



RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1971.

WANGARATTA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Cemeteries Act 1958, the Trustees of the Wangaratta Public Cemetery do hereby revoke all previous Regulations and scale of fees and make the following Regulations and scale of fees, which shall come into operation upon publication in the Government Gazette:—

PART ONE-GENERAL

1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter— $\,$

"Cemetery" means the Wangaratta Public Cemetery. "Memorial work" means manual work (including the writing of inscriptions) in connexion with any building, tomb, vault, kerbing or other structure erected or placed on or in any place of burial.

"Trustees" means the Trustees of the Wangaratta Public Cemetery.

2. The Officer in Charge shall exercise general supervision and control over the Cemetery and be responsible to the Trustees for its administration. He shall be present at the Cemetery between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive (Public Holidays excepted) to carry out such work and to receive orders on behalf of the Trustees.

3. A person who carries out work within the Cemetery, whether or not he is carrying out the work for the Trustees, shall carry out the work in as short a time as is possible and shall obey directions given to him by the Officer in Charge or other authorized employee relating to the carrying out of the work or to any other matter arising out of the carrying out of the work.

4. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

5. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in the Cemetery unless the planting is approved by the Trustees and the trees and shrubs are planted in accordance with the terms of the approval.

No person shall cause or allow any animal or vehicle (other than a hearse or authorized vehicle) to pass along a road, path or part of a road in the Cemetery.

No person shall within the Cemetery—

(a) Put any animal or animals for the purpose of grazing except with the consent, in writing, of the Trustees.

(b) Wilfully damage or destroy any flowers or other tokens placed upon any graves.

8. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the

PART TWO-MEMORIAL WORK.

9. A person desiring to carry out memorial work shall apply in writing to the Trustees, for their permission to carry out the work, enclosing with his application a plan of the proposed work (clearly showing any inscriptions).

10. No memorial work shall be carried out without the permission of the Trustees.

11. When the Trustees give a person permission to carry out memorial work, the work may be carried out only according to the plans enclosed with the application for permission.

12. The name of the monumental mason shall be restricted to a plaque not more than 3 inches long by 2 inches wide and any other writing whatsoever, except the approved inscription, shall not be allowed to be upon the monument or any part thereof.

13. A person who has carried out any memorial work otherwise than in accordance with the plan enclosed with his application for the permission of the Trustees to his carrying out of the work, shall if required to do so by the Trustees, have the structures altered so as to accordance with the plan. with the plan.

14. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after the execution of any memorial work shall be removed immediately by the person who carried out the work and he shall repair and make good all damage caused by him to the satisfaction of the Officer in Charge.

15. When a person proposes digging or making a grave 15. When a person proposes digging or making a grave or vault or carrying out memorial work in the Cemetery, he shall produce the document evidencing the permission of the Trustees for his digging or making that grave or vault or carrying out that work to the Officer in Charge before beginning the work or delivering the materials or equipment within the Cemetery (as the case may be). 16. The only type of memorial permitted on a grave in the Lawn Section shall be of marble, granite or other material approved by the Trust with a maximum height 2 ft. 8 in. above ground level with base measuring not more than 3 ft. 6 in. long. Where the lawn section beams are provided of sufficient width to carry two memorials, the base shall not be more than 11 inches wide by 8 inches with the state sections the base shall not be more than high. In other sections, the base shall not be more than 15 inches wide by 8 inches high.

16a. In those areas of the Lawn Section where beams are required to hold two memorials back to back, the base of the first memorial shall be set on the beam so that the rear face of the base lies along the longitudinal centre

The base of the second memorial shall be set on the beam in such a way as to permit the person carrying out this work to grout between the two bases neatly with cement mortar to make a joint not more than 1 inch wide. The abutting faces of both bases shall be finished in such a way to enable this jointing work to be carried out.

- a way to enable this joining work to be carried out.

 17. The only type of memorial permitted on a child's grave in the Lawn Section shall be of marble, granite or other material approved by the Trust. On graves 3 feet wide the memorial shall have a maximum height of 20 inches above the ground level and a base measuring 32 inches long by 7 inches wide by 4 inches thick. On graves 2 feet wide, the memorial shall have a maximum height of 20 inches above the ground level and a base measuring 20 inches long by 7 inches wide by 4 inches thick.
- thick.

 18. The Trustees will provide at no cost to the person making the application for burial flower containers for use in the Lawn Section. No person is permitted to use a container other than that provided. Where containers are required the base of the memorial shall be drilled to provide holes at least 3 inches in diameter and 4 inches deep to hold the containers, unless holes are provided in the beam upon which the memorial is being erected. The hole shall have a clearance to the edge of the base of at least 2 inches. Adequate means of drainage of the hole shall be provided in the base.
- 19. All flowers, wreaths, &c., remaining on any grave in the Lawn Section seven days after the date of burial shall be removed by the Officer in Charge with the exception of those placed in containers provided by the
- 20. The Trustees may order the removal or alteration of any monument, tomb, tablet, gravestone, vault, railing or other erection, or the erasure of any inscription, which has been erected or placed in the burial ground in contravention of the foregoing Regulations.

