A By-Law of the City of Broadmeadows Numbered 63 made under Section 93 clauses 'j' and 'k' of the Health Act 1958 for the purpose of the regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of any place or any animals (including birds) which in the opinion of the Council, may be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous, and of fixing subject to Part IV of the Health Act 1958 the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Broadmeadows order as follows:-

- 1. No person shall, except with the written consent of the Council, keep or permit to be kept more than two dogs upon any premises within the City of Broadmeadows, unless such dogs are confined within an enclosure approved of in writing by the Council.
- 2. The Council may refuse to approve of any enclosure upon any premises within the City of Broadmeadows if—
  - (a) the said enclosure is situated within twenty-five feet of any dwelling house;
  - (b) the said enclosure is not sufficiently secure to prevent the escape of dogs therefrom;
  - (c) having regard to the character of the neighbour-hood the Council is of the opinion that the keeping of more than two dogs upon the said premises would be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.
- 3. The Council may give written consent pursuant to paragraph one hereof if it is of the opinion that the keeping of more than two dogs upon the said premises otherwise than within an enclosure would not be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.
- 4. In respect of any enclosure approved of in writing by the Council pursuant to paragraph one hereof, the Council, if it is of the opinion that the keeping of more than two dogs within the said enclosure would be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous, may determine and cause to be stated upon the said written approval the maximum number of dogs which may be kept within the said enclosure, and it shall be an offence for any person to keep or permit to be kept more than the said number of dogs within the said enclosure.
- 5. Any receipt or certified copy thereof given by the Council pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act 1970 shall not be deemed a sufficient consent or approval in writing within the meaning of this By-Law.

Proof that any person is the occupier of any premises where a dog is usually kept or harboured or permitted to live or remain shall be prima facie evidence that such person keeps the said dog upon the said premises, provided that where there are more occupiers than one in any premises let in several apartments or lodgings or otherwise, the occupier of that particular part of such premises in which any dog is kept or harboured or permitted to live or remain shall be deemed to keep such dog upon such premises.



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### LEXTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-LAW No. 3.

A By-law of the Lexton Waterworks Trust made under section 332 (1) of the Water Act 1958, and numbered 3, for the regulation of the resort thereto and the use thereof the Lexton Storage and Service Reservoirs.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958, the Chairman and Commissioners of the Lexton Waterworks Trust order as follows:—

- Waterworks Trust order as follows:—

  1. The area of the Lexton Storage Reservoir is that area defined on a plan lodged at the office of the Trust and contained in Certificate of Title Vol. 8735 Folio 277, together with that contained in Crown Grant Vol. 8617 Folio 892 of a total area of 48 acres 24 perches being parts of Crown Allotments 30A and 1968 in the Parish of Lexton, County of Talbot; and that of the Lexton Service Reservoir is that area defined on a plan lodged at the office of the Trust and contained in Certificate of Title Volume 8777 Folio 549 of an area of 2 acres 1 rood 39 perches, being Lot 1 of Plan of Subdivision No. 79526 and being part of Crown Allotment 3c, Parish of Lexton, County of Talbot, and these areas shall be referred to herein as "the Reservoirs".

  2. No person shall enter into or upon the Reservoirs
- 2. No person shall enter into or upon the Reservoirs nor into or upon the water of the said Reservoirs.
- 3. No person shall interfere with or remove any stone, soil, trees, shrubs, plants, animals, fish, birds, or other property on the Reservoirs.
- 4. No person shall bring into, carry, be in possession of, or use in the Reservoirs any firearms or fishing tackle, net, or other device for catching or snaring fish or other creatures in or upon the water or land.
- 5. No person shall bring or allow to remain on the Reservoirs any animal or bird whatsoever, and any such found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 6. No person shall camp or light a fire or in any way interfere with fencing, notices, structures, buildings, embankments, beaching or any other works of any kind in the Reservoirs.
- 7. No person shall bring into or use on or be in possession of or carry on or into the Reservoirs any boat or other means of moving in or on the water, and any such boat or device may be seized or confiscated.
- 8. No person may wade, swim, walk, bathe or otherwise enter into, on, or use the water of the Reservoirs.
- 9. No person shall cause any pollution in the Reservoir areas nor deposit or drop or place in the Reservoirs any stone, soil, manure, creature or other article or object of any kind.
- 10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reservoirs.
- all it is provided, however, that any or all of these things may be done if authorized by the Trust, in writing, under the hand of the Secretary, and that any Commissioner or Councillor, and any officer or employee of the Lexton Waterworks Trust or Lexton Shire Council may enter at all times into the Reservoirs and perform all necessary lawful tasks without such written authority.
- 12. Any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall render the offender liable to a penalty of not less than \$20 nor greater than \$40, and that for successive similar offences the minimum penalty shall be increased by \$10 for each successive offence until the maximum penalty of \$40 is reached. It is further provided that the penalty shall be imposed for each wilful act or default contrary to this By-law so that the aggregate of several acts or the several effects of one act contrary to the By-law may amount to more than \$40.

