AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown Lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961, Section 4 (1).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 2 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* may from time to time appoint an Authority in control over any Victorian waters:

AND WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity:

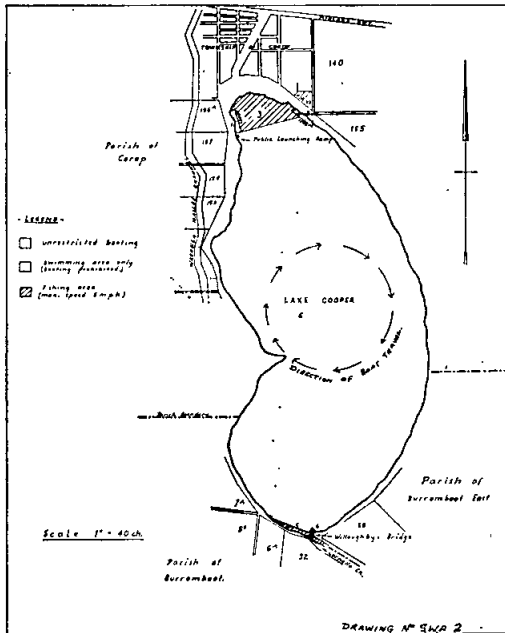
AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Waranga has been proclaimed the Authority over the waters of Lake Cooper at Corop:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Waranga has recommended the prohibition of the use of certain specified parts of the waters of Lake Cooper at Corop for all classes of boating:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, do by this my Proclamation prohibit the use of those parts of the waters of Lake Cooper at Corop specified hereunder for all classes of boating:—

1. *Location*—on the western side of Lake Cooper one mile from Corop township: adjacent to Crown Allotment 156A, Parish of Corop, and commencing 150 feet north of the concrete launching ramp and extending northward along the shoreline for 1,200 feet and extending into the Lake for 150 feet.
2. *Location*—on the north-eastern corner of the shore of Lake Cooper: adjacent to Crown Allotments 111, 112, and 113 Township of Corop, and commencing at a point being the prolongation of the road between Crown Allotment 113, Township of Corop and Crown Allotment 140, Township of Corop and the shoreline and extending north-westerly for a distance of 1,200 feet and extending into the Lake for a distance of 150 feet.

3. Location—at the southern end of the Lake adjacent to Willoughby's Bridge.
Being an area 300 feet square immediately north of Willoughby's Bridge.
4. All boundaries shall be marked by beacons on the shore or by buoys.
5. The areas specified in this Proclamation are those delineated on drawing No. SWA2 hereunder.

AND WHEREAS the council of the municipal district of the Shire of Croydon has requested that the portion of such district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District:

AND WHEREAS a certificate has been received from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board that it is desirable so to do:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 5 (1) of the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Croydon enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder shall from the thirty-first day of December, 1967, be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District, viz.:—

Shire of Croydon.

Commencing at the corner of Lusher Road and Ronald Road: thence southerly by a line to the corner of Eastfield Road and Lusher Road; thence southerly by Lusher Road and a line to the corner of Branch Road and Central Avenue; thence southerly by Branch Road to Bayfield Road; thence southerly by a line to the junction of Canterbury Road and Hamilton Road; thence generally southerly and westerly by Hamilton Road to the Dandenong Creek; thence generally westerly by that Creek to the existing boundary of the Metropolitan Fire District; thence generally northerly and easterly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS
ACT 1958.

BY-LAW NO. 93—WATER SUPPLY RESTRICTIONS.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958* and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any way enabling the Board in that behalf, doth make the By-law following:—

1. By-law No. 61 made and passed by the Board on the 21st day of September, 1954, and gazetted on the 29th day of September, 1954, and By-law No. 85 made and passed by the Board on the 11th day of December, 1962, and gazetted on the 12th day of December, 1962, are hereby repealed as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law.

2. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the subject matter or context—

(a) "The Act" means the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958* and any Act amending the same.

"The Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board for the time being.

"The Secretary" means the Secretary of the Board for the time being or the Acting Secretary of the Board for the time being and shall also mean and include any other Officer or person appointed by the Board for the purpose of exercising the powers of the Secretary under this By-law.

"Municipal District" means a municipal district or so much thereof as lies within the metropolis.

"Daily Newspaper" means "The Age" "Herald" "Sun" or other daily newspaper circulating in the metropolis.

