## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 2 of the Motor Boating Act 1961 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, may from time to time appoint an Authority in control over any Victorian waters:

AND WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Motor Boating Act 1961 the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part of parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Portland has been proclaimed the Authority over the waters of Bridgewater Lakes:


AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Portland has recommended that certain specified parts of the waters of Bridgewater Lakes be set aside for water-skiing and power boating activities during specified periods:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Boating Act 1961 do by this my Proclamation—

1 (a) set aside for water skiing and power boating activities between the hours of 11.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. that part of the Bridgewater main lake north of an imaginary line drawn between a beacon on the east shore and a beacon on the west shore approximately 56 chains north of the launching ramp.

(b) set aside for water skiing and power boating activities between sunrise and sunset that part of the Bridgewater main lake south of the imaginary line referred to in paragraph (a) and bounded at the southern end of the lake by an imaginary line bearing northerly from the launching ramp to a beacon on the opposite shore.

The areas specified in this Proclamation are those delineated on drawing No. B.L.A.1 in the Schedule hereto.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by Section 2 of the Motor Boating Act 1961 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, may from time to time appoint an Authority in control over any Victorian waters:

And whereas by Section 4 of the Motor Boating Act 1961 the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity. activity:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Portland has been proclaimed the Authority over those waters of the Glenelg River within the boundaries of the Shire of Portland:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Portland has recommended that the use of certain specified parts of the waters of the Glenelg River be set aside for water skiing and power boating activities during specified periods:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria. in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Boating Act 1961 do by this my Proclamation set aside between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. in the months of December, January and February, 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in the months of March, April and November, and 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. in the months of May to October inclusive the use of those parts of the waters of the Glenelg River specified hereunder for water skiing and power boating activities—

1 (a) From Simpson's Landing and being a point

1. (a) From Simpson's Landing and being a point approximately two and a half miles from the River Mouth upstream to the top of Taylor's Straight and being a distance of approximately one and a half miles; and

(b) From the beginning of the River straight near the Princess Margaret Rose Caves Lookout and being approximately nine miles from the River Mouth, upstream to a point opposite the south-east corner of Crown Allotment 1, Parish of Palpara.

2. The boundaries of the areas specified in paragraphs

1 (a) and (b) above shall be marked by beacons on each bank of the river.
