PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Depen-dencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Motor Boating Act 1961 the Governor in Council on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity: similar activity:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Warracknabeal has been appointed as the Authority over the waters of the Yarriambiack Creek within the Township of Warracknabeal:

And whereas the said Authority has recommended that the use of certain parts of the waters of Yarriambiack Creek be set aside for certain classes of boating or similar activity:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Boating Act 1961 do by this my Proclamation set aside the use of those parts of the waters of Yarriambiack Creek downstream from the pipe line bridge to the weir on Rainbow Road for motor boating and water skiing.

And whereas by Proclamations published in the Govern-

And whereas by Proclamations published in the Government Gazette on the 4th September 1946 and the 20th July, 1966 the operation of the said part was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of McIvor.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of McIvor has requested that the operation of the said Part be extended to the balance of the municipal district of the Shire of

McIvor.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of McIvor to which they do not already apply, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned part of the municipal district of the Shire of McIvor on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall be deemed not to come into operation till the 15th October, 1970 except insofar as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 15th October 1970.

- 1. This By-Law may be known as the Control of Caravans By-Law.

No person shall place, permit to be placed or allow to remain placed upon any private property of which he is the owner or occupier a caravan which when so placed is used or intended to be used for the purpose of providing accommodation or habitation for himself or any other person or persons unless he shall first have obtained a written authority of the Council permitting him to do so.
- 5. Any written authority issued by the Council pursuant to the last preceding clause may be limited to a specific period of time and/or to a specific place and may be issued subject to such conditions (to be specified therein) as the Council may at its complete discretion think fit to impose in any particular case.

6. Any written authority issued by the Council as aforesaid may be revoked by the Council at any time by the Council giving seven (7) days written notice to the person to whom the written authority was issued or may in a like manner be varied by the imposition of further conditions or by the variation of existing conditions.

7. Any person who has been issued with a written authority pursuant to Clause 5 hereof shall observe all terms and conditions specified therein including all revocations and variations of the written authority made by the council pursuant to clause 6 hereof.

8. Any person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding \$40.00 for each such breach, and in the case of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which an offence against this By-Law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

9. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Essendon.

ARARAT REGIONAL LIBRARY SERVICE AGREEMENT

THIS indenture made this 1st day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five between the Mayor, Councillors and citizens of the City of Ararat (hereinafter called the Council of the City of Ararat) of the first part the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ararat (hereinafter called the Council of the Shire of Ararat) of the second part and the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mount Rouse (hereinafter called the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse) of the

third part whereas the Council of the City of Ararat the Council of the Shire of Ararat and the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse have mutually agreed pursuant to the powers conferred on them by section 505 (2) of the Local Government Act 1958 to contract upon such terms and conditions as are hereinafter set forth for the control and management of a Regional Library Service within the Municipal Districts of the City of Ararat, Shire of Ararat and the Shire of Mount Rouse (hereinafter called the Ararat Regional Library Committee). Now this indenture witnesseth that the parties hereto mutually agree with the others of them as follows: the others of them as follows:-

- 1. In this Indenture unless inconsistent with the subject matter-
 - (a) "Book" includes any book, publication, periodical, newspapers, pamphlet, magazine, picture, print, map, chart, photograph, plan, manuscript or any other article of a like nature forming part of the book-stock of the Ararat Regional Library Service.
 - (b) "Population" means the population figure acceptable to the Free Library Service Board of Victoria for subsidy basis.
- Victoria for subsidy basis.

