AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided : Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in Section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say) :—

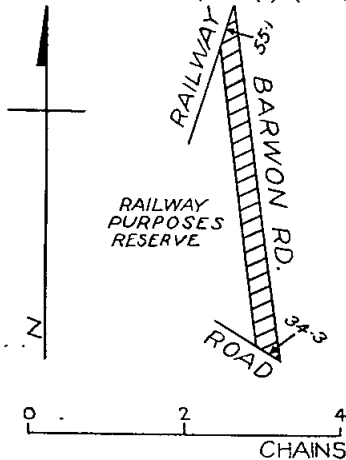

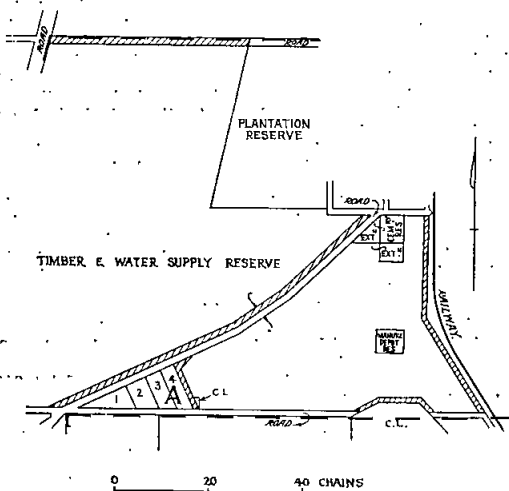

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—BOROUGH OF KYABRAM.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Kyabram has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, being streets, roads, lanes or passages made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which plans of subdivision delineating the streets, roads, lanes or passages have been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be public highways.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Lewry Street coloured brown on Plan of Subdivision No. 26003 lodged in the Office of Titles and Underwood Grove coloured brown on Plans of Subdivision Nos. 26003 and 44244 lodged as aforesaid shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act.

—PORTION OF DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AN "URBAN DISTRICT".

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958* and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do hereby proclaim that as on and from the first day of July, 1970 that portion of the Mornington Peninsula Waterworks District included within the boundaries set out and described in the Schedule

hereto, shall be and become an "Urban District" for the purpose of the said Act and shall be known as Devon Meadows-Tooradin Urban District.

Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 17, parish of Cranbourne; thence easterly by a line in continuation of the northern boundary of said allotment 17 to the north-eastern boundary of the South Gippsland highway; thence south-easterly by that highway to a point in line with the northern boundary of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 51866, parish of Cranbourne; thence generally easterly by a line and the northern boundaries of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 51866 and lots 9, 10, 17 and 26 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 53166 and by lines connecting those boundaries to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of lots 26 and 27 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 53166 and lot 29 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 51866, Parish of Cranbourne and lot 9 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 72818, Parish of Sherwood and by a line connecting those boundaries to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence generally westerly by the southern boundaries of lots 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 72818, parish of Sherwood to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence south-easterly and south-westerly by the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of lot 5 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 69098 to the south-eastern angle of that lot; thence generally south-easterly by the north-eastern boundary of the South Gippsland highway to the north-western angle of lot 4 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 34329; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundaries of the last-mentioned lot and of lot 2 on said lodged plan of subdivision No. 34329 to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned lot to its south-eastern angle; thence easterly by a line in continuation of the northern boundary of lot 6 on said lodged plan of subdivision No. 34329 to the eastern boundary of Clyde-Five Ways; thence southerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the north-western angle of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 42892; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the last-mentioned lot to its north-eastern angle; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of lots 1, 2, 2A, 3, 4 and 5 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 42892 and by a line in continuation thereof to a point in the northern boundary of lot 7 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 53369; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said lot 7 to its most north-western angle; thence generally south-easterly by the north-eastern boundary of the South Gippsland highway to the south-western angle of lot 208 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 3315; thence northerly by the western boundary of lot 208 to the south-western angle of lot 209; thence easterly by the southern boundary of lot 209 to its south-eastern angle; thence northerly and easterly by the western and northern boundaries of lot 210 to the north-eastern angle of that lot; thence generally easterly by a line and the northern boundaries of lots 24 and 25 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 11643 to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence north-easterly by the south-eastern boundary of lot 18 to its north-eastern angle; thence easterly by the southern boundary of Hopetoun-road to the north-eastern angle of lot 90 on said lodged plan of subdivision No. 3315; thence generally south-westerly by the south-eastern boundaries of lots 90, 89, 88, 87, 86, 85, 84, 83, 82, 81, 80, 79, 78, 77, 76, 75, 74 and 73 on said lodged plan of subdivision No. 3315 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Bayview-road to the west-bank of Sawtells creek; thence generally southerly by that creek bank to a point in the north-eastern boundary of the South Gippsland highway in line with the southern boundary of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 2588, parish of Koo-Wee-Rup; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundary of that highway to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence north-easterly by the north-western boundary of lot 1 to its north-western angle; thence generally easterly by the northern boundaries of lots 1, 2, 3, 31, 30, 29, 28, 27, 26, 25, 24, 23, 22, 21, 20, 19 and 18 and by lines connecting those boundaries and by a line in continuation thereof to the south-eastern boundary of Ballarto-street; thence south-westerly by that street boundary and by a line in continuation thereof to the south-western boundary of the South Gippsland highway; thence north-westerly by that highway to the north-eastern angle of lot 8 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 41588; thence south-westerly by the eastern boundaries of the last-mentioned lot and of lot 78 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 1809 to its south-eastern angle; thence generally westerly by the

