DAYS OF COMING INTO OPERATION OF CERTAIN PROVISIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 2 of the *Weights and Measures (Pre-packed Articles) Act 1967*, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix the days hereinafter set out as the days on which certain provisions of the *Weights and Measures (Pre-packed Articles) Act 1967* (No. 7639) not yet in operation shall come into operation:

1. The provisions in sub-section (1) of section 3 appearing under the heading "Division 4.—Pre-Packed Articles," numbered as sub-section (4) of section 82A, section 82J and section 82J in that Division shall come into operation on the first day of November 1969.

2. Sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) of section 3 and paragraph (a) of sub-section (3) of section 3 shall come into operation on the first day of November 1969.

3. All the other provisions of the said Act except for—
 (a) the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 3 appearing under the heading "Division 4. Pre-Packaged Articles" and numbered in that Division as—
 (i) section 82D;
 (ii) section 82P;
 (iii) sub-section (1) of section 82N; and
 (iv) paragraph (g) of section 82Q; and
 (b) sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) of section 3—

shall come into operation on the twenty first day of October 1968.

Labour and Industry Act 1958.

ORDER OF EXEMPTION UNDER SECTION 80A.

WHEREAS pursuant to section 80A of the *Labour and Industry Act 1958* as amended by the *Labour and Industry (Amendment) Act 1955* the council of the Shire of Mansfield has applied to the Minister for an order exempting shopkeepers of shops in its municipal district from being required to close and keep closed their shops in accordance with the provisions of Part VI. of the said Act:

AND WHEREAS I have considered the report of the Tourist Development Authority obtained in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (4) of section 80A of the said Act:

NOW THEREFORE I, John Frederick Rossiter, Her Majesty's Minister of Labour and Industry in the State of Victoria, do pursuant to the aforesaid section 80A of the *Labour and Industry Act 1958* make this Order granting exemption to any shopkeeper within the area mentioned in the First Schedule hereto from being required to close and keep closed his shop, at any time when he would but for this Order be required to close and keep closed that shop in accordance with Part VI. of the said Act on

Mondays to Saturdays, inclusive, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 p.m. during the periods of the year mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto:

Provided that such exemption shall not apply to Christmas Day.

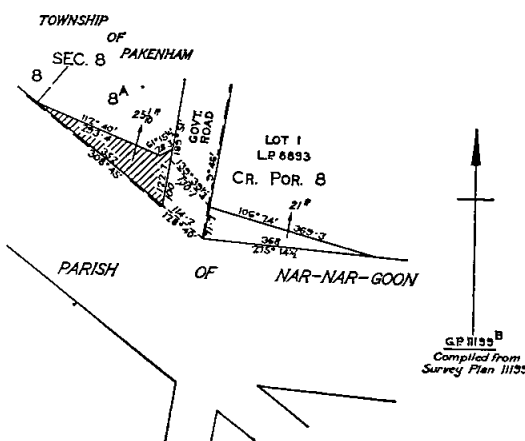

Marine Act 1958.

AMENDMENT OF PILOTAGE RATES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 79 of the Marine Act 1958, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine, that on and after the 1st day of October, 1968, Pilotage Rates for shipping shall be amended in accordance with the rates as set out hereunder:—

(A) PORT PHILLIP.

1. The Pilotage Rates for ships from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, shall be—

- (a) \$0.0275 per gross ton for ships not exceeding 20,000 gross tons, subject in any case to a maximum charge of \$440 and a minimum charge of \$60;
- (b) \$455 for ships exceeding 20,000 gross tons and not exceeding 30,000 gross tons;
- (c) \$470 for ships exceeding 30,000 gross tons and not exceeding 40,000 gross tons;
- (d) \$485 for ships exceeding 40,000 gross tons and not exceeding 50,000 gross tons; and
- (e) \$500 for ships exceeding 50,000 gross tons.

2. The Pilotage Rate from an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay to an anchorage or pier in Corio Bay, or vice versa, shall be \$0.0104 per gross ton, subject in any case to a maximum charge of \$130 and a minimum charge of \$60.

