REGULATIONS.—PART IV.—SALARIES AND INCREMENTS.

The Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Service Act* 1958, hereby amends the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations as on and from the 28th May, 1972 as follows:—