southern boundaries of said lot 78 and of lots 77, 48, 47, 16 and 15 and by lines connecting those boundaries and by a line in continuation thereof to the east-bank of Sawtells creek; thence generally northerly by that creek bank to a point in the south-western boundary of the South Gippsland highway in line with the northern boundary of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 27922; thence north-westerly by that highway to the west-bank of Sawtells creek; thence generally north-westerly by that creek bank and by the east-bank of Evans Inlet to a point in the western boundary of allotment 1, section 1, parish of Sherwood; thence north-westerly by a line and the south-western boundary of the South Gippsland highway to its intersection with the eastern boundary of Fisheries-road; thence southerly by the last-mentioned road boundary to a point in line with the southern boundary of lot 149 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 6487; thence westerly by a line and the southern boundaries of said lot 149 and of lots 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85 and 86 to the north-eastern angle of lot 150 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 6596; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of said lot 150 and of lots 172, 173 and 194 and by lines connecting those boundaries to the north-western angle of lot 10 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 6527; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of lots 10 and 1 and by a line connecting those boundaries and by a line in continuation thereof to the eastern boundary of Fisheries-road; thence southerly by that road boundary to the north-western angle of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 18886; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the last-mentioned lot to a point distant 2 chains from the western boundary of that lot; thence southerly by a line parallel to the western boundary of said lot 1 to the northern boundary of North-road; thence westerly by that road boundary to the south-western angle of said lot 1; thence southerly and south-easterly by the eastern and north eastern boundaries of Fisheries-road to the north-western angle of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 34360; thence generally easterly by the northern boundary of the last-mentioned lot to its north-eastern angle; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundaries of lots 1 to 13 (both inclusive) and by a line in continuation thereof to a point in the northern boundary of lot 86 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 13206; thence north-westerly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to a point in line with the western boundary of lot 47 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 45584; thence northerly by a line, the western boundaries of lots 47 and 46 and by a line connecting those boundaries to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence easterly by the northern boundary of said lot 46 to its north-eastern angle; thence northerly by the western boundary of Peters-road to its intersection with the northern boundary of Glenalva-parade; thence easterly by that parade to the south-western angle of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 30515; thence northerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned lot to its north-western angle; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of lots 1 to 21 (both inclusive) on lodged plan of subdivision No. 30515 and lots 22 to 29 (both inclusive) on lodged plan of subdivision No. 30700 and by lines connecting those boundaries to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence north-westerly by the South-western boundaries of lots 32 to 45 (both inclusive) on lodged plan of subdivision No. 44578 and by a line connecting those boundaries to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence north-easterly by the north-western boundary of the last-mentioned lot to the south-western boundary of Fisheries-road; thence north-westerly and northerly by the south-western and western boundaries of Fisheries-road to the north-eastern angle of Crown Portion 83; thence westerly by the southern boundary of North-road to the north-eastern angle of allotment 87; thence northerly by the western boundary of Hastings-road to the south-eastern angle of lot 217 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 51188; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of lots 217, 225, 224, 223, 222, 221, 220, 219, and 218 to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence northerly by the western boundary of lot 218 and a line in continuation thereof to the south-western angle of lot 226; thence north-westerly and northerly by the south-western and western boundaries of lots 226 to 249 (both inclusive) and by a line connecting those boundaries to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence north-westerly by the south-western boundaries

of lots 152, 151, 150, 149, 148, 147, 146, 145, 144, 143, 142, 141, 140, 139, 138, 137, 136, 135, 134, 133, 132, 131, 130, 129 and 128 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 51187 and by a line connecting those boundaries to the south-eastern angle of lot 5 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 54277; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of the last-mentioned lot and by a line in continuation thereof to the northern boundary of Bullarto-road; thence easterly by that road boundary to its intersection with the South Gippsland highway; thence north-westerly by the south-western boundary of that highway to the point of commencement.

