PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, together with the short titles, that is to say:—

BECOME TRUSTEES OF COBURG PUBLIC CEMETERY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by Section 87A of the Cemeteries Act 1958, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation fix the 15th April 1970 as the day on which the Trustees for the time being of the Coburg Public Cemetery shall go out of office as such Trustees and thereupon the Trustees of the New Melbourne Cemetery shall become and be the Trustees of the Coburg Public Cemetery and the property (whether real or personal) rights, duties, functions and obligations formerly vested in the Trustees of the Coburg Public Cemetery shall vest in the Trustees of the New Melbourne Cemetery.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF
THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Section 916A of the Local Government Act 1958, provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor-in-Council may, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of Part XLIX. of the said Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof.

And whereas by Proclamations published in the Government Gazette on the 27th August 1952, 19th June 1957 and the 25th March 1970, the operation of the said Part was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Tambo.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Tambo has requested that the operation of the said Part be extended to a further part of the municipal district of the Shire of Tambo.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Tambo defined hereunder:

Commencing at the south-east corner of C.A. 10A, Parish of Colquhoun, County of Tambo; thence northerly to the north-east corner of the said C.A.; thence generally easterly along the southern boundaries of C.A. 103, 102A and 102B, to the south-east corner of C.A. 102B; thence northerly along the said C.A. to the northern tip of C.A. 101H; thence generally south-easterly along same C.A. to a point due west of the most western point of C.A. 90; thence due east to such point; thence generally north-easterly and easterly along the boundaries of C.A. 90, 85A, and 85, to a point due south of the south-east tip of C.A. 89B; thence in a straight line from this point across the North Arm to the south-west corner of C.A. 9, Section A of the same Parish; thence generally northerly along the western boundaries of C.A.'s 9, 8, 7, 6 and 5 of the same section; thence generally north easterly along the northern boundaries of C.A.'s 5, 4, 3 and 1, Section A, to the northern tip of the said C.A. 1; thence in a straight line generally north-easterly across C.A. 124, Parish of Colquhoun, to the north-west corner of C.A. 126; thence generally easterly along the northern boundaries of C.A.'s 126 and 30A, Parish of Colquhoun, and C.A.'s 31, 37 and 38 of the Township of Cunningham, to the north-east corner of the said C.A. 38; thence generally northerly and easterly along the Township boundary to the south-east point of C.A. 131C, Parish of Colquhoun; thence generally northerly and north-easterly around the boundary of C.A. 131D to the north-east corner of the same C.A.; thence

in a straight line to the most westerly point of C.A. 153; thence generally easterly along the southern boundary of the Government Road between C.A.'s 153 and 152 to the high water mark on the southern shore of Fishermans Arm of Lake Tyers; thence generally easterly and southerly around the shore of Lake Tyers to a point due east from the most easterly point of C.A. 1; Township of East Cunninghame; thence due south to high water mark on the Ninety Mile Beach; thence generally south-westerly along the high water mark of the Ninety Mile Beach to the boundary between the Counties of Tambo and Tanjil at the Lake Entrance; thence generally north-westerly and westerly along this boundary to Jemmy's Point and along the high water mark of the north shore of Lake King to a point due south of the commencing point; thence due north to the commencing point of C.A. 10A, Parish of Colquhoun.

And order that the said Regulation shall come into operation in the above described part of the municipal district of the Shire of Tambo on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall be deemed not to come into operation until the 22nd July, 1970 except insofar as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 22nd July, 1970.

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 (No. 6304).

THE ONION MARKETING BOARD.

BY Proclamation duly made on Tuesday, the twenty-fourth day of March, 1970, under the provisions of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 (No. 6304), and published in the Victoria Government Gazette, No. 31, on the third day of April, 1970, page 868, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria acting pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, provided and declared that on and from the fifth day of April, 1970, all onions coming into existence within two years from the fifth day of April, 1970, shall subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Onion Marketing Board, and that all such onions shall be delivered by the producers thereof to the Onion Marketing Board or its authorized receiving agent.

The Onion Marketing Board by this public notice requires and directs that all onions subject to the said Act be delivered in accordance with the said Act and that all such onions be tendered for delivery by producers thereof or their servants or agents to the Onion Marketing Board or its appointed receiving agents in the manner and at the time and place as shall in the particular circumstances be notified or directed by the Onion Marketing Board or its appointed receiving agents to each producer thereof and by each and every producer neglecting failing or refusing to deliver his onions in such manner and by each and every other producer who has not been so notified or directed on the 30th day of November, 1970, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon at the premises of the nearest appointed receiving agent wheresoever from time to time situated.

