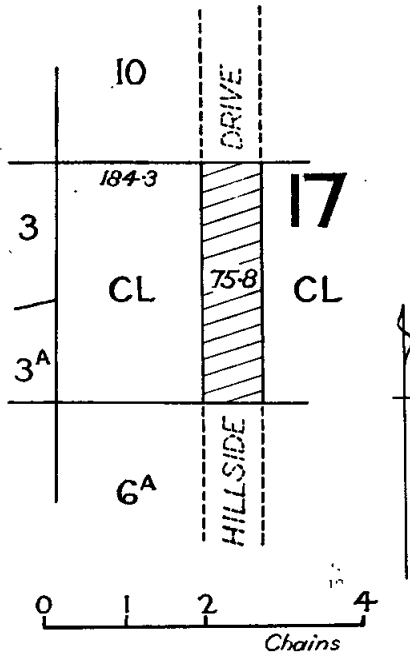

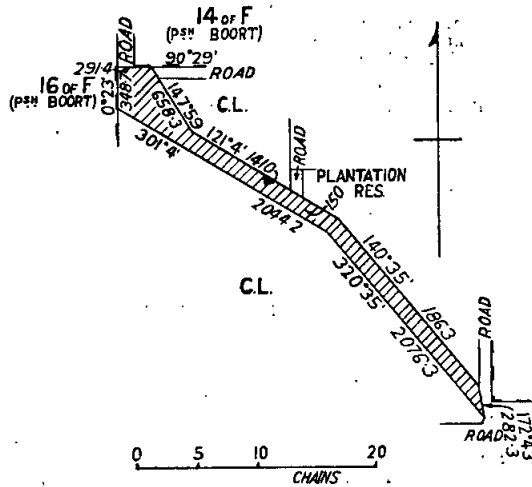

MENTAL HEALTH ACT 1959.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 24 of the Mental Health Act 1959 (No. 6605), it is provided that the Governor in Council may by proclamation published in the Government Gazette proclaim one or more buildings or places provided by the State for the treatment of the mentally ill or the intellectually defective or any part of such building or place to be—

- (a) a psychiatric hospital;
- (b) a mental hospital;
- (c) a training centre; or
- (d) a repatriation mental hospital;

And whereas by sub-section (3) of Section 24 it is provided that the Governor in Council may by proclamation published in the Government Gazette exempt from all or any of the provisions of Act No. 6605 any specified building forming part of an institution;

And whereas by Proclamation of the Governor in Council made pursuant to sub-section (1) of Section 24 of the Mental Health Act 1959 and dated the seventeenth day of May, 1966, and published in the Government Gazette of the twenty-fifth day of May, 1966, the whole of the area in the Parish of Keelbundora, County of Bourke, indicated by hachure on the plan attached to the said Proclamation dated the seventeenth day of May, 1966, was proclaimed as a mental hospital known as the Mental Hospital Mont Park:

Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do, by this my Proclamation exempt from all of the provisions of the Mental Health Act 1959 as from the first day of September, 1972, the building, known as the General Surgical Unit and forming part of the Mont Park Mental Hospital, which is located in a south-easterly direction from Main Drive and at the rear of the Mont Park Psychiatric Hospital, proclaimed as such on the 1st day of December, 1971.

CITY OF CAULFIELD.

CITY OF CAULFIELD BY-LAW No. 151.

A by-law of the City of Caulfield made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 151 for the purpose of regulating the proceedings of Council and Committee Meetings and other meetings conducted by the City of Caulfield, and for other purposes.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of any and every set power it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and citizens of the City of Caulfield orders as follows:—

1. This By-Law is known as the Proceedings of Council By-Law.

2. By-Law No. 134 of the City of Caulfield is hereby repealed.

3. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

4. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Committee" means a standing committee or an occasional committee of the Council and to the extent applicable includes the Council in committee of the whole; "Officer" means an officer appointed by the Council.

Business to be Considered.

