PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in Section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say) :—

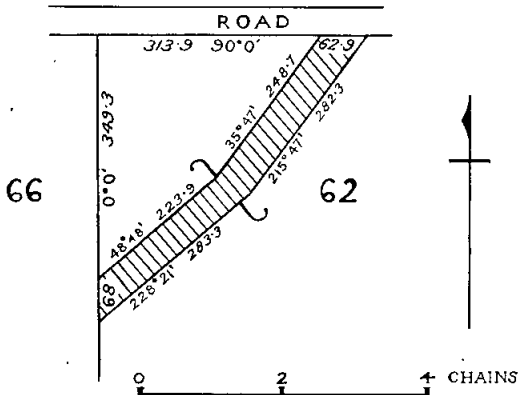

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and with effect on and from the fourth day of July, 1969, hereby proclaim the Shire of Knox to be a city under the name of the City of Knox.

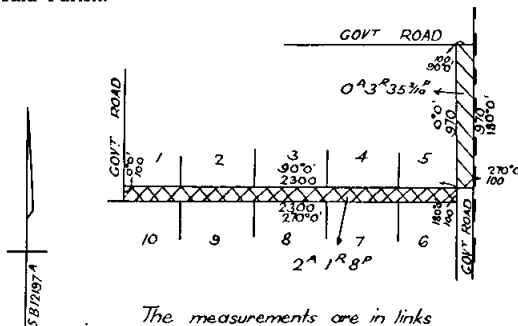

THE Rutherglen Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-law as follows:—

1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter year") shall be the basis of calculating charges payable under this By-law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

2. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust—

(a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at Fifteen cents per thousand gallons for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause is hereby fixed at Fifteen cents per thousand gallons for any meter year.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Fifteen cents per thousand gallons.

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Fifteen dollars per annum.

5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust, Shire Hall, Rutherglen, during normal business hours.

6. The provisions of Clauses 3, 4 and 5 of this By-law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.

LAKE MERRIMU—GOODMAN'S CREEK WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATION OF LAND-USE, PLAN No. 2246.

PROCLAIMED 13th February, 1968, *Victoria Government Gazette*, No. 14, dated 21st February, 1968, pursuant to section 22 of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958*.

In pursuance of the provisions of section 23, sub-section (1) of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372), the Soil Conservation Authority, after consultation with the Land Utilization Advisory Council, has determined the land-use for all that area of land in the Parishes of Coimadai, Bullengarook and Coornmill within the boundaries of the Lake Merrimu-Goodman's Creek Water Supply Catchment delineated and marked on plan No. 2246, the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority. All land within this area shall be used in accordance with the provisions of the particular category of land-use to which each area has been assigned. The boundaries of land-use areas shown on plan No. 2246 are intended as a guide to landholders, who should consult with the Soil Conservation Authority before making any changes in land-use.

The provisions of each of the land-use categories are set out hereunder.

Category No. 1.

Land which shall be used for permanent forest where forestry operations shall be carried out only in accordance with management conditions made or approved by the Soil Conservation Authority. No tree shall be removed and no soil shall be disturbed within a minimum distance of 1 chain from the banks of all streams and watercourses without the specific approval of the Authority. Grazing, the construction of roads, dams, or earthworks of any description are subject to the approval of the Authority.

Category No. 2.

Land which may be used for grazing subject to conditions made or approved by the Authority, such conditions to include:—

- A. The specification of areas suitable for clearing and those which are to remain under forest.
- B. The application of management and conservation practices where necessary.

Category No. 3.

Land which shall be used primarily for grazing where cropping may be practised only under management conditions made or approved by the Authority. Such conditions to include the specification of length of rotation and conservation practices where necessary.

Category No. 4.

Land suitable for cropping, subject to conditions imposed by the Authority for particular circumstances and where changes in land-use shall be subject to approval by the Soil Conservation Authority.

Category No. 5.

