MAIN ROAD RUSHWORTH — STANHOPE ROAD





No person shall, with water supplied by the Trust, water any commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries, or land used for growing green feed for commercial poultry farms within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers except between the hours of 4 a.m. and 7 a.m. of each day. (Maximum of three sprinklers.)
- 5. No person shall, with water supplied by the Trust by means of a hose:
 - (a) wash any vehicle caravan & boats. vehicle, including cars, trailers,
 - (b) wash any paths, walks or buildings.

- 5. Every person who uses or permits or suffers water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-Law shall be guilty of a breach of this By-Law.
- 6. Every person guilty of a breach of this By-Law, shall for every breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).
- 7. Restrictions on the use of Water-Stage Two.

The Kerang Waterworks Trust (hereinafter referred to as "The Trust") in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1958 doth hereby make the By-Law following, restricting the use for other than domestic purposes of water supplied by the said Trust within its district.

1. This By-Law shall apply to and have force throughout the whole of the Kerang Waterworks District, and shall come into operation at such time or times as the Trust directs by notice published in a newspaper circulating generally within the Waterworks District, and shall cease to operate at such time or times as the Trust may direct by notice so published.

- 2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any other By-Law of the Trust, during the period of operation of this By-Law and subject to the provisions of clauses 3 and 4 of this By-Law no person shall, with water supplied by the Trust-
 - (a) Water any garden, lawn, plantation, orchard, uncovered place, tree, plant or vegetation within the specified area except by means of a hose held in the hand, or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand.
 - (b) Fill, add to or cleanse any private Swimming
 Pool within the specified area, except during
 periods in accordance with conditions stipulated
 by notice in writing to each of the proprietors,
 or bodies concerned following application to
 the Trust by such proprietors or bodies.
- 3. No person, shall, with water supplied by the Trust, water any land comprising sports ground, golf courses, race courses, public and club bowling and croquet greens and public and club tennis courts within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers except between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. of each day. (Maximum of three sprinklers.)
- 4. No person shall, with water supplied by the Trust, water any commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries, or land used for growing greenfeed for commercial poultry farms within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers except between the hours of 4 a.m. and 7 a.m. of each day. (Maximum of 3 sprinklers.)
- 5. No person shall, with water supplied by the Trust by means of a hose:
 - (a) Wash any vehicle, including cars, trailers, caravans and boats.
 - (b) Wash any paths, walks or buildings.
- 6. The occupier of any premises shall not permit or suffer any hose therein to be connected to any tap, stopcock or pipe supplied with water by the Trust other than during the approved times for the use of hoses set out in clauses 2, 3, and 4 above.
- 7. Every person who uses or permits or suffers water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-Law shall be guilty of a breach of this By-Law.
- 8. Every person guilty of a breach of this By-Law; shall for every breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).
- 9. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-Law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied to him or for his use and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Act 1958.





MAIN ROAD NATIMUK - HAMILTON ROAD SHIRE OF KOWREE Measuramente in Links





- A By-Law of the Shire of Berwick made under Section 326 of the Health Act 1958 and Numbered 59 for:
 - (a) Fixing the rates of fees or dues payable to the Council under Part XV, of the Health Act 1958.

- (b) Prescribing the times for slaughtering animals at public and private abattoirs.
- (c) The feeding, watering and tending and the pre-venting of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in abattoirs.
- (d) Stopping temporarily the manufacture of and the sale of small goods in circumstances in which danger to the consumer is apprehended owing to uncleanliness or to the presence of infection on or about the premises where such manufacture or sale is carried on.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health* Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Berwick orders as follows:

- 1. This By-Law shall be known as the Abattoirs By-Law.

- 4. (a) The times for slaughtering animals at public or private abattoirs are hereby prescribed as being between the hours of 6 o'clock in the morning and 3 o'clock in the afternoon of any week day other than Saturday.
- (b) No person shall slaughter any animals at any public or private abattoir at any time other than the times prescribed by this By-Law, except where in the opinion of the Meat Inspector it is necessary immediately to slaughter any animal.
 - 5. The proprietor or person in charge of any abattoir:
 - (a) Shall at all times cause to be provided for and to be available to all animals therein adequate water and food for the use of such animals.
 - (b) Shall not suffer any animal or animals therein to be overcrowded or treated with_cruelty. .
- 6. Any person having the control or management of any animal or animals in any abattoir:
 - (a) Shall at all times cause to be provided for and to be available to such animal or animals adequate water and food for the use of such animal or animals.
 - (b) Shall not suffer any such animal or animals to be overcrowded or treated with cruelty.
- 7.