"Period" means a succession of days whether broken or not commencing at a specified hour of a specified day and concluding at a specified hour of a specified day or at such hour of such day as shall subsequently be declared.

"Period of Restriction" means a period of control of peak use of water, a period of controlled use of water, a period of restricted use of water, a period of limited use of water, a period of reduced use of water, a period of severely reduced use of water or a period of more severely reduced use of water whichever be declared in terms of this By-law.

"Garden" means any ground used for the cultivation of or in which are situate trees shrubs flowers vegetables lawns or vegetation of any kind but shall not include a market garden or a nursery.

"Private Garden" means a garden appurtenant to a building used for domestic, commercial or industrial purposes and shall include any part of the curtilage in which the private garden is situate which is used or adapted for use for the purposes of any sport game or other form of recreation and any nature strip appurtenant to such curtilage.

"Market Garden" means any ground used wholly for the growing for sale any vegetables fruit seedlings seeds or flowers.

"Nursery" means any land devoted to the cultivation of trees shrubs flowers seeds and seedlings either for sale or for use or distribution by some body (whether corporate or not) other than for profit.

"Sports Ground" means any ground used or adapted for use for the purpose of any sport game contest or other form of recreation by any club school institution or like organization or by any person normally conducting any sport game contest or other form of recreation upon such ground for gain or reward.

"Vehicle" includes a motor car and a trailer as defined in the *Motor Car Act 1958* and a caravan and for the purposes of this By-law shall include a boat.

(b) The expression "person" shall include a corporation unless there is something repugnant to or inconsistent with that interpretation.

(c) Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular, unless the contrary as to gender or number is expressly provided.

3. If in the opinion of the Chairman or in his absence of the Secretary it is necessary to reduce the consumption of water supplied by the Board within the whole of the metropolis or within any municipal district or municipal districts comprised therein the Chairman or the Secretary (as the case may be) may at any time and from time to time declare that in respect to the metropolis or in respect to such municipal district or municipal districts as are specified in the declaration—

- (a) any period to be a period of control of peak use of water;
- (b) any period to be a period of controlled use of water;
- (c) any period to be a period of restricted use of water;
- (d) any period to be a period of limited use of water;
- (e) any period to be a period of reduced use of water;
- (f) any period to be a period of severely reduced use of water; or
- (g) any period to be a period of more severely reduced use of water.

4. If during any period of restriction the Chairman or in his absence the Secretary is of the opinion that (having regard to the water supply then available) less severe or more severe (as the case may be) restrictions upon the use of water supplied by the Board should be imposed within the whole of the metropolis or within any municipal district or municipal districts specified in a declaration made pursuant to Clause 3 hereof he may in respect to the metropolis or with respect to any municipal district or municipal districts—

- (a) Terminate such period of restriction and may declare that the period from the time of termination to be a period of restriction other than that terminated.
- (b) Without terminating such period of restriction may declare any immediately ensuing period to be a period of restriction.

5. (1) Any declaration made pursuant to Clause 3 or Clause 4 hereof shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Schedule hereto and where made during the currency of any period of restriction an appropriate reference to the termination or effluxion of such period of restriction shall be contained in such declaration and such declaration shall be signed by the Chairman or the Secretary (as the case may be) and shall be published in a daily newspaper and subject to such publication shall take effect as provided in the declaration.

(2) To each declaration published in a daily newspaper pursuant to sub-clause (1) hereof there shall be appended such portion of Clause 6 hereof as shall be applicable having regard to such declaration.

6. Water supplied by the Board—

(1) During any period declared to be a period of control of peak use of water shall between the hours of 5 p.m. and 9 p.m. of each day be used for the watering of any garden or sports ground only by means of a hose or a watering can or other similar container held in the hand.

(2) During any period declared to be a period of controlled use of water shall be used for the watering of gardens and of sports grounds only by means of a watering can or hose held in the hand except between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 a.m. on each day during which period water may be used for any such purpose by means of a hose not held in the hand.

(3) During any period declared to be a period of restricted use of water—

(a) Shall be used for the watering of gardens or sports grounds only by means of a watering can or other similar container held in the hand except between the hours of 6 a.m. and 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. and 8.30 p.m. each day during which periods water may be used for any such purpose by means of a hose held in the hand.