3. The Pilotage Rate from one place to another in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay; from Hobson's Bay to a Melbourne wharf or vice versa, from Newport, Footscray or Yarraville to a Melbourne wharf or vice versa, or any intermediate distance shall be \$0.0042 per gross ton, subject in any case to a maximum charge of \$110 and a minimum charge of \$42.

(B) WESTERNPORT.

1. The Pilotage Rates for ships from without Westernport Bay to an anchorage or the Refinery pier within Westernport Bay, or vice versa, shall be—

- (a) \$0.0275 per gross ton for ships not exceeding 20,000 gross tons, subject in any case to a maximum charge of \$440 and a minimum charge of \$60;
- (b) \$455 for ships exceeding 20,000 gross tons and not exceeding 30,000 gross tons;
- (c) \$470 for ships exceeding 30,000 gross tons and not exceeding 40,000 gross tons;
- (d) \$485 for ships exceeding 40,000 gross tons and not exceeding 50,000 gross tons; and
- (e) \$500 for ships exceeding 50,000 gross tons.

2. The Pilotage Rate from one place to another in Westernport Bay shall be \$0.0042 per gross ton, subject in any case to a maximum charge of \$110 and a minimum charge of \$42.

(C) SPECIAL RATES.

The Pilotage Rate for a pleasure yacht or other ship not being a Ship of War resorting to port only for or on account of one or more of the following purposes or causes, namely, pleasure or seeking cargo or calling for orders or effecting repairs or docking or obtaining provisions or filling up bunkers or through stress of weather undergoing survey or being otherwise in distress, subject to the proviso that should the ship subsequently discharge or load any cargo or land or take on board any passengers in the port for the purpose of, or incidental to earning freight or passage money, the ship and those concerned shall be liable to pay the ordinary full rates of pilotage in respect of the ship both inwards and outwards:—

1. From without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, \$0.015 per gross ton, subject in any case to a maximum charge of \$100 and a minimum charge of \$30.

2. From without Westernport Bay to an anchorage or the Refinery pier within Westernport Bay, or vice versa, \$0.015 per gross ton, subject in any case to a maximum charge of \$100 and a minimum charge of \$30.

3. From one place to another in Hobson's Bay, Corio Bay, or Westernport Bay; from Hobson's Bay to a Melbourne wharf or vice versa; from Newport, Footscray or Yarraville to a Melbourne wharf or vice versa; or any intermediate distance, \$0.0025 per gross ton, subject in any case to a maximum charge of \$50 and a minimum charge of \$20.

4. Ships of War which have had the services of a pilot for any port shall only be required to pay the minimum pilotage charge laid down for that port.

5. The fee for the delayed departure of a ship, which occasions the detention of a pilot on board such ship for more than two hours, as determined by clause 34A of "The Pilot Regulations 1931", shall be \$20 for such detention and shall be paid in the same manner as and in addition to any pilotage at the prescribed rate which is or may become payable for pilotage services rendered to such ship, and in addition to any liability under section 81 of the *Marine Act* 1958.

All the Regulations made on the 27th July, 1931, with respect to the land in the Township of Sunbury, temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of the 16th March, 1897, and the 15th January, 1963, as sites for Public Park and Recreation, are hereby applied to the land in the Township of Sunbury temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 30th July, 1968, as a site for Public Park and Recreation.—(Rs.1758.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the Land Act 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE YEA CIVIC CENTRE RESERVE.

WHEREAS by Section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Township of Yea were reserved as a site for Municipal Offices, a Court House and Children's Playground: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William John Farquhar McDonald, Her

Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Yea (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with power and authority to enforce the following regulations.