PART THREE-INTERMENTS.

- 21. An application for a permit to bury a corpse shall be made at least eight working hours before the time appointed for burial and shall be made in the form contained in Schedule B to these Regulations.
- 22. The Trustees shall divide the burial ground into sections, and shall allot graves within the sections and shall cause a plan to be made showing the sections and graves of the burial ground and shall sign and certify the plan when made. The plan or a copy thereof shall be kept for reference in the office of the Officer in Charge.
- 23. The Trustees shall cause a register to be kept in which shall be entered the name and former address of every person whose body is interred in the burial ground and the section and number of the grave in which the interment has been made and the date of the interment. The entry shall be made as soon as possible after each interment. interment.
- 24. Two persons only shall be interred in any one grave except where under special circumstances the permission of the Trustees has been obtained.
 - 25. The grave allotments shall be as follows:-
 - (ii) General Cemetery: 8 feet long and 4 feet wide. (ii) Lawn Section: 10 feet long and 4 feet wide. (ii) Children's Lawn Section:—
 - - 6 feet long by 4 feet wide (8-12 years).

 5 feet long by 3 feet wide (1-4 years).
 2 ft. 6 in. long by 2 feet wide (stillborn—1 year).
- 26. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be

On weekdays: 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Weekends and Public Holidays: 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

28. Plots of ground in the Lawn Section shall be allotted in rotation and be restricted to two plots per application and provided that one is needed for immediate use for burial the other may be reserved but at the same time as the former.

SCHEDULE A.

Certificate of Right of Burial in Wangaratta Public Cemetery.

Upon payment of the sum of the Trustees of the Wangaratta Public Cemetery do hereby grant unto permission to provide a grave or vault on the piece of ground feet long feet broad, within the portion of the Cemetery appropriated for burials and marked compartment on the map or plan of the said Cemetery kept by the Trustees, with permission to erect or place on the said piece of ground a monument or tombstone on payment of the prescribed sum.

This grant is made subject to the following terms and conditions:-

- That the said piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said and near relations solely as a burying place and that no other use shall be made thereof.
- That no enclosing wall, fence, building, monument or tombstone shall be erected or placed on the said piece of ground until a plan thereof has been exhibited to the said Trustees, and their authority given for the erection thereof.
- 3. That the said grave or vault, and the said wall, fence, building, monument or tombstone shall be maintained and kept by the said and heirs and near relations in proper repair to the satisfaction of the said Trustees.
- 4. That the Trustees will provide the required maintenance to the lawns in the Lawn Section of the Cemetery.
- 5. That the said That the said and heirs and near relations shall, in the use of the said piece of ground, have access thereto and be subject in every respect to such rules and regulations as the Trustees may from time to time make, and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein, except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said Trustees.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick made under section 198 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 187 for the purpose of regulating or prohibiting the erection construction conversion or alteration and of any addition to buildings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 198 of the Local Government Act 1958 as amended the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Brunswick order as follows:—

- 1. The erection construction conversion or alteration of any new or existing building or erection in any area within the Municipality of Brunswick without the written permission of the Council of the said Municipality or the Building Surveyor of the said Municipality is prohibited from midnight on any Saturday to midnight on the following Sunday. Provided that this By-law shall not be applicable—
 - (a) to any person who himself performs any work as aforesaid on his own property or,

 (b) to any person who without material reward himself person any work as a foresaid on any

 - self person who without material reward him-self performs any work as aforesaid on any property in which he resides,

 (c) to any such work performed by or under the direction of the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Brunswick.

- (2) Any person applying for such consent shall make application in writing to the Council and in this application, state:
 - (a) his full name and address.
 - (b) the name of the charitable religious educational or other similar organization on whose behalf such application is made.
 - (c) the object of such application.

- (d) the date or dates when the collection or solicitation is to take place and where, and
- (e) give such further information as the Council may require.
- 3. The Council may grant or refuse the application as it sees fit.
- 4. The Council may grant to any person or organization authority to solicit or collect gifts of money or subscriptions for any purpose on any road or street or from house to house adjacent thereto and every authority granted by the Council shall be in writing signed by the Mayor and the Borough Clerk of the said Borough and shall state the date upon which the granting of the authority was agreed to by the Council.
- 5. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Eaglehawk.
- 6. Any person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable for a first offence to a penalty of not more than \$50.00 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which such offence is confirmed after a conviction or order is made by any Court.