Further, a penalty of \$10 per day may be imposed for a continuing offence against this By-law after a conviction or order by any court.




# MAIN ROAD LARDNERS TRACK SHIRE OF WARRAGUL Messurements in links




# MAIN ROAD ALLANSFORD - PETERBOROUGH ROAD SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL. Measurements in links




MAIN ROAD MYRTLEFORD - YACKANDANDAH ROAD SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH








ROAD ENGLAND ROAD CITY OF WAVERLEY surements in fact & inches

- 7. No person shall damage or remove any placard or noticeboard within the Reserve.
- 8. No person shall bring any intoxicating liquor into the Reserve, and no person shall enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in the state of intoxication.
- 9. MANAGEMENT OF THE HAPPY VALLEY CROSSING CAMPING AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE.

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parishes of Clarkesdale, Mindai and Mannibadar and described in a notice published in the Gazette of the third day of February, 1971, were reserved as a site for Recreation and Camping Purposes: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore, I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve, the Reserve has been placed under the control of the Corporation of the Shire of Grenville as the Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the Committee) with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Committee shall have power, by Resolution to permit the use of the Reserve upon such terms and conditions as it determines, subject to such use being in accordance with the Reservation.

- 2. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any animal (including birds of any description), or any skin, egg, feathers, or nests, or carry any firearms, poison, traps. snares, or guns within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 3. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only in such places and in such manner as may be described by such Committee.
- 4. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord and any dog found wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed and the owner of such dog may be liable to pay compensation for any damage done by such dog to any property on the Reserve Reserve.
- 5. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- 6. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve or leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish or roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein.
- 8. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained.
- 9. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained.
- 10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained.
- 11. No person shall remove any earth, trees, structures, or materials from the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained.
- 12. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work or duty.
- 13. No club, association or person, shall hold entertainments, performances or sports without the consent in writing of the Committee first had and obtained. Such consent may be granted subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as the Committee deems to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations. The Committee of Management may authorize any club, association or person to make a charge for the admission thereto.—(Rs.9432).

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Jan Juc and described in a notice published in the Gazette of 2nd day of April, 1969, were reserved as a site for Public Recreation: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be

made: Now Therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

#### REGULATIONS.

- The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
  - 2. No person shall-
    - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner or creates or takes part in any disturbance.
    - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
    - (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
    - (d) Offer any article of food or drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale, or bring intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
    - (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed on the Reserve.
    - (f) Climb, jump on, or get over any of the gates, fences in or around the reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture, or fittings, gates, stiles, fences, seats, or other structures in the Reserve.
    - (g) Interfere with, break, or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs, or plants, or pluck flowers, destroy or cut grassess in the Reserve.
    - (h) Leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse, or rubbish whatsoever therein, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything that might injure a person.
    - (i) Light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee.
    - (j) Carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds thereon.
    - (k) Bet publicly in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
    - (1) Spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure in the Reserve.
    - (m) Erect any building, tent or structure or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.
    - (n) Bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
    - (o) Do anything whatsoever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

Every person infringing this Regulation in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve, in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable.

- 3. For the purpose of good order, any person authorized by the Committee may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.
- 4. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by a member or employee of the Committee to leave the same.

- 5. No club or association or person shall hold or take any part in any game of any description, entertainment, performance, show or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first obtained and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as the Committee deems to be reasonable and consistent with these regulations.
- 6. No person, except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge for admission is made without paying the fees chargeable for admission.
- 7. No person shall park a motor car within the Reserve except at such places, if any, as are set apart for the nurpose.
- 8. No person shall take or put or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals.
- 9. The owner of any horses, sheep, cattle, goats, pigs or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 10. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve or enter upon the arena therein without the permission of the Committee, and any person having done so shall leave the same on having been requested to do so by any member of the Committee, a Police Constable or Crown Lands Bailiff.
- 11. The driver of a motor car entering the Reserve shall proceed at a speed not exceeding 5 miles an hour in a direction indicated by persons appointed by the Committee to control same.
- 12. The Committee shall have the right to charge or authorize any person, club or association to charge a fee for admission to the Reserve on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, sports shows, musical performances, fetes, outdoor and holiday amusements on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding fifty cents (50c) may be charged and taken for admission from each adult person to the Reserve.
- 13. Persons renting or hiring any of the facilities in the Reserve may be required by the Committee to deposit a sum not exceeding One Hundred dollars (\$100) with the Committee by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such property hired, and the Committee may, at its absolute discretion, retain all or part of said sum to compensate it for any damage caused to property by the hirer, and all persons renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any Order given by the Committee.—(Rs. 9087.)


