





WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Township of Glenthompson and described in a notice published in the Gazette of the 16th day of November, 1910, were reserved as a site for Public Recreation: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge from sunrise to sunset except on such occasions as the Reserve may be set apart with the consent of the Committee of Management for football cricket swimming and other sports shows carnivals fêtes musical performances outdoor gatherings holiday amusements or any other purpose to which the Committee of Management consented, on any of which occasions fees not exceeding the maximum permissable described in paragraph 3, may be charged and taken for the admission of persons and vehicles to the Reserve.
- 2. The Committee of Management shall have power to let or set aside any portion of the Reserve or any building or part of building thereon to any club, association, person, committee or society for the purpose of meetings, holiday entertainment performances, shows, training, competitive sports subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to determine from time to time. All such fees shall be due and payable in advance for periods as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine. to time determine.
- 3. The fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve and to any buildings, erections or enclosures for the time being thereon on any occasions on which it is set apart for the purposes described in paragraph 1 of these Regulations shall not exceed the following:—
 - (a) for admission of each adult or wage earner a sum not exceed One Dollar (\$1.00);
 - (b) for admission of each child a sum not exceeding 50 cents (\$0.50);
 - (c) for admission of each motor car, truck, motor cycle or other vehicle a sum not exceeding 25 cents (\$0.25);
 - (d) Subject to the foregoing provisions the Committee may at its discretion authorize annual tickets for admission to football, swimming and other facilities to members of the public so required by them. Provided also, that the Committee of Management may at any time at its absolute discretion refuse to admit to the Reserve any person, motor car, motor cycle or any other vehicle.
- 4. No person shall in the Reserve organize or take part in any sports, entertainment, amusement or meeting whatsoever without the consent of the Committee of Management first being obtained.
- 5. The Committee of Management shall have power to hold or authorize to be held sports, carnivals, entertainments, shows, performances or ceremonies in the Reserve and to make charges for admission thereto as herein before provided.
 - 6. No person shall
 - enter or remain in the Reserve who in the opinion of the Committee of Management may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;

- (b) enten or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
- (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve;
- (d) bring any intoxicating liquor onto the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management first being obtained;
- (e) excerise or train any horse, pony or other animal on the Reserve, or take part thereof, without consent of the Committee of Management first
- (f) use the conveniences provided for the use of the public or participants in activities as described in paragraph 1 in an unhygenic or unclean way so as to reinder them unsuitable for human use for the time being;
- (g) enter conveniences provided for the opposite sex except being a person authorized by the Committee of Management to do cleaning maintainence of the said conveniences.
- 7. No person, except the Committee of Management or 7. No person, except the Committee of Management of its officers, its representatives or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
- 8. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management.
- No person shall spit or expectorate on the footpaths or on any structure, building, or erection in the Reserve.
- 10. No person shall damage in any way footpaths, water pipes, drinking taps, tools appliances, seats, buildings, fences, walls or erections, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the written permission of the Committee of Management.
 - 11. No person shall in the Reserve-
 - (a) climb over or jump upon the fences, gates, buildings or trees;
 - (b) place any bill, placard, pamphlet, or paper on or write or paint on or otherwise deface any gate, fence, structure building, seat wall or tree;
 - (c) distribute or give out to any person or persons, or scatter about or throw down hand bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, papers or like matter without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained;
 - (d) throw, place, or leave therein any glasses, filth, dirt, paper, rubbish, or like matter;
 - (e) roll, throw, or discharge any stone or other missile:
 - (f) interfere with or in any way damage any notice, placard, sign or regulation.
- 12. No person shall camp on the Reserve or erect thereon any building or any other structure without the consent of the Committee of Management first being obtained.
- 13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep or other animals without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 14. No person shall, without the authority of the Committee of Management, enter upon any portion of the Reserve set apart for cricket, football, or other games or sports during such time as such portion may be required or used for the purpose for which it has been set apart, nor shall any person enter upon any portion of the Reserve set apart for tennis, croquet, bowls, swimming or any like game, unless such person has authority from the Committee of Management so to do.
- 15. Any person renting or hiring the Reserve for any approved purpose and making a charge for admission of persons and vehicles thereto shall pay to the Committee of Management such amount as the Committee of Management shall deem to be fair and reasonable.
- 16. The Committee of Management may set apart any 16. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve or any building thereon for any lawful game or sport and may from time to time grant to any club or combination of clubs the use of such portion so set apart upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and with the terms of the Reservation.
- 17. When any portion of the Reserve has been set apart as provided in Regulation No. 16, and the use of such portion has been granted to any club or combination of clubs, these may have access to such portion at any time, free of charge, but under such conditions and reservations as may be imposed by the Committee of Management from time to time

- 18. The Committee of Management may from time to time by resolution appoint sub-committees to administer and control portions of the Reserve set aside for particular sports or other purposes and sub-committees until discharged shall have the same power and rights of administration and control as the Committee of Management.
- 19. No person shall wilfully obstruct, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper and lawful use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, nor wilfully obstruct or interrupt. any servant of the Committee of Management of any person appointed by it in the execution of anything for which such servant or person appointed by it is respectively empowered or required to do by the Committee of Management.

