SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by section 14 of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1958, No. 6409, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation specified a day being a day not less than 30 days after the publication of such Proclamation from and after which any noxious weed specified in such Proclamation shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land in Victoria or in any part of Victoria described in the Proclamation:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonweath of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby specify the third day of November, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two, as the day from and after which the noxious weed, Senecio jacobaea L.—Ragwort—shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land in those parts of Victoria described in the Schedule hereunder.

ALTERATION OF CONSTITUTION OF A UNION.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by the Weights and Measures Act 1958, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at a request by municipalities constituting a Union alter or revoke any such proclamation declaring such municipalities to be a Union for the purposes of this Act.

And whereas the Cities of Box Hill, Camberwell, Hawthorn, Kew, Nunawading, Richmond, Ringwood, Croydon, Doncaster and Templestowe and the Shire of Lillydale do constitute a Union for the purposes of the Weights and Measures Act 1958, under the name "East Central Weights and Measures Union".

And whereas the Council of each of the said municipalities has requested that the terms "apportionment of the expenses devolving on the Union" be altered.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Weights and Measures Act 1958, do by this proclamation alter the proclamation which apportioned the expenses devolving on such Union

  - (e) disturb or remove any earth, sand, stone, marl or gravel from the Reserve;
  - (f) deposit or leave any bottles, glass or any other unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind on any part of the Reserve.
- 3. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management—
  - (a) light or cause to be lit any fires in the Reserve except in a fireplace provided by the Committee for this purpose;
  - (b) erect any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale or hire any article or commodity;
  - (c) bring into the Reserve any animal unless such animal is and continues to be at all times under proper control and does not disturb or inconvenience any person or persons on the Reserve;
  - (d) bring into the Reserve any dog unless such dog is and continues to be at all times controlled by a chain or leash;
  - (e) play at or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve;
  - (f) perform in any band of music, deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon or address of any kind or hold or take part in any public assemblage on the Reserve.
- 4. Any person bringing a vehicle onto the Reserve must abide by all traffic regulations as provided for by the Committee from time to time.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WIMMERA MALLEE PIONEERS MUSEUM".

I, William, Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 218 of the Land Act 1958, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect of the land in the Parish of Jeparit temporarily reserved by Order in Council, dated the 4th November, 1970, as a site for Public Purposes (Historical Purposes) and hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve":—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Corporation of the Shire of Dimboola as the Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public every day from 9.30 a.m. to 12 a.m., 1 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. or by special appointment subject to the payment of such fees as may be prescribed and deemed reasonable by the Committee

- 5. No person, except on lawful occasions, may enter any enclosed area or building, garage, or shed, or any other structure within the Reserve.
- 6. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 7. No person shall remain within the Reserve, or on any property therein, when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown lands, or member of the Police Force or authorized officer on the Committee.
- 8. No person shall hawk or sell, or offer for sale, within the Reserve, any goods, fruit, or merchandise or anything, or solicit or gather money therein without the authority, in writing, of the Committee.

  9. No person shall give out, or distribute, any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers in the Reserve, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers.

  10. No person shall take part in any public entertain
- 10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.
- 11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless securely held by chain, cord, or leash, without the permission of the Committee.
- 12. No person shall bring in or allow to remain in the Reserve any horse, cow, sheep, goat, pig or any other animal, without permission of the Committee.
- 13. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any wall, structure, or property within the Reserve.
- 14. No person shall remove any of the exhibits at the Museum from their fixtures without permission of the Officer in Charge.

- 15. No person shall interfere with or enter the enclosures of animals and birds within the Reserve.
- 16. No fires shall be lit in the Reserve except in the fireplaces provided.

within six months or such further time as the Council may allow from the date of the coming into operation of this Bylaw where such a general notice has been given prior to the said date or within six months or such further time as aforesaid from the date of any such general notice given after the coming into operation of this bylaw as the case may be.
