### MINES ACT 1958.

#### **PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Mines Act 1958 it is provided that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette declare any substance to be a "mineral" within the meaning of the said Act in addition to those already referred to in the interpretation of "mineral" in subsection (1) of section 3 of the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the additional substances referred to hereunder to be "minerals" within the meaning of the said Act:

arsenic, bentonite, beryllium, cadmium, cobalt, columbium, kaolin, lithium, nickel, quartz crystal, serpentine, sulphur, talc, tantalum, titanium, serpentine, su vanadium, zinc.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight and in the seventeenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

#### **PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the seventeenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., entituled the Liquor Control Act 1968 (No. 7695), it is amongst other things enacted that the several provisions of the said Act shall

come into operation on a day or the respective days to be fixed by proclamation or successive proclamations of the Governor in Council published in the Government

NOW THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix Monday, the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight as the day on which the whole of the said Liquor Control Act 1968 (No. 7695), shall come into operation.
