DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION OF ACT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II intituled the Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Act 1967, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day or the respective days to be fixed by proclamation or successive proclamations of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my proclamation fix Monday the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight as the day upon which the said Act shall come into operation.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.-CITY OF FRANKSTON.

PROCLAMATION


By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, or a corresponding previous enactment, to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become

and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the City of Frankston has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be a public highway.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Franklin Court, Frankston, shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

Apprenticeship Act 1958.
WAITING TRADE PROCLAIMED TO BE AN APPRENTICESHIP TRADE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Section 13 of the Apprenticeship Act 1958 provides, inter alia, that after the Minister has taken into consideration any recommendation made by the Apprenticeship Commission the Governor in Council, for the purposes of the said Act, may from time to time by Proclamation proclaim any trade to be an apprenticeship trade:

AND WHEREAS the Apprenticeship Commission, having notified in the manner prescribed by the said Act its intention to recommend that the trade of waiting be proclaimed an apprenticeship trade under the said Act insofar as it is carried on in any hotel, club, restaurant, eating house or boarding house anywhere in the State of Victoria in which three or more adult persons are permanently employed in the said trade, and, having considered the representations made on behalf of employers and employees in the said trade, has recommended to the Minister that the said trade be so proclaimed:

AND WHEREAS the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the trade of waiting to be an apprenticeship trade insofar as it is carried on in any hotel, club, restaurant, eating house or boarding house anywhere in the State of Victoria in which three or more adult persons are permanently employed in the said trade, (that is to say, engaged to work a week of not less than 40 hours).

APPLICATION OF SECTION 28 OF THE DOG ACT 1958 TO THE WHOLE OF THE SHIRE OF SHERBROOKE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 23 of the Dog Act 1958, as amended, that the owner and the person (if any) for the time being in charge cf any greyhound (other than a greyhound being raced coursed exercised or trained upon land which the owner of the greyhound has obtained a right or permission to use for that purpose) which is not—

- (a) on the premises of the owner of the greyhound; or
- (b) muzzled in a manner sufficient to prevent the greyhound causing injury by biting and also under the effective control of some person by means of a chain cord or leash—

shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Six dollars and not more than Forty dollars.

AND WHEREAS it is further provided that this section shall apply to cities towns and boroughs and to such shires or parts of shires as are specified for the purposes of this section on the recommendation of the council of the shire by proclamation of the Governor-in-Council published in the Government Gazette.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Sherbrooke has recommended that the provisions of the section be applied to the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Sherbrooke.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Sherbrooke as a shire to which the provisions of the said Section 28 shall apply.

UNDERBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.: By-LAW No. 103.

Restrictions on the Use of Water.

THE Underbool Waterworks Trust (hereinafter referred to as "the Trust") in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 doth hereby make the By-Law following, restricting the use for other than domestic purposes of water supplied by the Trust within the Underbool Waterworks Trust District.

- 1. This By-Law shall come into operation at such time as the Trust from time to time directs by a notice published in a newspaper circulating generally within the District, and cease to have operation at such time as the Trust from time to time directs by a notice so published.
- 2. Subject to the provisions of Clauses 3 and 4 of this By-Law no person shall, with water supplied by the Trust-
 - (a) Water any garden, lawn or other land (other than commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms) within the specified area except by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand, between the hours of 5.30 p.m. and 7 p.m. on each day.
 - (b) Fill, add to or cleanse any private swimming pool within the specified area.
- 3. No person shall, with water supplied by the Trust, water any commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers between the hours of 5.30 p.m. and 7 p.m. of each day.
- 4. No person shall, with water supplied by the Trust, water any land comprising sports grounds, golf courses, racecourses, public and club bowling and croquet greens and public and club tennis courts within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers except between the hours of 8 p.m. and 10 p.m. each day.
- 5. No person shall wash a car within the specified area by means of a hose held in the hand.
- 6. Every person who uses or permits or suffers water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-Law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred Dollars
- 7. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-Law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied to him or for his use and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Act 1958.




ROAD MALLACOOTA FORESHORE ROAD SHIRE OF ORBOST MEASUREMENTS IN LINKS


