PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the second, intitled the *Labour and Industry Act 1965*, it is amongst other things enacted that the several provisions of the said Act shall come into operation on a day or the respective days to be fixed by proclamation, or successive proclamations of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix the first day of November, 1967, as the day upon which the provisions of Sections 9 and 11 of the said Act shall come into operation.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A PROCLAMATION PERMITTING THE USE OF FISHING NETS IN LAKE TYERS AND CONCERNING BOATS WITH NETS ON BOARD IN CERTAIN WATERS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* to make a proclamation as follows:—

(a) Revoke the whole or portion of the Proclamations set out hereunder—

(b) Permitting the use of seine or hauling nets and mesh or set nets for the purpose of taking fish from the first day of April to the thirty-first day of August in each year (both days inclusive) in the waters of Lake Tyers other than the waters of such Lake which lie in the Toorloo Arm of Lake Tyers between the limits of Stony Creek and an imaginary line commencing at Ironbark Point and running due west to a point on the opposite bank of such Arm.

The use of such nets shall be subject to the following restrictions:—

No person shall—

- (i) use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length two hundred (200) fathoms;
- (ii) use "mesh" or "set" nets of a total length of more than six hundred (600) fathoms;
- (iii) use at the same time a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net;
- (iv) use any net between ten o'clock (10 a.m.) in the morning of every Friday and sunrise on the following Sunday.

(c) Providing that in the period from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year boats having nets attached thereto or on board to be employed in fishing shall not be left or allowed to remain in or upon the waters of Ironstone Creek, Stony Creek, Boggy Creek or the Toorloo Arm of Lake Tyers which lie between the limits of Stony Creek and an imaginary line commencing at Ironbark Point and running due west to a point on the opposite bank of such Arm.

Provided that the holders of professional fishing licences may during the period from the first day of April to the thirty-first day of August in each year (both days inclusive) take boats with nets on board down Boggy Creek to Lake Tyers by the most direct route.

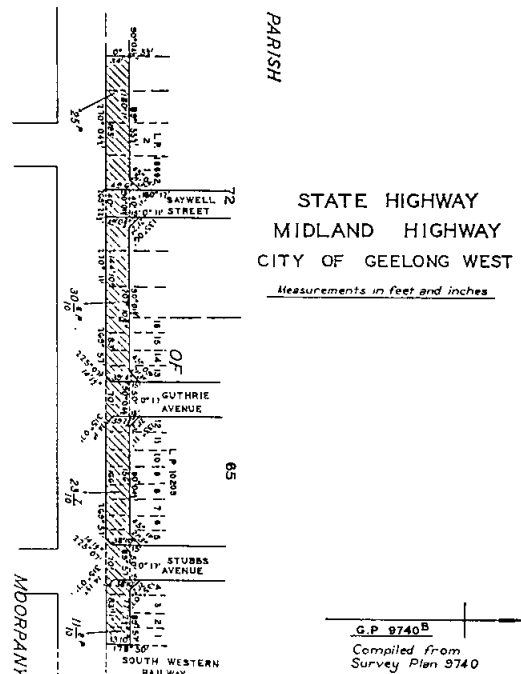

Interim Development Order.

THAT by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961*, as amended, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Brighton (hereinafter referred to as the responsible authority), having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme on the 14th day of December, 1964, in accordance with the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961*, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any buildings or works on any land within the area described in the Schedule hereto.

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order no person shall use or develop any land or erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works on any land within the area included in the Schedule, except in accordance with the provision of a permit issued by the responsible authority.

2. Every application for a permit under the provisions of this Order shall be made on the prescribed form, copies of which may be obtained from the office of the responsible authority at Brighton.

3. This Interim Development Order shall not prevent—

(a) the continuance of the use of any land or buildings or works for the purposes for which such land or buildings or works were lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order;

(b) any dealing or the registration of any dealing with any land in a subdivision of which a plan has been sealed by the Council of the City of Brighton and lodged with the Registrar of Titles, pursuant to section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, before the coming into operation of this Order.

