PROCLAMATION.

- (b) Fill, add to or cleanse any private swimming pool of a depth greater than one foot within the specified area.
- (c) Water any land grass lawn or ornamental garden comprising a nature strip on a road reserve within the specified area.
- (d) Wash any vehicle of any description by means of a hose.

3. No person shall with water supplied by the Council, water any market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms within the specified district by means of fixed sprinklers except between the hours of 6.00 A.M. and 10.00 A.M. of each day or by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand.

4. No person shall with water supplied by the Council water any land comprising sports grounds, golf courses, racecourses, public and club bowling and croquet greens and public and club tennis courts within the specified district by means of fixed sprinklers except for a maximum period of fourteen hours per week at such times as are agreed to by the Council.

5. Every person who uses or permits or suffers water supplied by the Council to be used contrary to the provisions of this By Law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred Dollars.

6. If any person supplied with water by the Council wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By Law, the Council may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied for his house and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Act 1958.

- (a) water any garden, lawn or other land within the specified area except by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand, between the hours of 5.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. of each day
- (b) wash any vehicle of any description whatsoever by means of a hose or other mechanical device
- (c) fill, add to or cleanse any private swimming pool within the specified area.

3. No person shall with water supplied by the Trust, water any land comprising sports grounds, Public and Club Bowling and Croquet Greens and Public and Club Tennis Courts within the specified area except between the hours of 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. of each day.

4. No person shall with water supplied by the Trust, water any land comprising Parks and Gardens under the control of the St. Arnaud Town Council except for a maximum period of 14 hours a week at times and under conditions to be determined by the Trust.

5. Except during the hours referred to in Clauses 2, 3 and 4 hereof no person shall attach or affix a hose or permit or suffer a hose to remain attached or affixed to any taps connected to any pipe or main used for the conveyance or supply of water by the Trust.

6. Any person who shall use or permit or suffer to be used any water supplied by the Trust contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding \$10 for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

7. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied to him or for his use and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the *Water Act 1958*.

8. The provisions of this By-law shall have effect throughout the whole of the St. Arnaud Waterworks Trust Urban District, and shall also apply to the owners or occupiers of any premises supplied with water by the Trust, outside its urban district.

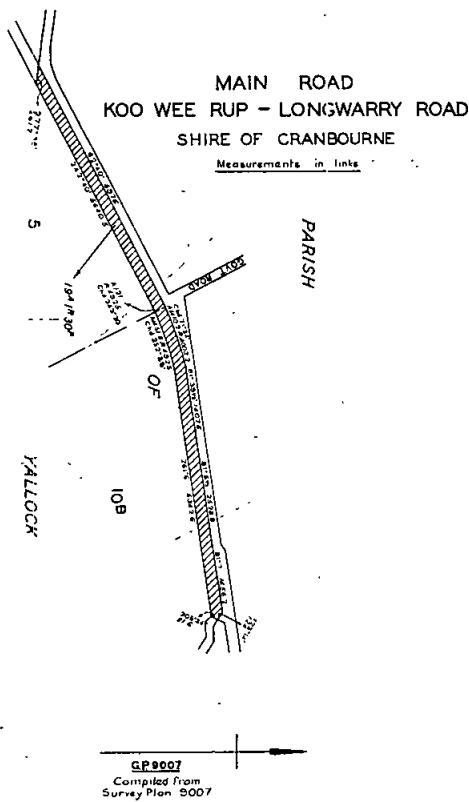
MAIN ROAD LOCH-WONTHAGGI ROAD SHIRE OF KORUMBURRA

