WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Poisons Act 1962 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette amend any of Schedules One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven or Eight to such Act by adding to any such Schedules or removing thereform any item:

NOW THEREFORE, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, by virtue of the provisions of the said Section and all other enabling powers, do by this Proclamation—

1. Amend Schedule One to the said Act by removing therefrom the following items:-

ATROPINE and substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of the organic base.

HYOSCINE and substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of Hyoscine.

and by adding thereto the following items:-

ATROPINE and substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of the organic base except Atropine Methonitrate.

HYOSCINE and substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of Hyoscine except Hyoscine N-butyl-Bromide.

2. Amend Schedule Two to the said Act by removing therefrom the following items:-

ATROPINE in substances containing 0.25 per centum or less of Atropine.

HYOSCINE in substances containing 0.25 per centum or less of Hyoscine.

ZINC PYRIDINETHIONE

and by adding thereto the following items:-

ATROPINE in substances containing 0.25 per centum or less of Atropine except Atropine Methonitrate. HYOSCINE and its derivatives in substances containing 0.25 per centum or less of Hyoscine and its derivatives except Hyoscine N-butyl-Bromide. ZINC PYRIDINETHIONE in substances containing more than 2 per centum of Zinc Pyridinethione.

3. Amend Schedule Three to the said Act by deleting therefrom the following item:-

CHINIOFON and other derivatives of 7-Iodo-8-Hydroxy-quinoline and their salts.

and by adding thereto the following items:-

CHINIOFON and other derivatives of 7-Iodo-8-Hydroxyquinoline and their salts, except when included in Schedule Six.

DICYCLOMINE in preparations containing 0.1 per centum or less of Dicyclomine.

PROPANTHELINE BROMIDE in preparations for

ANTICHOLINERGIC SUBSTANCES, including Dicyclomine, Methantheline, Oxyphenonium and Diphemanil Methylsulphate, except Diphemanil Methylsulphate for topical use.


PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time, upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, or a corresponding previous enactment, to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Ringwood has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, used for a street, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that the land shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.





 The following charges will be borne separately by the Government:—
 - (α) cost of conveyance to and from the overseas locality, and cost of conveyance on official business at that locality;
 - (b) insurance premium on essential personal effects carried by the member of a value not exceeding \$400;

- (c) charges for official telephone calls made at the overseas locality;
- (d) charges for necessary health examinations, inoculations and vac-
- (e) fees for necessary passports and visas;
- (f) compulsory entry or exit fees, or imposts, of overseas authorities or governments.
- (3) Where the travelling allowance rate is determined as "all-inclusive", all costs for accommodation, meal charges, service charges and incidental expenses are to be met by the member from it.
- (4) Where the travelling allowance rate is determined as "the cost of accommodation and meals plus an amount specified for incidentals" or "the cost of accommodation plus an amount specified for meals and incidentals" the Government will meet the cost of accommodation plus any COMPULSORY service charge levied by the hotel. If the service charge is not compulsory it will not be paid by the Government.
- (5) Where the full daily rate is not involved (e.g. on days of arrival or departure), payment should be made on a pro rata basis, having regard to the time of arrival or departure.

AMENDMENT OF CONSTITUTION.

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers

conferred upon him by the Water Act and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby order that the persons holding office as Commissioners of the said Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust shall cease to hold office as such Commissioners on the thirty-first day of May, 1967, and shall be succeeded by six Commissioners elected by the ratepayers of the said Trust and one Commissioner appointed by the Governor in Council.

And further that one-third of the Commissioners elected by the ratepayers shall retire and be elected annually and the Commissioners who shall so retire shall be those who have held office for the longest term without re-election and if by reason of two or more Commissioners having become Commissioners at the same time it is not apparent which of such last-mentioned Commissioners ought at any time to go out of office then such Commissioners as to whom it is not apparent shall go out of office in the order of the number of votes obtained by each at his election commencing with the smallest number and proceeding upwards and in all such cases if the votes given for any Commissioners of whom a number less than the whole are-to go out of office at any one time have been equal or if such Commissioners have been elected without a poll the Trust fourteen days at least previously to the day appointed for the going out of office and in the Trust's default the Governor in Council shall for such occasion determine in what order and which of such Commissioners shall go out of office.