(b) Shall be used for the washing of a vehicle only by means of a bucket or other similar container unless—

(i) the cleaning of the vehicle is necessary for the purpose of public health and it has been established to the satisfaction of the Board that such vehicle can only be properly cleaned by the means of a hose; or

- (ii) the washing of vehicles is carried out for fee or reward by a vehicle cleaning establishment which has made provision for the recirculation of the cleaning water.
- (c) Shall not be used for filling or adding to or replacing water in any swimming pool or wading pool or other than a pool to which members of the public are admitted unless the Board having regard to considerations of health or of the structural safety of the pool has given prior consent in writing to such use.
- (d) Shall be used for the washing of drives, paths, walks, paved surfaces or buildings only by means of a watering can or other similar container held in the hand unless the washing is such as is necessary in the interests of public health or is required for the construction of any buildings or works.
- (e) Shall not be used for filling tankers unless such water is required for flushing of streets gutters or drains for public health purposes, for watering public gardens, and trees situate in or along any thoroughfare during the hours prescribed in paragraph (a) hereof or for construction purposes on buildings or other works.
- (f) Shall not be used for the operation of any fountains, whether public or private, whether recirculated or not.
- (4) During any period declared to be a period of limited use of water—
- (a) Shall be used for the watering of a private garden only by means of a watering can or other similar container held in the hand except between the hours of 7 p.m. and 8 p.m. each day during which period water may be used for such purpose by means of a hose held in the hand.
- (b) Shall be used for the watering of any garden (other than a private garden) or any sports grounds only by means of a watering can or other similar container held in the hand except between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 a.m. each day during which period water may be used for any such purpose by means of a hose held in the hand.
- (c) Shall be used for the washing of a vehicle only by means of a bucket or other similar container unless—
- (i) the cleaning of the vehicle is necessary for the purpose of public health and it has been established to the satisfaction of the Board that such vehicle can only be properly cleansed by the means of a hose; or
- (ii) the washing of vehicles is carried out for fee or reward by a vehicle cleaning establishment which has made provision for the recirculation of the cleaning water.
- (d) Shall not be used for filling or adding to or replacing water in any swimming pool or wading pool or other than a pool to which members of the public are admitted unless the Board having regard to considerations of health or of the structural safety of the pool has given prior consent in writing to such use.

- (f) Shall not be used for filling tankers unless such water is required for flushing of streets gutters or drains for public health purposes, for watering public gardens, and trees situate in or along any thoroughfare during the hours prescribed in paragraph (a) hereof or for construction purposes on buildings or other works.
- (g) Shall not be used for the operation of any fountains whether public or private and whether recirculated or not.
- (5) During any period declared to be a period of reduced use of water—
- (a) Shall not be used for the watering by any means whatsoever of lawns or other grass areas wheresoever the same may be situate unless such water shall have first been used for some domestic commercial or industrial purpose and cannot again be so used.
- (b) Shall be used for the watering of garden beds shrubs and trees within a private garden only by means of a watering can or other similar container held in the hand except that between the hours of 7 p.m. and 8 p.m. on such of the days prescribed hereunder as may be applicable having regard to the numbering to the frontage or to the situation of the premises in which a private garden is situate water supplied by the Board may be used for the watering of garden beds shrubs and trees within such private garden by means of a hose held in the hand provided that not more than one hose is at any time used within such garden—
- (i) Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday of each week—
Where houses and buildings are numbered such houses or buildings as have odd numbers—
Where houses and buildings are not numbered such houses or buildings as are situate in a court, cul-de-sac, crescent, or quadrant, or where not so situate, have a frontage generally facing north or a frontage generally east;
- (ii) Monday, Wednesday and Saturday of each week—
Where houses and buildings are numbered such houses or buildings as have even numbers—
Where houses and buildings are not numbered such houses or buildings as have a frontage generally facing south or a frontage generally facing west.
- (c) May be used for the watering by means of a hose held in the hand of garden beds shrubs and trees situate in a garden other than a private garden between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday of each week provided that trees and shrubs situate in The Royal Botanic Gardens may be watered by means of a hose held in the hand during the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 a.m. any day other than Saturday or Sunday.
- (d) Shall be used for the watering of any sports grounds only by means of a watering can or other similar container held in the hand except that to the extent hereinafter prescribed water may be used by means of a hose or hoses held in the hand between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 a.m. on each day other than Tuesday and Saturday of each week for—
- (i) Trees and shrubs comprised in any sports ground;
- (ii) Cricket grounds—wicket area only;
- (iii) Golf courses—greens only;
- (iv) Bowling clubs, Trugo and Croquet clubs—greens only;