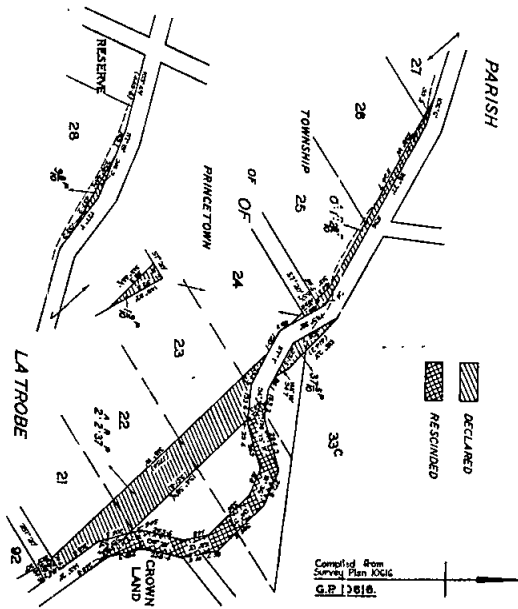
ROAD DISCONTINUED—CITY OF BRIGHTON.

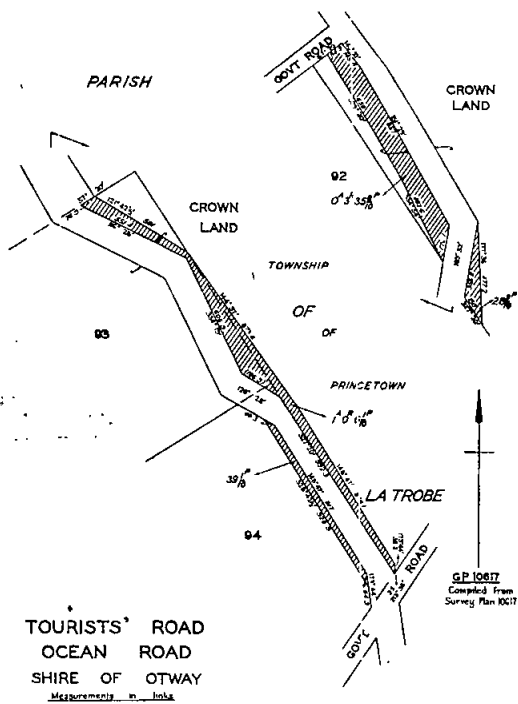

NOW THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, hereby directs:

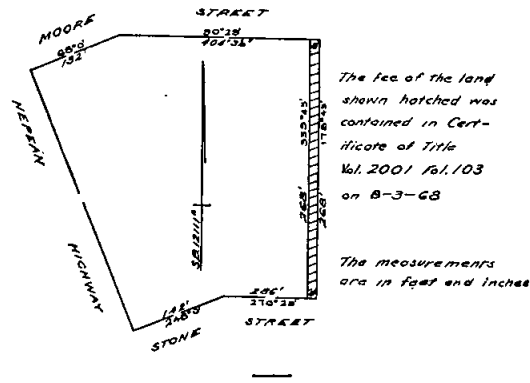

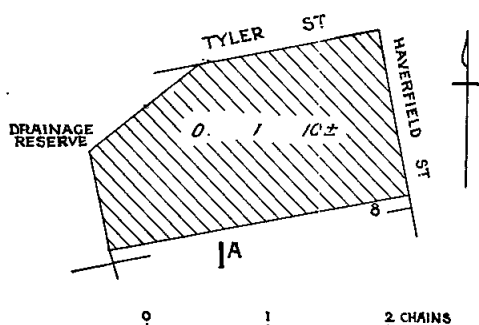

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CAPE SCHANCK AND OCEAN FRONTAGE RESERVE, SORRENTO FORESHORE RESERVE, RYE OCEAN PARK RESERVE, RYE FORESHORE RESERVE, ARTHUR'S SEAT PUBLIC PARK, SORRENTO OCEAN PARK RESERVE, FLINDERS FORESHORE RESERVE, KOONYA OCEAN PARK RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas the above-named Reserves have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserves and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William John Farquhar McDonald, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserves:—

The above-named Reserves have been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Flinders as a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Cape Schanck and Ocean Frontage Reserve, Sorrento Foreshore Reserve, Rye Ocean Park Reserve, Rye Foreshore Reserve, Arthur's Seat Public Park Reserve, Kings Falls Reserve, Sorrento Public Park Reserve, Sorrento Ocean Park Reserve, Koonya Ocean Park Reserve, Flinders Foreshore Reserve.