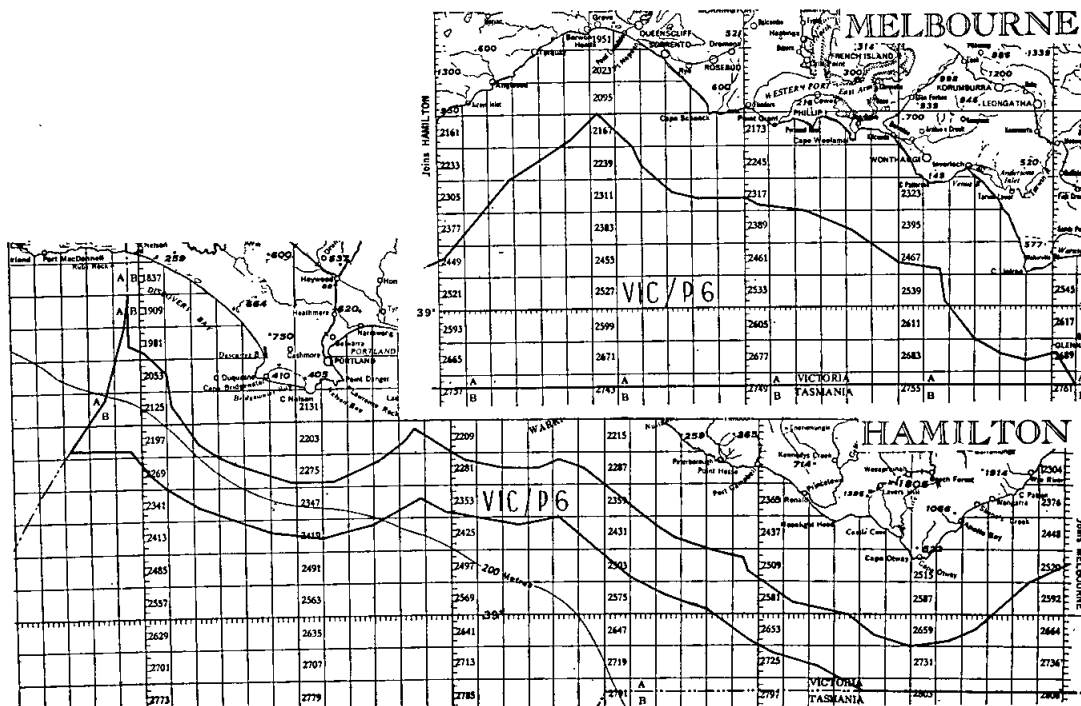

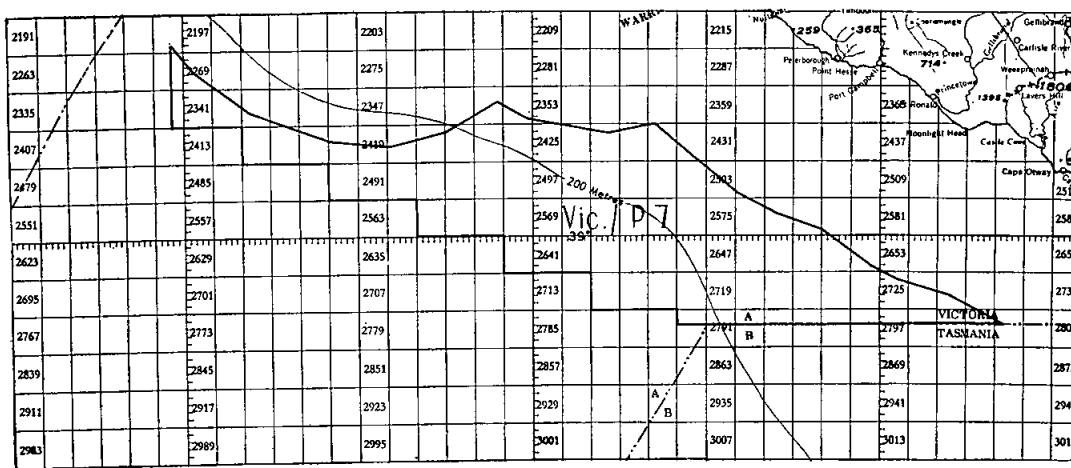

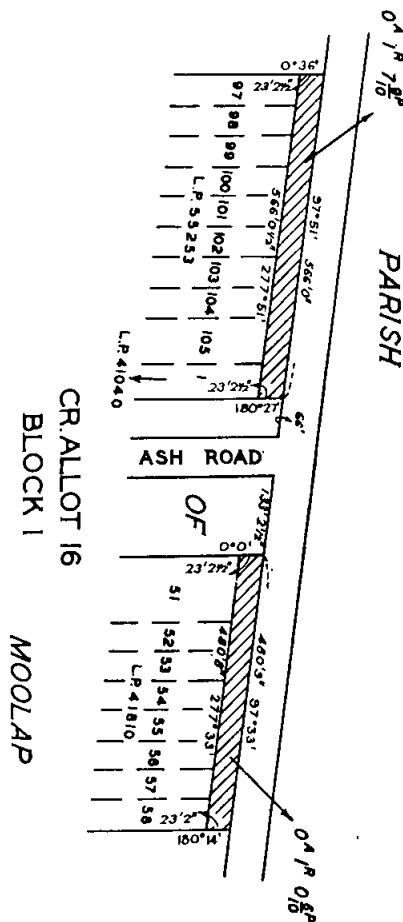

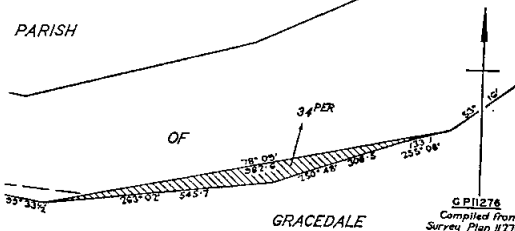

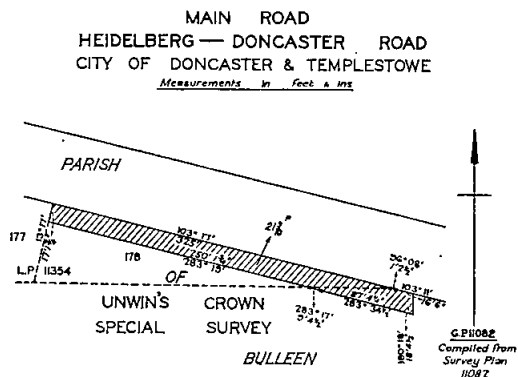

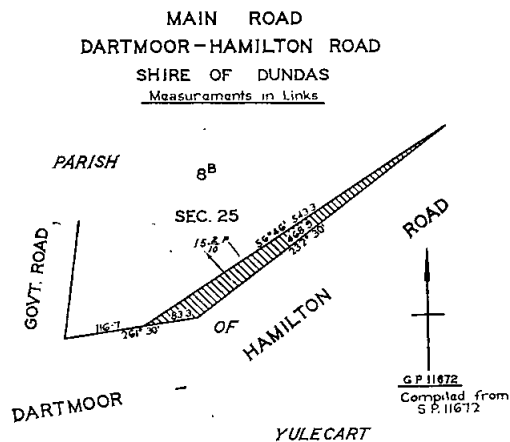

DEVENISH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW 1970.

THE Devenish Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes on land and tenements liable to be rated within the Devenish Urban District.

The charge for water to be supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the preceding clause, is hereby fixed at 20 cents per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water to be supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the Office of the said Trust.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE STEIGLITZ RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Township of Steiglitz, Parish of Durdidwarrah and described in a notice published in the Gazette of the fourth day of December, 1968, were reserved as a site for Recreation Reserve: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William John Farquhar McDonald, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

REGULATIONS.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Corporation of the Shire of Bannockburn as the Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fetes, sports, or holiday or other amusements, on any of which occasions a charge, approved by the Committee, may be made for admission to the Reserve.

1. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who behaves in a disorderly or offensive manner, or creates or takes part in any disturbance;

- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
 - (c) bring into or sell or distribute in the Reserve any intoxicating liquor, unless authorized, in writing, by the Committee and holding any licences or permit required pursuant to the *Licensing Act 1958* for the sale or drinking of intoxicating liquor therein, or employed by or acting on behalf of or delivering intoxicating liquor to any person so authorized and licensed or holding a permit, and then only in such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for the purpose or in such booths, buildings and kiosks therein wherein the sale or drinking of intoxicating liquor is permitted by the Committee and licences or permits granted pursuant to the *Licensing Act 1958*;
 - (d) exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
 - (e) climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills or posters thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage, mark or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein;
 - (f) remove, deface, or displace any board, plate or fitting, written or printed notice for exhibition of any Regulations, or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve;
 - (g) light a fire in the Reserve except at places as set apart for such purpose by the Committee;
 - (h) play, practise, or engage in any game, sport, or entertainment in the Reserve at any time without the consent in writing, of the Committee having been first obtained and then only subject to such conditions as the Committee deems reasonable and consistent with the Regulations;
 - (i) do anything whatever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent, in writing of the Committee first obtained;
 - (j) take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained. All applications for the use of the Reserve must be lodged in writing with the Secretary of the Committee fourteen days before the ground is required;
 - (k) bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals nor permit the same to enter, without the permission of the Committee being first obtained, otherwise the same may be impounded by the Committee. All dogs must be controlled by a chain or leash.
 - (l) on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound, or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system, or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee;
 - (m) remain within the Reserve, or on any property therein, when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown lands, or member of the Police Force, or authorized officer of the Committee;
 - (n) hawk, or sell, or offer for sale, within the Reserve any goods, fruit or merchandise, or anything whatsoever or solicit or gather money therein, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee;
 - (o) in or upon the Reserve, kill, wound, trap or snare or attempt to kill, wound trap or snare any bird or other native game, or have any dead bird or other native game, or the skin or pelt thereof, in his possession;
 - (p) dig or remove any sand, soil, stone or other material from the Reserve;
 - (q) break glass of any kind or leave or deposit any matter or thing injurious to persons;
 - (r) deposit or leave any bottles, glass, tin, can, waste paper, garbage, or litter of any kind, except in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee;
 - (s) play or perform in any band of music, or deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon or address of any kind, sing any sacred or secular song, enter into any public assembly on the Reserve, except with the consent of the Committee, in writing first obtained;
 - (t) camp in the Reserve or in any of the buildings therein;
 - (u) obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve;
 - (v) ride a horse, bicycle or motor cycle or drive a motor vehicle or any other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, or on any area other than that set aside by the committee for the particular purpose;
 - (w) cut, saw, dig, move, or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood, or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee;
 - (x) carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
 - (y) park any motor vehicle or other vehicle in the Reserve, except at such place or places set apart for that purpose by the Committee, or bring a caravan into the reserve without the consent of the Committee;
 - (z) spit or expectorate or commit any nuisance on the paths or in or on any building, structure, or erection in the Reserve;
 - (za) enter, cross, be on, or trespass on any playing ground area, enclosure, or course, or building, room, or structure, or any part thereof whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment or amusement is being played, conducted or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee;
 - (zb) interfere with or interrupt any game, sports, competition, entertainment or amusement or practice thereat;
 - (zc) obtain or attempt to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.
2. The Committee may set apart a portion of the Reserve as and for the purposes of a children's playground.
3. No person over the age of fourteen years shall use playground equipment erected within the Reserve.
4. No male person over the age of six years shall enter or use any place, room, convenience or building or any separate passage or approach thereto set apart for the use of females and no females shall enter or use any place, room, convenience or building or any separate passage or approach thereto set apart for the use of males.
5. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games, recreation or sports, and from time to time grant to any person, club or association, upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be consistent with these Regulations the use of the ground so set apart.
6. The Committee shall not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Reserve.
7. Any person finding any article in the Reserve shall immediately thereafter deliver same to the attendant in charge or the nearest Police Station.
8. No person, except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
9. Every person holding or purporting to hold a receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee or the properly appointed servant of such Committee or any member of the Police Force or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission in writing.
10. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any Officer of the Committee or any member of the Police Force, or any bailiff of Crown lands to leave the Reserve.—(Rs.8094.)

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context—
 "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Avon.
 "Frontage" means the boundary line between private property and the street upon which such private property abuts and where such property abuts on more than one street then the boundary line between the said property and the street to which any building that may be erected thereon fronts.
 "Private Property" includes vacant land and a private street.
 "Private Street" has the same meaning as in the Local Government Act 1958.
 "Caravan" includes a covered van, a house on wheels, and any vehicle used or adapted for living quarters whether on wheels or not.
2. This By-law shall come into force and operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Avon.
4. No person shall place or permit to be placed:—
 (a) More than one caravan on any private property in the one ownership or occupation.
 (b) Any caravan on any private property in such a position that any part of the caravan is within a distance of twenty five (25) feet from the frontage to such property or is within a distance of five (5) feet from any other boundary of the said property.
 Provided however the Council may permit more than one caravan to be placed on any private property and within lesser distances from the frontage or other boundary of the said property upon application in writing by the owner or occupier of such property.
5. No person shall occupy any caravan placed on any private property without the consent of the Council in writing.
6. (a) Every person applying to the Council for the placing of or for consent to occupy any caravan under this By-law shall make application in writing and supply all reasonable information required by the Council including the reasons for seeking such consent, the number, age, and sex of the persons proposing to occupy the caravan, the size and location of the caravan and the sanitation facilities to be provided in respect thereof.

(b) The Council may grant or refuse its consent to any such application as it thinks fit.

