MUNICIPAL ASSOCIATION ACT 1907 AS AMENDED.

PROCLAMATION

FIBROUS PLASTERING TRADE PROCLAIMED AN APPRENTICESHIP TRADE OUTSIDE THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT.

BY-LAW No. 103.

A By-law for making and levying the rates for the year commencing on the 1st day of July, 1966.

GEELONG Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "The Trust") in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1958* and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-Law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works, or any extension of such works.

1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area, and supplied with water for domestic and/or other purposes:—

- (a) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed \$166—Ten Dollars per annum.
- (b) On any tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds \$166—Six cents in the dollar of the annual valuation.
- (c) On any land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof does not exceed \$66—Four Dollars per annum.
- (d) On any such land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof exceeds \$66—Six cents in the dollar of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1966, and ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1967, and shall be payable on the tenth day of September, 1966.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for

such rates, be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act by the Council of such municipality on the written application of the Trust as provided for in such case by the Water Acts.

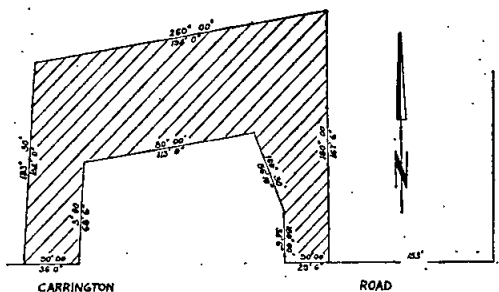

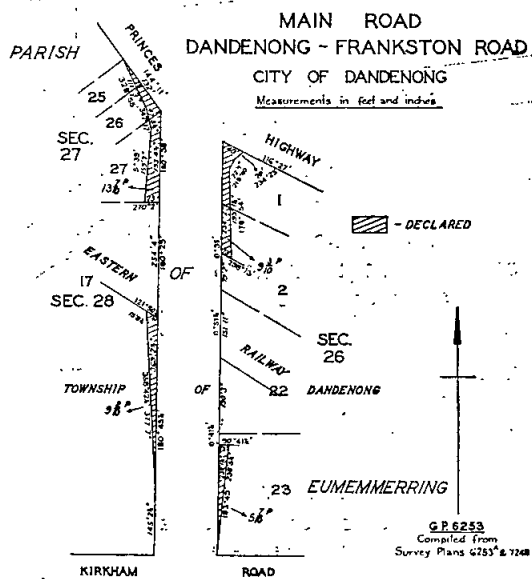

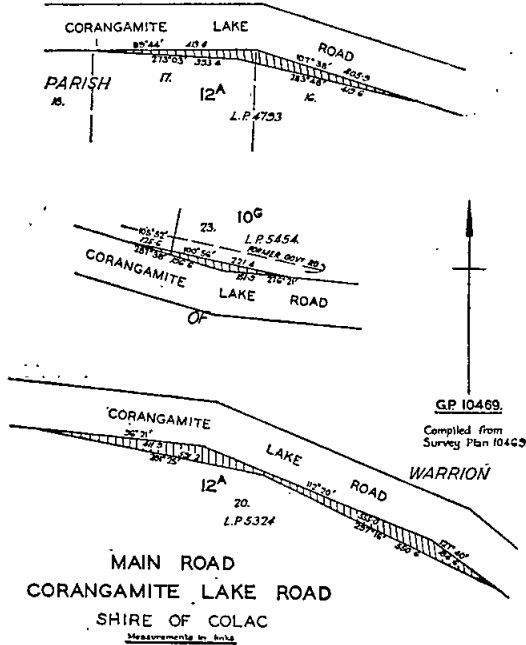

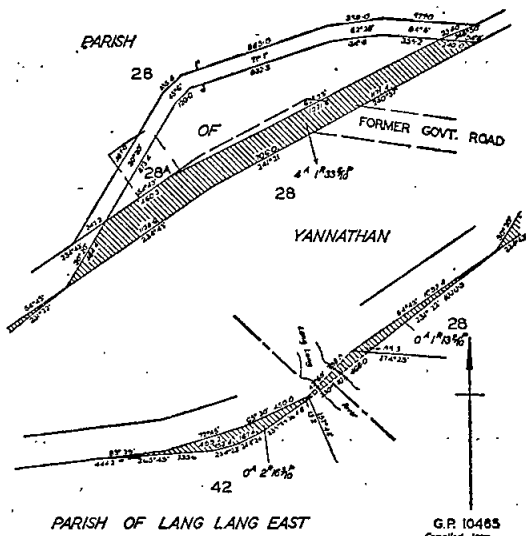

