AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

### BUNGAREE AND WALLACE WATERWORKS TRUST. PROCLAMATION OF URBAN DISTRICTS.

#### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Act and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim that on and from the date hereof portions of the Waterworks District of the Bungaree and Wallace Waterworks Trust within the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto shall be and become Urban Districts for the purpose of and within the meaning of the said Act.

##### *Bungaree Urban District.*

thence north-easterly along the north-western boundaries of the said Lot 1 and Lots 2, 3, 4, and 5 to the northernmost angle of the said Lot 5; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Lodged Plan of Subdivision No. R678 to its north-eastern angle; thence south-westerly along the said northern boundary of Crown allotment 1 to its westernmost angle; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundary of the said Crown allotment 1 to a point in line with the southern boundary of Lot 5 on Lodged Plan of Subdivision No. 52755; thence westerly by a line across a road and along the said southern boundary of Lot 5 through Crown allotment 3A, Section 2A to a point on the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 3; thence northerly along the said eastern boundary of Crown allotment 3 to its intersection with a line parallel to and distant 215 links south-easterly from the north-western boundary of the said Crown allotment 3; thence south-westerly by the said parallel line through the said Crown allotment 3 to a point on its western boundary; thence northerly along the said western boundary of Crown allotment 3 to its north-western angle; thence generally westerly along the southern boundary of the said Western Highway to a point on the eastern boundary of Portion 2, Crown allotment 5, Section 2A; thence southerly along the said eastern boundary of Portion 2, Crown allotment 5 a distance of 279.4 links; thence through the said Portion 2, by a line bearing 266° 07' a distance of 752.1 links to a point on its western boundary; thence southerly along the said western boundary of Portion 2 a distance of 737.2 links; thence across a road and through Portion 1, Crown allotment 5 by lines bearing 275° 05' a distance of 355.4 links and 3° 23' a distance of 669.5 links to a point on the northern boundary of the said Portion 1; thence westerly along the said northern boundary of Portion 1 to the north-eastern angle of Lot 1 on Lodged Plan of Subdivision No. 63841; thence southerly, westerly and northerly along the eastern, southern and western boundaries of the said

Lot 1 to its north-western angle; thence northerly by a line across the said Western Highway to the point of commencement.

Wallace Urban District.

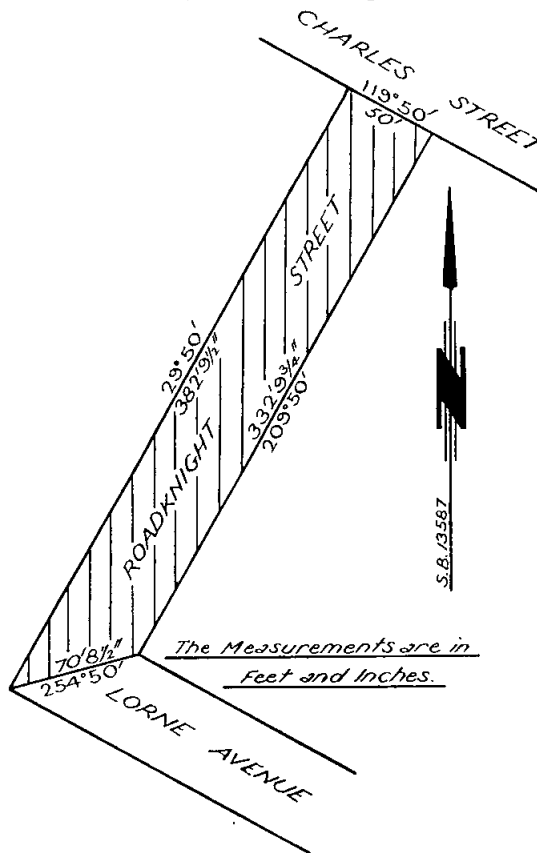

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage

has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then and thereafter in force.