5. No business shall be considered at any Ordinary or Special Meetings of the Council or any meetings of the Council's Standing Committees unless it appears on the agenda or in any report accompanying same except:—

- (a) if the matter has been referred to the Council by a Committee which has met earlier on the same day;
- (b) if the matter has arisen since the presentation of the agenda and reports and is of such importance that a decision of the Council cannot be delayed, and the matter submitted to Council is read either in the form of a supplementary agenda or report by the Town Clerk so that it may be incorporated in the Minutes of the Council which must resolve it to be urgent and therefore may be considered without notice.

6. A copy of the agenda paper for every Council and Standing Committee Meeting together with all reports to be considered at the Meeting, shall be delivered or sent by post or otherwise to the place of abode or to the usual place of business (if any) within the municipal district of each Councillor at least 48 hours before the time fixed for the holding of that particular meeting.

Admission of the Public.

7. The business of the Council shall be conducted at all Ordinary Meetings of the Council with open doors but the majority of the members present at such a Meeting may resolve that any question shall be considered in Committee of the whole and a motion to that effect may be moved without previous notice and if carried the Council shall thereupon resolve itself into Committee of the whole.

8. Members of the public shall be excluded from meetings of the Council as a Committee of the whole and from Committee meetings.

Council Meetings.

9. In all cases not provided for by this By-Law resort shall be had to the rules, forms and usages of parliament which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council.

Confirmation of Minutes.

10. At every meeting of the Council the first business shall subject to the proviso hereto be the reading of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting and putting a question for the confirmation thereof provided that if all councillors present indicate that they have received a copy of such minutes the reading thereof may be dispensed with.

11. No discussion shall be permitted on these Minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said Minutes shall then be signed as required by Law.

Order of Business.

12. After the signing of the Minutes the order of business for an Ordinary Meeting of the Council shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular Meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- I. The resumption of debate on motions or Orders of the Day lapsed at previous Meeting.
- II. Declaration of Councillors of any direct or indirect pecuniary interests in items listed for consideration on the agenda.
- III. Considering and Ordering upon Inward Correspondence referred to in Clause 14 hereof.
- IV. The Reception and Reading of Petitions and Memorials.
- V. The presentation of Committee Reports.
- VI. Payment of Accounts.
- VII. Consideration of Ordinary Business.
- VIII. Questions with or without notice.
- IX. Orders of the Day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.

- X. Consideration of any matter or class of matters which might be delegated to a Committee or to an Officer.
 - XI. Extraordinary Business.
 - XII. Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
 - XIII. Notices of Motion.
13. The order of business at a Special Meeting of the Council shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Correspondence.

14. The Town Clerk shall prepare and place before each Meeting of the Council or the appropriate Committee a summary of the correspondence to be considered at such meeting.

Petitions and Memorials.

15. It shall be incumbent upon every Councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Council and that the contents do not violate any By-Law or any provision thereof.

16. Every Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

17. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks and by no-one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

18. No letters, affidavits or other such documents shall be attached to any petition.

19. Every Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it and to the reading of the Prayer thereof.

20. No motion except that for receiving same shall, unless what the Council considers urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial or other like application until the next Meeting of the Council after that at which it has been presented.

Committee Reports.

21. The Town Clerk shall cause a report of each Committee Meeting to be prepared prior to the holding of each Ordinary Meeting of the Council.

22. Meetings of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committees' Minute Book and signed by the Chairman of the Committee who shall present the Report to the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council.

23. Committee Reports presented to Council shall be submitted in two parts:—

- (a) A schedule of decisions made and acted upon in the exercise of any power delegated by the Council, and
- (b) A summary of items and recommendations therein where the decision is to be made by the Council.

24. (a) The Council shall formally ratify the decisions made by a Committee and included in its report pursuant to Clause 23 (a) hereof.

(b) The Council may adopt the whole of the recommendations made by a Committee pursuant to Clause 23 (b) hereof, and contained in its report or may adopt such recommendations other than that or those specified and may vary or reject any specified recommendation.