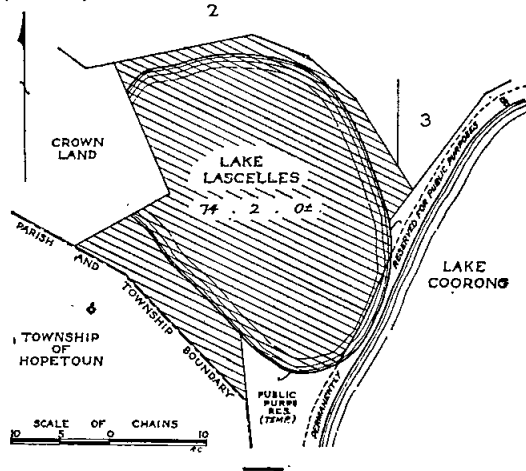

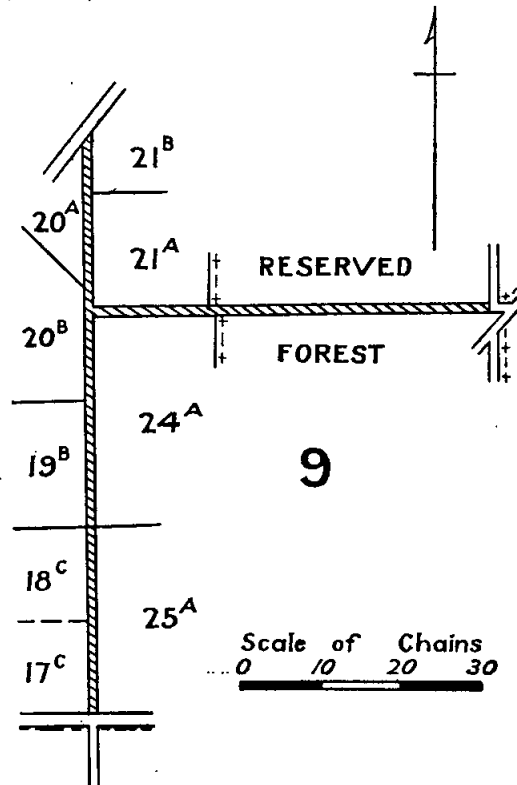

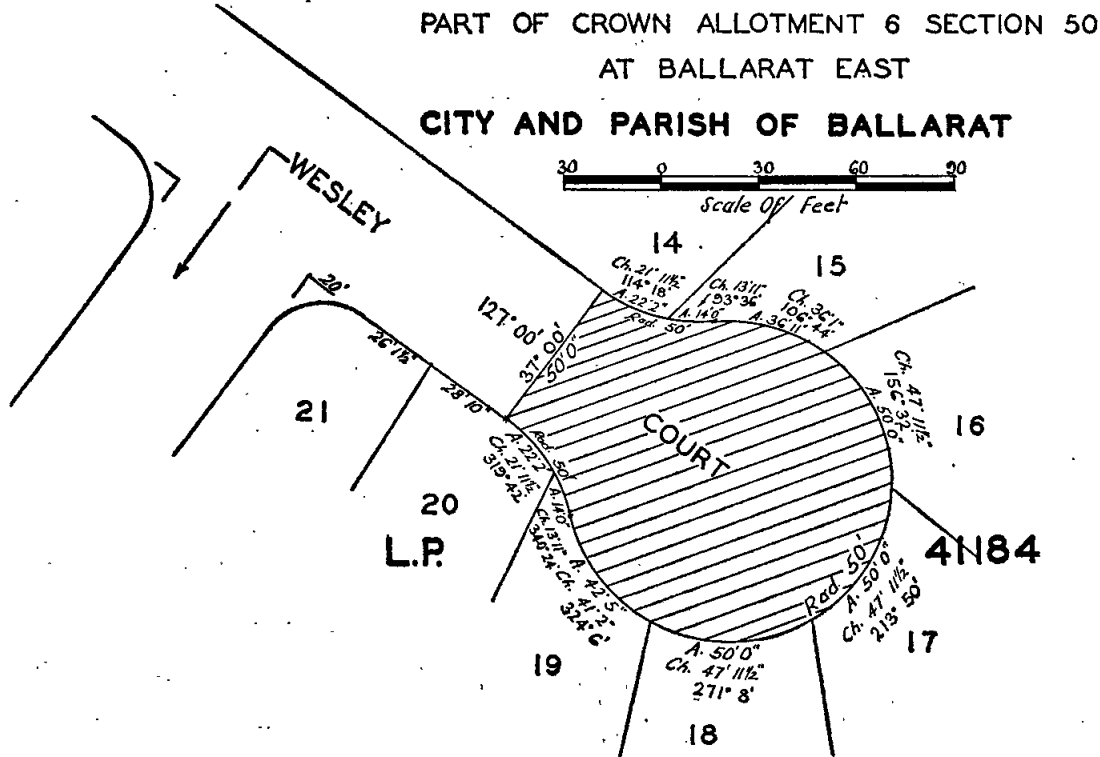

BY-LAW NO. 43.

A By-Law of the Borough of Eaglehawk made under the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 43 for requiring that any land in the municipal district which the Council by Notice in writing to the owner or occupier has declared to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood shall be enclosed with a sufficient fence of such material and in such manner as is prescribed by this By-Law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* The Mayor Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk Order as follows:—

1. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Council" means the Council of the Borough of Eaglehawk;
"Municipality" means the municipal district of the Borough of Eaglehawk.

2. Every owner or occupier of land within the municipality on being served with a notice in writing from Council declaring such land to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood shall enclose such land with a sufficient fence of such material and in such manner as is hereinafter prescribed within 28 days of the service of such notice.

3. It is hereby prescribed that every such fence shall be of the materials and constructed in the manner following:—

(i) Posts—5 in. by 3 in. posts soled and strutted two ways, spaced not more than 9 feet centres, with 3 in. by 2 in. sole plates 3 feet long and 3 in. by 2 in. struts sunk 2 feet into the ground, all of red gum, jarrah, pre-stressed concrete or steel.

(ii) Rails—top bottom and centre 3 in. by 2 in. hardwood;

(iii) Plinth—6 in. by 1 in. hardwood;

(iv) Palings—fence to be covered with half-inch sawn palings lapped 1 inch on each side cut straight to line at top and nailed to each rail;

(v) Height—not less than 6 feet 3 inches above ground level; and

(vi) General—on lands situated at the intersection of two streets, fence to be stepped back fifteen feet from the main street for a distance of thirty feet from the intersection of the building lines of such streets.

4. Should the owner or occupier of land on whom a Notice under this By-Law has been served fail to comply with such Notice the Council may forthwith cause to be erected a sufficient fence.

5. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$20 and not more than \$40 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10 for each day on which such offence is continued after conviction or Order is made by any Court AND in addition to such penalty any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of such wilful act or default or in the execution of work directed by this By-Law to be executed by such person and not executed by him shall be paid to the Council by such person so wilfully acting or defaulting.

6. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Eaglehawk.

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE

BY-LAW NO. 74.

A By-Law of the Shire of Bairnsdale made under Sections 762 and 781 of the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended and all other powers enabling it in that behalf and numbered 74 for the following purposes, namely:—

(a) For regulating the market place known as the Bairnsdale Municipal Sale Yards, and the buildings, stalls, pens and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto.

(b) For fixing the days and hours during each day of which the market shall be held.

