

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, Section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge, square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the Local Government Act 1958, or a corresponding previous enactment, to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Heidelberg has

FISH CREEK WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1966; No. 1.

THE Fish Creek Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Fifteen cents in the dollar of the net annual valuation of the land and tenements liable to be rated in the Fish Creek Urban District.

ALAN J. HOLT, Secretary for Lands. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WIRRAWAY PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE," MOE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Moe and described in a notice published in the Gazette of the eighteenth day of May, 1966, were reserved as a site for Public Recreation: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holically amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One dollar may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
 - 2. No person shall-
 - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct;
 - (b) bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 3. No person shall without the consent of the Committee of Management damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

- (b) Any caravan complying with the conditions of the preceding sub-clause may be left standing on a highway for a period not exceeding 24 consecutive hours.
- 3. No person shall on any highway use a caravan for human habitation.
- 4. (a) No person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed more than one caravan on any private property without the consent, in writing, of the Council.
- (b) No person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed any caravan on any private property for a period exceeding fourteen (14) days (other than for the purpose of storing or parking such caravan) without the consent, in writing, of the Council.
- 5. (a) No person shall (unless upon any caravan or camping park site approved by the Council) use any caravan on private property for the purpose of human habitation or leave any caravan on private property or land so that the same could be used for human habitation without the written consent of the Council.
- (b) Every person applying for such consent shall make application, in writing, to the Council and supply such information as the Council may reasonably require.
- (c) The Council may grant or refuse its consent to the application as it sees fit.
- (d) If the Council grants its consent the permit to be issued as a result shall be—
 - (i) for a period not exceeding six (6) months;
 - (ii) absolutely conditional upon proper sanitation faci-lities to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector to the Council being at all times available for the use of the occupant or occupants.
- (e) In event of such sanitation facilities ceasing to be available, then any permit granted shall be immediately cancelled on service on the holder of such permit of notice under the signature of the Shire Secretary or Health Inspector that such facilities have ceased to be excelleble. available.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the Gazette Officer, Room 9, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the Gazette Officer.

2. Other matter.

- (a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.
- (b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.
- (c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or, at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.
- (d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.
