### PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the *Local Authorities Superannuation Act 1958*, Section 3, it is among other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to declare any body constituted for a joint purpose by two or more authorities within the meaning of that Act to be an authority for the purposes of the Act:

PROCLAMATION OF STATES AND TERRITORIES FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE SECURITIES INDUSTRY ACT 1970.

### PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS section 5 of the *Securities Industry Act 1970* provides *inter alia* that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare any Act or enactment of any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth to be corresponding law for the purposes of the *Securities Industry Act 1970*.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby declare to be corresponding law for the purposes of the said *Securities Industry Act 1970* the Acts the titles of which are hereunder set forth:—

*Securities Industry Act 1970* as amended by *Securities Industry (Amendment) Act 1971* of the State of New South Wales;  
*Securities Industry Act 1971* of the State of Queensland; and  
*Securities Industry Act 1970* of the State of Western Australia.

## PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF BRIGHTON.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment, to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the City of Brighton has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958* or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Snooks Court coloured brown and brown hatched on Plan of Subdivision No. 90447 lodged in the Office of Titles shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

NORTH CAMPERDOWN WATERWORKS DISTRICT AND PORTION OF THE OTWAY WATERWORKS DISTRICT PROCLAIMED A "RURAL DISTRICT".

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958* and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do hereby proclaim that as on and from the first day of July, 1971 that the North Camperdown Waterworks District and portion of the Otway Waterworks District included within the boundaries set out and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and become a "Rural District" for the purpose of the said Act and shall be known as North Camperdown Rural District and the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission shall have jurisdiction and control over such Rural District.

SCHEDULE.

*Boundaries of North Camperdown Rural District.*

1. Those lands which were within the boundaries of the North Camperdown Waterworks District, as on 1st July, 1971.

2. That portion of the Otway Waterworks District shown by blue colour on the plan accompanying this draft Proclamation and described as follows:—

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of lot 11, L.P. 5132, Parish of Colongulac; thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of lots 11 and 12 and by a line in continuation thereof to a point in the southern boundary of lot 18; thence generally easterly by the southern boundaries of lots 18 and 19 to the southern shore of Lake Colongulac; thence generally south-easterly by that shore to the left bank of Timboon Creek; thence generally southerly by that creek bank to the south-eastern angle of lot 15; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the last-mentioned lot to

the north-western angle of lot 5, L.P. 4418; thence southerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned lot to its south-western angle; thence westerly by a line and the southern boundary of lot 3, L.P. 5132, to its south-western angle; thence northerly by the western boundaries of lots 3 and 4 to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence westerly by the southern boundary of lot 14 to the point of commencement.

The lands set out and described in the foregoing Schedule are shown within the red border on a plan approved by the Governor in Council and deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne.—(Corr. No. 71/1357).
