Game Act 1958.

CLOSE SEASON FOR WILD DUCKS AND TEAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Game Act 1958*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation remove the period of the close season set opposite the names of the under-mentioned birds in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1958*, and prescribe instead of such period the period specified hereunder to be the close season in respect of such birds:—

The alteration made by this my Proclamation shall apply to and in relation to the close season ending on the second last Saturday in February, 1972 and to all subsequent close seasons, and shall come into operation on the third day of February, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, aforesaid, at Melbourne this 2nd day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two, and in the twentieth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

MOTOR CAR TRIALS OF SPEED WITHIN THE TOWN OF
CAMPERDOWN AND THE SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

Whereas it is enacted by sub-section (2) of section eighty-three of the *Motor Car Act 1958* that, if a motor car is used on a highway for purposes of racing or of trial of speed, the driver or the person in charge thereof shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars, provided that the said sub-section (2) shall not apply to a motor car used as aforesaid on any highway or portion thereof specified by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and on such days and during such hours as are specified in the Order:

And, whereas the Camperdown Motor Sports Club has requested that such an Order be made to enable motor car trials of speed to be conducted by the said Club on Mount Leura-road on Sundays, the 6th February, 1972, 30th April, 1972, 27th August, 1972 and 12th November, 1972.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Car Act 1958*, doth by this Order specify that portion of Mount Leura-road within the Town of Camperdown and the Shire of Hampden as a highway in respect of which any motor car may, without being subject to the application of the said sub-section (2) of section 83 of the *Motor Car Act*, be used for purposes of trials of speed under the control of the said Camperdown Motor Sports Club on Sundays, the 6th February, 1972, 30th April, 1972, 27th August, 1972 and 12th November, 1972, between the hours of twelve noon and five o'clock in the afternoon on each day provided that the Officer-in-Charge of Police in attendance is satisfied that the highway is in a satisfactory condition for racing purposes and that adequate arrangements have been made for the safety of the public.

And the Honorable Rupert James Hamer, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
