

Such application shall be signed by the applicant and by at least five ratepayers of the City of Geelong West. Notwithstanding anything herein contained the Council shall not grant any application hereunder to sell within the areas set out in the Second Schedule unless the Council considers special circumstances exist. The fact that permission to sell is sought to raise funds for charitable, public or community purposes may if the Council so considers constitute special circumstances. circumstances.

The Council may in its discretion grant or refuse to grant the said application or may grant the same for such period and subject to such terms and conditions as the Councill shall cause to be endorsed on the permit. Any permit issued pursuant to the provisions of this clause shall be in form in the Third Schedule hereto together with such additions or alterations as the Council may require and shall be given under the hand of the Town Clark
- 7. Any person who is the holder of a current permit hereunder shall when engaged in the business of selling goods as a hawker or itinerant trader within the City of Geelong West shall carry the said permit and produce the same on demand to any Authorised Officer of the Council.