 2. That the Council of the City of Ararat the Council of the Shire of Ararat and the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse shall each by resolution of their respective Councils pursuant to the provisions of said section 505 (2) of the Local Government Act 1958 execute this Indenture and shall each appoint two members of its Council and an executive officer from each municipality to a Committee which shall be known as the Ararat Regional Library Committee (hereinafter called "the Committee") which shall have vested in it the powers and functions set out in Schedule 1 attached hereto.
- 3. That the Council of the City of Ararat the Council of the Shire of Ararat and the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse shall each contribute annually to the funds of the Committee the sums apportioned on their annual Estimates for expenditure on library services for the ensuing financial year.
- 4. That the Council of the City of Ararat the Council of the Shire of Ararat and the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse shall provide the Library Services set out in Schedule 2 attached hereto.
- 5. That the Council of the City of Ararat the Council of the Shire of Ararat and the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse shall bear the costs of the library services in the manner set out in Schedule 3 attached hereto.
- 6. That the book-stock belonging to the Ararat Municipal Library shall be transferred to the Ararat Regional Library at the opening of the Ararat Regional Library for public service. This book-stock together with all future purchases shall be available for use throughout the libraries in each of the Municipal Districts of the City of Ararat the Shire of Ararat and the Shire of Mount Rouse.
- 7. That the selection and purchase of all books required for the Library Services in respect of the Regional Library shall be made by the Chief Librarian.
- 8. That all cataloguing and processing of books shall be done at the Central Library.
- 9. That there shall be an interim period between the execution of this Indenture and the full implementation of the Ararat Regional Library Service. Such period shall be used for the processing of book-stock the purchase of a suitable motor vehicle and for other necessary preparations for the Ararat Pagingal Library. for the opening of the Ararat Regional Library
- 10. That the Shire Secretary of the Council of the Shire of Ararat shall at the date of this Indenture be appointed to the position of Chief Administrative Officer of the Ararat Regional Library and shall hold office until he resigns or is removed by the Committee. Any subsequent appointments to the position of Chief Administrative Officer shall be made by the Committee.
- 11. That the Chief Librarian of the Ararat Municipal Library shall at the date of this Indenture be appointed to the position of Chief Librarian for the Ararat Regional Library and shall hold office until she resigns or is removed by the Committee. Any subsequent appointments to the position of Chief Librarian shall be made by the Committee.
- 12. That the Chief Librarian shall be responsible to the Chief Administrative Officer for the direct supervision and administration of the Library staff and services
- 13. That at the date of this Indenture the Staff of the Ararat Municipal Library shall become employees of the Committee.
- 14. That the salaries of the Staff of the Ararat Regional Library shall be paid out of the Ararat Regional Library Committee's Bank Account.

15. That the whole of the Staff employed by the Committee shall be available for duty as and when required library under the control and management of the Committee.

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- 16. That this Indenture shall take effect as at the date hereof and shall continue in force until the thirtieth day of September One thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven and thereafter shall continue in force unless determined by at least twelve months prior notice in writing given by one party to the others. Such notice shall be deemed to be sufficiently given if forwarded by registered post addressed to the Town Clerk/Shire Secretary/s of the Council/s to which the notice is being given.
- Council/s to which the notice is being given.

 17. That in the event of this Indenture being determined pursuant to the preceding clause the book-stock of the Ararat Regional Library less the book-stock of the Ararat Municipal Library at the commencement of this Indenture shall be distributed between the Council of the City of Ararat the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse in proportions calculated on the basis of population of each Municipality and the bookstock of the Ararat Municipal Library at the commencement of this Indenture shall be distributed between the Council of the City of Ararat and the Council of the Shire of Ararat and the Council of the Shire of Ararat in proportions calculated on the basis of population of each Municipality. All other capital assets of the Ararat Regional Library shall be distributed in the proportion of the amount contributed by each Council. Such distributions shall be made by the Committee and in the event of it failing to agree the Local Government Department of Victoria shall arbitrate and its decision shall be final and binding on the three parties. shall be final and binding on the three parties.
- 18. That the regular place of meeting of the Ararat Regional Library shall be the Shire Hall, Ararat.

Powers and Functions of the Ararat Regional Library Committee.