Land which shall be used for the protection of streams and watercourses where:—

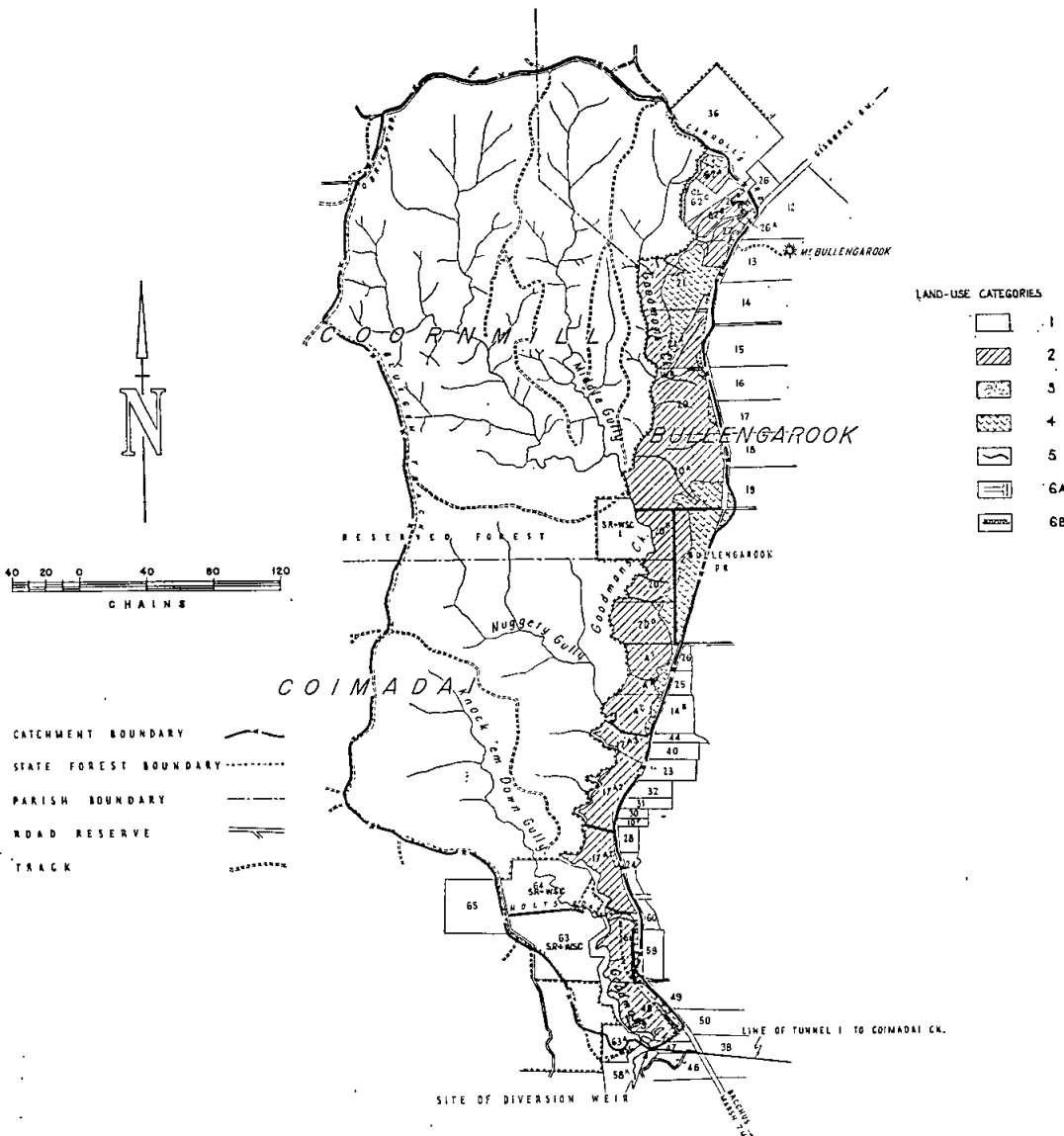
1. No tree shall be removed or soil disturbed in any way without the specific approval of the Authority.
2. The crossing of streams and watercourses is permitted only by means of properly constructed crossings specifically approved for the particular site by the Soil Conservation Authority.