(c) For fixing dues to be paid by persons selling cattle in the market, or in any yards licensed by the Council and outside such market.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

1. That the saleyards known as the Bairnsdale Municipal Saleyards (and hereinafter called the said saleyards), being all that piece of land containing 17 acres and 18 perches or thereabouts, being part of lots 12 and 13 on plan of subdivision No. 4102 lodged in the Office of Titles, and being part of Crown Pre-emptive Section A, Township and Parish of Bairnsdale, County of Tanjil, and being the land more particularly described in certificate of title, volume 3579, folio 715713, but exclusive of that portion bounded on the north by Rupert-street and mainly to the north and western sides of the saleyards, proper, and being approximately 10 acres in extent shall be a market in accordance with the provisions of the *Local Government Acts* (commenced as from 1st October, 1944), and shall be open daily on every lawful day from sunrise until sunset for the reception, delivery, and sale of cattle and other live stock.

2. Every auctioneer, which term includes a firm or incorporated company, exercising or conducting his, her, or its vocation or business within the said saleyards and its immediate approaches, shall be responsible for the payment to the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale of the sum of One hundred Dollars to be paid annually, in advance, on 1st October for the right to occupy one of the office premises provided by the Council.

3. Whenever two or more auctioneers intend selling on the same day, in the said saleyards, a draw shall take place on the day prior to the sale for the prior right of selection of pens and on the morning of the sale for determining the order of selling for the day by the respective auctioneers.

4. The said saleyards shall be open for the reception, delivery, and sale of pigs and calves on every alternate Monday, commencing from a date to be fixed by the Council and on every Thursday for the sale of all kinds of cattle excluding pigs and calves. Such days shall be called regular sale days.

5. Special sale days may be allotted on any day other than regular sale days, and any application for a special sale must be lodged in writing not less than fourteen days nor more than six months prior to the date of sale and be accompanied by the appropriate charges.

6. The times of commencing sales of the various classes of stock and of land sales shall be as mutually arranged between the auctioneers, or, in the event of any dispute, by the Council's authorized officer as provided in Clause 10 hereof.

7. The following limit of times shall be allowed each auctioneer to offer the various classes of stock:—

Fat sheep at the rate of a pen in 2 minutes.
 Fat cattle at the rate of a pen in 3 minutes.
 Dairy cattle at the rate of 3 minutes per head.
 Store sheep at the rate of a pen in 2 minutes.
 Fat pigs and store pigs at the rate of 200 per hour.
 Calves at the rate of a pen in 3 minutes.
 Horses at the rate of 5 minutes per head.

8. In case any auctioneer has not disposed of the whole of the cattle on his hands for sale at the expiration of the allotted time, the cattle in his hands not disposed of shall not be offered for auction until after all other similar stock that day in the saleyards for disposal by auction have been offered for sale, and the same order of selling shall be followed.

9. Any auctioneer not present and proceeding with his sale when his time arrives to commence selling shall besides being guilty of a breach of this By-Law forfeit his priority of right to sell and shall be placed at the foot of the list of auctioneers entitled to sell.

10. All disputes with reference to or affecting the time, order, and otherwise of conducting sales in the saleyards by the auctioneers shall be referred to the Inspector or other authorized officer appointed by the Council, whose decision shall be final.

11. There shall be appointed by the Council, if and when it deems necessary, an Inspector who shall be empowered to enforce the provisions of all Acts, By-Laws and Regulations governing the operation of the said saleyards.

12. Any person who shall refuse or neglect to comply with any lawful direction of the Council's authorized officer or any police constable, or obstruct, hinder, or resist such officer or police constable in the discharge of his duty in the said saleyards shall be guilty of an offence against this By-Law.

13. Any person or persons who shall obstruct the Council's authorized officer in the performance of his duty or wilfully obstruct lanes, entry gates or outlets, or shall wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, or premises of the saleyards shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty Dollars, and in addition thereto be required to make good at his or their own expense any such damage.