Parts.

2. These Regulations are divided into Parts as follows:—

Part I.—The Reserves Generally.

Part II.—Camping Areas.

Part III.—General.

Application.

3. Parts I. and III. of these Regulations shall apply to the whole of the Reserves and Part II. shall apply to any camping areas therein.

4. These Regulations are made in lieu of all previous Regulations which may have been applicable to the Reserves mentioned in the Title hereto and which Regulations are hereby revoked.

Definitions.

5. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Act" means the *Land Act 1958*.

"Authorized Officer" means any person appointed, in writing, by the Committee as an authorized officer for the purpose of these Regulations and (except for the purpose of receipt of any fees or the grant, variation or revocation of any permit) also includes any member of the Police Force and any bailiff of Crown Lands.

"Camp", without limiting the generality of the verb, includes—

(a) Erect, occupy or use any tent, or any temporary makeshift or similar form of accommodation; or

(b) park, occupy or use any caravan or other movable form of accommodation.

5. "Camping Area" means any part of the Reserves reserved under the Act or set apart by the Committee as a site for camping purposes.

"Committee" means the Committee of Management appointed, pursuant to the Act to manage the Reserves.

"Firearm" includes any rifle, gun, pistol, air pistol, gun or like thing using gas, cartridges, catapult, bow and arrow or cross bow and any other implement designed to discharge missiles capable of injuring or destroying animal life.

"Permit" includes any authority, approval, consent, permission, receipt, ticket or the like given, granted or issued under the Act or these Regulations.

"Vehicle" includes any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, cart, trailer, caravan, horse drawn vehicle, trailer and water craft.

"Building" means any tent, marquee, stall, booth, shed, bathing box, boat shed, swing boat, merry-go-round, ocean wave, toilet block or other structure or erection.

"Person" means and includes a person, a group of persons, members of any Club, Society or any organization or any member thereof and any firm or corporation (where the context so permits).

For the purpose of these Regulations words purporting the singular number shall mean and include the plural and words purporting the masculine gender shall mean and include the feminine gender where the context requires or admits.

PART I.—THE RESERVES GENERALLY.

Behaviour.

6. No person shall—

(a) Enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct;

(b) commit or create or knowingly permit or allow to continue any public or private nuisance or any annoyance to the public or any person lawfully in the Reserves whether such nuisance or annoyance takes place in a public or private building, tent, caravan or other structure or in any enclosed or unenclosed space in the Reserves or do or suffer to be done any act which in the opinion of an authorized officer is or is likely to be to the annoyance or disturbance of any person using the Reserves;

(c) Except in an area set apart for the purpose, play any game in which a hard ball is used or engage in any game or sport likely to cause interference, disturbance or danger to other persons using the Reserves.

Shooting, &c.

7. No person shall in the Reserves except in accordance with a written permit—

(a) Shoot, trap, maim, injure, kill or destroy any bird or animal;

(b) have in his possession, carry or use any firearm, poison, trap or snare.

8. (a) Any person carrying or using any firearm, poison, trap or snare in the Reserves without a permit shall surrender the same on demand to any authorized officer who shall issue a receipt therefore.

(b) The person apparently entitled to any such article may collect it from the office of the Committee after completion of investigations and legal proceedings (if any) by the Committee or the Police in relation to any offence alleged against the person who surrendered the same.

Damage.

9. (a) No person, except with a permit issued by the Committee, shall in the Reserves, remove, cut, damage, displace, deface or interfere with any rock, timber, tree, shrub, plant, wild flower or other vegetation or any sign, notice board, seat, table, gate, post, fence, bridge, building, structure or any other thing of the like nature to any of the foregoing.

(b) No person shall without a permit from the Committee, dig or remove from or take into the Reserves any gravel, stone, shell grit, sand, soil or loam.

Missiles.