25. Upon the adoption of the Report by the Council, each decision made and acted upon and each recommendation contained in the Report as adopted, shall be treated in Law as being a resolution of the Council.

Ordinary Business.

26. A Councillor at any ordinary meeting of the Council may raise for the consideration of the Council a matter of which a notice of motion has not been given provided however that unless a majority of the Councillors present at such Meeting agree no such matter shall be raised if a resolution of the Council therein is to be sought.

Questions with and without Notice.

27. Every Councillor present at every Ordinary Meeting of the Council shall be given the opportunity of asking questions either with or without notice of any other Councillor present or any member of the Council's staff, and if such questions to such officers cannot be answered then it shall be incumbent upon the Town Clerk to ascertain the answer thereto in order that it may be read by the Chairman at the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council.

28. Questions upon Notice shall be notified to the Town Clerk at least five days before the time fixed for holding of the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council.

29. All questions and answers shall be as brief as possible and discussion on any question or answer may be allowed only at the discretion of the Chairman.

30. A question may be disallowed by the Chairman upon the ground that it:—

- (a) relates to a matter ultra vires the Council;
- (b) is defamatory, indecent, abusive or objectionable in language or obscene;
- (c) is repetitive of a question already answered whether at the same or an earlier Meeting;
- (d) is asked to embarrass a fellow Councillor or the Officer concerned.

Consideration of Matters of Delegation.

31. It shall be competent for any Committee or for the Town Clerk to submit for consideration by the Council the delegation (with or without direction or limitation) of any matter or class of matter to a Committee or to an Officer.

Notices of Motion.

32. All notices of motion (where notice of motion is required by Law to be given) shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover, to the Town Clerk at the close of the Meeting of Council or at such time before the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council as will permit the Town Clerk to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for Special Meetings, and the Town Clerk shall enter the same in the Notices of Motion Book in the order in which they are given.

Motions and Amendments.

33. A motion moved at a Meeting of the Council need not be reduced in writing by the mover unless the Chairman of the Meeting so directs.

34. The Town Clerk shall cause to be recorded in the Rough Minutes and the Minutes of the Council all motions given and seconded at a Meeting of the Council.

35. A motion or amendment shall be:

- (a) within the powers of the Council;
- (b) relevant to the item of business properly before the Council.

36. A motion or amendment which is not seconded lapses.

37. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Council.

38. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote by the Council unless it is seconded, but a Councillor may require the endorsement of any Standing Order of the Council by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

39. A Councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon but a Councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

40. No Councillor shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

41. The mover of every original proposition or any amendment thereto shall have a right of reply, to be exercised at the conclusion of the debate.

42. The Councillors present at a Meeting of Council shall designate each other by their official titles and stand when addressing the Council.

43. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time the Chairman shall decide which Councillor is entitled to priority.

Points of Order.

44. The Chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

45. No Councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on Councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly, and such remarks shall be withdrawn by the offending Councillor when required by the Chairman and a satisfactory apology made to the Council.

46. A Councillor using offensive or disorderly language or having been twice called to order or to withdraw or apologise for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

Voting.

47. The Council shall vote by show of hands and any Councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by Law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

48. The Chairman shall in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative and the result thereof shall be recorded in the Minutes.

49. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon the original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

50. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved.

Motion for Adjournment.

51. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council but if on the question being put the motion is negatived, the subject then under discussion or next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment, be met.

Protests.

52. Any Councillor may protest against any resolution of the council and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reason for protesting and shall be entered three days at least before the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council by the protesting Councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Town Clerk and signed by such Councillor and shall also be entered in the Minutes of the Meeting at which notice of intention to protest is given previously to the confirmation thereof but such protest may be expunged from the Minutes if declared by a majority of the Council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Council.

Lapsed Question.

53. If a debate on any Motion or Order of the Day be interrupted by a number of Councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the next Meeting of the Council at the point where it was interrupted.

Committees.

