AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 4 and 6 of the classes mentioned in Section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 23, sub-section (1), of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372), the Soil Conservation Authority after Consultation with the Land Utilization Advisory Council has determined the land-use for all that area of land in the Parishes of Murrungowar and Jirrah within the boundaries of the Rocky River Water Supply Catchment delineated and marked on Plan No. 1988, the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority. All land within this area shall be used in accordance with the provisions of the particular category of land-use to which each area has been assigned. The boundaries of land-use areas shown on Plan No. 1988 are intended, as a guide to landholders, who should consult with the Soil Conservation Authority before making any changes in land-use.

The provisions of each of the land-use categories are set out hereunder:—

Category No. 1.

Land which shall be used primarily for the protection of streams and watercourses where:—

- (a) no cropping shall be practised;
- (b) cultivation may be approved only for specific pasture improvement or weed and vermin control purposes;
- (c) no tree shall be removed or soil be disturbed without the approval of the Soil Conservation Authority; and
- (d) the crossing of streams and watercourses is permitted only by means of properly constructed crossings specifically approved for the particular site by the Soil Conservation Authority.

This category covers areas within a five-chain radius of the offtake weir and within a distance of one, one and one-half or two chains from the edge of the banks of streams and water-courses as specified on Plan No. 1988.

The Authority may specify variations of these distances in cases where the quality of the water becomes adversely affected or following approved changes in land-use or management practices.

Category No. 2.

Land which shall be used for permanent forest for catchment conservation purposes where forestry operation shall be carried out only in accordance with management conditions made or approved by the Soil Conservation Authority. The construction of roads, dams or earthworks of any description are subject to the approval of the Soil Conservation Authority.

Category No. 3.

Land which may be used for forest purposes or which may be developed partly for grazing or agricultural purposes, subject to Authority approval and conditions for particular circumstances, such conditions to include:—

- (a) the specification of areas which may be cleared and those which shall remain under forest;
- (b) the specification of the acreage which may be cleared in any one year;
- (c) the specification of areas where cropping may be practised and areas where grazing only may be practised;
- (d) the application of management and conservation practices where necessary.

Category No. 4.

Land which shall be used primarily for grazing where any changes in land-use shall be subject to approval by the Soil Conservation Authority.

Category No. 5.

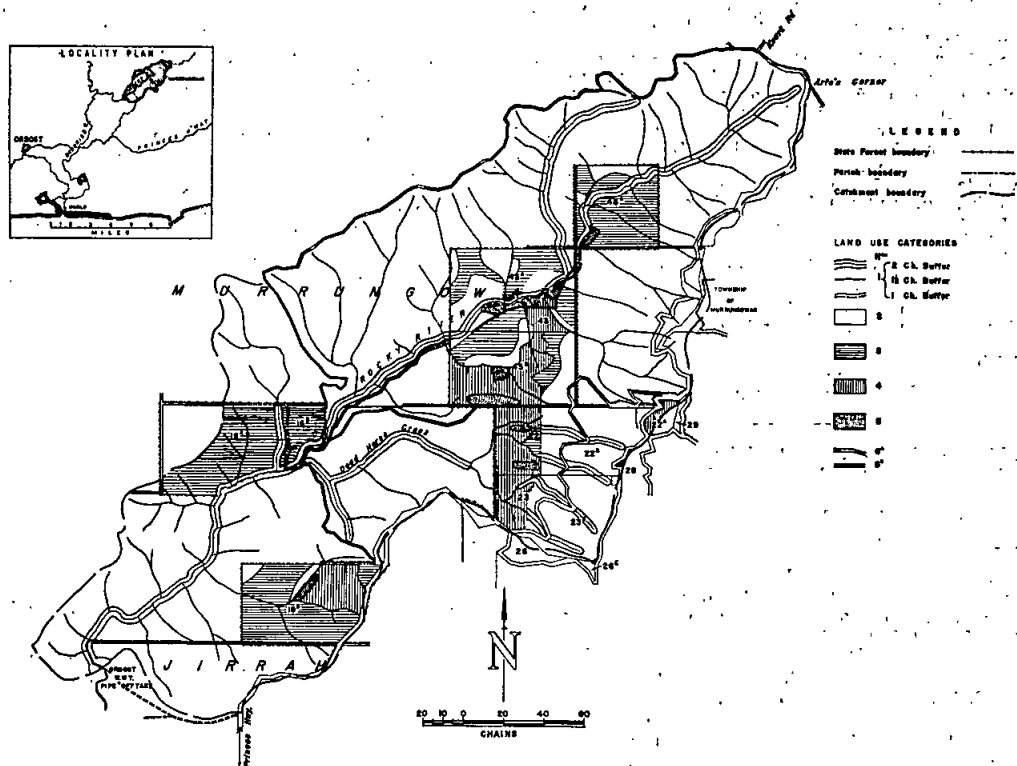
Land suitable for cropping, subject to conditions imposed by the Authority for particular circumstances.

