BALLARAT WEST TOWN COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

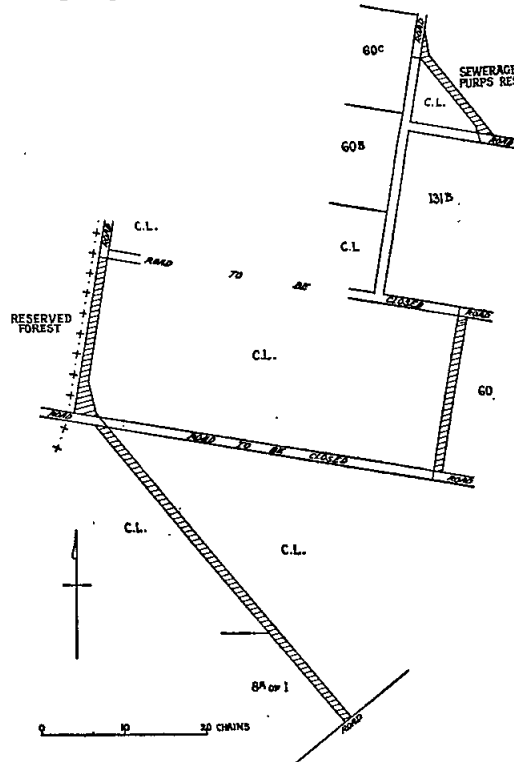

MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961, SECTION 4 (1).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity:

AND WHEREAS the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission has been appointed the Authority in respect of the waters of Lake Eppalock:

AND WHEREAS the said Authority has recommended that the use of certain parts of the waters of Lake Eppalock be prohibited for all classes of motor boating:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, do by this my Proclamation prohibit the use of those parts of the waters of Lake Eppalock specified hereunder for all classes of motor boating:—

*Strath Bay*—The northern waters of Strath Bay, northward of a line between two beacons marked "No motor boats" on opposing shores.

*Motor Boating Act 1961.*  
CAIRN CURRAN RESERVOIR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* set aside, prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity:

AND WHEREAS the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission has been appointed the Authority over the waters of Cairn Curran Reservoir:

AND WHEREAS the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission has recommended that the use of certain parts of the waters of Cairn Curran Reservoir be set aside for boating (except the anchoring or mooring of boats):

NOW THEREFORE, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby set aside the waters of Cairn Curran Reservoir specified hereunder for boating except the anchoring or mooring of boats (that is to say):—

*Woolshed Bay*—

(a) The waters within an off-shore distance of 200 feet around the point at the northern limit of Woolshed Bay for a distance of about 100 yards between beacons along the shore.

(b) The waters within an off-shore distance of 200 feet on the south side of Woolshed Bay between a beacon situated on the shore approximately 200 yards easterly from the point where the shoreline meets the western end of the unused road in Allotment I, Section IIIA, Parish of Baringhup, and a beacon situated on the shore approximately 200 yards distant in an easterly direction.

*Upstream of Dam*—

The waters within an off-shore distance of 200 feet between a beacon on the western shore of the Reservoir approximately 25 chains upstream of the Dam and a beacon a further 200 yards along that shore.

*Lethbridge's Bay*—

The waters within an off-shore distance of 200 feet between beacons about 200 yards apart on the northern side of Lethbridge's Bay, about a mile and a quarter northward of the Maryborough—Castlemaine railway line.

## BY-LAW No. 5.

THE Yarram Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-Law as follows:—

1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any lands or tenements shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-Law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

2. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust:—

- (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at FIFTEEN cents per thousand gallons for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.
- (b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at THIRTEEN cents per thousand gallons for any meter year.
- (c) For all water supplied to farm properties within the Urban District of the Trust in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at TWENTY-FIVE cents per thousand gallons for any meter year.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at TWENTY-FIVE cents per thousand gallons.

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at TWENTY DOLLARS for any meter year.

5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

6. The provisions of clauses 2, 3, & 4 of this By-Law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1969.

THE Yarram Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-Law as follows:—

1. The Trust hereby makes and levies a rate in respect of all the lands and tenements within the Yarram Urban District of FIVE cents in the Dollar on the net annual value set out in the valuation at present in force of such lands and tenements for the purposes of the municipal rate of the Shire of Alberton which is hereby adopted as the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively.

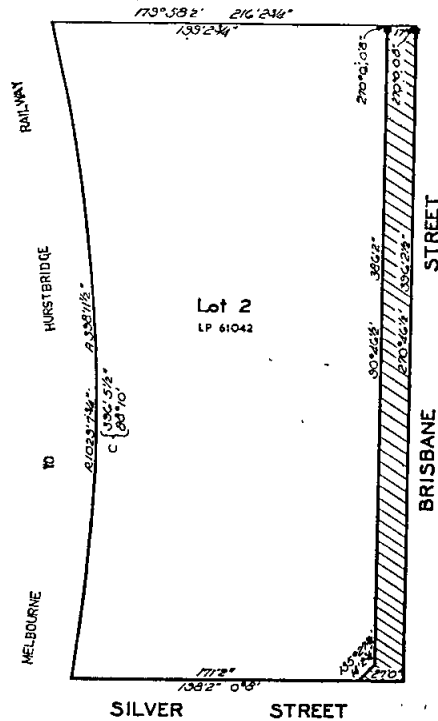
