PROCLAMATION

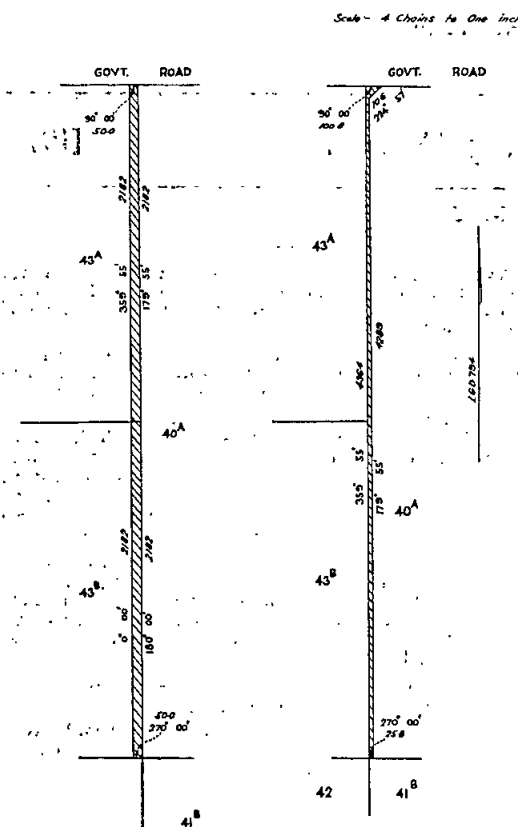
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by the *Local Government Act 1958*, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of the municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or

exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Hastings has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned being land used for a street or road or being a street, road, lane, or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating the street, road, lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Carpenters Lane, Hastings shown hatched on the plan, hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

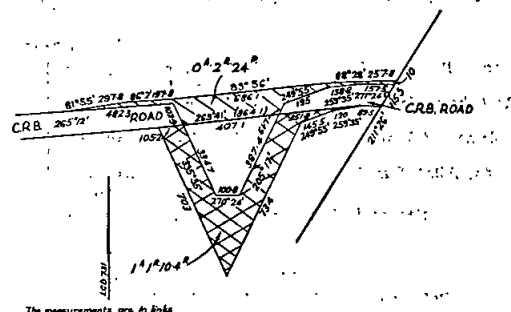

PIPELINE LICENCE.

Whereas sub-section (3) of section 30 of the *Pipelines Act 1967-1971* provides that the Minister may by notice published in the *Government Gazette* amend vary add to or revoke any conditions stated or included in a licence, I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Minister of Mines, do now hereby vary the conditions of Pipeline Licence No. 53 in the manner indicated in the Schedule hereto:—

SCHEDULE.

1. Delete the whole of sub-clause (iv) of Specification Clause (B) of the Schedule and substitute the following:—

(iv) Pipe Coatings:

Below ground piping: American Water Works Association A.W.W.A. Standard for Coal Tar Enamel Protective Coatings for Steel Water Pipe No. C203-62 covering primer, coal tar enamel, glass fibre reinforcement and 15 lb. coal tar saturated asbestos felt, except for a length of 9,070 feet at Altona as shown on Esso Drawing No. 309-ME1-6, Revision 6, which shall be Yellow Jacket polyethylene coating to Shaw Pipe Protection (Australia) Pty. Ltd. standard YJ1 Specification which accompanied the Esso-Hematite Application for Licence Variation dated 5th May, 1972, as Attachment "A".

Above ground piping: A length of 9,880 feet of above ground pipework at Altona and shown on Esso Drawing No. 309-ME1-6, Revision 6, shall be sandblasted, primed and painted in accordance with Painting Specifications which accompanied Esso-Hematite Application for Licence Variation dated 5th May, 1972, as Attachment "B".

The pipeline across Port Phillip Bay shall in addition to the above-referred-to coal tar enamel coating be weight-coated with a one inch minimum thickness of 140 pound per cubic foot concrete.

2. Delete the first two lines of sub-clause (iii) of Specification Clause (C) of the Schedule and substitute the following:—

Mainline valves shall be installed along the pipeline as shown on Esso Drawings No. 309-ME1-1, Revision 7; 309-ME1-5, Revision 9; and 309-ME1-6, Revision 6.

In addition, at each end of the Port Phillip Bay crossing.

3. Delete the whole of sub-clause (ii) of Specification Clause (D) of the Schedule and substitute the following:—

(ii) Ditching Requirements for the Port Phillip Bay Crossing:

Depths of cover to the top of the weight coating of the pipeline shall be not less than:—

(a) From the chainage 00 feet (i.e., Mordialloc shore at Central Zone "O" Rectangular Co-ordinates 1 079 291.77N, 1 184 585.53E—refer Esso Drawing No. 309-MF1-33) to chainage 2,000 feet seaward—six (6) feet of cover using sand backfill as specified in the Contract Documents.

(b) From chainage 2,000 feet to chainage 51,333 feet (i.e., east side of the shipping channel)—four (4) feet of cover using a local backfill material.

(c) From chainage 51,333 feet to chainage 53,579 feet (i.e., across the shipping channel)—seven (7) feet of cover using sand backfill. In addition to this requirement, the top of the weight coating of the pipeline shall be not less than fifty-seven (57) feet below Low Water Ordinary Spring Tide, which shall be taken to be the same as the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works datum.

(d) From chainage 53,579 feet to chainage 69,600 feet—five (5) feet of cover using sand backfill.

Zinc anode bracelets, constructed in accordance with details shown on Esso Drawing No. 304-MC6-4 shall be installed at 320 feet intervals along the pipeline.

Two electrolysis drainage bonds shall be installed at each end of the Port Phillip Bay section. Current measuring test points shall be installed on the Port Phillip Bay side of each drainage bond to ensure drainage bonds are effective in preventing stray currents flowing offshore.

Three potential measuring test points shall be installed in the Bay section as shown on Esso Drawing No. 309-ME-7-3.

7. Delete the whole of sub-clause (iv) of Specification Clause (G) of the Schedule and substitute the following:—

(iv) Marker Buoys—Port Phillip Bay Section.

A By-Law of the City of Knox made under the provisions of Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 18 for the purpose of:—

- (a) Regulating sewerage and drainage;
- (b) Providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases; and
- (c) Suppressing nuisances.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Knox order as follows:—

1. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—

"Board" means the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Knox.

"Property" includes any land upon which a house or other building is erected.

"Sewer" means a sewer laid by the Board.

"Sullage water" includes household waste water.

2. (1) The owner of every property in respect of which a general notice has been given by the Board under Section 160 (1) of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958*, shall:—

(a) Make provision to have the sewage carried off from such property by the sewer laid by the Board; and

(b) Provide such proper water closet or water closets and such drains, appliances, apparatus and connexion with such sewer as may be prescribed by Regulations of the Board:—

within twelve months or such further time as the Council may allow from the date of the coming into operation of this By-Law where such a general notice has been given prior to the said date or within twelve months or such further time as aforesaid from the date of any such general notice given after the coming into operation of this By-Law as the case may be.

2. (2) All such sewerage works and the provision of all such water closet or water closets, drains, appliances, apparatus and connexions with a sewer shall be carried out, fitted and laid in accordance with Regulations prescribed by the Board.

(3) Any owner desirous of an extension of time beyond the said period of twelve months shall—

(a) Make application, in writing, to the Council; and
(b) In his application give:—

- (i) His full name and address,
- (ii) Particulars of his property,
- (iii) The reasons why he requires an extension; and
- (iv) Any other information the Council may require.
