AMENDING PROCLAMATION DECLARING
PROCLAIMED AREAS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 (No. 6407) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may amend or revoke any Proclamation made in accordance with the provisions of section 25 of the said Act: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation hereby amend the Proclamation made on the sixth day of February, 1968, as follows:—

- (1) After sub-paragraph (f) of paragraph 4 there shall be inserted the following sub-paragraph—
  - "(g) To apply to an Inspector for a permit to remove from any place within the proclaimed areas to any place outside those areas or to any other place in those areas any plant or soil and to refrain from such removal until a permit is granted."
- (2) In the First Schedule after the expression "north-western angle of allotment 1c;" for the words "thence westerly" there shall be substituted the words "thence easterly".

### PROCLAMATION


By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 (No. 6372), do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Lake Merrimu—(Goodman's Creek) Water Supply Catchment.

The area to be proclaimed is the catchment to that part of the Goodman's Creek and its tributaries which lie upstream of a diversion weir to be constructed by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, adjacent to the point where the south-west corner of C.A. 47, Parish of Coimadai meets Goodman's Creek.

The use of the land within this Catchment is subject to determination by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of section 23 (i) (a) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 (No. 6372).

The area described is indicated on Plan No. 2056 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham Road, Kew, 3101.

  - (b) Fill, add to or cleanse any private swimming pool within the specified area.
- 3. No person shall with water supplied by the Trust, water any commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers between the hours of 5.30 p.m. and 8.00 p.m. of each day.
- 4. No person shall with water supplied by the Trust, water any land comprising sports grounds, golf courses, public and club bowling and croquet greens and public and club tennis courts within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers, except between the hours of 8.00 p.m. and 10.00 p.m. of each day.
- 5. Every person who uses or permits or suffers water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00.
- 6. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this by-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied to him or for his use and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Act 1958.

# HEALESVILLE - KOO-WEE-RUP ROAD SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE







# MAIN ROAD KYNETON REDESDALE ROAD SHIRE OF METCALFE





# FOREST ROAD WARBURTON - WOODS POINT ROAD SHIRE OF UPPER YARRA Measurements in feet and inches




