In accordance with previous custom, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of services and all public bodies group themselves together for presentation, as far as possible.

It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress will do so on this occasion, but His Excellency will be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in morning suit or lounge suit.

For the guidance of those attending the Levee, it will be appropriate, for those who wish to do so, to wear Honours, Decorations and Awards.

Private Entree Cards will admit recipients to the South Door of the Spring-street Entrance at Parliament House at 9.30 a.m. All other citizens are requested to enter by the North Door of the Spring-street Entrance at 10.15 a.m.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levee should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed or typed in capitals, or written in block letters, their styles of address for presentation, in order to facilitate announcement to His Excellency.

#### AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

##### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say) :—

**WHEREAS** by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right of way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

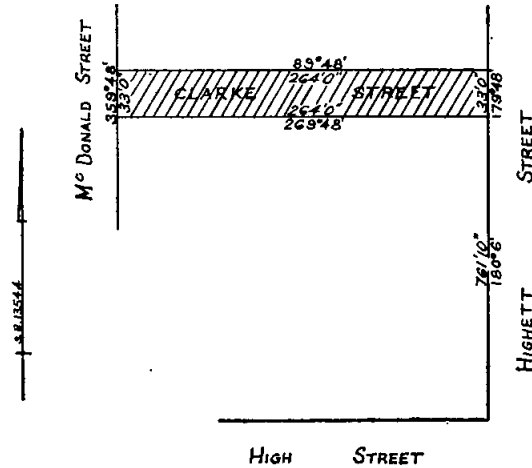

**Apprenticeship Act 1958.**

**WOOD MACHINING TRADE PROCLAIMED TO BE AN APPRENTICESHIP TRADE.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** section 13 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1958* provides, *inter alia*, that after the Minister has taken into consideration any recommendation made by the Apprenticeship Commission the Governor in Council, for the purposes of the said Act, may from time to time by Proclamation proclaim any trades to be apprenticeship trades and that the Governor in Council (whether with or without any recommendation of the said Commission) may by Proclamation at any time revoke, amend or vary any such Proclamation:

And whereas the trade of Machining (Furniture) was proclaimed to be an apprenticeship trade within the Metropolitan District on the 25th of March, 1952 and within the remainder of the State of Victoria on the 10th of June, 1965:

And whereas the Apprenticeship Commission, having notified in the manner prescribed by the said Act its intention to recommend that the trade of Wood Machining be proclaimed to be an apprenticeship trade within the whole of the State of Victoria, and having considered the representations made on behalf of employers and employees in the said trade, has recommended to the Minister that the said trade be so proclaimed and that the Proclamation of the trade of Machining (Furniture) as an apprenticeship trade in consequence be revoked:

And whereas the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

Now therefore I, the lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation:—

- (a) proclaim the trade of Wood Machining to be an apprenticeship trade within the whole of the State of Victoria;
- (b) revoke the Proclamations made on the 25th of March, 1952 and the 10th of June, 1965, in so far as they relate to the trade of Machining (Furniture).

And whereas the Apprenticeship Commission having notified in the manner prescribed by the said Act its intention to recommend that the gardening trade, in so far as it is carried on in municipal councils, racing clubs, foreshore trusts, golf clubs and cemetery trusts, in the Metropolitan District, be proclaimed an apprenticeship trade under the said Act, and having considered the representations made on behalf of the employers and employees in the said trade, has recommended to the Minister that the said trade be so proclaimed:

And whereas the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the gardening trade, in so far as it is carried on in municipal councils, racing clubs, foreshore trusts and cemetery trusts, in the Metropolitan District, to be an apprenticeship trade.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF  
THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 916A of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the Council

of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of Part XLIX. of the said Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas by Proclamations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 25th May, 1947, 29th October, 1952 and 6th May, 1959, the operation of the said Part was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Buninyong:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Buninyong has requested that the operation of the said Part be extended to the balance of the municipal district of the Shire of Buninyong:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Buninyong to which they do not already apply, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned part of the municipal district of the Shire of Buninyong on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 8th September, 1966, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter and provided further that no such by-laws shall come into operation before the 8th September, 1966.

MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961.—SECTION 4 (1).

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time appoint an Authority in control over any Victorian waters:

And whereas by section 4 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity:

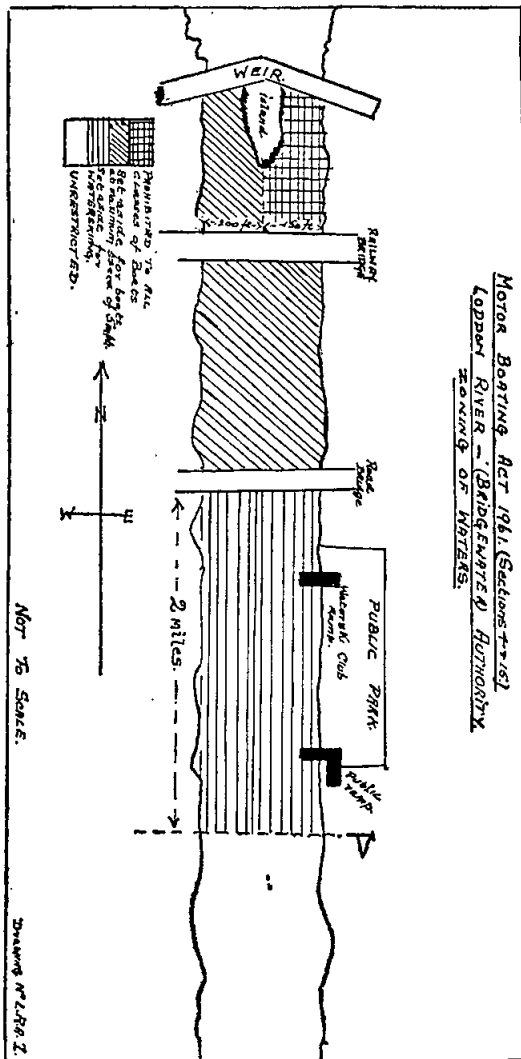
And whereas the Bridgewater Park Trust has been proclaimed the Authority over the waters of the River Loddon at Bridgewater in the Shire of Marong:

And whereas the Bridgewater Park Trust has recommended the prohibition of a certain part of the waters of the said river for all classes of boating and the setting aside of another part of the waters of the said river for water ski-ing:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, do by this my Proclamation—

- (1) Prohibit the use of that part of the waters of the River Loddon at Bridgewater which lie between the railway bridge and the weir and bounded by the eastern bank of the said river and an imaginary line, parallel to the bank, from a point 150 feet westward along the bridge from the eastern bank, to the island adjacent to the weir, in midstream, for all classes of boating.
- (2) Set aside that part of the waters of the River Loddon from the road bridge over the said river for a distance of two miles in a southerly direction for water ski-ing.

The waters specified above are those delineated in the drawing No. L.R.A.1 in the Schedule hereto.

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

OTWAY WATERWORKS DISTRICT.  
PORTION OF DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AN "URBAN DISTRICT".

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim that as on and from the first day of July, 1966 that portion of the Otway Waterworks District, included within the boundaries set out and described in the Schedule hereto shall be and become an "Urban District" for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be known as Simpson Urban District.

SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of Simpson Urban District.

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 165, parish of Cooriejong, county of Heytesbury; thence by lines bearing South 16° 48' West 804 links, South 34° 47' East 2,535 4/10 links to the western boundary of a Government road; thence south-easterly by a line across that road to the most western angle of allotment 2A, parish of Corodjil; thence south-easterly and north-easterly by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of that allotment to the most eastern angle thereof; thence south-easterly by the south-western boundary of the Simpson to Kennedy's Creek Road to the most northern angle of allotment 3A; thence south-westerly, south-easterly, and north-easterly by the north-western, south-western, and south-eastern boundaries of that allotment to the most eastern angle thereof; thence south-easterly by the south-western boundary of the Simpson to Kennedy's Creek Road to the most northern angle of allotment 5; thence by lines bearing