Provided that the Commissioners who shall first retire shall so retire on the day of the regular election in the year One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT No. 117.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Teaching Service Act 1958, hereby rescinds Regulation 9 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations and substitutes therefor the following Regulation:—

REGULATION 9.

Qualifications of Teachers in the Technical Schools Division.

The qualifications required for the promotion or appointment (as the case may be) of teachers in the several classes in the Technical Schools Division shall be those prescribed hereunder, or approved equivalent or higher qualifications:—

- 1. Special Class or Class I.-
 - (a) Principal or Vice-Principal-

The academic or technical qualifications prescribed for Class I. teaching positions together with a sound knowledge of the principles and problems of vocational education and of industrial requirements and at least four years' experience in charge of a technical school or technical school department.

The academic or technical qualifications prescribed for Class I. teaching positions together with at least four years' teaching and organizing experience in a technical school.

(c) Teaching Positions (Technical) -

- (i) An approved University degree;
- (ii) The Art Teacher's Certificate;
- (iii) An approved technical college diploma;
- (iv) An approved fourth year of study.
- (d) Teaching Positions (Technician and Trade) -

- (b) The literary qualifications for any class shall be held to include that of each lower class.
- (c) If the Committee of Classifiers for the Technical Schools Division reports that certificates gained from any other approved examining body, whether in Victoria or elsewhere, are of at least equal value to any of the certificates mentioned in this Regulation, the Tribunal, after consultation with the Director-General, may order that any teacher possessing such certificates be recorded as possessing such qualifications under this Regulation as it deems a fair equivalent.
- (d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulation, the Committee of Classifiers for the Technical Schools Division may promote to any class a teacher who has had at least 25 years of approved service with the Education Department of Victoria and has the qualifications prescribed for a similar position in Class IV.; provided that such teacher has an outstanding record of service and that the Committee of Classifiers for the Technical Schools Division or the Tribunal is satisfied that he is capable of carrying out the duties of the higher position.
- (e) Notwithstanding anything contained in clauses 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, the Committee of Classifiers for the Technical Schools Division may appoint to Class I. any teacher who, on the 1st day of January, 1951, was academically qualified for promotion to Class II. and who has been continuously employed in the Education Department of Victoria since the 1st day of January, 1928, provided that such teacher has the assessment mark required for promotion and the Committee of Classifiers or the

Tribunal is satisfied that he is capable of carrying out the duties of the higher position and provided further that not more than 20 per cent. of those teachers promoted in any one calendar year shall be promoted under this sub-clause.

- (i) In this Regulation, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, "approved" means approved by the Tribunal after consultation with the Director-General.
- 7. First Appointments of Applicants from Outside the Teaching Service.—

Applicants who receive a first appointment to any class from outside the teaching service shall be required to hold the qualifications prescribed in clauses 1, 2, 3 and 4 for the particular class and position, but in lieu of the prescribed service in a lower class they shall be required to furnish evidence that they possess satisfactory teaching and organizing ability.

- 3. Prescribes times when the Abattoirs shall be open for slaughtering receiving and removing carcases from the chiller, and receiving animals intended for slaughter.
- Persons who pay fees and dues prescribed, to be entitled to use such portion of Abattoirs as is available.
- Details of the number and description of all stock brought to the Abattoirs to be kept and such other details as required by any other regulation or Act.
- 6. Slaughtering compartments to be cleansed, offal to be hung up and other refuse to be removed.
- 7. Swine not to be received unless intended for immediate slaughter.
- 8. Council not to be responsible for loss of carcase, or offal, and death or escape of animals not arising from the neglect or default of its officers or servants.
- 9. Council to have lien on all stock, carcases, skins, etc., of any person indebted to the Council, and may sell same if person defaults for seven days in payment of any fees due by him. The balance of funds after deduction of costs to be paid to such person.
 - 10. All stock to be inspected before and after slaughter.
- 11. No person shall remove any carcase from the Abattoirs until same has been examined by a meat inspector, and branded by him. All diseased carcases to be set aside to the place provided.
- 12. Meat inspector shall have power to cut into any carcase he suspects as diseased.
- 13. Slaughtermen to sign the Register of Slaughtermen before commencing work and also sign an undertaking to observe and obey rules of Abattoirs.
- 14. Slaughtermen to wear clean clothes and report diseased animals to meat inspectors.
- 15. Slaughtermen not to mix healthy and diseased rgans or detach head of lamb before inspected and passed as lamb.
- 16. Regulates and prohibits smoking, dressing of car-cases, use of fittings, eating of meals, etc. at the Abattoirs.