The powers and Functions of the Ararat Regional Library Committee (hereinafter called "the Committee") shall be as follows:

- be as follows:—

 1. The Committee shall consist of nine members two of whom shall be Councillors and one executive officer of the City of Ararat two of whom shall be Councillors and one executive officer of the Shire of Ararat and two of whom shall be Councillors and one executive officer of the Shire of Mount Rouse. They shall be appointed by resolution of the respective Councils prior to the thirtieth day of September in each year and shall hold office for twelve months from the first day of October following their appointment. their appointment.
- 2. Any member of the Committee may be removed from office at any time by resolution of the Council which appointed him and such Council shall have the right to re-appoint such member or appoint another eligible person a member of the Committee in place of the member so removed. Any extraordinary vacancy that may occur may be filled by the Council whose member has caused such vacancy.
- Members of the Committee shall unless otherwise removed hold office until the thirtieth day of September following the date of their appointment.
- 4. The procedure for meetings of the Committee shall be in accordance with that set down for committees constituted under section 190 of the Local Government Act

- 1958 provided that a quorum shall consist of five members of the Committee. The Chairman of the Committee shall be appointed annually at a meeting of the Committee held during the month of October and the office of Chairman shall alternate between member Councils. The Committee shall meet at least four times in each year. An extraordinary meeting of the Committee shall be convened by the Administrative Officer on the requisition of the Chairman or any two members. Seven clear days notice in writing shall be given to members of the Committee of any extraordinary meeting.
- 5. The Committee shall cause books to be provided and kept in accordance with Regulations made by the Governor-in-Council pursuant to section 462 of the Local Government Act 1958 (as amended) and shall cause true and regular accounts to be entered therein of the assets and liabilities income and expenditure of the Committee and of the several purposes for which any sums of money are received and paid or payable and receivable. Such books shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by any Councillor or member of the Regional Library Committee of the City of Ararat Shire of Ararat and the Shire of Mount Rouse
- 6. The Committee shall cause the accounts of the Ararat Regional Library Committee to be balanced as at the thirtieth day of September in each year and shall arrange for the books and accounts to be audited by an auditor for the time being appointed by the Governor-in-Council to make an audit of the books and accounts of the Municipality of the Shire of Ararat.
- 7. The Committee shall immediately the accounts have been audited in each year furnish to the Council of the City of Ararat the Council of the Shire of Ararat and the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse a full statement of all moneys received and paid by the Committee in exercise of its powers and functions during the period of twelve months ending on the thirtieth day of September then last year.
- 8. The Committee shall as early as practicable after the fifteenth day of September in each year submit a copy of its Annual Estimates of Income and Expenditure for the ensuing financial year showing therein the amounts to be contributed by each Council. Such estimates shall be prepared by the Chief Administrative Officer in conjunction with the Chief Librarian.
- 9. All moneys received by the Committee shall be paid 9. All moneys received by the Committee shall be paid into such bank and in such manner as the Committee shall from time to time appoint and direct for that purpose. No money paid into any bank on account of the Committee shall be withdrawn except by cheque signed by two members of the Council of the Shire of Ararat and the Chief Administrative Officer.
- 10. The Committee shall cause minutes to be kept of the proceedings of each meeting of the Committee together with the names of the members present and the names of all members voting upon any question for the decision of which a division is called. Sufficient copies of such minutes shall be furnished to each Council.
- 11. Such minutes after confirmation by the Committee 11. Such minutes after confirmation by the Committee at the next meeting of the Committee shall be signed by the Chairman of such next meeting unless the same are confirmed at the meeting to which the minutes relate and signed by the Chairman of that meeting. The minutes shall be kept in a book to be provided for the purpose which shall be kept by the Chief Administrative Officer. Such book shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any member of the Committee of the City of Ararat the Shire of Ararat and the Shire of Mount Rouse. Rouse.
- 12. The Committee shall cause a full report of the activities of the Ararat Regional Library Committee to be prepared by the Chief Librarian immediately after the thirtieth day of September each year. Sufficient copies of such reports shall be submitted to the Council of the City of Ararat the Council of the Shire of Ararat and the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse respectively
- 13. The Committee shall cause to be kept and maintained records of all staff employed by it.
 - 14. The functions of the Committee shall be:-
 - (a) The control and management of the Ararat Regional Library Service under the advice and guidance of the Chief Administrative Officer and the Chief Librarian.
 - (b) To make recommendations to the parties to this of make recommendations to the parties to this indenture on all matters pertaining to the policy of the Ararat Regional Library Committee including the development improvement and performance of all things that may be necessary

for the maintenance and repair of the central library and furniture and fittings required at the central library.

