

IN accordance with the provisions of section 4A of the Milk Board Act 1958, the Milk Board hereby exempts from the provisions of the said Act all milk intended for use by S. N. Stamoulis in the manufacture of yoghurt at his dairy premises, at 20 Cozens-street, Brunswick, until 30th June, 1969, subject to the following conditions:—

- 1. Such milk shall be purchased from an authorized depot agent of the Milk Board.
- 2. S. N. Stamoulis shall lodge with the Board, not later than the tenth day of the months of January, April, July and October, a return setting out the following information in respect of milk so purchased during each of the three preceding calendar months:—
 - (i) Depot agent or agents from whom supply was obtained;
 - (ii) quantity;
 - (iii) price or prices paid;
 - (iv) method of transport;

and shall certify on such return that all of the milk so purchased was used in the manufacture of yoghurt.



CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

REGULATION No. 14.

Libraries.

A Regulation of the City of Camberwell, numbered 14, made under section 2 of Part IV. of the Fifteenth Schedule to the Local Government Act 1958, in force in the City by virtue of a By-Law of the City of Camberwell numbered 89, for the proper management and control of public libraries belonging to the municipality of the City of Camberwell, or under the control or management of the Council thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Camberwell make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district:—

Repeal.—Regulation No. 12 of the City of Camberwell made by the Council on the 2nd October, 1961, is hereby repealed.

- 1. Definition.—In these Regulations, unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires:

 (a) "Librarian" includes the person appointed by the City of Camberwell City Council for the time being in charge of the library generally, or any portion or section thereof:

- (b) "Ratepayer" is any person who is an owner, lessee, or occupier of any rateable property within the City of Camberwell and is liable to pay rates on same.
- 2. Use of Library.
 - (a) Services of the Library on the premises will be available to everyone irrespective of residential qualifications in accordance with the Free Library Service Act.
 - (b) No person shall without the Librarian's permission use the Library for any other purpose than reading, consulting or borrowing the books of the Library.
- 3. Reading in the Library.—Any person wishing to use the Library may be required:
 - (i) To register himself by completing a written form which shall state his name, address, and such other particulars as may be specified therein. Such form shall be prescribed by the Council, and a copy thereof shall be displayed in the Library.
 - (ii) To accept a card, ticket, or token to be presented or surrendered as a condition of entry into the Library for the use of any book.
 - (iii) To make written application for any book for which the Librarian may require written application.
- 4. Hours of Opening.—The Library will be open to all borrowers in the various sections at such times as the Council may determine from time to time.
- 5. Membership.—Subject to the approval of the Librarian, any person in the following categories is entitled to borrow books for perusal:—
 - (a) Adult
 - ratepayers (see definition) of the City of Camberwell irrespective of where they live; and any members of his immediate family residing at the same address: residents of the City of Camberwell who are not ratepayers, if guaranteed by a ratepayer of this City;

 - or this City;
 non-residents who are employed within the
 municipality provided they are guaranteed
 by a ratepayer of Camberwell. For
 teachers employed within the City of Cam
 berwell, the Teacher's application form

Period of Loan.—No books shall be deemed to have been returned to the Library unless it has been handed to the Librarian or left in a place or receptacle in the Library designated for the return of books, or despatched to the Library in a manner and by means previously approved by the Librarian:—
 - (a) The time within which any book shall be returned to the Library by any registered borrower of the Library shall be fourteen days. Sundays and holidays included, from the date of the borrowing of the said book. Provided that where the last day for the return of the book is a public holiday or any other day on which the Library is closed, the book may without charge be returned on the first day thereafter on which the Library is open.
 - (b) (i) Books which have been bespoken by another borrower shall be loaned for a period of fourteen days only after which overdue charges may be levied.

 - (g) Interfere in any way with the comfort and convenience of other persons using the Library.
 - (h) Use offensive or obscene language in the Library.
 - (i) Make disturbing noises in the Library by speech or otherwise.
 - (j) Deface, mutilate, or mark by cutting or tearing or by writing or by improper folding or otherwise any part of the book belonging to the Library.

- 13. Name and address.—Notwithstanding any other provision of these Regulations, any person who is in the Library shall give his name and address to the Librarian on being requested by the Librarian so to do.

14. Penalty.—Any person who commits an offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Dollars in addition to the provisions under clauses 9 (d); 10 (a) and 10 (b).

(c) Prescribing areas in which off street accommodation for stationary vehicles in accordance with a schedule to this bylaw shall be provided.

(1) This Bylaw may be known as the Flats Bylaw.

(3) The whole of the municipal district of the City of Essendon is hereby prescribed as an area in which buildings of class II. and class III. occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than two storeys.

(4) The whole of the municipal district of the City of Essendon is hereby prescribed as an area of land in which a building or buildings of class II. occupancy on any one site shall contain in the aggregate not more than six flats.

(5) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of class II. or class III. occupancy from frontage is hereby specified as thirty feet.

(6) The whole of the municipal district of the City of Essendon is hereby prescribed as an area in which off street accommodation for stationary vehicles in accordance with the schedule hereto shall be provided in or within fifty feet of every flat building hereafter constructed within such area.

- (7) No person shall construct any building or buildings contrary to or not in conformity with the provisions of this bylaw.
- (8) This Bylaw shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

The Schedule hereinbefore referred to:

- (A) In respect of every building of class II. occupancy there shall be provided for off street accommodation for stationary vehicles an area of one hundred and forty square feet for each flat. No part of any such area shall be between the frontage of the site and the outer wall of any building of class II occupancy on such site nearest to the frontage thereof.
- (B) Save where access to a car space is obtained directly from a street or road, an access lane or lanes of sufficient dimensions shall be provided.
- (C) Where entrance to a car space is obtained from the side, the combined width of the car space and the access lane shall not be less than 15 feet. Where access is obtained as aforesaid if the combined width of the car space and the access lane is not more than 16 feet, the length of the car space shall be not less than 24 feet; if such combined width is more than 16 feet but less than 17 feet, the length of the car space shall be not less than 22 feet. the length of the car space shall be not less than 22 feet and if such combined width is more than 17 feet, the length of the car space shall be not less than 20 feet.
- (D) Where entrance to a car space is from an end and such car space is at right angles to the access lane, the length of the car space shall be not less than 16 feet 6 inches and the width of the access lane shall not be less than 20 feet.
- (E) Where entrance to the car space is from an end and such car space is at an angle of 45 degrees to the access lane, the length of the car space shall be not less than 16 feet 6 inches and the width of the access lane shall be not less than 12 feet.