1. No person shall interfere with, move, damage or destroy any shrub, tree, plant, grass, flowers, or any property, or enter on any flower bed or borders, or light fires within the Reserve.
2. No person shall throw stones or missiles of any kind within the Reserve.
3. No person shall climb on any portion of any building, balustrade, or property in the Reserve, or jump over any fence or hedge thereon.
4. No person shall affix or interfere with any placard, bill, notice, or marking of any kind on any building, structure, tree, constructed surface, or anything within the Reserve.
5. No person shall enter or travel over the Reserve with or on any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle, except on such portions thereof provided for wheeled traffic, and the driver of such motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle shall be guided and directed, and shall abide by any notice, post, or sign, marking or barrier guide which has been marked or erected for the purpose of traffic guidance, control or direction.
6. No person shall drive a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public, or likely to cause any damage to anything within the Reserve.
7. No person or persons except with the authority of the Committee shall park any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle or other vehicle within the Reserve.
8. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats, or any wall, structure, or property within the Reserve.
9. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or is not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Reserve, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.
10. No person shall remain within the Reserve, or on any property therein, when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown lands, or member of the Police Force, or authorized officer of the Committee.
11. No person shall hawk, or sell, or offer for sale, within the Reserve any goods, fruit, or merchandise, or anything, or solicit or gather money therein, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee.
12. No person shall give out, or distribute, any hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Reserve, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.
13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless securely held by a chain, cord, or leash.
14. No person shall bring in or allow to remain in the Reserve any horse, cow, sheep, pig, or goat, and any such animal found wandering therein shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed.
15. No person, except on lawful occasions, may enter any enclosed area or any building, garage, or shed, or other structure within the Reserve.
16. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing within the Reserve without the authority in writing of the Committee.
17. No person above the age of fourteen years shall use the playground or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents or others in charge of children shall be at liberty to enter the Reserve to watch over children who are in their charge.
18. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Reserve, except for the purposes for which they are respectively provided.
19. Every person in the Reserve shall obey the lawful directions of any officer of the Committee of Management in respect of his or her conduct herein.
20. Any bailiff of the Crown lands, member of the Police Force, or duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee of Management shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty provided under these Regulations) to remove or exclude from the Reserve any person who commits a

breach of these Regulations, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Reserve.—(Rs.8970).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ARARAT PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE (TROTTERING ARENA).

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Township and Parish of Ararat and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the 22nd day of November, 1967, were reserved as a site for Public Recreation: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William John Farquhar McDonald, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Regulations have been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games, recreation, or sports, and from time to time grant to any person, club, or association, upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.
2. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all powers incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1958*.
3. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Fifty dollars (\$50) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall carry on the business or calling of a bookmaker except in and upon such portions of the Reserve as may be set aside for that purpose, and then only when he shall—
 - (a) have obtained the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management on payment of a fee not to exceed Ten dollars (\$10) for any meeting or sporting event held in the Reserve, and
 - (b) that during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on the business or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket or have a bag either of which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.

5. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve except in the part or parts thereof which are set apart for such purposes by the Committee of Management and then only on the payment of such fee and subject to such conditions as are determined by such Committee.

8. No person shall erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in the fire-places provided for the purpose.

12. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon.

15. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, litter, or rubbish in the Reserve except in a place provided for the purpose and indicated by notice board.

16. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve, or in any of the rooms, building, structures, erection, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations:—

- (a) Assaulting or threatening any person or persons.
- (b) Entering, crossing, being on, or trespassing on any playing ground area, enclosure, or course, or building, room, or structure, or any part thereon whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment or amusement is being played, conducted or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee of Management.
- (c) Being under the influence of liquor.
- (d) Using profane, indecent, obscene or unseemly language.
- (e) Using threatening, abusive, offensive, or insulting words.
- (f) Behaving improperly, offensively or riotously.
- (g) Interfering with, or interrupting any game, sports, competition, entertainment or amusement or practice thereat.
- (h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.

No person shall—

- (a) remain in the Reserve who behaves in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or creates or takes part in any disturbance.
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

18. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

19. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound, or noise to be emitted from any amplifier, loud speaker, public address system, or like instrument, without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee of Management, and such permission

may be granted subject to such terms, conditions, and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.—(Rs.8890.)