(c) Should the Council give its consent then the permit issued thereon shall be for a period not exceeding six months and be conditional upon the number of persons to occupy a caravan not exceeding the number set out in the permit and upon proper sanitation facilities being provided to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector of the Council and being available at all times to the occupants of the caravan.

(d) Should such sanitation facilities cease to be available during the period of the permit and not be restored within twenty four (24) hours after notice in writing has been given by the Health Inspector to the owner or occupier of the caravan or of the premises on which the caravan is placed then any permit granted hereunder shall at the expiration of the period of notice be immediately cancelled.

7. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default or default contrary to this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty of not less than ten dollars (\$10) or more than twenty dollars (\$20) and to a further penalty of not more than ten dollars (\$10) for each day upon which such offence is continued after a conviction or order is made by any Court.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have force throughout the whole of the Municipal district of the Shire of Avon except such areas as are registered with the Council as camping areas under the provisions of the Health Acts.

BY-LAW No. 20.

A By-Law of the Shire of Croydon made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and Section 93 of the *Health Act 1958* and every and any other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 20, for the purpose of—

- (a) regulating the keeping of animals and limiting the number of any such animals kept on any property;
- (b) fixing subject to Part IV of the *Health Act 1958* the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any animals; and
- (c) suppressing nuisances.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and the *Health Act 1958* and every and any other power it thereunto enabling The President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Croydon order as follows:

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Back open space” means the area of any property between an imaginary line drawn across such property in line with the rear of the residence (excluding any attached outbuildings) erected thereon and the rear boundary of the same.

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Croydon.

“Animal” includes an ass, mule, cow, bull, bullock, goat and sheep.

“Dog” means and includes a dog of either sex over the age of six months.

“Dwelling” includes any building or portion of a building which is used or intended, adapted or designed for use for living purposes.

“Municipal Clerk” means the Municipal Clerk for the time being of the Shire of Croydon.

“Municipal District” means the Municipal District of the Shire of Croydon.

“Person” includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of any property.

“Property” includes vacant land.

2. By-law No. 10 of the Shire of Croydon is hereby repealed.

3. No person shall keep or permit to be kept on any property any horse or animal within a distance of 35 feet from the nearest point of any dwelling whether erected on such property or on adjoining property.

4. No person shall keep or permit to be kept any goat, cow, bull, bullock or horse (other than a horse used for trade or business purposes or a goat used for milking purposes) on any property having an area of less than one acre.

5. No person shall keep or permit to be kept any horse used for trade or business purposes or any goat used for milking purposes on any property having an area less than one acre except with a written permit issued by the Council.

6. (1) No person shall keep or allow to be kept more than 2 dogs on any property to which this sub-clause applies except with a written permit issued by the Council.

(2) No person shall keep or allow to be kept more than 3 dogs on any property to which this sub-clause applies except with a written permit issued by the Council.

7. (1) Any person applying for a permit under Clause 6 hereof shall—

(a) in the case of a first application, advertise his intention so to do in the form of the First Schedule hereto at least one month before applying for such permit in the Croydon Mail published at Ringwood; and

(b) in every case make application in writing to the Council in the form of the Second Schedule hereto, and supply such additional information as the Council may require.

(2) Any person interested in or affected by any such application may object to the Council, such objection to be made in writing to the Municipal Clerk within one calendar month of the publication of the notice of intention as aforesaid, and any such objection shall state the grounds thereof.

(3) The Council shall, before granting any such application, consider all objections made thereto as aforesaid.

(4) The Council may grant or refuse to grant such application and if the Council grants the application it shall issue a permit in the form of the Third Schedule hereto.

(5) Every permit issued by the Council under sub-clause (4) of this Clause shall remain in force until the same is revoked or cancelled by the Council under sub-clause (6) of this Clause.

(6) Any permit may be revoked or cancelled by the Council at any time if in its opinion the property by reason of the keeping of the number of dogs permitted becomes offensive, injurious to health or dangerous, or if by reason of any alteration to the property the Council is of the opinion that the permit should be revoked.

(7) Every person giving false or misleading information in a notice of intention to apply for a permit or in any application for a permit shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

8. The occupier of any property on which any dog, horse or animal is kept shall cause the place where such dog, horse or animal is kept to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

9. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 or more than \$40.00 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or Order by any Court.

10. (1) Sub-clause 1 of Clause 6 of this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout those parts of the Municipal District as may from time to time be zoned as Residential or within 300 feet of any area zoned Residential under any Interim Development Order or Planning Scheme of the Council made pursuant to the provisions of the *Town and Country Planning Act 1962*.

(2) Sub-clause 2 of Clause 6 of this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout those parts of the Municipal District to which sub-clause (1) of this Clause does not apply and have operation throughout.

(3) Except as herein provided this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.