South 58° 25' West 225 3/10 links, South 31° 30' East 545 links and North 67° 59' East to the north-eastern boundary of the Simpson to Kennedy's Creek Road; thence north-westerly by that road boundary to the most southern angle of allotment 4A; thence north-easterly by the south-eastern boundary of that allotment and generally north-westerly by the north-eastern boundaries of said allotment 4A and allotment 1A and a line connecting those boundaries to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by the northern boundary of that allotment and northerly by the eastern boundary of Lavers Hill-road to the south-western angle of allotment 1B; thence easterly, northerly and westerly by the southern, eastern and northern boundaries of said allotment 1B, parish of Coradjil to the north-western angle thereof; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of Lavers Hill-road to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 95A, parish of Cooriejong; thence westerly by a line and the last-mentioned allotment boundary and southerly by the western boundary of said allotment 95A to the south-western angle of that allotment; thence generally north-westerly by the north-eastern boundaries of a Government road to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 164; thence southerly by a line and the western boundaries of allotments 164 and 165 and easterly by the southern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the point of commencement.

Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts.  
SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1958* (No. 6409), as amended by section 7 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1959* (No. 6518), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in relation to land in the whole of Victoria or to land in any part of Victoria described in the Proclamation require every owner or occupier of such land to destroy the vermin on such land by means of poisoning with a derivative of monofluoroacetic acid strychnine or arsenic or by fumigation of burrows and warrens and specify the method by which such poisoning or fumigation shall be undertaken and further direct the time within which it shall be undertaken and require such owners or occupiers to continue such poisoning or fumigation until the vermin are destroyed to the satisfaction of an Inspector:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby, in relation to land in the whole of Victoria, require every owner or occupier of such land to destroy certain vermin, to wit, rabbits, on such land by means of fumigation of burrows and warrens with calcium cyanide, chloropicrin, carbon tetrachloride or carbon monoxide and direct that such fumigation shall be undertaken within the period of four weeks commencing on Monday, the eighteenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six and require such owners or occupiers to continue such fumigation until the rabbits are destroyed to the satisfaction of an Inspector.

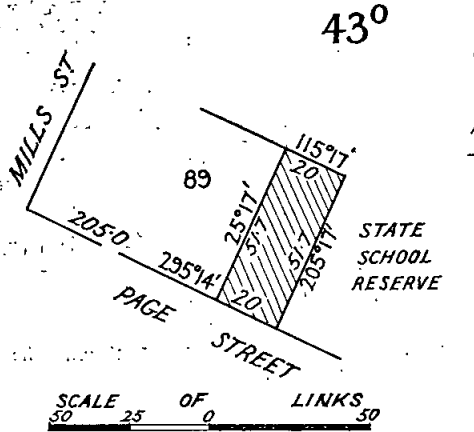

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE MUNICIPAL AND PUBLIC PURPOSES RESERVE (CURTIS-STREET) BALLARAT.**

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Township of Ballarat East were reserved for Municipal and Public Purposes by Order in

Council, dated the 30th October, 1962 and the 30th November, 1965: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Ballarat City Council as the Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

## REGULATIONS:

1. No person shall damage or destroy any property or light fires within the Reserve.
2. No person shall throw stones or missiles of any kind within the Reserve.
3. No person shall climb on any portion of any building, balustrade, or property within the Reserve or jump over any fence or hedge therein.
4. No person shall affix or interfere with any placard, bill, notice or marking of any kind on any building, structure, post, tree, constructed surface or anything within the Reserve.
5. No person shall enter or travel over the Reserve with or on a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle or other vehicle except on such portion therein provided for wheeled traffic and the driver of such motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle shall be guided and directed and shall abide by any notice, post or sign or marking or barrier that shall have been made or erected for the purpose of traffic guidance, control or direction.
6. No person shall drive any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle or other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly or at such a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public or likely to cause any damage to anything within the Reserve.
7. No person or persons except as hereunder provided shall park any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle or other vehicle within the Reserve, except completely within the marked spaces provided for such car parking.
8. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any wall, structure or property within the Reserve.
9. No person in an intoxicated state or who is disorderly or is not decorously dressed shall enter or remain in the Reserve and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.
10. No person shall remain within the Reserve or in any property therein when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown lands or member of the Police Force or authorized Officer of the Committee.
11. No person shall hawk, or sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any goods, fruit, or merchandise or anything or solicit or gather money therein without the authority in writing of the Committee.
12. No person shall give out or distribute any hand bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers in the Reserve without the authority in writing of the Committee.
13. No person shall litter the Reserve by scattering or throwing down hand bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers or place them on any vehicle within the Reserve.
14. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless securely held by a chain, cord or leash.
15. No person shall bring in or allow to remain in the Reserve any horse, cow, sheep, pig or goat and any such animal found therein shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed.
16. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance or sound or shall play upon any musical instrument or noisy instrument or sing within the Reserve without the authority in writing of the Committee.
17. No person except on lawful occasions may enter any enclosed area or any garage or shed or other structure within the Reserve.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the South Melbourne City Council as the Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

