AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF
THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Section 916 of the *Local Government Act* 1958, provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor-in-Council may, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the Council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of Part XLIX of the said Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

AND WHEREAS by Proclamations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th March, 1949 and the 16th September 1964, the operation of the said Part was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Swan Hill.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Swan Hill has requested that the operation of the said Part be extended to further parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Swan Hill.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX of the *Local Government Act* 1958, as amended, to those portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Swan Hill described hereunder:

Parish of Boga:

Crown Allotments A2, 9, 9B, 9b, 8 and A Murrabit Pre-emptive Right of Section 1.
Crown Allotments A1, A2, A3, A4, A5, A6, A7, A8, 4, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4b, 4f and Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 of Section IV.

Parish of Kunat Kunat:

Crown Allotments 7d, 10, 9 of Section 1.
Crown Allotment 1 of Section 2, A Lake Boga Pre-emptive Right.
Crown Allotments 6A, 6 and 1 of Section 3A.
Township of Lake Boga as per *Government Gazette* at pages 3710 in 1892 and 2362 in 1900.

And order that the said Regulation shall come into operation in the above described parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Swan Hill on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* provided that parts I and II of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 20th February, 1969, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III of the said Chapter and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 20th February 1969.

If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid rate becomes during the year 1969 a "sewered property" there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a sewered property, and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.

6. For making and levying such rate the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined in the manner provided in the Sewerage Districts Acts.

7. Such person or persons as the Seymour Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be or is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate and charges.

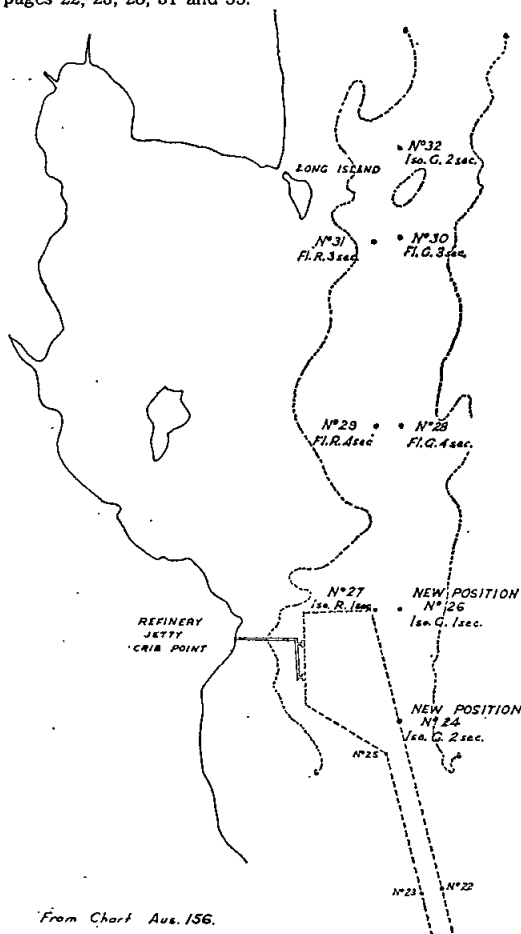