4. *Schedule.*—The whole of the land within the following boundaries:—Commencing at a point on the west building line of Cochrane-street 652 feet north of Bay-street; thence southerly along the west building line of Cochrane-street to Bay-street; thence westerly along the north building line of Bay-street to Berwick-street; thence northerly along the east building line of Berwick-street for a distance of 652 feet; thence easterly by a line to the point of commencement.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission") in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958* doth hereby make the By-law following, restricting the use for other than domestic purposes of water supplied by the said Commission within the Bellarine Peninsula, Mornington Peninsula and Otway Waterworks Districts, and the Corop, Dingee, Gunbower, Leitchville, Lockington, Macoma, Mitiamo, Murrabit, Pyramid Hill, Stanhope, Tallygaroopna, Carwarp, Lake Boga, Koondrook, Merbein, Meringur, Nyah, Nyah West, Piangil, Red Cliffs, Robinvale, Werrimull, Eildon, Heyfield, Wonthaggi, Antwerp, Berrillock, Beulah, Birchip, Brim, Chillingollah, Chinkapook, Culgoa, Dimboola, Dooen, Hopetoun, Jeparit, Jung Jung, Lalbert, Lascelles, Manangatang, Marnoo, Minyip, Nandaly, Natimuk, Nullawil, Ouyen, Patchewollock, Pimpinio, Quambatook, Rainbow, Rupanyup, Sea Lake, Speed, Tempy, Ultima, Waitchie, Waipcup, Watchem, Woomelang, Woorinen, Wycheproof, Yaapeet and Newstead Urban Districts.

1. This By-law shall come into operation at such time and in such Districts or parts of Districts (hereinafter referred to as "the specified area") as the Commission from time to time directs by notice published in a newspaper circulating generally within the Districts and cease to have operation at such time as the Commission from time to time directs by a notice so published.

2. Subject to the provisions of Clauses 3 and 4 of this By-law no person shall, with water supplied by the Commission—

- (a) Water any garden, lawn or other land (other than commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms) within the specified area except by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand, between the hours of 5.30 p.m. and 8 p.m. on each day.
- (b) Fill, add to or cleanse any private swimming pool within the specified area.

3. No person shall, with water supplied by the Commission, water any commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers between the hours of 5.30 p.m. and 8 p.m. of each day.

4. No person shall with water supplied by the Commission water any land comprising sports grounds, golf courses, race courses, public and club bowling and croquet grounds and public and club tennis courts within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers, except during a maximum period of 14 hours a week at times and under conditions to be determined by the Commission's District Engineer.

5. Every person who uses or permits or suffers water supplied by the Commission to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred Dollars.

6. No person shall wash a car within the specified area by means of a hose held in the hand.

7. If any person supplied with water by the Commission wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Commission may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied to him or for his use and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the *Water Act 1958*.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Shire of Nathalia Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect, and recover the rates and charges aforesaid, and each of them. And in the absence of such appointment the Secretary and/or Rate Collector of the Trust shall be deemed to have been appointed for the purpose aforesaid, and every and each of them.

The owner or occupier of any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads upon which property any trees, shrubs or hedges are growing abutting on such streets or roads or within a distance of 10 feet therefrom or within a distance of 30 feet from such junction shall, if any such trees, shrubs or hedges or any part or parts thereof be of a height greater than 3 feet 6 inches above the surface level of the street or road nearest to any such trees, shrubs or hedges, upon receipt of notice in writing under the hand of the Municipal Clerk of the said Shire and within the time specified in such notice, remove or lop or cause to be removed or lopped any tree, shrub or hedge (whether planted before or after the commencement of the *Local Government Act, 1958*) to such extent as may be necessary to bring the same into conformity with the requirements of clause 1 of this By-Law.

3. Upon default being made by any owner or occupier of private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads in complying with any notice served under clause 2 of this By-Law, the said Council may, notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, by its engineer or authorised officer enter upon such private property with a sufficient number of workmen and may remove or lop such trees, shrubs or hedges growing or being thereon which have not been removed or lopped as required by the said notice and the expenses incurred by the said Council in so doing shall be forthwith paid by the owner of such private property to the said Council and in default of such payment may be recovered by the said Council as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

4. The owner of any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads upon which private property there is a fence within 30 feet from the junction of such streets or roads, shall, if such fence be of a height greater than 3 feet 6 inches from the surface level of the street or road nearest to such fence, upon receipt of notice in writing under the hand of the Municipal Clerk of the said Shire and within the time therein specified, cause to be reduced to a height not exceeding 3 feet 6 inches above the surface level of the street or road nearest such fence any portion of such fence within 30 feet of the junction of such street or road.

5. Upon default by the owner or occupier of any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads in complying with any notice served under clause 4 of this By-Law, the said Council may, notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, by its engineer or other authorised officer, enter upon such private property with a sufficient number of workmen and may reduce in height any portion of a fence which has not been reduced in height as required by such notice, and the expense incurred by the said Council in so doing shall be forthwith paid by the owner of such private property to the said Council, and in default of such payment may be recovered by the said Council as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

6. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Kilmore.

7. Any person who by wilful act or default shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty dollars.

1. *Matter submitted to the Executive Council.*

Matters submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the *Gazette* Officer, Room 9, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the *Gazette* Officer.

2. *Other matter.*

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the *Gazette* Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or, at the direction of the *Gazette* Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.