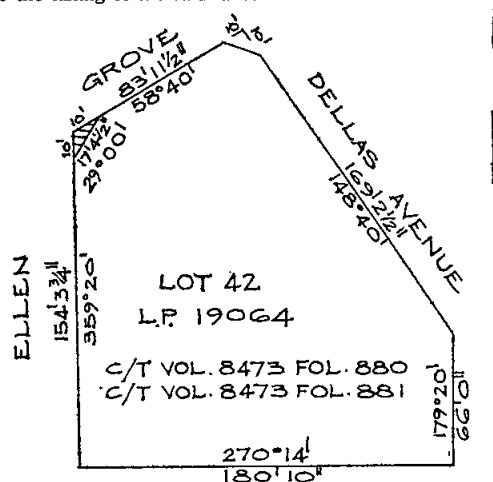

By-Law No. 59.

Animal By-Law.

A By-Law of the City of Nunawading made under Sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and Section 93 of the *Health Act 1958* and numbered 59 for regulating the keeping of animals for restricting restraining or prohibiting the erection construction use occupation conversion and alteration of and any addition to buildings or erections and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* the *Health Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Nunawading orders as follows:

PART I.—GENERAL.

1. This By-Law may be known as the Animal By-Law.
2. Clauses 3 to 6 and 12 to 18 of By-Law No. 18 of the City of Nunawading relating to suppressing nuisances and regulating or prohibiting the keeping of animals are hereby repealed.

3. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:

- "Animal" means and includes cow heifer bull bullock horse goat swine pig and sheep and the young thereof.
- "Cat" means and includes a cat of either sex over the age of three months.
- "Dog" means and includes a dog of either sex over the age of six months.
- "Dwelling" includes a living room sleep out or tent and all rooms for sleeping living and cooking.
- "Horse" means and includes any stallion mare gelding pony colt or foal ass or mule or any animal used for burden or draft or for carrying persons.
- "Stable" means and includes any building or erection used or intended to be used for the purpose of confining protecting or sheltering any horse.

PART II.—ANIMALS.

4. (Save Clause 8 hereof) This part shall apply to and have operation throughout the parts of the municipal district set out and described in the first schedule hereto. Clause 8 hereof shall apply to and have operation throughout the parts of the municipal district set out and described in the first schedule hereto other than that part of the municipal district set out and described in the second schedule hereto.

5. No person shall on any property keep more than one animal unless the area of such property is not less than the number of such animals multiplied by one half acre.

6. No person shall on any land keep any animal within a distance of:

- (a) Six feet from any street or road.
- (b) Six feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.
- (c) Twenty feet from any dwelling whether on the same or any adjoining land.

7. The occupier of any land on which are kept any animals shall:

- (a) Cause all manure refuse and rubbish produced or accumulated on such land to be forthwith placed in a properly constructed fly and vermin proofed receptacle with impervious walls and impervious floor and shall:
 - (i) at all times maintain such receptacle in a good state of repair so as to prevent the escape or leakage of the contents.
 - (ii) keep such receptacle at all times covered with a fly and vermin proof lid and from time to time as may be required by the Health Inspector of the Municipality effectively deodorise the same.
 - (iii) cause the contents of such receptacle to be removed and disposed of to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector at least once in every week.
- (b) Cause the floor of such receptacle to be paved with concrete or other approved impervious material and properly graded and drained to an approved silt trap and outlet.
- (c) Maintain such receptacle at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

8. No person shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept on any property more than two dogs or four cats.

PART III.—CLEANLINESS.

9. The ground surrounding any stable or receptacle for manure shall be well drained.

10. The occupier of any land on which any stable is erected shall keep the area of land within five feet of such stable free from all dry grass weeds refuse rubbish or other materials capable of harbouring rats or vermin.

11. No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any land where animals are kept any food for consumption by such animals unless such food is kept or stored in rat proof receptacles or rat proof buildings.

12. The occupier of any land shall cause any stable thereon to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same at all times in a clean wholesome and sanitary condition.

13. The occupier of any land on which any animal is kept shall cause any animal kept thereon which shall develop diphtheria tuberculosis or other contagious or infectious disease injurious to human beings to be forthwith destroyed and disposed of to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector of the Municipality.

PART IV.—MISCELLANEOUS.

14. Save as is otherwise herein provided this By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