2. Commencing at the most north-western angle of allotment 111, parish of Sherwood (at the intersection of Kallara and Warneet roads); thence north-easterly by the south-eastern boundary of Warneet-road to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Aruma-street; thence north-westerly by a line, the last-mentioned street boundary and by a line in continuation thereof to the south-bank of Rutherford's Inlet; thence generally westerly and southerly by that Inlet to a point in line with the southern boundary of Rutherford-parade; thence generally easterly and northerly by the southern and eastern boundaries of Rutherford-parade and generally northerly by the eastern boundary of Kallara-road to the point of commencement.

Building By-law.

A By-law of the City of Richmond made under the provisions of Sections 197 and 198 of the Local Government Act 1958 and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called "the Regulations") for:

(a) Prescribing areas in which no person shall construct or cause to be constructed any building the exterior walls of which are of material other than masonry or concrete.

(b) Adopting the minimum depth and width of frontage specified in Column 1 of Table 804 as the minimum area depth and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class I or Class II occupancy shall be constructed throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

(c) Prescribing areas in which buildings of Classes II and III occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than three storeys.

(d) Dispensing with the requirements of Clause 813 of the Regulations in certain cases.

(e) Repealing various By-laws.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 and the Regulations and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Richmond order as follows:—

1. This By-law may be known as the Building By-law.

2. By-laws Nos. 136 and 163 of the City of Richmond are hereby repealed.

3. The areas described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas in which no person shall construct or cause to be constructed any building or any outbuildings named in the Second Schedule hereto the exterior walls of which are of material other than masonry or concrete.

4. The areas described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Class II or Class III occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than three storeys including the ground floor and the whole of the rest of the Municipal District is hereby prescribed as an area in which buildings of Class II or Class III occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than two storeys including the ground storey. Provided always that where the ground storey is devoted exclusively to the parking of wheeled vehicles the building may contain one storey in excess of the maximum number prescribed under this Clause.

5. The minimum area depth and width of frontage specified in Column 1 of Table 804 of the Regulations are hereby adopted as the minimum area depth and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class I or Class II occupancy shall be constructed throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

6. In the case of a building on land forming part of a sub-division approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations and the requirement of Clause 813 of the Regulations may be dispensed with by resolution of the Council if it is satisfied that Section 452 of the Health Act 1958 can be otherwise complied with.

7. No person shall construct any fowl house, kennel, conservatory, green house or similar structure appurtenant to a building of Class I, II, III or IV occupancy except in accordance with the plans and specifications submitted to and approved by the Building Surveyor of the Council.

8. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$40.00 and in the case of a continuing offence not more than \$10.00 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

9. Save as is herein otherwise provided this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Richmond.

10. In this By-law "the Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Richmond.

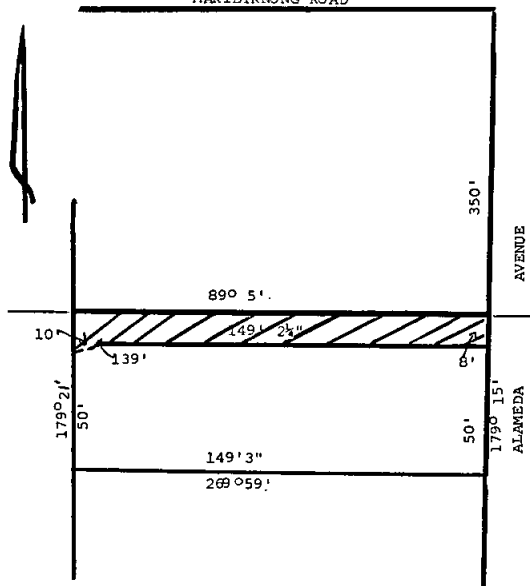