- (v) Tennis courts other than courts situate in a private garden—play surface only;
- (vi) Athletic grounds—running tracks and surfaces used for field games only.
- (e) For watering the running tracks of a race course within the metropolitan area by means of a hose or hoses held in the hand only between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 a.m. on each day other than Tuesday and Saturday of each week.
- (f) For watering of market gardens and nurseries by means of existing reticulation or a hose or hoses not held in the hand only between the hours of 5 a.m. and 8 p.m. each day.
- (g) For watering land used for the growing of green feed by a commercial poultryman or for the cooling of a building in which poultry is kept for commercial purposes by means of existing reticulation or a hose or hoses not held in the hand only between the hours of 5 a.m. and 8 p.m. each day.
- (h) Shall not be used for filling or adding to the contents of any dam tank or like container situate upon premises used for any agricultural, horticultural commercial or industrial purpose unless the prior written authority of the Board is first obtained.
- (i) Shall be used for the washing of a vehicle only by means of a bucket or other similar container unless—
- (i) the cleaning of the vehicle is necessary for the purpose of public health and it has been established to the satisfaction of the Board that such vehicle can only be properly cleaned by the means of a hose; or
 - (ii) the washing of vehicles is carried out for fee or reward by a vehicle cleaning establishment which has made provision for the recirculation of the cleaning water.
- (j) Shall not be used for filling or adding to or replacing water in any swimming pool or wading pool other than a pool to which members of the public are admitted unless the Board having regard to considerations of health or of the structural safety of the pool has given prior consent in writing to such use.

- (c) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained trees and shrubs situate in The Royal Botanic Gardens may be watered by means of a hose or hoses held in the hand between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 a.m. any day other than Saturday or Sunday.
- (d) Shall be used for the watering of any sports grounds only by means of a watering can or other similar container held in the hand except that to the extent hereinafter prescribed water may be used by means of a hose or hoses held in the hand between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 a.m. each day other than Tuesday and Saturday for—
- (i) Trees and shrubs comprised in any sports ground;
 - (ii) Cricket grounds—wicket area only;
 - (iii) Golf courses—greens only;
 - (iv) Bowling clubs Trugo and Croquet Clubs—greens only;
 - (v) Tennis Courts other than courts situate in a private garden—play surface only;
 - (vi) Athletic grounds—running tracks and surfaces used for field games only.

 - (ii) the washing of vehicles is carried out for fee or reward by a vehicle cleaning establishment which has made provision for the recirculation of the cleaning water.
- (j) Shall not be used for filling or adding to or replacing water in any swimming pool or wading pool other than a pool to which members of the public are admitted unless the Board having regard to considerations of health or of the structural safety of the pool has given prior consent in writing to such use.
- (k) Shall be used for the washing of drives, paths, walks, paved surfaces or buildings only by means of a watering can

or other similar container held in the hand unless the washing is such as is necessary in the interests of public health or is required for the construction of any buildings or works.