- (c) To frame and recommend for adoption by the Councils of the City of Ararat the Shire of Ararat and the Shire of Mount Rouse rules and regulations for the proper management and control of the libraries or any of them constituting the Ararat Regional Library Service.
- (d) To appoint the staff necessary to satisfactorily operate the Ararat Regional Library Service.

SCHEDULE 2.

Schedule of Free Library Services to be Provided.

- 1. The Council of the City of Ararat shall provide jointly with the Council of the Shire of Ararat the Central Library Building in Barkly-street, Ararat, now known as the Ararat Municipal Library, to be known as the Ararat Project Library. Regional Library.
- 2. The Council of the Shire of Ararat shall provide jointly with the Council of the City of Ararat the Central Library Building in Barkly-street, Ararat, now known as the Ararat Municipal Library, to be known as the Ararat Regional Library.
- 3. The Council of the Shire of Ararat shall be responsible 3. The Council of the Shire of Ararat shall be responsible for the administrative organization of the Ararat Regional Library Service and shall make administrative facilities available for the proper conduct of the Ararat Regional Library Service and the Council of the Shire of Ararat shall receive annually from the Ararat Regional Library Bank Account a contribution equivalent to 2½ per cent. of revenue as shown on the audited Statement of Accounts for the preceding year towards the cost of providing such administrative services administrative services.
- 4. The Council of the Shire of Ararat shall provide at its own expense the following branch library services complete with the necessary fixtures, fittings, furnishings, equipment and staff:—

Streatham Willaura

5. The Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse shall provide at its own expense the following branch library services complete with the necessary fixtures, fittings, furnishings, equipment and staff:—

Chatsworth Riding

Glenthompson Penshurst

- 6. No additional libraries or services beyond those herein above mentioned shall be provided except by mutual consent of the Councils of the City of Ararat, the Shire of Ararat and the Shire of Mount Rouse.
- 7. All fixtures, fittings, furnishings and equipment of the branch libraries shall remain the property of the respective Councils.
- 8. When the Ararat Regional Library is established all persons who reside in attend school or are employed within the Municipalities of the City of Ararat, the Shire of Ararat and the Shire of Mount Rouse, shall be entitled subject to the rules and regulations for the proper management and control of the Libraries, to the privileges in regard to the library services in the three municipalities.

SCHEDULE 3.

Basis of Costs of the Ararat Regional Library Service.

- 1. Books &c.—The cost of additional books, replacements and renewals, binding and repair of books shall be borne by the Ararat Regional Library Bank Account.
- 2. Building and Motor Vehicle.—The cost of additional fixtures, fittings, furniture, furnishings and equipment required at the Central Library, the maintenance and repair of the Central Library Building and the hire costs of the motor vehicle shall be borne by the Ararat Regional Library Bank Account.
- 3. Payment in lieu of Rent.—The Committee shall make provision in its Estimates each year for the payment to the Council of the City of Ararat and the Council of the Shire of Ararat from the Ararat Regional Library Account a contribution in lieu of rent for the use of the Central Library. Such amount to be based on 4 per cent. of the capital value of the building and to be apportioned on the basis of population of the Municipalities of the City of Ararat and the Shire of Ararat.
- 4. Administration and Maintenance.—The payment of all salaries and cost of administering the Ararat Regional Library Service shall be borne by the Ararat Regional Library Bank Account.
