PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961, SECTION 4 (1)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

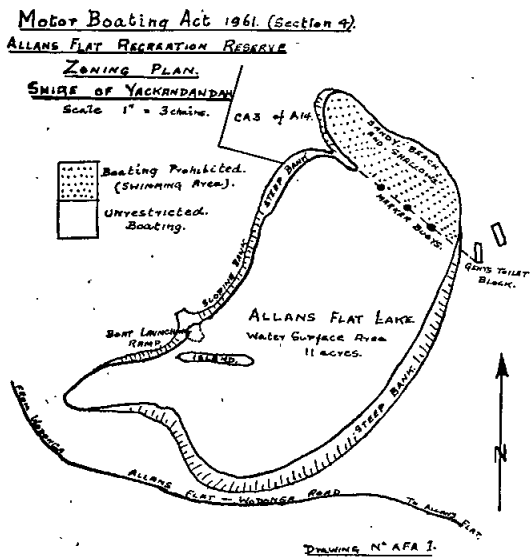
WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity:

AND WHEREAS the Committee of Management of the Allans Flat Recreation Reserve has been proclaimed the Authority in respect of the waters of the Allans Flat Lake in the Shire of Yackandandah:

AND WHEREAS the said Committee of Management has recommended the prohibition of boating in a specified part of Allans Flat Lake and the setting aside of another part of the said Lake for the use of all classes of boats:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, do by this my Proclamation—

- (1) Prohibit to all classes of boating the use of those waters of the Northern portion of Allans Flat Lake contained within an area bounded by an imaginary line, marked by three buoys, from the centre of that spit of land projecting into the waters of the Lake in the area adjacent to Crown Allotment 3 of Allotment 14 thence in a south-easterly direction to the south-west corner of the Gents Toilet block on the north-eastern side of the Lake.
- (2) Set aside for all classes of boating that part of the waters of Allans Flat Lake to the southward of the above buoyed boundary.
- (3) The waters defined in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Proclamation are those delineated in drawing No. A.F.A. 1 in the Schedule hereunder.

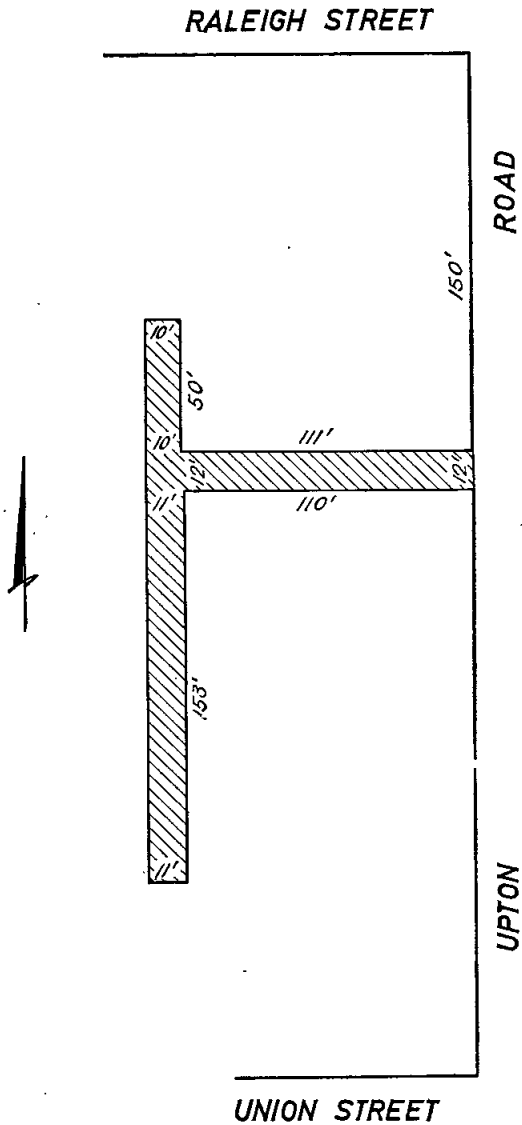