This category covers areas within 5 chains of the offtake weir and within 1 chain or such greater distance as the Authority may require from the banks of streams, springs and watercourses within this catchment.

Category No. 6.

- 6A. Land used or reserved for roads on which any changes in land-use shall be made only after consultation with the Soil Conservation Authority.
- 6B. Land reserved for roads on which any changes in land-use shall be made only with the approval of the Soil Conservation Authority.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 5601—URBAN DISTRICTS—FIXING CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE AND REVOKING BY-LAW NO. 5525.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall be substituted for By-law No. 5525 which is hereby revoked.

2. This By-law shall apply within the urban districts named in the Schedule hereunder and shall take effect as hereinafter provided notwithstanding the provisions of any previous By-law.

3. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any property within the said urban districts shall be read once in every financial year as near as practicable to the same date and the quantity so measured as having been supplied during the period (hereinafter called the "meter year") between any two successive such readings shall be the basis of charges payable under this By-law.

4. (a) In respect of any property rated or supplied by the Commission the maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge shall, except where a special agreement with the Commission applies, be the quantity which if charged at twenty-five cents per thousand gallons would give an amount equal to:—

- (i) the amount of the rate or minimum annual charge payable, if any, in the previous financial year if the meter year ends at any time from 1st July to 30th September, both dates inclusive, or
- (ii) the amount of the rate or minimum annual charge payable, if any, in the current financial year if the meter year ends at any time from 1st October to 30th June, both dates inclusive.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge shall be twenty-five cents per thousand gallons.

5. The charges as set out in Clause 4 of this By-law shall be payable on demand at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at the place mentioned in Column 2 opposite the name of the respective urban districts in Column 1 of the Schedule hereunder.

6. Interest will be chargeable on all charges for water remaining unpaid for a period of three months from the date they become payable.

7. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand receive collect and recover the said charges for water.

Four (4) barrel buoys coloured yellow and black with the reflecting topmarks will be located in approximately eighteen (18) feet of water on the seaward side of the bar.

These buoys will be placed to the eastward and westward of a line joining the flagstaff and the green Entrance Light.

Several small flag buoys may also be laid in the area.

Mariners are required to keep clear of the above buoys and of the dredger whilst it is working in the area.