- (l) Shall not be used for filling tankers unless such water is required for flushing of streets gutters or drains for public health purposes or for watering shrubs and trees in public gardens and shrubs and trees situate in or along any thoroughfare during the hours prescribed in paragraph (b) hereof or for construction purposes on buildings or other works.
- (m) Shall not be used for the operation of any fountains whether public or private and whether recirculated or not.
- (7) During any period declared to be a period of more severely reduced use of water—
 - (a) Shall not be used for the watering by any means whatsoever of lawns or other grass areas wheresoever the same may be situate unless such water shall first have been used for some domestic commercial or industrial purposes and cannot again be so used.
 - (b) Shall be used for watering garden beds shrubs and trees situate within any garden only by means of a watering can or other similar container held in the hand except that garden beds shrubs and trees situate in any garden not being a private garden may be watered by means of a hose held in the hand between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. on Tuesday and Friday of each week.
 - (c) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained trees and shrubs situate in the Royal Botanic Gardens may be watered by means of a hose or hoses held in the hand between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 a.m. on any day other than Saturday or Sunday.
 - (d) Shall not be used for the watering of any sports grounds including a race-course unless such water shall have first been used for some domestic commercial or industrial purpose and cannot again be so used.
 - (e) For watering of market gardens and nurseries by means of existing reticulation or a hose or hoses not held in the hand only between the hours of 5 a.m. and 8 p.m. each day.
 - (f) For watering land used for the growing of green feed by a commercial poultryman or for the cooling of a building in which poultry is kept for commercial purposes by means of existing reticulation or a hose or hoses not held in the hand only between the hours of 5 a.m. and 8 p.m. each day.
 - (g) Shall not be used for filling or adding to the contents of any dam tank or like container situate upon premises used for any agricultural, horticultural, commercial or industrial purpose unless the prior written authority of the Board is first obtained.
 - (h) Shall be used for the washing of a vehicle only by means of a bucket or other similar container on the Tuesday and Saturday of each week unless—
 - (i) the cleaning of the vehicle is necessary for the purpose of public health and it has been established to the satisfaction of the Board that such vehicle can only be properly cleansed by the means of a hose; or
 - (ii) the washing of vehicles is carried out for fee or reward by a vehicle cleaning establishment which has made provision for the recirculation of the cleaning water.
 - (i) Shall not be used for filling or adding to or replacing water in any swimming pool or wading pool other than a pool to which members of the public are

admitted unless the Board having regard to considerations of health or of the structural safety of the pool has given prior consent in writing to such use.

- (j) Shall be used for the washing of drives, paths, walks, paved surfaces or buildings only by means of a watering can or other similar container held in the hand unless the washing is such as is necessary in the interests of public health or is required for the construction of any buildings or works.
- (k) Shall not be used for filling tankers unless such water is required for flushing of streets gutters or drains for public health purposes or for watering shrubs and trees in public gardens, and shrubs and trees situate in or along any thoroughfare during the hours prescribed in paragraph (b) hereof or for construction purposes on buildings or other works.
- (l) Shall not be used for the operation of any fountains whether public or private and whether recirculated or not.

7. Any person who uses or causes or permits to be used water supplied by the Board contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred dollars.

8. The Chairman or in his absence the Secretary having regard to the water supply then available may by declaration published in a daily newspaper—

- (a) Specify the hour and day of the conclusion of a period of restriction where such conclusion was not specified when the period of restriction was declared;
- (b) Specify an earlier conclusion where the hour and day of the conclusion of the period of restriction was specified when the period of restriction was declared.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS ACT 1958.

By-LAW No. 94.

Water Supply—Industrial—Commercial Restriction.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS (hereinafter called "the Board") pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on the Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958, and in exercise and execution of any powers and authorities in any way enabling the Board in that behalf doth make the By-law following that is to say:—

1. Water supplied by the Board otherwise than for domestic purposes shall in addition to the conditions contained in any By-law of the Board be and be deemed to be supplied subject to and upon the conditions herein prescribed.

2. During any period of restriction declared in terms of By-law No. 93 of the Board other than a period of control of peak demand use of water, a period of controlled use of water or a period of restricted use of water;

(1) Any person using water supplied by the Board otherwise than for domestic purposes shall adopt such methods or processes and shall take all such measures (including where practicable the recirculation of water and the use of waste water) as may reduce his consumption of water so supplied.

(2) The Board may make such investigation as in the circumstances may be necessary or desirable in order to ascertain whether the amount of water supplied by the Board to any person otherwise than for domestic purposes can be reduced and any person using water so supplied otherwise than for domestic purposes shall furnish to the Board such information as it may properly require for the purpose of such investigation and shall permit such inspections and tests as may be required for such purposes.

(3) (a) If as a result of any such investigation as aforesaid it would appear that the consumption of water by any person otherwise than for domestic purposes can be reduced by the adoption of any system control method or process the Board (after consideration of the cost of the adoption of such method or process the effect thereof on the carrying on of industrial or commercial operations and the amount by which the quantity of water used is likely to be reduced) may by order under the hand of its Secretary require such person or may require all persons carrying on any industrial or commercial activity which is the same as or similar to the industry or commercial activity which was the subject of such investigation to adopt such system form of control method or process generally or particularly described in such order.