17. Persons bringing animals to the Abattoirs shall not ill-treat same and shall provide same with food and water

- A By-law of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 52 for prescribing residential and business areas and for other purposes.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and of any and every other Act or power it thereunto enabling the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh order as follows:
- 1. By-law No. 43, By-law No. 46 and By-law No. 49 of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, for prescribing residential and business areas and for other purposes, are hereby repealed.
- 2. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "Extractive industry" means and includes mining and quarrying and the extraction from any land and the treatment thereon of sand, gravel, clay, turf, soil, rock, stone or similar substances.

 - turf, soil, rock, stone or similar substances.

 "Rural industry" means and includes the businesses or industries of grazing, dairying, pig farming, poultry farming, bee keeping, viticulture, horticulture, fruit growing, vegetable growing, or the growing of crops of any kind, but does not include the sale of any goods or chattels by retail.

 "Rural industry dwelling" means any dwelling erected on land used for the purposes of a rural industry, an extractive industry, or the milling of timber, but only if such dwelling is used solely for occupation by the owner of the industry carried on on such land or by employees employed by him in connection with such industry.

 The grees described in the First and Second Schedules.
- 3. The areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto are hereby prescribed as residential areas.
- 4. No person shall, in any such residential areas as are described in the First Schedule hereto, use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement other than a rural industry. For the purposes of this clause the term "rural industry" shall not include pig farming.
- 5. No person shall in any such residential area as is described in the Second Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of any extractive industry or for pig farming or milling timber.
- 6. The areas described in the Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Schedules hereto are hereby prescribed as business areas.
- 7. No person shall within any such business areas as are described in the Third Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building or portion of a building for the purposes of any extractive industry or of the trades or businesses of pig farming or milling timber.
- person shall within any such business area as is described in the Fourth Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building or portion of a building for the purposes of a dwelling or for the purposes of any extractive industry, or for the purposes of retail trade or business.

- 9. No person shall within any such business areas as are described in the Fifth Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use any building or portion of a building for the purpose of a dwelling or for the purpose of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business or public amusement other than for the purposes of retail trade or business or for a dwelling used solely for occupation by the current of such retail trade or business or so by tion by the owner of such retail trade or business or by employees employed by him in connection with such trade or business
- 10. No person shall within any such business areas as are described in the Sixth Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use any building or portion of a building for the purposes of an extractive industry or of retail trade or business or of the trades or businesses of pig farming or milling timber.
- 11. No person shall within any such business area as is described in the Seventh Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building or portion of a building for the purposes of a dwelling (other than a rural industry dwelling) or for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business or public amusement other than a rural industry, an extractive industry or a trade or business of milling timber. Provided always that nothing in this clause contained shall preclude any person who is carrying on a rural industry on land from selling by retail any of the produce of such industry from any building erected on such land if such building is situated at a distance of not less than 100 feet from any street or road. 11. No person shall within any such business area as is street or road.
- 12. No person shall on, from, or after the 1st day of December, 1959-
 - (a) erect or use on any land within the municipal district of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh any tent or other temporary structure or building for the sale of goods therein or therefrom; or
 - (b) sell any goods in or from any such tent, structure or building.

No person shall sell any goods from any stall, motor car, truck, barrow, or any other vehicle, box, basket, crate, bag, or other receptacle standing or placed on vacant land (not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the municipality or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the Public Offences Act 1928) within the municipal district of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.