10. No person shall roll or throw any stone or other substance or missile within the Reserves.

Camping.

11. No person shall camp in any part of the Reserves except in accordance with the provisions of Part II. of these Regulations.

Refuse and Litter.

12. No person shall within the Reserves deposit or cause to be deposited (except in a receptacle provided for the purpose) any bottle, glass object, vessel or other container, broken glass, tins, waste paper, foodstuff, vegetable matter, offal or other refuse or litter.

Glass, &c.

13. No person shall intentionally break any glass, bottle or other container within the Reserves and in the event of breaking any glass, bottle or other container shall immediately gather the pieces up and place them in receptacles provided.

General.

14. No person shall in any part of the Reserves, except in accordance with and upon the terms of a permit, in writing, by the Committee—

- (a) Sell or offer for sale any article whatsoever;
- (b) give out, distribute, erect, leave, set up or display any handbills, placards, notices, pamphlets, books, papers, advertising matter or the like thing;
- (c) occupy, use or enter any building, booth, shed, stand or structure unless the same is set aside for public use or held under occupancy by the person concerned;
- (d) erect or place therein any building, booth, shed or other structure;
- (e) solicit or collect money or orders for goods or services;
- (f) take part in or advertise any entertainment for gain;
- (g) preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind or use any amplifier, public address system, loud hailer or similar device;
- (h) let for hire any article, device or thing;
- (i) take photographs for gain or commercial purposes;
- (j) ply any vehicle for hire or carry passengers for fee or reward;
- (k) conduct any school or provide any form of instruction for gain;
- (l) advertise for sale or trade or hire any article, device, service or thing.

Dogs.

15. No person shall cause, suffer or permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge—

- (a) To be brought into or enter or remain in the Reserves unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash and unless such dog be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person and from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the Committee;
- (b) to be brought into or enter or remain in any camping area or any portion of the Reserves prohibited to the entry of dogs and indicated by notices.

Horses.

16. No person shall ride, drive or lead any horse upon the Reserves except for the purpose of swimming or bathing the same in Port Phillip Bay and then only in the mornings before 8 a.m.

Animals Generally.

17. (a) Save as aforesaid, no person shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any animal belonging to him or in his charge to be brought into or enter or remain in the Reserves without a permit.

(b) Any animal found in the Reserves contrary to these Regulations may be seized by an Authorized Officer and impounded or destroyed, and the owner or custodian thereof shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done by such animal to the property of the Committee.

Enclosures.

18. No person shall, except where and upon conditions authorized by the Committee, enter any area in the Reserves which is enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs or grass plots or for the growth or preservation of native flora or for re-establishment of growth or reclamation of eroded areas.

Fires.

19. No person shall without a permit light a fire within the Reserves, except in a fireplace provided by the Committee for the purpose and any person who lights a fire in the Reserves shall take all reasonable and proper precautions to ensure that the fire does not escape from control, nor shall any person wilfully, carelessly or negligently do make or permit any act or omission which may result or be likely to result in damage by fire to anything growing or being thereon.

Roadways, &c.

20. No person shall unless authorized by the Committee drive, ride, push, pull, place or leave any vehicle in or on the Reserves except in or upon such roadways or areas set aside for the purpose, and no person shall allow any vehicle to remain stationary in any position obstructing the lawful passage of others.

Parking.

21. No person shall park any vehicle within the Reserves except—

- (a) In an area set apart for the purpose and clearly defined by signs; or
- (b) as and where directed or authorized by the Committee or an Authorized Officer;
- (c) upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed.

Stranded Vehicles.

22. An Authorized Officer may remove or cause to be removed or order the removal of any parked, stranded or broken down vehicle from any roadway or area within the Reserves—provided that the removal of any vehicle—

- (a) Shall be at the sole risk of the owner of the vehicle who shall be deemed to have accepted such risk as a condition of entry to the Reserves; and
- (b) may be effected in such manner as the Authorized Officer deems fit.

Abandoned Vehicles.