No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter upon the children's playground or use any of the swings or toys or other appliances erected thereon; provided, however, that parents or others in charge of children shall be at liberty to enter upon the children's playground to watch over children who are in their charge.
- 24. Except as hereinbefore provided any person found within the children's playground, except during the hours the same is open to the public, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

- 28. The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground.
- 29. No person shall be permitted to bring any animal into the children's playground.
- 30. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle on any part of the children's playground.

Any ballin of crown lands, member of the police force, or duly appointed officer, representative, or servant of the Committee of Management shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty provided under these regulations) to remove or exclude from the Reserve or any section of the Reserve any person who commits a breach of these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 10. The Committee of Management may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purposes of a Caravan Park, and may make, fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and use of any such area or the buildings thereon.
- 11. In the area set aside by the Committee as a Caravan Park the following Regulations shall apply:—
 - 1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "Camping" includes the parking of a vehicle on the camping site.

- "Camping site" means an individual site set apart by the Committee for the parking of vehicles and for the erection of tents.
- "Caretaker" shall mean the Manager or Deputy Caretaker appointed by the Committee
- "Occupier" includes each and every person in charge of a vehicle parked on a camping site and the person in charge of any tent thereon.
- "Refuse" includes food and all discarded matter.
- "Sanitary conveniences" includes urinals, water closets, showers, water taps, gully traps, wash troughs, washing machines, wash coppers, wash basins, refuse bins and receptacles provided by the Committee for depositing therein of refuse.
- "Vehicle" includes-
 - (a) motor cars within the meaning of the Motor Car Act 1958; and
 - (b) caravans and trailers.
- 12. Parking of Vehicles.—The person in charge of a vehicle and who desires to park the same in the Caravan Park shall park it on a camping site as directed by the Caretaker or, in his absence, on a vacant camping site in the said park, and shall pay to the Caretaker the fees prescribed in accordance with these Regulations.

No occupier or other person shall park any vehicle and/or erect any tent or annexe so that any part thereof shall extend beyond the limits of the camping site occupied by

- 13. Time Limit on Camping.—No person other than a person desirous of holidaying in the Caravan Park shall bring a caravan therein and then only for a period of not more than four weeks at any one time, save that under exceptional circumstances the Committee may extend the period of time upon receipt of a request, in writing, from the person or persons concerned the person or persons concerned.
- 14. Sub-letting.—No person shall sub-let any vehicle within the Caravan Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 15. Animals.—No animals other than dogs shall be permitted in the Caravan Park and then only if confined to camping sites occupied by their owners or persons in charge of such dogs, or on a leash, or within the enclosure set exert for dogs. set apart for dogs.
- 16. If, in the opinion of the Caretaker, any dog is causing annoyance or disturbance to persons within the Caravan Park the owner or person for the time being in charge of such animal shall forthwith remove it from the Caravan
- 17. Conduct in the Caravan Park.—No occupier shall deposit or cause to be deposited refuse in or on any part of the Caravan Park other than in receptacles provided for that purpose by the Committee.
- 18. Each occupier shall keep the camping site allocated to him clean and tidy.
- 19. Waste water shall be placed in or directed into receptacles provided by the Committee, and under no circumstances shall waste water be deposited on or allowed to overflow on to the grounds of the Caravan Park. - 24. No person shall without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained and subject to such conditions as the Committee thinks fit within the Caravan Park—
 - (a) sell or offer for sale any article or commodity whatsoever or distribute any bill or like thing or place any chair, seat or other item for hire;