(b) Should any person supplied by the Board with water otherwise than for domestic purposes fail to observe any order made as hereinbefore provided which is applicable to him the Board may by further order under the hand of its Secretary direct that the water supplied to and consumed by such person at such premises during any period of such duration as is specified in the order shall not exceed the quantity specified therein and during the operation of such last mentioned order the Board may limit the quantity of water supplied so that the quantity specified in the order is not exceeded.

(4) Any person failing to observe any order made pursuant to sub-clause (b) of Clause (3) hereof shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100 and in case of a continuing offence shall be liable to a further penalty not exceeding \$10 for each day the offence continues after notice of the offence from the Board.

Water Supply—Industrial—Commercial Surcharge.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS (hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon the Board by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958*, and in exercise and execution of any powers and authorities in any way enabling the Board in that behalf doth make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. 81 duly made and passed by the Board on the 18th day of September 1962 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of October 1962 (which By-law by virtue of a Declaration made by the Attorney General pursuant to the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1962* is a Statutory Rule within the meaning of the said Act) as amended by By-law No. 89 (Statutory Rule No. 192/1965) duly made and passed by the Board on the 14th day of September 1965 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th day of October 1965 as further amended by Decimal Currency (Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works) Order 1966 (Statutory Rule No. 141/1966) and as further amended by By-law No. 91 (Statutory Rule No.

165/1967) duly made and passed by the Board on the 7th day of February 1967 notice of which was published in the *Government Gazette* on 30th day of June, 1967.

2. The said By-law No. 81 as so amended (being hereinafter referred to as "the said By-law") is hereby further amended by inserting after Clause 7 thereof the following new Clause, that is to say:—

"7A. In the event of the Board making any order under sub-clause (a) of Clause 3 of By-law No. 94 whereby it is directed that the water supplied to and consumed by any person at the premises and during the period specified in such order shall not exceed the quantity specified therein then whether or not the quantity of water supplied may be limited and whether or not any proceedings may be commenced in respect of any breach of the said By-law No. 94 the supply of water to the person named in the order at the premises and during the period specified therein shall as to such quantity as exceeds the quantity specified in such order be upon and subject to a surcharge calculated at the rate per thousand gallons of four times the rate prescribed in sub-clause (a) of Clause 7 of this By-law."

CITY OF SALE.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR ENDING 1967-68.

By-law No. 54.

THE Municipal Council of the City of Sale, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Four cents in the dollar on the Net Annual Valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Sale Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Six dollars and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Two dollars.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the Occupiers or Owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of October, 1967 and shall be payable on the 20th day of December, 1967, at the office of the said Local Governing Body, Council Chambers, Sale.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Council is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Fifteen cents per 1000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause is hereby fixed at Twenty Five cents for 1000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at Twenty Five cents per 1000 gallons and the minimum quantity of water to be charged in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 48,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorised to demand, receive and collect the said rates and charges.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW NO. 19.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-law as follows:—

1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

2. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Commissioners—

(a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at Fourteen cents per thousand gallons for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the said meter year.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at Fourteen cents per thousand gallons for any meter year.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Commissioners is hereby fixed at Fourteen cents per thousand gallons.

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Commissioners is hereby fixed at Four dollars.

5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Commissioners during normal business hours.

6. The provisions of Clauses 2, 3 and 4 of this By-law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Commissioners under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.

4. If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid rate becomes during the said year a "sewered property", there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a sewered property, and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.

5. For making and levying such rate the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the nett annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined in the manner provided in the Sewerage Districts Acts.

6. Such person or persons as the Bendigo Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges.

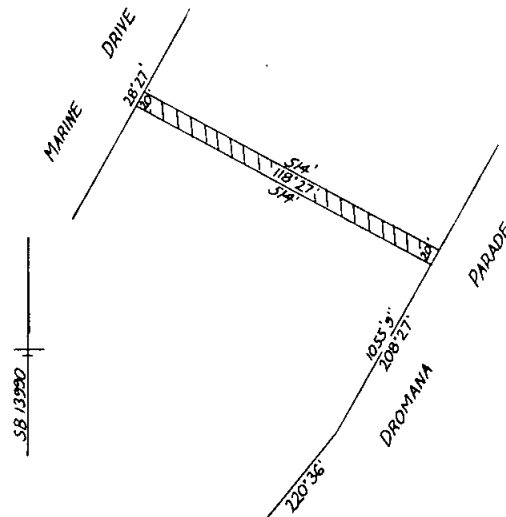

ROAD DISCONTINUED.— SHIRE OF FLINDERS.