23. Any vehicle left unattended within the Reserves for a continuous period exceeding 48 hours may be removed by the Committee at the risk and expense of the owner.

Use of Facilities.

24. No person shall—

- (a) Use any kitchen, laundry, change room, shower, toilet or other convenience or any part thereof in the Reserves, except for its proper purpose and upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed;
- (b) enter or use or permit any child under his care or control to enter or use any place, room, convenience or structure set apart for the use of the opposite sex; provided that this Regulation shall not apply to a child under the age of six years, when accompanied by an adult of the opposite sex;
- (c) if above the age of fourteen years, use any swings or play equipment provided for children, or (save whilst in charge of a child under that age) enter any children's playground.

Boatsheds, &c.

25. (a) The Committee may set aside sites on the Reserves for bathing boxes, boatsheds and other buildings or structures.

(b) No person shall occupy any such site or erect or maintain any such structure without a written permit from the Committee.

(c) The Committee may at any time cancel the permit given in which case the bathing box, boatshed or other structure shall be removed and in the event of it not being removed by the person to whom the permit had been given for such occupation, the Committee shall cause the bathing box, boatshed or other structure to be removed from the Reserve.

(d) No bathing box, boatshed or similar structure shall be used at any time for residential purposes and in the event of the Committee being satisfied that such bathing box, boatshed or similar structure is being used contrary to this Regulation, the permit shall be cancelled.

Direction by Sign.

26. (a) The Committee may, by clear notices or signs established in such prominent position or positions as the case requires, prohibit or regulate any act, matter or thing within the Reserves or any part thereof.

(b) No person shall erect or remove any such notice or sign except with the authority of the Committee.

(c) No person shall disobey the directions indicated in any such notice or sign.

Permits.

27. (a) The holder of any permit shall observe and comply with all conditions thereof.

(b) Any person purporting to hold any permit shall produce the same on demand by an Authorized Officer and unless such permit is thereupon produced that person shall not be entitled to claim the benefit of any such permit.

Direction to Leave.

28. (a) Any Authorized Officer may direct a person who in his opinion offends any of these Regulations forthwith to leave the Reserves or any place therein.

(b) Every person who fails to comply forthwith with any such direction shall be guilty of an offence and may be removed from the Reserves or such place.

Giving of Name.

29. If, in the opinion of an Authorized Officer, any person has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of these Regulations, then such officer may demand and receive the name and address of such person and any person who refuses to furnish his name and address or who then furnishes an incorrect name and address, shall be deemed to have committed an offence.

Obstruction to Officers.

30. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with an Authorized Officer or any employee of the Committee in the execution of his duty in the Reserves.

General.

31. Every person found to be under the influence of alcohol in the Reserves shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

32. No person shall commit any nuisance or behave in a disorderly manner in the Reserves.

33. Every person bathing from the Reserves shall be decently attired in a bathing costume.

34. No person shall play any game or take part in any activity in or on any portion of the Reserve to the danger, inconvenience or annoyance of the public or any member of the public.

35. The Committee may set apart or enclose certain parts of the Reserves for the holding of fêtes, sports, concerts, carnivals or other amusements subject to such conditions as may be set out on such permit and on such charges as the Committee shall decide.

36. Any permits required to be issued by the Committee of the Reserves shall be issued by the Secretary of the Committee or other Authorized Officer of the Committee.

PART II.—CAMPING AREAS.

General.

37. The Committee may—

- (a) Set aside any portions of the Reserves as camping areas.
- (b) Set apart individual camp sites within any camping area.
- (c) Fix and collect such fees or other charges as it may from time to time determine for the entry, use or occupation of any camping area or of any facilities or sites therein.

Conditions.

38. (a) No person shall camp except on a site set apart as aforesaid.

(b) No person shall occupy or use any site or any facilities or amenities within any camping area except in accordance with a written permit from the Committee.

