person entering any structure, tent or shelter or parking a caravan in any camping area shall abide by such directions as may be given by the Committee or its duly appointed officer.

30. No person, other than a person desirous of holidaying on any area set apart for camping in the Reserve shall bring a caravan therein or erect a tent thereon and then only for a period of not more than four weeks at any one time nor shall any person sublet such caravan, such tent or camping site.

31. The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee or its authorized officer, to use a site in a camping area shall be deemed to be the person who erected on such site any structure, tent or shelter or who parked a caravan pursuant to such permission, and such person shall keep the site thus occupied in such camping area in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition, and before vacating such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose all refuse, litter or garbage from the site.

32. Any permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to a person for use of a camping area may be cancelled or withdrawn by such Committee or its authorized officer, and subsequent to such cancellation or withdrawal a proportionate refund of any fees or charges paid in advance shall be refunded and such Committee or its authorized officer at its or his discretion may deduct and retain from any such proportionate refund a sum as it or he determines will be necessary to clear up and put in order the site vacated.

33. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission in writing, issued by the Committee shall on demand by any member of the Committee or the properly appointed servant of such Committee or any member of the Police Force, or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission in writing.—(Rs.8428.)

(a) specify with sufficient particularity to enable the same to be identified the site to which the application relates.

(b) specify the purposes for which the permit is required.

(c) contain such particulars as to the type of ground to be blasted and of any buildings or works in the vicinity of the site as may be required by the Engineer or Deputy Engineer.

(5) The Council shall consider such application and if in its opinion such blasting operations are not likely to cause danger or damage to any persons buildings or works in the vicinity shall grant such permit subject to any of the conditions referred to in the next succeeding clause.

(6) Any such permit shall be issued under the hand of the Engineer or Deputy Engineer and may contain any conditions relating to:

(a) The days and times during which such blasting operations may be carried on.

(b) The maximum size of any charge of explosive used.

(c) Any precautions to be taken during the progress of such blasting operations for the protection of persons buildings and works.

Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 (\$10) or more than £20 (\$40) and to a further penalty of not more than £5 (\$10) for each day on which such offence is continued after conviction or order is made by the Court.