WHEREAS it is provided in Section 528 (2) of the Local Government Act, as amended, that where a road (whether or not a public highway but not being a road set out on land of the Crown) or any part thereof is not required for public use the Governor-in-Council on the request of the Council of the municipality in which such road is situated made not less than one month after publishing in a newspaper generally circulating in the district and posting to the registered proprietor (if any) of the land and any person known to have an interest in the land notice of intention to make such a request may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* direct that such road or part shall be discontinued and thereupon such road or part shall be discontinued accordingly.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Flinders has requested that the Governor-in-Council direct that a right-of-way off Dromana Parade, be discontinued and not less than one month previously has published in a newspaper generally circulating in the district and posted to the registered proprietor of the land in the said road and to all persons known to have an interest in the said land notice of intention to make such request.

1. By-Law No. 51 of the Shire of Flinders is hereby repealed.

2. No person shall in or upon any land or premises make cause or permit or suffer to be made or cause such volume or amount of sound or noise as to be objectionable or an annoyance or nuisance to any other person being in or upon any other land or premises or in or upon any public highway:—

- (a) by shouting calling out haranguing or singing or;
- (b) by using operating controlling sounding or playing any wireless set amplifying equipment gramophone piano piano-player or any other instrument or contrivance.

3. No person shall in any public highway cause or permit or suffer to be caused without justifiable cause any loud or objectionable noise by shouting calling out haranguing or singing.

4. (i) No person shall in any public highway cause or permit or suffer to be caused any noise by using operating controlling sounding or playing any wireless set amplifying equipment gramophone piano piano-player or any other instrument or contrivance without the consent in writing of the Council of the Shire of Flinders and in the event of such consent being granted except in accordance with the conditions (if any) attached thereto.

- (ii) Any person applying for such consent shall:—
 - (a) make application in writing to the Council of the Shire of Flinders and
 - (b) in such application state:
 - (i) his full name and address;
 - (ii) the date and times between which he proposes to use such wireless set amplifying equipment gramophone piano piano-player or any other instrument or contrivance;

- (iii) the purpose for which he desires to use such electrical wireless set amplifying equipment gramophone piano piano-player or any other instrument or contrivance;
- (iv) the name of the public highway involved; and

(c) supply any other information the Council of the Shire of Flinders may desire.

5. The Council of the Shire of Flinders may grant the application either subject to conditions or not or refuse the same as it sees fit.

6. Any person guilty of wilful act or default contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Twenty Dollars (\$20) or more than Forty Dollars (\$40) and to a further penalty of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10) for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order is made by the Court.

7. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Flinders.

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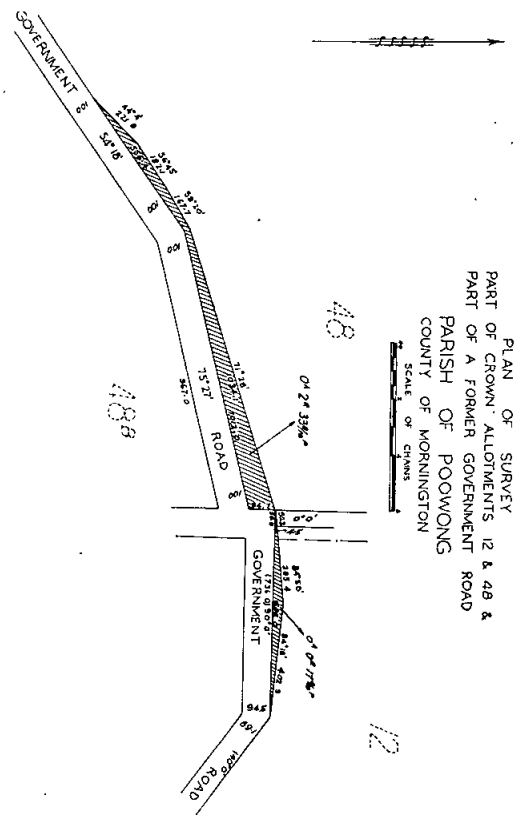

(4) Sections 18, 22 and 23 of the By-law No. 97, are hereby repealed.