- (b) erect or place therein any building, booth, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing, or seat or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or in any way enclose any part of the Caravan Park;
- (c) preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public;
- (d) carry, use, or discharge any fireworks, firearms, air gun or other lethal weapons.
- 25. No person shall without permission, in writing of the Committee first obtained, operate or use any loud speaker, amplifier, or broadcasting equipment (mechanical or electrical) for broadcasting music, speech, or other noises or sound within the Caravan Park.
- 26. No person shall spit or expectorate on any path or in any building or erection on the Caravan Park.
- 27. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate or fitting for the exhibition of any Regulations, neither shall any person remove or displace any notice fixed or set up in the Caravan Park by the Committee.
- 28. No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his work and duty.
- 29. No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Caravan Park.
- 30. No person shall play, practise or engage in any game or sport within the Caravan Park without the consent of the Committee.
- 31. No male over the age of six years shall enter or use any place, room, convenience or building set apart for the use of females, and no females shall enter or use any place, room convenience or building set apart for the use
- 32. No person shall offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or the use of unnecessarily loud talking, or by any unnecessary noise disturbing or otherwise annoying persons in the Caravan Park.
- 33. No person over the age of fourteen years shall use playground equipment erected within the Caravan Park.
- 34. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Caravan Park without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
- 35. No person shall remove any stone, soil, sand or loam from the Caravan Park without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
- 36. No person shall drive any vehicle within the Caravan Park at a greater speed than 5 miles per hour.
- 37. Fees.—Every occupier shall pay to the Caretaker the respective fees prescribed from time to time by the Committee.
- 38. General.—Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any members of the Committee or any officer thereof or any member of the Police Force, produce such receipt or permission.

Any person who shall offend against any of these Regulations may be requested to leave the Caravan Park forthwith, and his refusal or failure to leave when so requested by the Caretaker or any duly authorized officer of the Committee or any member of the Police Force shall constitute a further offence against these Regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE MERRICKS BEACH FORE-SHORE RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been

reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Balantring whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Balnarring as indicated by red colour on plan marked B/6.5.65, attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.8445, were reserved as a site for Public purposes: And whereas such land hereinafter called ("the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands, in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve. lations for or with respect to the Reserve.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or
- 2. (a) Every person bathing or sunbathing from or on the Reserve shall be decently attired.
- (b) No person shall remain in or on the Reserve if in the opinion of the Beach Inspector he or she is not decently attired.
- 3. The Committee may at any time which it considers desirable appoint any suitable person or persons as Beach Inspectors for the purpose of these Regulations and may remove such person or persons as and when it thinks fit. Beach Inspectors shall be appointed, in writing, signed by the Chairman and the Secretary of the Committee.
- 4. No person shall enter or leave the Reserve except by means of the roads, paths or other carriageways provided and no person shall climb the cliffs in the Reserve.
- 5. No person shall damage or in any way interfere with the trees, shrubs, marram grass or flowers in the Reserve. This Regulation shall not prohibit the removal of undergrowth, shrubs, trees, &c., which, in the opinion of the Committee, constitute a fire hazard. Any such removal shall be authorized, in writing, by the Committee.
- 6. No person shall in any way injure any buildings, fences or seats in the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited or leave wastepaper, bottles, tins, broken glass, garbage or litter of any kind on any part of the Reserve except in the appropriate receptacles provided for the purpose.
- 8. No person shall remove from the Reserve any gravel, stone, shellgrit, sand, loam or seaweed.
- No person shall cut, sow, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve.
- 10. No person shall commit a nuisance in any public or private bathing-box, toilet, boatshed or other building or erection on the Reserve.
- 11. No person shall carry or discharge any firearm, airgun or other lethal weapon in the Reserve.
- 12. No person shall shoot, trap or destroy any birds or native game within the Reserve.
- 13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats or other animal without the written permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 14. (a) No person, without the consent, in writing, of 14. (a) No person, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee, shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him, or in his charge, to enter or remain on the Reserve unless such dog be and continues to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, or be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee. No person shall bring onto the Reserve any dog, for training or exercising for coursing or other purposes of sport.
- (b) Any dog found in the Reserve, except as provided in these Regulations, shall be liable to be seized, and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and may be required to make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog such dog.
- 15. No person shall light or cause to be lighted any fire or burn any material in the Reserve except in fire-places provided by the Committee without the written consent of the Secretary or a Bailiff of Crown lands or the Ranger first obtained.

- 16. No person shall erect any bathing-box, boathouse, shed, kiosk or any other building, structure or erection or booth on any site on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee consistent with these Regulations but no person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure or erection or booth for residential purposes.
- 17. The Committee may, subject to the payment of a fee prescribed by it, allow the transfer of any permit, but no person shall sub-let any site or structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 18. The granting, withdrawal, renewal or allowance of the transfer of any permit of any site or structure shall at all times be at the absolute discretion of the Committee.
- 19. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserve of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth which has been placed, erected or established without its consent, or which has not been properly erected or properly painted or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily painted or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily being the property of which the maintained or kept in repair or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.
- nas expired or been withdrawn.

 20. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserve within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the Chairman or Secretary for the time being of the said Committee.
- 21. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee may remove such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth and recover the cost and/or expense of such removal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same, but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing. or refusing.
- or refusing.