(c) Any permission issued by the Committee or its Authorized Officer to a person to use a camping area or camping site may be cancelled or withdrawn by the Committee or its authorized officer, and subject to such cancellation or withdrawal a proportionate refund of any fees or charges paid in advance may be refunded, and the Committee or its authorized officer at its or his discretion may deduct and retain from any such proportionate refund such sums as it or he determines will be necessary to clean up and put in order the site in relation to which the permission has been so cancelled or withdrawn.

(d) No person shall neglect or refuse to remove forthwith, any tent, camping structure, caravan or vehicle erected or installed on any portion of the Reserves when directed to do so by the Committee or its authorized officer.

Cleanliness.

39. Every person using or in any camping area shall—

- (a) Maintain any site used or occupied by him and all appurtenances for the time being thereon in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition;
- (b) before vacating such site, clear the same of all refuse and litter whatsoever;
- (c) observe proper standards of hygiene and tidiness in the use of the camping area generally and of facilities and amenities therein;
- (d) abide by all lawful directions given by the Committee or an authorized officer.

PART III.—GENERAL.

General Powers.

40. The Committee may—

(a) Provide and maintain conveniences, facilities and amenities of any description in any part of the Reserves; or arrange for the provision and maintenance thereof and may from time to time determine or vary the conditions of entry or use thereof;

(b) make such arrangements as it deems necessary or desirable for or in connexion with the proper and efficient management and operation of the Reserves or any portion thereof.

Permits.

41. (a) Any permit may be granted for such period and subject to such terms, conditions and fees consistent with these regulations as the Committee may from time to time determine either generally or in a particular case.

(b) No permit shall be transferable.

(c) Any permit (other than a permit granted by or pursuant to a document under seal) may be revoked or withdrawn.—(Rs.1187, Rs.1010, Rs.7713, Rs.3565, Rs.1496, Rs.229, Rs.4124, Rs.2110, Rs.3605, Rs.7224.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "PHILLIP ISLAND KOALA RESERVES".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Phillip Island were reserved as sites for a Sanctuary for Native Bears and the Preservation of Koalas: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees.

And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William John Farquhar McDonald, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve without the authority, in writing, of the Curator or of a member of the Committee of Management.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, remove, cut, damage, or deface any buildings, trees (whether alive or dead) or any shrubs, ferns, plants, or bark, fruit, seeds, roots, leaves or flowers, or seats, tables, gates, posts or fences in the Reserve, or write on or otherwise, mark any tree, seat, gate, post, table, fence, pillar, railing, building, or any other erection within or in connexion with the Reserve.

4. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences in or around the Reserve or stick bills on the buildings, fences, gates, seats or trees, or cut or paint names, letters, or marks on the buildings, trees or seats, gates, posts or fences, or otherwise deface or write thereon without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

5. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any animal, including birds, of any description, or skin, egg, feathers, or nest, or carry any firearms, poison, traps, snares, or gins within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only in such places as may be directed.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for any purpose whatsoever, or offer for sale therein any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine; such written permission shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to demand the production of same.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve or allow to wander therein any horse, cattle, sheep, goat, pig, or other animal without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and the owner of any such animals found trespassing shall be liable to prosecution for breach of these Regulations.

9. The Committee of Management shall have full power to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and the Committee of Management shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any seed or portion of any plant without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserve, and all dogs found therein shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owners thereof to prosecution.

12. No person except those employed in the Reserve, and other persons engaged on official business, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, or for the protection of young native species naturally grown, or remove therefrom any plant or bark, fruit, seed, leaves, or flowers, or other part of any plant, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

13. No motor delivery cart, lorry, wagon, truck, van, or other vehicle shall be allowed within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall commit a nuisance in any part of the Reserve, or in or on any part of any building in the Reserve.

15. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve, or at any time behave in such a way as, in the opinion of the Committee of

Management, tends to frighten or disturb the native animals and/or birds therein.

These Regulations are made in lieu of all previous regulations in respect of the said land which are hereby revoked.—(Rs.79, Rs.8401, Rs.4770 and Rs.7714.)

