AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

*Country Fire Authority Act 1958.*ALTERATION OF FIRE CONTROL REGIONS, URBAN
FIRE DISTRICTS AND RURAL FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Proclamations of the Governor in Council issued on the sixteenth day of November, 1954, and the fifteenth day of January, 1959, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventeenth day of November, 1954, and the twenty-first day of January, 1959, respectively, for the purposes of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958*, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district:

AND WHEREAS by section sixteen of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958* it is (amongst other things) enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the *Country Fire Authority*, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*—

- (1) add any area to or excise any area from any fire control region;
- (2) add any area to or excise any area from any urban fire district;
- (3) amend or alter the boundaries of rural districts within any region:

AND WHEREAS the *Country Fire Authority* has submitted a report that it is necessary and desirable that certain areas in the rural fire districts of the Seventh Fire Control Region be added to the Third Fire Control Region the whole of which is an urban fire district:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, after consideration of the said report of the *Country Fire Authority*, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958*, do by this my Proclamation excise from the Seventh Fire Control Region and add to the Third Fire Control Region those areas described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of Barrabool, Parish of Barrabool, Parish of Duneed, County of Grant; Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of Crown portion 7 distant forty chains from the north-east angle thereof, Parish of Barrabool,

thence generally northerly and easterly by the Ceres Lookout-road and Barrabool-road to Scenic-road; thence southerly by Scenic-road to Roslyn-road; thence southerly by the western boundaries of Crown portions 10 and 8 to the Princes Highway; thence south-westerly by the Princes Highway to Marendaz-road, Parish of Duneed; thence northerly by Marendaz-road and a line to the point of commencement.

Shire of Bellarine, Parish of Moolap, County of Grant; Commencing at the north-west angle of Crown allotment 1, Section 13, Parish of Moolap, thence northerly by a line the prolongation of Coppards-road to the shore of Corio Bay; thence easterly northerly and south-easterly by the shore line of Corio Bay and the Geelong Outer Harbour to Clifton Avenue; thence by a line to the south-west angle of Crown portion 16; thence westerly by Hays-road to Point Henry-road; thence generally south-westerly by Point Henry-road to the Geelong-Portarlington-road; thence southerly by Moolap Station-road to Townsend-road; thence easterly by Townsend-road to Coppards-road; thence northerly by Coppards-road to the point of commencement.

Shire of Corio; Parishes of Moorpanyul, Moranghurk, Woornyalook and Murcain; County of Grant; Commencing at the intersection of Rollins-road with the Geelong-Ballarat Railway line, Parish of Moorpanyul, thence northerly by Rollins-road and a line, the prolongation of Rollins-road to Heales-road; Parish of Moranghurk; thence easterly by Heales-road to a point distant 1,136' 6" westerly from Hendy-street; thence due north a distance of 2,876' 9"; thence easterly by a line bearing 89° 58' to Hendy-street; thence southerly by Hendy-street to Heales-road; thence easterly by Heales-road a line the prolongation of Heales-road, Dando's-road and a line the prolongation of Dando's-road to the shore of the Geelong Outer Harbour, Parishes of Woornyalook and Murcain; thence southerly and easterly by the shore line of the Geelong Outer Harbour and Corio Bay to a point in line with Mont View-road; thence westerly by a line and Mont View-road to a point distant five chains westerly from Biddlecombe-avenue, Parish of Moranghurk; thence southerly by a line parallel with and five chains distant from Biddlecombe-avenue to a point five chains distant northerly from School-road; thence westerly by a line parallel with and distant five chains from School-road to Shell-parade; thence southerly by Shell-parade to School-road; thence westerly by School-road, a line and Plantation-road to a point distant five chains westerly from the Bacchus Marsh-road; thence southerly by a line parallel with and distant five chains from the Bacchus Marsh-road to Goldsworthy-road; thence westerly by Goldsworthy-road to Anakie-road; thence southerly by Anakie-road to the Geelong-Ballarat Railway line; thence north-westerly by the Geelong-Ballarat Railway line to the point of commencement.