 22. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure, on the occasions of any fêtes, carnivals, regattas, sports or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine not exceeding \$100 by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building erection or enclosure and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building erection or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

 23. No person shall offer for sale any article within
- 23. No person shall offer for sale any article within the Reserve or within any structure thereon without the written permission of the Secretary of the Committee first obtained.
- 24. No person shall drive or ride any animal or motor vehicle within the Reserve in a manner likely to cause injury to any person.
- 25. (a) No person shall drive on to the Reserve or park thereon any motor car or motor cycle or other vehicle except at such places as are set apart for this purpose by the Committee.
- (b) No person shall drive a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle or other vehicle on the sands of the beach without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- (c) No person shall drive any motor car, motor cycle r other vehicle on the Reserve at a speed greater than 15 miles per hour.
- 26. No person shall park or leave any motor car, motor cycle or other vehicle on any part of the Reserve except in an area set apart for the purpose by the Committee.
- 27. The Committee may set apart any portion or portions of the Reserve as a place for parking vehicles.
- 28. The Committee may fix such fees not exceeding—motor cycles, Twenty cents (20c), motor cars, Forty cents (40c), buses, One dollar fifty cents (\$1.50), per day, season tickets Two dollars (\$2), as it thinks fit as fees for parking of vehicles in any place set apart within

the Reserve for the parking of vehicles. This fee may be collected on entry to the Reserve or at any other place in the Reserve appointed by the Committee.

- 29. Every person who parks a vehicle in the place set apart for the parking of vehicles shall pay to the Committee or its authorized representatives on demand, such fee as has been fixed by the Committee, pursuant to these Regulations as the fee for parking in such place.
- 30. Every person bringing a vehicle into the Reserve shall obey the reasonable direction of the Committee or its authorized representatives in relation to the driving or parking of such vehicles within the Reserve.
- 31. No person shall play any game or throw any object which in the opinion of the Beach Inspector or a Bailiff of Crown lands or Ranger may constitute a danger or nuisance to any other person using the beach area.
- 32. No person shall play, practise or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve unless by consent of the Committee.
- 33. No person shall bring in or on the Reserve or use any diving stand made of iron or other metal or materials.
- 34. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee on the Reserve shall pay any charges for the use of the same as may from time to time be made by the Committee.
- 35. No assemblies for fêtes, carnivals, regattas, concerts or for the purpose of public workship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 36. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee, or the properly appointed servant of such Committee or any member of the Police Force, or any Bailiff of Crown Lands, produce such receipt or permission, in writing.
- 37. The Committee may set apart portion of the Reserve as and for the purposes of a children's playground.

- 38. No person shall drive or park a motor vehicle of any kind within twenty-five (25) yards of the children's playground.
- 39. No person above the age of fourteen (14) years shall use or play with any of the swings, fixtures or other equipment erected or provided in the children's playground.
- $40.\ \mbox{No}$ person shall leave or deposit any fish or fish offal on the Reserve.
- 41. No person shall moor and/or use any boat on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.
- 42. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from any amplifier, loudspeaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.
- 43. No person shall camp or erect any tent or similar structure or park a caravan on any site or portion of the Reserve.

- 17. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.
- .18. The contract shall not be considered broken, infringed, or vitiated by the Government performing the service or arranging for the carrying out of the same otherwise than by the contractor in the event of urgency or emergency.

- A bylaw of the Shire of Lillydale made under Section 197 of the Local Government Act 1958 and Numbered 152 for:
 - Requiring that any land in the municipal district which the Council by notice in writing to the owner or occupier has declared to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood shall be enclosed with a sufficient fence.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 and every other power it thereunto enabling the President and Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale orders as follows:-
- (1) This Bylaw may be known as the Fencing of Land
- (2) The Council may serve on the owner or occupier of any land within the municipal district a notice in writing declaring the same to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood and requiring that such land be enclosed with a sufficient fence of such material and in such manner as is prescribed by clause 7 hereof.
- (3) Every owner or occupier of land upon whom a notice pursuant to the last preceding clause shall have been served shall within the time therein limited enclose the land therein referred to with a sufficient fence as in such notice prescribed.
- (4) In addition to any penalties any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of any breach of this Bylaw or in the execution of work directed by this Bylaw to be executed by any person and not executed by him shall be paid by the person committing such breach or failing to execute such work:
- (5) It is hereby prescribed that a "Substantial fence" and a "sufficient fence" shall be constructed of such materials and in such manner as it set out hereunder namely:
 - (a) Posts-constructed of 5" x 3" red gum or jarrah securely strutted and set at least two feet into the ground at not less than nine foot centres.

- (b) Rails—top and bottom rails to be constructed of 3" x 2" hardwood mortised into the posts and centre rail constructed of 3" x 1½" hardwood mortised into the posts.
