



MENTAL HEALTH ACT 1959 (No. 6605).

### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Proclamation of the Governor in Council made pursuant to the Lunacy Statute 1867 and dated the first day of October, 1867, all buildings on certain land in the Parish of Ararat were proclaimed as a mental hospital:

And whereas by the Mental Health Act 1959 (No. 6605) (hereinafter referred to as the said Act) it is amongst other things provided that unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter a mental hospital means a place proclaimed to be a mental hospital under any corresponding praying enactment. ponding previous enactment;

And whereas the Governor in Council may by Proclamation made pursuant to sub-section (2) of section 24 of the said Act vary or revoke any Proclamation of a mental hospital;

And whereas by sub-section (1) of the said section 24 it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may declare one or more buildings or places provided by the State for the treatment of the intellectually defective or any part of such building or place to be a training centre;

And whereas it is desired to proclaim as a training centre certain groups of buildings at present forming part of the mental hospital at Ararat and known as—

Wards M3, M4, M5, M12, M13 and M6—and to give to such groups of buildings, respectively, the names of Wards 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclama-

- (a) revoke the Proclamation constituting the Mental Hospital, Ararat, so far as it relates to the groups of buildings known as Wards M3, M4, M5, M12, M13 and M6;
- (b) proclaim the aforesaid groups of buildings, which will in future be known as Wards 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, to be a training centre to be known as the Training Centre, Ararat; and
- (c) declare that this Proclamation shall have effect on and from the 12th day of December, 1966.

# NOTICE OF INTENTION RESPECTING THE METHODS OF FISHING.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the Government Gazette to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation to—

- :- 1. Revoke the whole or portion of the Proclamations set out in the Schedule hereto, and
- 2. Prohibit the shooting of fish or the attempted shooting of fish or the use of any gun for the purpose of shooting at fish in any waters provided that a shark gun may be used for the purpose of killing sharks other than Port Jackson, Elephant, Gummy or Snapper or School Sharks.

For the purpose of the Proclamation "gun" includes a firearm or pistol of any description and any air-gun or other instrument from which any shot, bullet or other missile can be discharged but does not include, when used in marine waters, a spear gun as commonly used by underwater spear fishermen; and "shark gun" includes any instrument or device purchased, possessed or carried in accordance with a firearms certificate issued pursuant to the Firearms Act 1958, and which in accordance with the conditions of that certificate, may only be used for the killing or shooting of shark other than Port Jackson, Elephant, Gummy or Snapper Shark.

. 3. Prohibit the use of English Perch, Carp or Tench as bait by any person fishing in any of the following

Lake Purrumbete.

Lake Bullen Merri.

Lake Konongwootong.

Teddington Reservoir.

Eildon Reservoir or in any of the streams flowing into such Reservoir.

- 4. Prohibit the use of Tench or Carp as bait by any person fishing in Fyans Lake.
- .5. (a) Prohibit the use of trout or salmon eggs either on fish hooks or broadcast as ground bait or lure or in any other manner as bait in fishing.
- (b) Prohibit the use of any lure made from plastic or rubber or any other material to resemble trout or salmon eggs either singly or in clusters in fishing.
- 6. Prohibit all methods of fishing other than with the artificial fly in that portion of the Kiewa River between the crossing over the said river at Sullivans-lane at Tawonga and the bridge over the said river at Ryders-lane near Tawonga.
- 7. Prohibit the use of "jiggers" or "jaggers" in fishing, or the use of any device or contrivance whatsoever to jig or jag fish other than to take squid or English Perch.
  - 8. Prohibit the tickling or attempted tickling of fish in any waters.
- 9. (a) Prohibit fishing or the taking of fish by any method or in any manner except as set out in sub-paragraph (b) hereunder from inland waters or from any of the under-mentioned waters— Top Lake at Mallacoota.

The waters known as "The Narrows" which connects with the Bottom and Lower Lakes at Mallacoota.

Sydenham Inlet.

Swan Lake.

Wingan Inlet.

Swan Bay (off Port Phillip Bay).

North Arm of the Gippsland Lakes.

The waters of the Gippsland Lakes in which the use of nets is or may be hereafter prohibited during the whole year.

- (b) (i) by rod and line or hand line with not more than two hooks attached provided that the hooks forming part of each spinner spoon flash or other artificial bait shall be considered as one hook; or
  - (ii) by the use of net when used in accordance with the provisions of the Fisheries Act.
- 10. Prohibit any person using at the same time more than two lines whether attached to rods or not for the purpose of fishing in or taking fish from any inland waters or any of the other waters mentioned in the last preceding paragraph.
- 11. Prohibit angling for trout in the waters of the Hume Reservoir which lie in Victoria by any method or in any manner except by holding the rod or line in the hand.
  - 12. Save as otherwise provided herein-

Prohibit fishing or the taking of fish by any method or in any manner from any marine waters in which the use of nets is permitted during any period of the year except—

- the use of nets is permitted during any period of the year except—

  (a) by rod and line or hand line or a spear propelled by a spring, rubber in any form, mechanism of any kind or used with a bow;

  (b) by a hand propelled spear which except as stated in "(c)" hereafter, shall have not more than two prongs each of which shall be without barbs of any type;

  (c) by a hand propelled multi-pronged spear with one barb to each prong or by a spear fitted with a harpoon head with floppers. Each of which type of spear shall be used only by a holder of a professional fishing licence;

  (d) by the use of nets, fixed engines or long lines by the holder of a fishing licence during any period in which the use of any such nets, fixed engines or long lines is permitted in any such marine waters.
- 13. Prohibit the use of a spear or similar device for the purpose of fishing in the waters of Tamboon Inlet, Lake Tyers including the Nowa Nowa and Toorloo Arms off such Lake or within 100 feet of any pier or jetty.
- 14. Prohibit fishing by means of a spear or similar device, or using a light in conjunction with a hand or dip net or contrivance, other than seine or mesh fishing nets or long lines, for fishing during the whole of each year in all the waters northerly and westerly of an imaginary line bearing north 36 degrees east (magnetic) from the south end of Rabbit Island to the eastern bank of the entrance to Shoal or Shallow Inlet, near St. Margaret's or McCrae Island, including the waters of Corner Inlet, Port Albert, Corner Basin, and Shoal or Shallow Inlet, provided that this prohibition shall not apply to any of the said waters north of a line running north-easterly from the south-east corner of allotment 9B, Parish of Tarra Tarra, to the south-west corner of allotment 52B; Parish of Balloong.