Shire of South Barwon; Parishes of Barrabool, Conewarre, Corio and Duneed, County of Grant; Commencing at the north-west angle of subdivision F-483 on chart Crown portion 10, Parish of Barrabool, thence southerly by the western boundaries of Crown portions 10 and 8 to the Princes Highway; thence southerly by Ghazepore-road to the Warrnambool Railway line, Parish of Duneed; thence generally north-easterly by the Railway line, Parish of Conewarre, to the Barwon River, Parish of Corio; thence generally north-westerly by the Barwon River to the Barwon Bridge; thence southerly by the Barwon Bridge and the east side of the Princes Highway and Mount Colite-road to a point being the intersection of Mount Colite-road and Graylings-road; thence westerly along Graylings-road to Bailey-street; thence southerly along Bailey-street to Autumn-street; thence westerly along Autumn-street and a production of the line of Autumn-street to a point five chains distant from the east side of the Princes Highway, Parish of Barrabool; thence south-westerly by a line parallel with the Princes Highway and five chains distant from the east boundary thereof sixty-four chains; thence westerly by a line to a point on the west boundary of Valley-road South distant twenty-three chains and fifty links from the intersection of Valley-road South with the north boundary of Crown portion 8; thence northerly by the boundary of Valley-road South a distance of fourteen chains; thence westerly by a line at right angles to a point the intersection of this line with the southern prolongation of the western boundary of Thornhill-road; thence northerly by a line and the west boundary of Thornhill-road to the north-east angle of subdivision F-483 on chart Crown portion 10; thence westerly by the northern boundary of subdivision F-483 to the point of commencement.

Shire of South Barwon; Parish of Barrabool, County of Grant; Commencing at the south-west angle of Crown allotment 1, Section XVIII, Parish of Barrabool, thence northerly by Scenic-road to the southern boundary of the Crown reserve known as Queen's Park; thence easterly

by that boundary to the Barwon River; thence generally southerly to the intersection of the Barwon River with a line parallel with and five chains distant westerly from the west boundary of Valley-road North; thence southerly by that line to a point 10 chains distant northerly from the north boundary of Mount Pleasant-road; thence westerly by a line at right angles to the east boundary of Crown Allotment 3, Section XVIII; thence southerly by the east boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to Mount Pleasant-road; thence westerly by Mount Pleasant-road to the point of commencement.

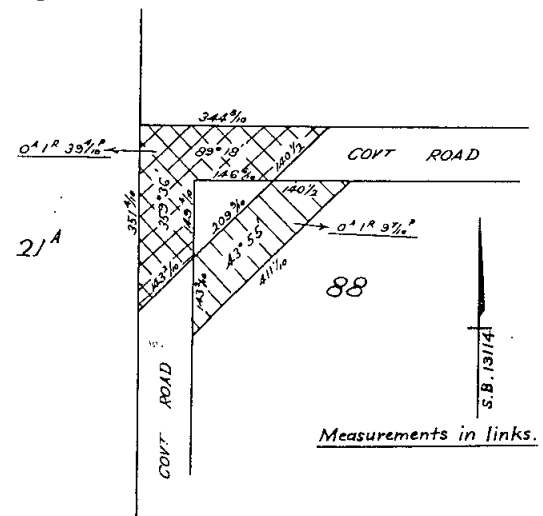

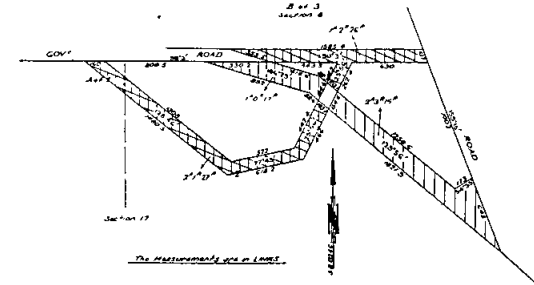

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1966.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Fifteen cents per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 73,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust, Shire Hall, Rutherglen.