14. No stock offered for sale shall be permitted to remain within the saleyards area other than any portion set apart as holding paddocks beyond midday on the day following the day offered for sale.

15. No pig shall be placed in any yards within the saleyards other than the yards provided for the sale of pigs.

16. All stock brought to the saleyards and/or placed in the yards or pens thereof by the owner of such stock, or his agent, shall be at the sole risk of such owner, and neither the Council nor any employee of the Council shall in any circumstances incur any liability or responsibility therewith.

17. All horses for disposal by auction shall be paraded in the selling rotunda.

18. No stock which have been placed in any auctioneer's hands for sale shall be permitted to leave the saleyards without the authority of the auctioneer concerned.

19. The auctioneer in whose hands stock have been placed for sale is hereby authorized to demand and receive on behalf of the Council all dues which are payable under this By-Law, or any amendment in force for the time being, in respect of any such stock sold within the said saleyards or any other licensed saleyards within the municipal district of the Shire of Bairnsdale.

20. No person shall bring, cause, or allow any dog to enter or remain in the said saleyards area if forbidden to do so by the Council's authorized officer.

21. No person shall in any thoroughfare or avenue within the said saleyards or in the immediate approaches thereto give out or distribute handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers, or take up collections of money without the consent of the Council.

22. No person shall in or upon the said saleyards area make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance or sound, or play any musical or noisy instrument, or sing or harangue.

23. No person shall loiter or trespass in the said saleyards area, or climb or attempt to climb on any roof, stand, shop, stall, therein, or wilfully or carelessly break, injure, damage, destroy, or improperly interfere with any portion of such premises or fittings or erections therein.

24. No person shall place any produce, article, or thing whatsoever so as to obstruct any thoroughfare or avenue in or of the said saleyards, or neglect or refuse to remove the same on being required to do so by any duly authorized officer of the Council.

25. All dues and/or fees collected under the authority of clause 19 hereof shall be paid over to the Council not later than the seventh day of each month and shall be accompanied by returns in the form as supplied by the Council or each sale conducted in the said Saleyards or licensed yards within the Shire of Bairnsdale during the preceding month.

26. No person shall leave the carcass of any beast within the saleyards or any holding paddock attached thereto but on the payment in advance to the Council of a fee of Four Dollars in respect to a cattle carcass and Two Dollars in respect to the carcass of any sheep the Council will arrange for the disposal of any such carcass.

27. Any auctioneer operating in the saleyards may use the saleyards for drafting any cattle or sheep, which have been brought into the saleyards for sale by such auctioneer, up to one day prior to such stock being offered for sale or up to midday on the day following the sale of such stock.

28. Subject to making up to twenty four hours prior written application on official application form to the Council's authorized officer and the obtaining of such officer's approval and the payment in advance of a charge at the rate of Two Dollars fifty cents per hundred or part thereof for cattle and sixty cents per hundred or part thereof for sheep, any person by himself or his agent may use the said saleyards for the drafting of such cattle or sheep which are free of any notifiable disease, and which have not been immediately prior to the drafting thereof offered for sale in the said saleyards or are not to be offered for sale in the said saleyards within forty-eight hours of such drafting.

29. Any drafting of stock in the saleyards contrary to the provisions of Clauses 27 & 28 of this By-Law shall be deemed a breach of the By-Law.

30. Subject to an annual payment in advance of \$50 on the first day of October in each year the proprietor of any stock transport shall be empowered to use the holding paddocks adjacent to the saleyards proper for the purpose of unloading, adjusting loads and loading stock provided that any unloaded stock shall not be held in any holding paddock for a period of more than six hours from the time of unloading.

31. The word "cattle" in this By-Law shall include any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, foal and any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, and any ram, ewe, sheep, lamb, and any ass, mule goat or pig unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter.

32. The dues and charges payable by every person selling any cattle or land in the said saleyards or any licensed yards within the municipal district of the Shire of Bairnsdale and outside the said saleyards shall be as follows:—

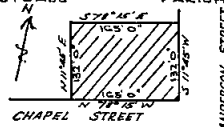