54. The Council shall each year appoint Standing Committees and shall determine the number of Councillors (other than the Mayor) of which each such Standing Committee shall consist and the purposes of each such Standing Committee.

Committee Chairman.

55. Each such Committee shall appoint its own Chairman, and the Chairman or other member of the Committee acting as such for the occasion shall, in the case of an equality of votes, be entitled to a second or casting vote. In the event of the Council appointing more than one Standing Committee no Councillor shall be appointed Chairman of more than one such Committee.

56. The Town Clerk shall convene every Committee within 10 days of its first appointment or at any other time thereof by Order of the Council or on the written order of the Chairman or any two members of the Committee.

Common Seal.

57. The Common Seal of the Council shall be kept by the Town Clerk in a safe place and shall not be affixed to any document except by the authority of the Council and in the presence of one Councillor and the Town Clerk.

Staff.

58. No appointment to any senior position at the disposal of the Council shall take place until 7 clear days public notice has been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Municipal District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for such position.

59. The initial salary and/or allowance to be paid for such positions shall be fixed prior to the appointment of any person to fill that vacancy.

60. No Councillor or Officer of the Council and no auditor of the Municipality shall be received as a surety for any Officer appointed by the Council or for any work to be done for the Council.

61. A Council Officer may make a brief statement at a Council or Committee Meeting in respect of any statement (whether made at a Council Meeting or not) affecting him as an Officer or any Officer under his control.

62. A statement under Clause 61:—

- (i) in respect of a statement made by a Councillor or Officer at a Council or Committee Meeting shall be made immediately the Councillor or Officer resumes his seat; and
- (ii) in respect of a statement made other than at a Council or Committee Meeting shall be made at such time during the Meeting as the Chairman determines to be appropriate.

Disbursement of Monies.

63. It shall be lawful for the Accountant of the Municipality from time to time on a written order of the Town Clerk, to disburse such monies as have been appropriated by the Council for the purpose of this clause and as are required for any necessary occasion not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two Ordinary Meetings of the Council the sum of \$100.00.

Suspension of Standing Orders.

64. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this By-Law may be suspended for a special purpose if notice of motion is duly given and shall not otherwise be suspended except by an unanimous vote by the whole of the Councillors present at the Meeting.

Public Works and Services.

65. (i) Subject as is hereinafter provided plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Council at least 6 days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

(ii) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided plans and specifications for public works which the Council may resolve to be urgent may be considered and ordered upon at any Meeting of the Council.

Penalty.

66. Every person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00.

The Resolution for passing this By-Law was agreed to by the Council on the 4th July, 1972, and confirmed on the 1st August, 1972.

CITY OF NUNAWADING.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PROPER MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF LIBRARIES.

Regulation No. 3.

A Regulation of the City of Nunawading Numbered 3 made under Section 2 of Part IV of the Fifteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1958* in force in the City of Nunawading by virtue of a bylaw of the Shire of Blackburn and Mitcham Numbered 4 for the proper management and control of libraries belonging to the City of Nunawading or under the management and control of the Council.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Nunawading makes the following regulation which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

(1) In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

- (a) "Council" means the Council of the City of Nunawading.
- (b) "Municipality" means the municipal district of the City of Nunawading.
- (c) "Library" means any library or library vehicles belonging to the City of Nunawading or under the management or control of the Council and the several rooms, offices, passages, entrances and exits forming part thereof and adjacent thereto.
- (d) "Book" includes any book periodical newspaper pamphlet magazine picture print map chart photograph plan manuscript record tape film strip or slide or any other article of a like nature forming part of the contents of a library.

(e) "Registered Reader" or "Reader" means a person to whom a reader's card has been issued in accordance with these Regulations. The expression "Reader" unless the context otherwise requires also includes a person who enters any reference or reading room.

(f) "Librarian" means and includes the City Librarian or any person duly authorised on his or her behalf.

(2) Every library shall have as its aim the encouragement of all individuals and groups who seek information, inspiration or recreation from printed or recorded material. The Council subscribes to the Library Association of Australia's current "Statement of principles on freedom to read", the conditions of which are observed in the Library's acquisition policy.