## REGULATIONS:

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public all day and all night free of charge.
2. No person shall in or on the Reserve—
  - (a) use the Reserve for any purpose except that of a public park;
  - (b) offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct or speak or behave in an offensive or noisy manner, or be in a state of intoxication;
  - (c) play any ball, athletic or unlawful game.
3. Except as otherwise provided in these Regulations, no person shall—
  - (a) suffer any animal owned by him or in his charge to be in the Reserve, provided that "animal" shall not include a dog so controlled by a leash or cord as not to interfere with the convenience or enjoyment of any person in the Reserve, or to cause damage or injury to the Reserve or to any person or thing therein.
  - (b) ride or drive any vehicle, including any bicycle, in the Reserve;
  - (c) remove, uproot, pluck, interfere with, deface, damage or destroy any property or thing belonging to or under the control or management of the Committee, including anything growing in or on the Reserve;
  - (d) light any fire in or discharge any fireworks or throw anything in or into the Reserve;
  - (e) deposit or leave any litter in the Reserve except in a receptacle provided by the Committee for the purpose, or spit on the Reserve or on anything therein;
  - (f) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed in the Reserve, or interfere with the convenience or enjoyment of any person therein.
4. (i) Except as otherwise provided in these Regulations, no person shall in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee in writing, first had and obtained—
  - (a) hawk, sell or offer for sale or advertise any goods or other article;
  - (b) solicit or gather money or other things;
  - (c) in any manner exhibit or give out any advertisement, placard, handbill or other notice or any book or paper;
  - (d) erect any tent or structure of any kind;
  - (e) speak publicly or take part in any public meeting or public entertainment or like assemblage;

(ii) The Committee may in writing at any time withdraw, cancel or annul any such consent.

5. Any person found committing a breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall state his name and place of abode when required so to do by any officer or employee of the Committee or any other person authorized by the Committee in that behalf or when so required by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force.

6. Notwithstanding anything in these Regulations contained, no person employed by or acting with or under the authority of the Committee shall, by reason of performing or abstaining from any act in the due course of his lawful duties on behalf of the Committee in the Reserve, be deemed to have contravened or failed to comply with these Regulations.

Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$40.00 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10.00 each for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order of any Court.

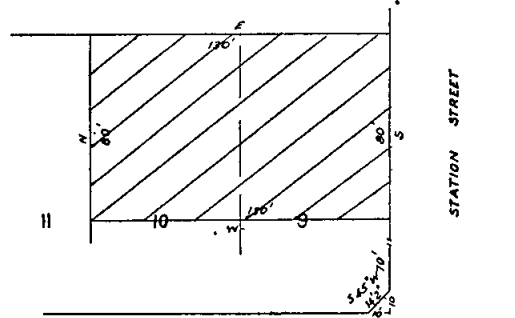

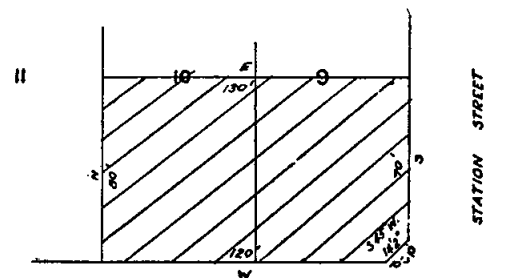
