**DECIMAL CURRENCY (LABOUR AND INDUSTRY)

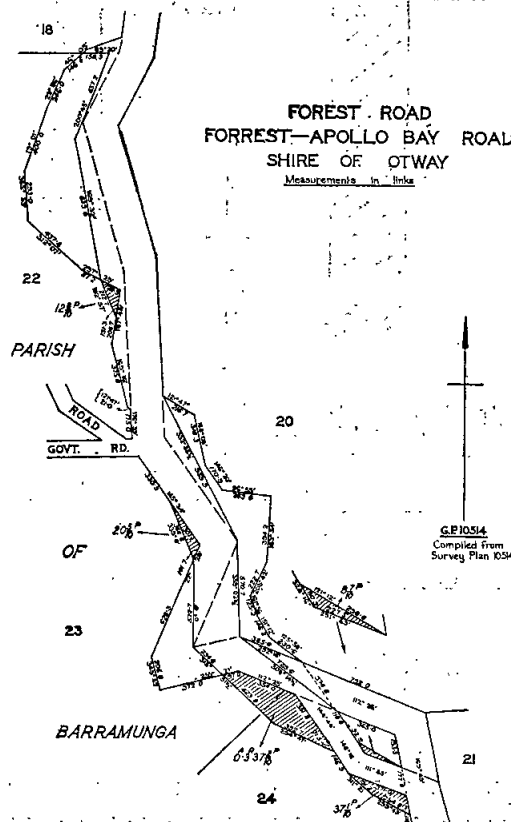

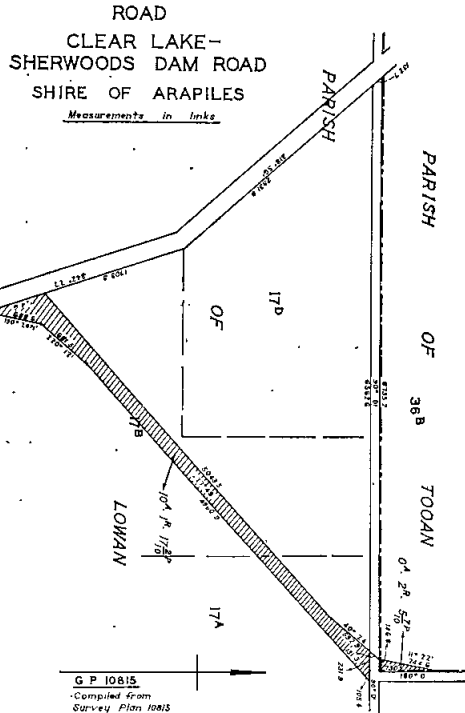