(3) The Library shall be for the use of persons who pay rates to and/or who live, work or attend schools in the Municipality of Nunawading, provided that before borrowing any books or other material, they shall have completed an enrolment form prescribed by the Council and been issued with a reader's card.

(4) Books may be lent to other libraries within the provisions of the Municipal Inter-Library Committee (Victoria) or to registered readers visiting from other municipalities with reciprocal arrangements, at the discretion of the Librarian.

(5) The Librarian has the responsibility of administering the service equally and without favour to all eligible persons, according to Council's policy and within the scope of the above statements.

(6) No charge shall be made for the use or borrowing of library books or other material.

(7) The Library will be open at such times as the Council may determine. The Council reserves the right to amend as necessary the days and hours of opening.

(8) The Council, through the Librarian shall have the right to levy charges to cover stationery and mailing costs where postage is needed, e.g. the reservation of books. It may also charge for any extra service which may be provided from time to time, e.g. printed catalogues, photocopies, gramophone records. A charge may also be made for the replacement of any reader's ticket or token, or any other item used in the borrowing of books.

(9) (a) A book shall be for the exclusive use of the person to whom it is issued, and that person shall be responsible for the care and safe return of the book or other material to the library within the time specified by the rules then in force. Fines and the cost of any reminders sent may be charged for overdue books but there is no obligation on the Librarian to send any such reminders. If the Library property is not returned, or proper restitution made when requested, the Council reserves the right to take legal action, and authorise the Librarian to take any reasonable precaution to protect Council property.

(b) The issue of a book is a confidential transaction between the library and the reader.

(10) In the event of the loss of or damage to a book, the reader to whom the book was issued shall pay a charge based on the cost of replacement or shall compensate the Council for the damage or loss as assessed by the Librarian.

(11) Regardless of any amount paid in fines for overdue, damaged or lost books, the book shall remain the property of the Council.

(12) A book is not to be considered "returned" to the Library unless it has been handed to a Librarian and any records discharged. Although the Librarian will attempt to deal with books returned by post or messenger, the reader may still be held responsible in the event of loss.

(13) The condition of a book on its return to the library is the responsibility of the person who returns it. Readers should therefore report to the Librarian any damage to a book before borrowing it.

(14) To maintain good service and a pleasant atmosphere the co-operation of readers is sought, and the Librarian is authorised to exclude from the use of the library persons who default in the return and treatment of books or whose conduct in or around the library may cause annoyance to readers or staff.

Conduct specifically prohibited includes being offensively unclean, smoking, taking part in loud or objectionable conversation, bringing dogs (except a Guide for the Blind) or other animals into the library, eating or sleeping in the library; entering and remaining in areas provided for the staff and their work, or in the library after hours of closing, obstructing the staff or other readers, refusing to observe

routines for the correct borrowing and return of books, marking, soiling, tracing, or defacing in any way books, periodicals or other library property.

The decision as to whether or not a nuisance is being created shall be the responsibility of the Librarian and staff.

(15) The council shall have no responsibility for any mishap which may occur in or around the public toilets, or on the public approaches to the Library and the surrounding parkland.

(16) The Council shall have no responsibility for bicycles, prams or other property left outside the Library, nor for private property left in the Library.

(17) Special collections are provided for children to the age of 14, but no blame shall be attached to the library if they borrow books which in some opinions, are unsuitable for youth.

If parents believe that adolescents' reading should be censored, the parents must be the censors, not the Library.

Offence.

(18) Any person who commits any offence against these Regulations shall, on being requested by the Librarian to do so, leave the library, and shall not thereafter, without the permission of the Librarian, enter or use the Library.

(19) Notwithstanding any other provision of these Regulations any person who is in the Library shall give his name and address to the Librarian on being requested by the Librarian to do so.

Resolution for passing this Regulation was agreed to by the Council of the City of Nunawading on the 19th day of June, 1972, and confirmed on the 10th day of July, 1972.