All the Regulations made on the 12th December, 1951, with respect to the land in the Township of Berwick, temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 24th April, 1951, as a site for Showgrounds and Public Recreation, are hereby applied to the land in the Township of Berwick, temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 6th February, 1968, as a site for Show Grounds and Public Recreation.—(Rs.6654.)

- (a) Fixing the rates of fees or dues payable to the Council under Part XV. of the *Health Act 1958*.
- (b) Prescribing the times for slaughtering animals at public and private abattoirs.
- (c) The feeding watering and tending and the preventing of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in abattoirs.
- (d) Stopping temporarily the manufacture of and the sale of small goods in circumstances in which danger to the consumer is apprehended owing to uncleanness or to the presence of infection on or about the premises where such manufacture or sale is carried on.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Berwick orders as follows:

- 1. This Bylaw shall be known as the Abattoirs Bylaw.
- 2. Bylaw No. 48 of the Shire of Berwick relating to Abattoirs is hereby repealed.

3. The fees and dues which shall be demanded and received by the Council for examining animals and examining and branding carcasses offal and meat by or under the direction of the Meat Inspector shall be as follows:—

C. Any quantity of meat (not including offal) fresh or cured in pieces less than a side per cwt. or part thereof	
	0.10c.

D. Any offal—per piece 0.03c.

In this Bylaw "bobby calf" means a calf not more than six weeks old.

For any Certificate as to an examination made by a Meat Inspector 0.50c.

4. (a) The times for slaughtering animals at public or private abattoirs are hereby prescribed as being between the hours of 6 o'clock in the morning and 3 o'clock in the afternoon of any week day other than Saturday.

(b) No person shall slaughter any animals at any public or private abattoir at any time other than the times prescribed by this Bylaw, except where in the opinion of the Meat Inspector it is necessary immediately to slaughter any animal.

5. The proprietor or person in charge of any abattoir:

(a) Shall at all times cause to be provided for and to be available to all animals therein adequate water and food for the use of such animals.

(b) Shall not suffer any animal or animals therein to be overcrowded or treated with cruelty.

6. Any person having the control or management of any animal or animals in any abattoir:

(a) Shall at all times cause to be provided for and to be available to such animal or animals adequate water and food for the use of such animal or animals.

(b) Shall not suffer any such animal or animals to be overcrowded or treated with cruelty.

7. If the Medical Officer of Health at any time apprehends that danger to the consumer will result owing to uncleanness or to the presence of infection on or about any premises where the manufacture of or the sale of small goods is carried on such Medical Officer of Health may by notice in writing under his hand to the owner occupier or person in charge of such premises direct such owner occupier and person in charge to stop the manufacture and/or sale (as the case may be) of small goods from such premises until such time as such condition of uncleanness or such infection ceases and such owner occupier and person in charge of such premises shall comply with the terms of such notice.

8. This Bylaw shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal district which has been constituted a meat area by proclamation of the Governor-in-Council.

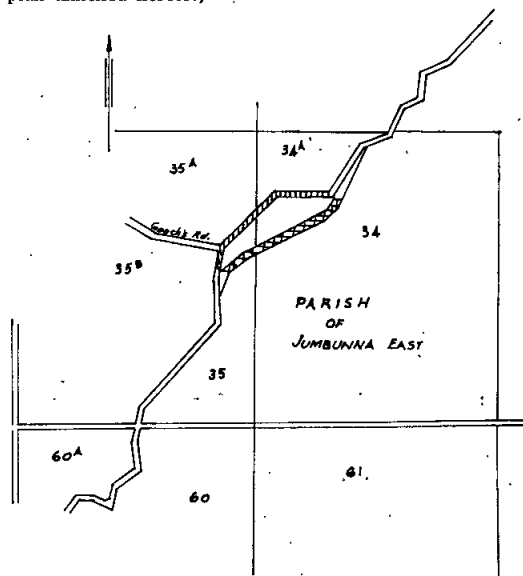