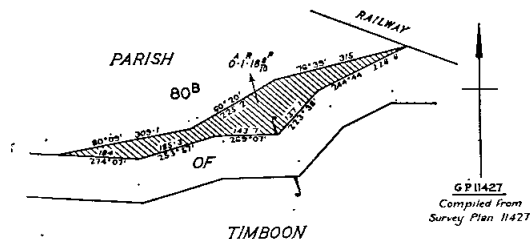

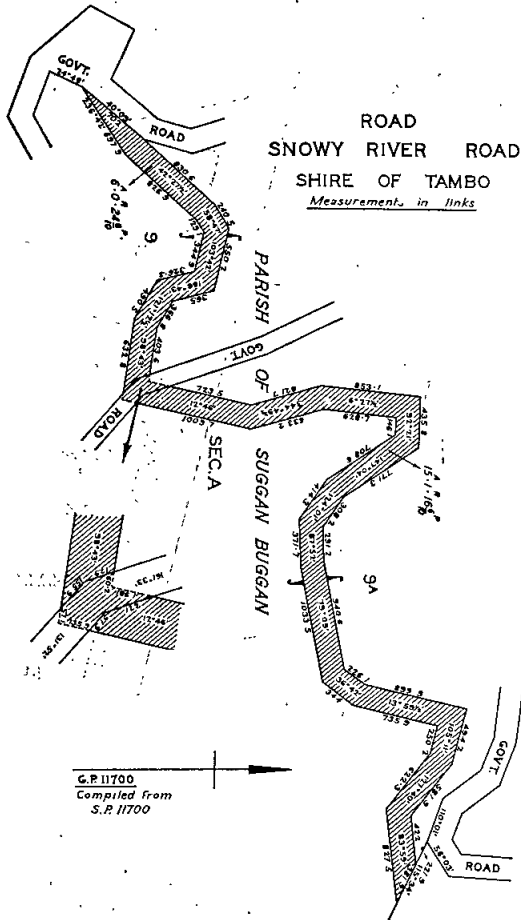

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made the 19th day of June, 1962, it was ordered *inter alia* that the land described in the Schedule thereto should be included in the Metropolis as defined by the said Act and further provided that the functions of any Sewerage Authority and of any Drainage Authority should continue in respect of such land: And whereas by Order in Council made the 30th day of April, 1963, the above-mentioned Order in Council was varied to describe more particularly the works and property to be vested in the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "the Board"): And whereas by Order in Council made the 16th day of June, 1965, the first-mentioned Order was further varied to include a further portion of the Municipality of Chelsea within the said Metropolis: And whereas the Chelsea Sewerage Authority (hereinafter called "the Authority") has duly constructed a sewerage treatment works with pumping stations and main and reticulation sewers within the Municipality of Chelsea to provide sewerage services for the portion of the area which is subject to its jurisdiction: And whereas it is proposed that the Board will take over all the works and property of the Authority with the exception of the lands described in certificates of title, volume 8690, folio 339 and volume 7665, folio 056 and the sewerage treatment works constructed thereon on the 1st October, 1969: And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Board by the said Act the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof hereby orders that the Order in Council made on the 19th day of June, 1962, and published in the Government Gazette on the 27th June, 1962, and as subsequently varied be further varied as follows:—

1. That Clause 3 of the said Order in Council shall be deleted and in substitution therefor there shall be inserted the following clause:—

"3. That all lands situate within the Municipality of the City of Chelsea whether vested in fee or otherwise in the Authority and the inheritance of all such lands in fee and interests rights benefits and advantages appurtenant to or relating to all or any of such lands and the mains pumping stations buildings plant or works thereon and all interests rights benefits and advantages vested in possessed by or accruing to the Authority over in or relating to any other land adjacent to such land and all sewer mains pipes branches manholes pumping plant and ancillary equipment rising mains valves penstocks and all other works and all personal property connected therewith and used or intended to be used for the purposes of providing sewerage facilities to persons residing or being on the said land (other than the land comprised in certificates of title, volume 8690, folio 339, and volume 7665, folio 056 and all interests rights benefits and advantages appurtenant thereto including the metering equipment associated with the reticulation rising main) shall from the 1st day of October, 1969, be vested in the Board."

2. That Clause 4 of the said Order in Council shall be deleted and in substitution therefor the following clause shall be inserted:—

"4. That consequent on the extension of the Metropolis as aforesaid Parts I. to IX. inclusive of the said Act shall apply to the land so included in the Metropolis."

3. That the following clauses be added to the said Order namely:—

"7. That in respect of the said land the Board may as from the 1st day of October, 1969, make and levy a Sewerage Rate (in the said Act described as a Metropolitan General Rate) greater than the same rate levied in respect of land in the Metropolis generally but in any case not exceeding 12 cents in the dollar provided that in respect of the period from the 1st day of October, 1969, until the 30th day of June, 1970, there shall be levied a proportionate part only of the Sewerage Rate (Metropolitan General Rate) appropriate to this period."

Schedules as above, with full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown and any information afforded to persons tendering.

Should the tenderer be in a position to supply a suitable substitute of Commonwealth production or manufacture in place of any sample exhibited that may be of imported origin, he may tender for such substitute, but must submit with his tender a sample of the article offered.