15. Prohibit any person fishing from any boat within an area marked by two boundary posts fixed 205 yards apart on the shore of Lake Purrumbete known as "Hose's Rock Barrier"; thence by a line seaward from such boundary posts for a distance of 100 yards such extremity being marked by three buoys.

For the purposes of this notice-

"Inland Waters" shall have the same meaning as the interpretation of those words set out in section 15 of the Fisheries Act.

"Marine Waters" shall include any part of the sea within a distance of 3 miles from any part of the coast of Victoria and any bay and any estuary or inlet of the sea not being inland waters.

#### REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Cemeteries Act 1958, the Trustees of the Maryknoll Public Cemetery make the following Regulations, and, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following Scale of Fees:—

#### · Part I.—General.

- 1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-
  - "Cemetery" means the Maryknoll Public Cemetery. \_ "Trustees" means the Trustees of the Maryknoll Public Cemetery.
- 2. The Officer in charge shall exercise general super vision and control over the cemetery and be responsible to the Trustees for its administration.
- 3. A person who carries out work within the cemetery, whether or not he is carrying out the work for the Trustees, shall carry out the work in as short a time as is possible, and shall obey directions given to him by the Officer in charge relating to the carrying out of the work, or to any other matter arising out of the carrying out of
- 4. When a person proposes digging or making a grave in the cemetery he shall produce the document evidencing the permission of the Trustees for such work to the Officer. in charge before commencing the work or bringing material or equipment into the Cemetery.

#### Part II.-Memorial Work.

- 5. The cemetery shall be a lawn cemetery in which there shall be no memorial other than a standard bronze plaque set flush with the lawn and as supplied by the Trustees.
- 6. No trees or plants shall be planted in the cemetery unless their planting is approved by the Trustees and the trees and plants are planted in accordance with the terms of the approval.

#### Part III.-Interments.

- 7. An application for a permit to bury a corpse shall be made at least eight working hours before the time appointed for burial, and shall be made in the form contained in Schedule B. to these Regulations.
- 8. The Trustees shall divide the burial ground into sections and graves and shall cause a plan to be made showing the sections and graves and shall certify the plan when made. The plan shall be kept in the office of the Officer in charge.
- 9. The Trustees shall cause a register to be kept in y, the trustees shall cause a register to be kept in which shall be entered the name and former address of every person whose body is interred in the burial ground and the section and number of the grave in which the interment has been made, and the date of interment; the entries shall be made as soon as possible after each
- 10. Each single grave allotment shall be 8 feet long and
- 11. No person shall cause or allow any animal or vehicle other than a hearse) to pass along a road or path in the cemetery, nor put any animal or animals for the purpose of grazing within the cemetery, nor wilfully damage or destroy any flowers or shrubs or other items within the cemetery. cemetery.

  - (i) the balance at 30th June, 1966, in the Water Supply Works Depreciation Account in respect of the Carrum Drainage District (estimated at \$9,400) in the books of the Commission, and (ii) the accumulated cash surplus in the cash account of the Carrum Drainage District (estimated at \$26,000) at 30th June, 1966; and

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE MUD ISLAND STATE FAUNAL RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958, the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands situate in Port Phillip Bay temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 12th January, 1872, as sites for Public purposes: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore, I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the improvement and management of wildlife habitat and for the control of the public within the Reserve.

- 2. Without the consent, in writing, of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers no person shall—
  - (a) Interfere with the flow or any water into, out of, or within the Reserve nor remove water from the Reserve by any method whether natural or artificial.
  - (b) Interfere with or remove or damage or destroy any tracks, signs, buildings, water control structures, earthen banks, wildlife shelter belts or any improvements or structures within the Reserve.
  - (c) Carry any poison, traps, or snares within the Reserve.
  - (d) Poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird, other animal, or nest, or take away any skin, egg, feathers, or nests or part thereof, in or from the Reserve.
  - (e) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind within the Reserve.
  - (f) Light or maintain any fire within the Reserve except in a properly constructed fire-place which is more than 25 feet from the nearest dead timber or standing tree, and with the surrounds cleared of all inflammable material for at least 10 feet in any direction. Further no person shall leave such fire unattended, without completely extinguishing it.
  - (g) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
  - (h) Deposit any rubbish, debris or material of any kind on the Reserve.
  - (i) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve. Any dog shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958 found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
  - (j) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, shoot at, or kill, or injure any animal, bird or other wildlife.
  - (k) Use within the Reserve any motor boat or powered water craft having an engine.
  - (1) Deposit on the Reserve or construct within the Reserve any fence, shed, structure or equipment. Any fence, shed, structure or other equipment located within the Reserve without permission will be dismantled and removed from the Reserve.
  - (m) Camp within the Reserve or light or maintain any fire therein.
  - (n) Enter upon, walk through or otherwise interfere with breeding rookeries on the Reserve, which breeding areas being defined by posts around the boundaries of the breeding area.

These Regulations are made in lieu of all previous regulations in respect of the said land which are hereby revoked.—(Rs. 7833.)