Category No. 6.

6A. Land used or reserved for roads on which any changes in land-use shall be made only after consultation with the Soil Conservation Authority.

6B. Land reserved for roads or other public purposes on which any changes in land-use shall be made only with the approval of the Soil Conservation Authority.

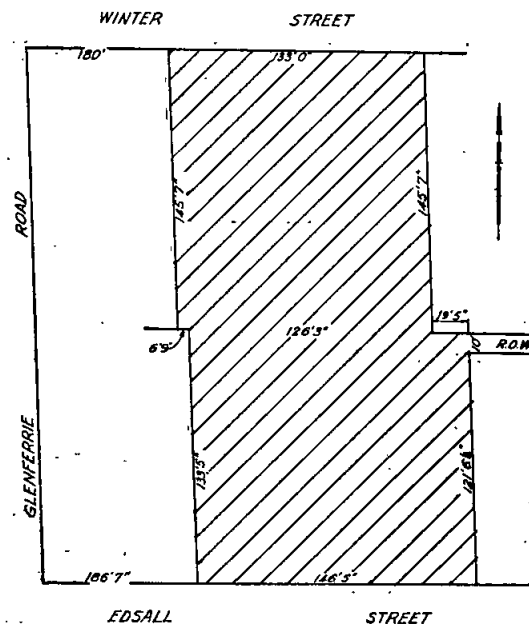

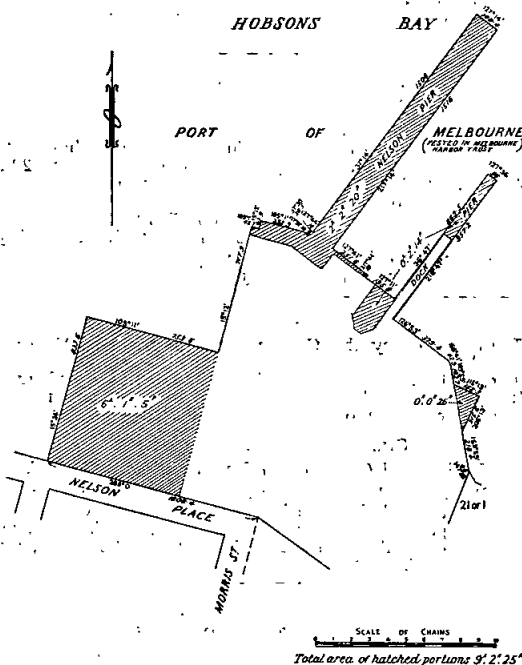

1. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the subject matter:—

“Attendant” means any person by authority of the Council performing any duties on or in connexion with the Swimming Pool premises.

“Pool Superintendant” means any person by the authority of the Council for the time being in charge or control of the swimming pool premises and of any attendant.

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Birchip.

“Pool” means any pool or body of water provided on the swimming pool premises for the use of swimmers, including any wading or diving pool.

“Pool Premises” means the paths, aprons, seats, dressing rooms, compartments, bathrooms, buildings, picnic area and other areas forming part of the Shire of Birchip swimming pool, and being the land more particularly described in (43) hereafter.

“Vehicle” means any car, bicycle, cart, trailer or other wheeled vehicle.

2. The Swimming Pool Premises shall be open to the public during such periods and such hours as the Council shall, by Resolution determine.

3. The Council may at any time and from time to time close the pool premises or any part thereof for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of cleansing, repairing, rebuilding and reconstructing the same or for any other like purpose.

4. No person shall bet, play cards or any other game of chance in the pool or pool premises provided always that this shall not prevent the Council giving written permission to any organization to conduct a raffle or similar scheme for its purposes in the event of that organization having obtained the necessary permit to do so from the Attorney General.

5. No person shall enter the pool premises unless an attendant or authorized person is present.

6. Every person using any swimming pool, shall wear a suitable bathing costume and the Council or its authorized officer shall be the sole judge of the suitability of any costume.

7. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any part of the pool premises open to the public view on in or upon any part of the premises, except places specifically reserved for such purpose.

8. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the pool or on any lawns or in the dressing rooms, compartments, passages or entrances thereto, or in the vicinity of the kiosk, on the walls or on any sealed surface within the pool premises.

9. No person shall spit, spout water, or blow his or her nose in any of the pools.

10. No person shall roll or throw stones or other articles into any of the pools.

11. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself or commit a nuisance in the pool premises or bring rubbish, filth or other offensive matter into the said premises or deposit any rubbish therein or leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers cast-off clothes or other litter, except in receptacles provided for such purpose.

12. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the pools by any other person and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner, shall immediately leave the pool when requested to do so by the attendant in charge, and the manager may refuse to sell a ticket of admission to any person whom he may consider undesirable. Only one person shall stand on or dive from any diving board at the one time, and no person other than the attendant in charge shall prevent any other person from using the diving board. No person shall use any diving board if the attendant in charge deems it dangerous for any such board to be used and so advises the person concerned either verbally or by a notice suitably displayed in the vicinity of such diving board or boards.

13. No person shall at any time while being in the pool or pool premises use any indecent, insulting or offensive language or behave in any indecent, insulting, offensive or riotous manner.

14. No person shall use any flippers, snorkels, masks or goggles, beach balls, motor tubes, insulated rubber or plastic articles or toys or kicking boards without first having obtained the permission of the Pool Superintendent.

15. No person shall obstruct hinder or interfere with the attendant in charge or any person employed at the pool or any officer of the Council or approved swimming instructor in the performance of his or her duty thereat.

16. An authorized attendant may require any person offending against any part of this By-Law (but without prejudice to the imposition of any penalty in respect of such offence) to leave the pool premises and may eject such person therefrom if he or she fails to leave forthwith.

17. No person over the age of eight years shall use the wading pool unless with the approval of the attendant.

18. No person shall smoke within 15 feet of any pool in the premises.

19. No person shall at any time bring into or introduce into the pool premises or any part thereof any intoxicating liquors.

20. No person shall enter or remain in the pool premises whilst in a state of intoxication.

21. No person shall in the pool area—

(a) ride or drive or push any vehicle not being a vehicle delivering any goods or providing any services for or in connection with the running of the pool or pool premises.

22. No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal under his or her control to remain in the pool premises.

23. No person shall use the pools while in an unclean condition or who is suffering from any infectious cutaneous lesion, infectious or contagious disease and any person shall retire from the pools on being requested to do so by the attendant in charge.

24. No person unless authorized by the attendant in charge shall climb or attempt to climb over, into or upon or remain on or upon any fixture, fence, roof, building or structure.

25. No person shall use or interfere with any rope, raft, lifebuoy, or lifesaving appliance or apparatus in the premises except in the case of accident and danger occurring to a bather rendering their use necessary.

26. No person shall use any soap or other substance or preparation in any place or manner in the pool premises whereby any water in any pool may become discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers. Approved soap is permitted for use in showers and at hand basins only.

27. No person shall damage, deface or remove any placard or notice board within the pool premises.

No person shall foul or pollute the water in any of the pools or the shower baths or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel or bathing costume or any shower, wall, closet or urinal or any bathroom, dressing room, compartment or any part of the pool premises or any furniture or articles therein.

29. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break, injure or interfere with any lock, tap or fitting used in connection with the pools nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fitting, towel or any other article that may be in or upon the pools or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other part of the pool premises.

30. No boy or girl under the age of eight years who is unable to swim shall use the main pool without the permission of the attendant in charge unless accompanied by an adult or other person approved by the attendant in charge, and no adult non swimmer will enter the pool beyond his or her depth.

31. No child under the age of six years shall be permitted to enter the pool premises unless in the opinion of the attendant in charge such child is in the care of a responsible person.

32. No person other than a child under the age of four years under the care of a responsible person shall enter or use any dressing room, shower or convenience or passages leading thereto which have been appointed or appropriated to use of persons of the opposite sex.

33. No unauthorized person shall enter the plant room, its enclosure or any storeroom within the pool premises.

34. No person shall hawk or sell or offer for sale in the pool premises any goods or articles or services without having first obtained permission in writing, from the Council.

35. Neither the Council nor its officers or employees shall be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person admitted to the pool premises.

36. Any person finding any article in the pool premises shall immediately thereafter deliver the same to the attendant in charge who shall thereupon register a description of same and all particulars relating thereto in a book to be kept for that purpose, and upon any person losing such article giving satisfactory proof of loss, the attendant in charge shall deliver the same to such last mentioned person after entering the name and address of that person in the same book and obtaining therein his or her signature thereof.

37. Neither the Council nor any of its officers or employees shall be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst within the pool premises. Valuables may be handed to the attendant in charge for safe keeping.

38. Every person not being the holder of a seasonal or concession ticket shall before entering the pool premises pay to the person authorized for the purpose, the price fixed from time to time for admission thereto.

39. No seasonal or concession ticket shall be transferable and any holder of such ticket who allows any other person to use the same shall immediately forfeit the ticket and all moneys paid thereon and the rights and privileges given by such a ticket.