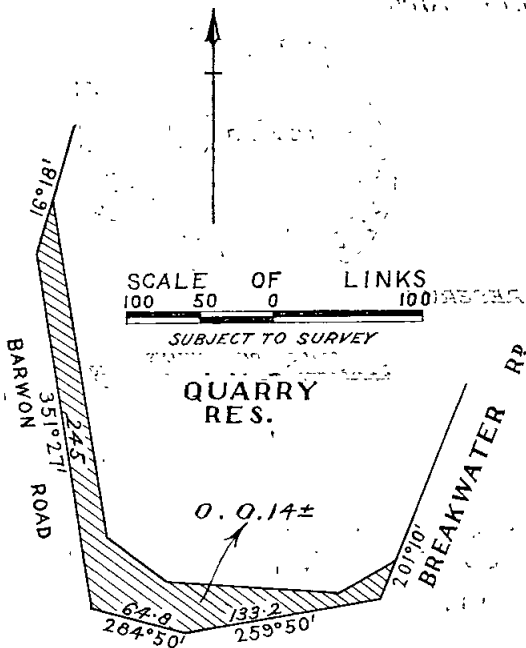
SCALE OF CHAINS 3

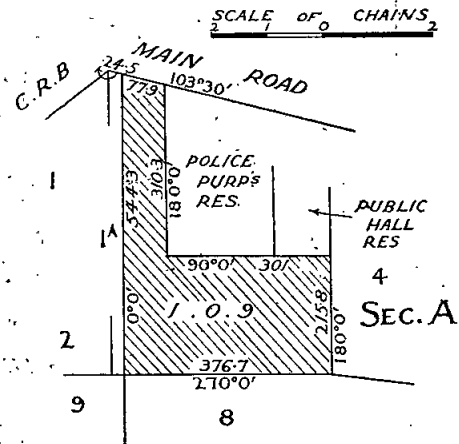

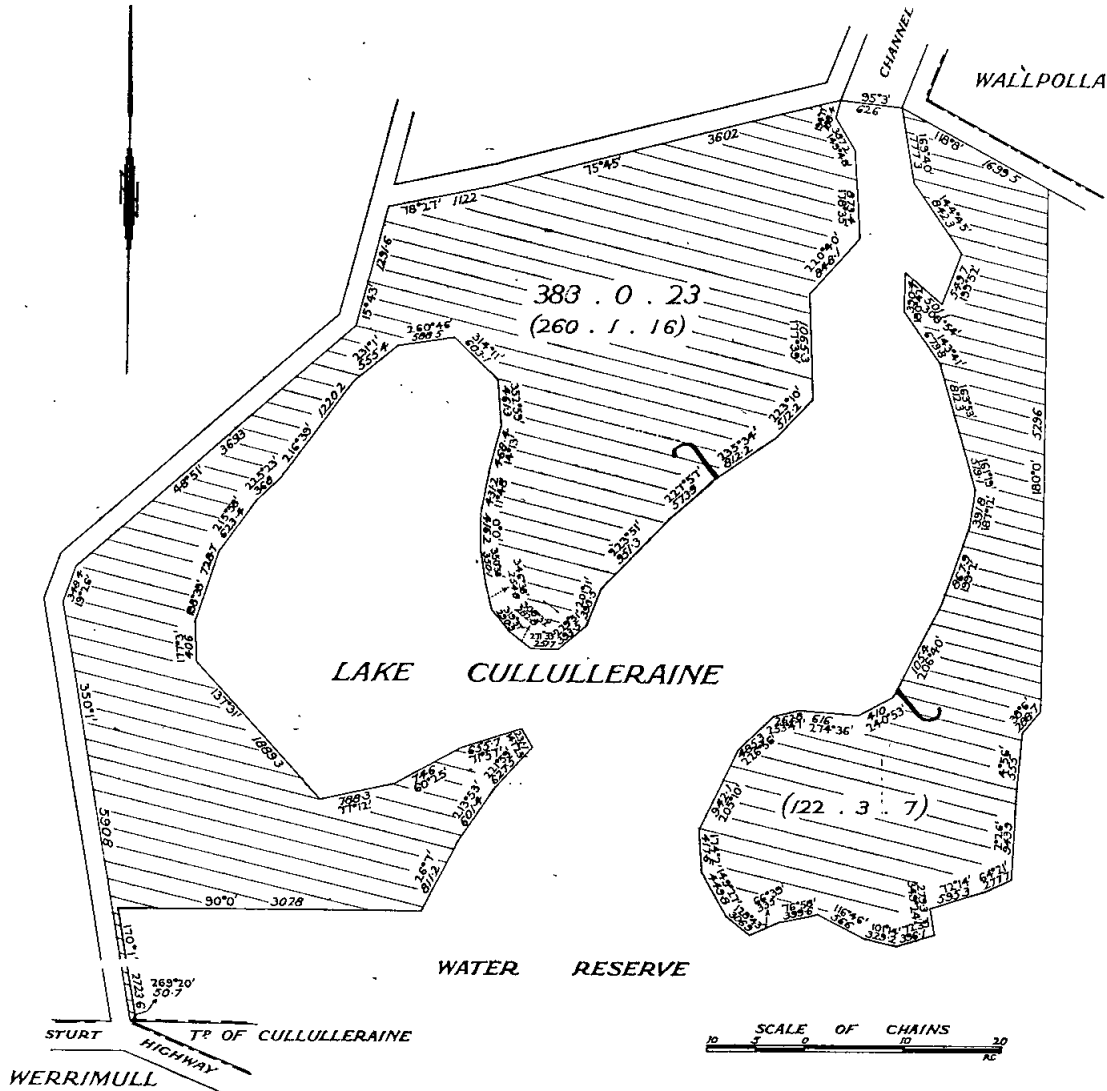
