(A) Description.—Apparatus and works comprising a system of gas/liquid separators shall receive petroleum in a gaseous and liquid form from 20 inch valves Nos. MOV111 or MOV112 referred to in Drawing No. A-PSC-2 submitted with the application for the variation of the licence dated 12th October, 1971, which valves are located on the scraper receivers at the input to the Gippsland Gas Processing Plant. Petroleum in a gaseous form shall be discharged from the said separators at an 18 inch non-return valve No. V-528 located upstream of the inlet to vessel No. 1101 and as shown on Drawing No. A-1101-Y11 which accompanied the application for the variation of the licence.

Petroleum in a liquid form shall be discharged from the said separators through 3 inch valves located downstream of 1½ inch flow control valves and which valves are indicated on Drawing No. A-1133-Y2A which accompanied the application for the variation of the licence.

Methanol/water mixtures shall be discharged from the said separators through 2 inch and 6 inch valves located downstream of 1 inch and 2 inch pressure control valves respectively and which valves are indicated on Drawing No. A-1133-Y2A which accompanied the application for the variation of the licence.

- (iii) All outlet piping from the slug catcher shall conform to the ASTM Designation A 106-68 Grade B hereinbefore mentioned and in addition steel in all pipes of 10½ inch outside diameter and larger shall have an impact value at 32°F of not less than 25 foot pounds when tested by the Charpy Impact Test hereinbefore mentioned.

- (iv) *Steel Pipe Flanges.*—All flanges shall conform to the relevant requirements of ASTM Standard Specifications for Forged or Rolled Steel Pipe Flanges, Forged Fittings and Valves and Parts for High Temperature Service, A 105-65 Grade I or Grade II.

In addition the steel in the flanges shall have an impact value at 32°F of 25 foot pounds when tested by the Charpy Impact Test hereinbefore mentioned.

The dimensions of flanges used with pipe of 24 inches diameter and less shall comply with the American National Standard ANSI B 16.5-1968 Steel Pipe Flanges and Flanged Fittings and the dimensions for flanges used with pipe of diameter greater than 24 inches shall comply with the requirements of the Manufacturers Standardization Society of the Valve and Fittings Industry MSS-SP44-Steel Pipe-line Flanges.

They shall be designed for equal or higher pressure ratings than the pipes to which they are attached.

PRIVATE ADVERTISEMENTS**CITY OF BROADMEADOWS.****BY-LAW No. 63.**

A By-Law of the City of Broadmeadows Numbered 63 made under Section 93 clauses 'j' and 'k' of the *Health Act 1958* for the purpose of the regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of any place or any animals (including birds) which in the opinion of the Council, may be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous, and of fixing subject to Part IV of the *Health Act 1958* the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Broadmeadows order as follows:—

1. No person shall, except with the written consent of the Council, keep or permit to be kept more than two dogs upon any premises within the City of Broadmeadows, unless such dogs are confined within an enclosure approved of in writing by the Council.

2. The Council may refuse to approve of any enclosure upon any premises within the City of Broadmeadows if—

- (a) the said enclosure is situated within twenty-five feet of any dwelling house;
- (b) the said enclosure is not sufficiently secure to prevent the escape of dogs therefrom;
- (c) having regard to the character of the neighbourhood the Council is of the opinion that the keeping of more than two dogs upon the said premises would be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

3. The Council may give written consent pursuant to paragraph one hereof if it is of the opinion that the keeping of more than two dogs upon the said premises otherwise than within an enclosure would not be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

4. In respect of any enclosure approved of in writing by the Council pursuant to paragraph one hereof, the Council, if it is of the opinion that the keeping of more than two dogs within the said enclosure would be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous, may determine and cause to be stated upon the said written approval the maximum number of dogs which may be kept within the said enclosure, and it shall be an offence for any person to keep or permit to be kept more than the said number of dogs within the said enclosure.

5. Any receipt or certified copy thereof given by the Council pursuant to the provisions of the *Dog Act 1970* shall not be deemed a sufficient consent or approval in writing within the meaning of this By-Law.

6. Proof that any person is the occupier of any premises where a dog is usually kept or harboured or permitted to live or remain shall be prima facie evidence that such person keeps the said dog upon the said premises, provided that where there are more occupiers than one in any premises let in several apartments or lodgings or otherwise, the occupier of that particular part of such premises in which any dog is kept or harboured or permitted to live or remain shall be deemed to keep such dog upon such premises.

7. In this By-Law—

"dog" means any dog over the age of three months;
 "premises" means premises as defined in the *Health Act 1958*.

8. This By-Law shall come into operation on its being published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* and shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the City of Broadmeadows.

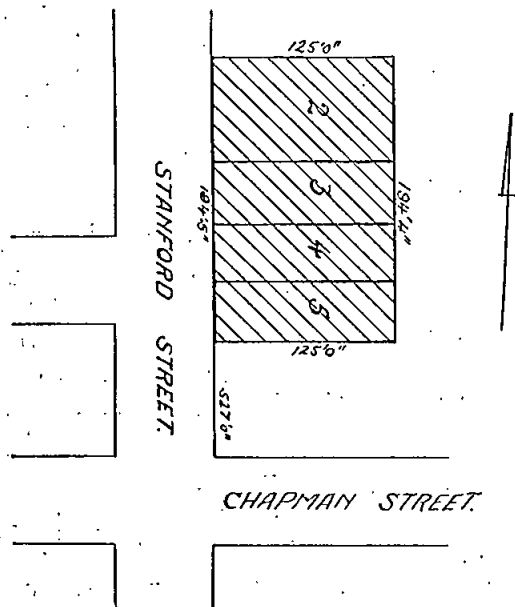

Attention is invited to the following procedure in relation to the publication of official matter in the *Government Gazette*:—

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the *Gazette* Officer.

1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council.

Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the *Gazette* Officer, Room 9, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

2. Other matter.

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the *Gazette* Officer not later than half-past Nine a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or at the direction of the *Gazette* Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.
