PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c. WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land 4ct 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION


By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, used for streets be so declared to be public highways.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Monahans-road and Breens-road, Cranbourne, shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act.



BY-LAW No. 71.

A By-law of the City of Wangaratta made under Part IV. of the Health Act 1958:—

(a) Providing that every closet be furnished with a double-pan service or other service approved by the Commission.
(b) Requiring for each closet the supply of a sufficient number of receptacles for night soil and prescribing the size and the shape and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles.

materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles.

(c) Regulating the disinfecting, deodorising and cleansing of sanitary conveniences.

(d) Regulating the removal, replacement, cleansing and disinfecting of receptacles for night soil, and the use of deodorants or disinfectants in such receptacles or in sanitary conveniences.

- (e) Requiring that all night soil removed be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator or incinerator or be trenched into land.
- land.

 (f) Prescribing the times for the removal or carriage through the streets of any night soil or offensive or noxious matter or liquid whether into or out of or through the municipal district; providing that the utensils, receptacles and vehicles used therefore shall be properly constructed and covered so as to prevent any leakage therefrom or the escape of any such matter or of any offensive effluvia; and compelling the cleansing of such place whereon such night soil matter or liquid has been dropped or spilt in such removal or carriage.

THE Council of the City of Wangaratta in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958, and of every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby order, as follows:—

- 1. By-law No. 3 of the 4th May, 1891 is hereby repealed.
- 2. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "Council" means the Council of the City of Wangaratta.
 - "Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council and includes any acting or assistant Inspector.
 - "Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier or any person having management or control thereof.
 - "The Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.
- 3. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan closet shall cause the space under the seat of each closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double pan service hereinafter provided for and shall cause each pan closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.
- 4. The proprietor shall CAUSE every pan closet to be supplied by the Council with a pan for the reception of night soil and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan closet.
- 5. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanised iron of not less than 22 gauge or other approved material or materials, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious hard, smooth and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with night soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be watertight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

Each pan shall have a capacity of 14 cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an air-tight lid to be affixed. The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved and sweated with solder.

- 6. The proprietor of any such premises shall provide as many pan closets upon such premises as the Council shall consider necessary for the proper sanitation of such premises. The Council may at any time give notice in writing to any such proprietor requiring him within a time to be specified in such notice to provide one or more additional pan closets.
- 7. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto, a supply of deodorant for deodorising night soil, and shall cause all night soil which may be deposited in the pan, in such closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorising material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorise the contents of such pan.
- 8. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops, water, rubbish or any extraneous material whatsoever, except bedroom slops in any pan.
- 9. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan closet or urinal shall-
 - (a) Maintain such pan closet and/or urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and
 - (b) Disinfect such pan closet and urinal and the contents thereof; and effect any repairs thereto.
- 10. At least once a week and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 3 inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the Contractor or person authorized or employed in that

- behalf by the Council with its contents from the premises and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place.
- 11. If the level of the pan shall reach 3 inches from the brim thereof, the proprietor shall immediately notify the Inspector, who shall arrange for the replacement thereof with a clean disinfected pan.
- 12. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the inspector at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.
- 13. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health or offensiveness and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot. Such vehicle shall at all times when not in use be kept at the depot.
- 14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night soil shall cause such night soil to be deposited at the depot and disposed of in such a manner as the Council shall direct.
- 15. If such a final soil be disposed of in trenches such trenches shall not be less than 9 nor more than 18 inches in depth nor exceed 2 feet in width and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids and the night soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than 6 inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean, thoroughly broken up soil upon the night soil and pan washings when covered in.
- 16. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material which will not permit of the satisfactory absorption of such night soil.
- 17. Immediately after the deposit of the night soil and washings in any trench, such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than 12 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night soil so deposited; trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in, in regular consecutive order.
- 18. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night soil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed to the satisfaction of the Inspector. The resultant washings or other filth shall be be disposed of in a similar manner as the night soil.
- 19. Every pan after the disposal of its contents and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground, shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by any method approved in writing from time to time by the Council.
- 20. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the council for the removal of night soil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean and disinfected daily at the depot and maintained in a proper state of repair.
- 21. No person shall remove any night soil from any premises except the contractor or other person employed by the Council or authorized in that behalf.
- 22. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury nor cause nor allow to be buried any night soil in any yard, garden or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.
- 23. The Inspector shall have full power to enter upon any premises, yards or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.
- 24. Where under the provisions of this By-law any matters acts or things are directed, required or authorized to be done by the Council such matters acts or things may be done by the Town Clerk, Inspector or other Officer of the Council authorized in that behalf acting on behalf of the Council; and any notice authorized or required to be given or signed by the Council may be given or signed by any such officer of the Council acting on its behalf.

25. If any person commits a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five Pounds.