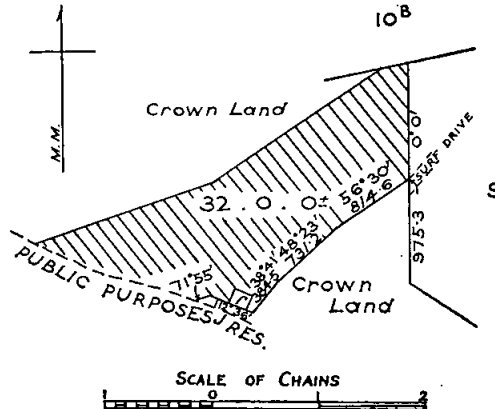

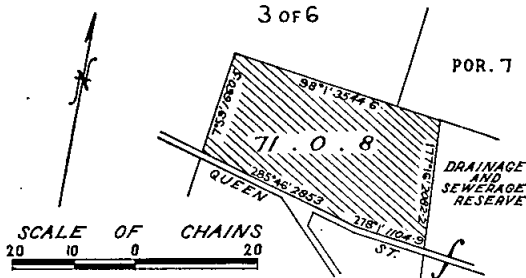

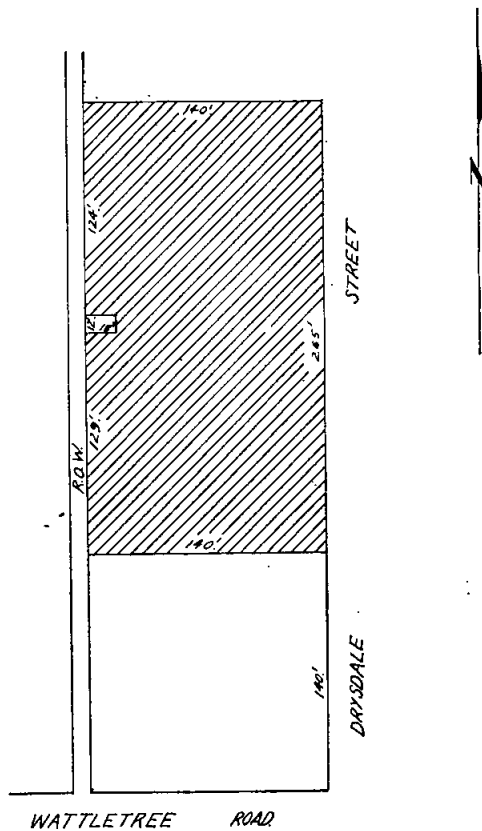

TRANSFER OF RIVERS DRAINS AND WORKS FROM STATE RIVERS
AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION TO DANDENONG VALLEY
AUTHORITY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 16 of the *Dandenong Valley Authority Act 1963*, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and upon the recommendation of the Minister of Water Supply, doth hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1966.
2. The rivers drains and improvement works which are described in the First Schedule hereto and which are within the catchment of the Dandenong Creek but which are vested in or under the control of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission (hereinafter called "the Commission") by or under the provisions of the *Water Act 1958* are hereby transferred to and vested in the Dandenong Valley Authority (hereinafter called "the Authority") for river improvement and arterial drainage purposes.
3. The lands which shall upon such transfer be included within the District of the Authority are all of the lands within the Carrum Drainage District as constituted under the *Water Act 1958*, the boundaries of which District were set out and described in an Order in Council made on the 28th October, 1941, and amended by Orders in Council made on the 13th July, 1942, 22nd December, 1958, 26th June, 1962 and 17th December, 1963, respectively, excepting thereout the land which was included within the District of the Authority by an Order in Council made on the 14th December, 1965, and are the lands shown by red colour on a plan numbered A41 accompanying this Order and deposited in the office of the Commission in Melbourne.
4. Upon such transfer all property, powers, rights, liabilities and obligations of the Commission in relation to the rivers drains and works so transferred, including the property and liabilities set out in the Second Schedule hereto, shall be transferred to the Authority.
5. (1) The financial liabilities which shall upon such transfer be transferred from the Commission to the Authority shall include—
 - (a) the amount of \$536,519.85 being the capital liability borne by the Carrum Drainage District at 30th June, 1966, in the books of the Commission;
 - (b) any liability subsequently transferred from the Capital Expenditure borne by the State Account to the District Capital Account in the books of the Commission (estimated at \$133,000 for 1965-66) in respect of one-half of any capital expenditure by the Commission in the Carrum Drainage District, provided that any liability so attaching to the Authority shall be reduced consequent upon the transfer of:—
 - (i) the balance at 30th June, 1966, in the Water Supply Works Depreciation Account in respect of the Carrum Drainage District (estimated at \$9,400) in the books of the Commission; and
 - (ii) the accumulated cash surplus in the cash account of the Carrum Drainage District (estimated at \$26,000) at 30th June, 1966.
- (2) The Authority shall on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December in each year until the capital liabilities transferred as aforesaid are repaid, pay to the Treasurer of Victoria a sum equivalent to three and one-quarter per centum per annum of the said liabilities. Every such half-yearly payment may be applied by the Treasurer for interest

at a rate not exceeding three per centum per annum on the balance of principal outstanding from time to time; and the difference between the amount of such half-yearly payment and the amount applied for interest shall be applied in reduction of principal.

3. (a) No person shall at any unreasonable time on any land or premises make or cause to be made any noise materially interfering with the reasonable comfort of any person in any adjacent premises or in any adjacent street or road.

(b) No person shall at any unreasonable time use or cause to be used any premises or any part of any premises so that there emanates therefrom any noise materially interfering with the reasonable comfort of any person in any adjacent premises or in any adjacent street or road.

(c) The owner or occupier of any land or premises permitting any person on such land or premises to contravene the provisions of this clause shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

4. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing clauses by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

5. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of Five pounds for each day on which the offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or, at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.
