





AND WHEREAS the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission has been appointed the Authority in respect of Rocklands Reservoir:

AND WHEREAS the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission has recommended that the use of certain parts of the waters of Rocklands Reservoir be prohibited for certain classes of boating or similar activity:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Boating Act 1961, do by this my Proclamation prohibit the use of the waters of Rocklands Reservoir 200 yards to the eastward of the dam to a line between two beacons on opposite shores of the reservoir marked "STOP" and "PROHIBITED WATER BEYOND THIS POINT" for all classes of boating.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Boating Act 1961, do by this my Proclamation prohibit the use of the waters of Lake Nillahcootie to the southward of the embankment to an imaginary line about 200 yards distant between two beacons on opposite shores of the Lake marked "STOP" and "PROHIBITED WATER BEYOND THIS POINT" for all classes of boating.

In paragraph 57—

At the end of sub-paragraph (1), by inserting the following proviso:—

"Provided that no member shall receive any such allowance for a period longer than twelve calendar months.".

2. This Determination shall come into operation on the 3rd day of December, 1967.





AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF "GOULBURN PARK RESERVE", SEYMOUR.

PARK RESERVE", SEYMOUR.

WHEREAS in pursuance of section 218 of the Land Act 1958 as then enacted the Board of Land and Works on the 9th day of December, 1948, made Regulations for the care protection and management of certain Crown land, in the Township and Parish of Seymour, reserved as a site for Public Recreation: And whereas the said Board was dissolved by the Public Lands and Works Act 1964, which provided inter alia that all Regulations made by the Board shall remain in force subject to the Land Act 1958: And whereas the Minister of Lands is now empowered to make Regulations for or with respect to the said land (hereinafter called the Reserve) in pursuance of section 218 of the Land Act 1958: And whereas it is expedient that the Regulations made by the Board as aforesaid should be amended: Now therefore, I, William John Farquhar McDonald, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria do hereby rescind Regulation numbers 10 and 10A and substitute therefore under the same numbers the following Regulations:

10. The charges for camping in the area set apart as

A sum of not more than seventy cents (70c) for one A sum of not more than seventy tents (100) for one night for a car party not exceeding six persons, for each additional person a sum of ten cents (10c) per night and for a party not exceeding six persons, four dollars (\$4) per week and for each additional person a sum of sixty cents (60c) per week.

10a. A sum of not more than thirty cents (30c) per night shall be charged for the use of a power point.— (Rs.4802.)

Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Forty dollars (\$40) and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of Ten dollars (\$10) for each day on which the offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.
