(*Albert Park Land Act 1972.*)

No. 8296. "An Act to amend the *Yarraville (Recreation Ground) Lands Act 1967* and for other purposes." (*Yarraville (Recreation Ground) Lands (Amendment) Act 1972.*)

- (ii) engaged or take part in any vehicular racing on any part of any park or reserve;
- (iii) fly model aeroplanes or gliders in or over any park or reserve;
- (iv) play any unlawful game or make any wager for money or carry on any form of gambling in any park or reserve without also obtaining the written consent of all other relevant authorities;
- (v) interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt any employee, officer or servant of the Council engaged in any duty or work in any park or reserve;
- (vi) sell, expose or offer for sale in any park or reserve any article of food or drink or any other article whatsoever or operate or cause to be operated any amusement for which a charge is made, make any charge for admission into any park or reserve or make a collection therein for any purpose whatsoever;
- (vii) behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any fight or disturbance or use any indecent or abusive language or commit any nuisance or in any way offend against decency by means of dress, language or conduct in any park or reserve;
- (viii) enter or remain in any park or reserve whilst in a drunken or intoxicating condition or whilst under the influence of any hallucinatory drug;
- (ix) enter or remain in or upon the playing arena in any sports ground during the progress of any sports match or sports gathering or otherwise interfere with the same save and except players, officials or competitors or interrupt or interfere with any employee, officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty or work;
- (x) remain in any park or reserve at any time when directed to leave the same by any Police Officer or employee, officer or servant of the Council whether or not a fee or charge of admission may have been paid;
- (xi) engage in play or practice cricket, football, bowls, tennis, lacrosse, golf or any like games in any park or reserve except in the case of children under the age of 14 years when occupied in playing in ball games in children's playgrounds and areas set aside for that purpose;
- (xii) camp or pitch or erect or occupy any camp, tent or temporary shelter in any park or reserve;
- (xiii) light any fire or permit any fire to remain alight in any park or reserve save in a fireplace provided by the Council for that purpose and subject to due observance and compliance with all statutory restrictions which may be in force;
- (xiv) bring allow or have any dog in any park or reserve unless such dog is controlled by a leash, chain or cord;

- (xv) ride or lead on to or on any part of any park or reserve or bring on to or put in any park or reserve or tether or cause to be tethered on any part of any park or reserve any cattle or graze cattle or permit or suffer cattle or any other animal to graze in any park or reserve;
- (xvi) carry any firearm or weapon in any park or reserve or shoot, snare or destroy any animal whatsoever in any park or reserve or on any water in or adjacent to any park or reserve or bathe within any such water;
- (xvii) use or carry on any activity in any park or reserve in any manner as to damage, mutilate, defile, deface or destroy any property or any thing therein;
- (xviii) interfere with or break or damage or remove any tree, plant, shrub or flower or any soil, sand, rock, stone, marl or gravel from in or upon any park or reserve or from any lawn or ornamental plantation in or upon any street or road or walk on the flower beds or borders or climb, jump or get upon or over any fence, gate, building or part thereof other than seats set aside for the public or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, walls, seats or other structures or roll or throw stones or missiles or leave in any reserve or garden or part thereof or building therein any bottle, can, broken glass, paper, fruits skins or peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever except in the receptacles provided or spit upon or expectorate upon or otherwise foul any path or structure or remove, displace, disfigure or damage any notice board or score board in or upon any park or reserve;
- (xix) bring into or consume in any park or reserve or permit or suffer to be brought in or consumed in any park or reserve any hallucinatory drug;

5. In any park or reserve or portion of any park or reserve where children's playgrounds have been established by the provision of playground equipment no person shall, without the consent in writing of the Council first had and obtained:

- (a) use any appliance erected in or upon such area for a longer period than five minutes if any other person is waiting to use such appliance;
- (b) enter or remain in such area between the hours of sunset and sunrise;
- (c) being a person above the age of 14 years, enter upon or remain on such an area or use any of the appliances therein except for the purpose of watching over or supervising any child or children in the charge, care or control of such person.

6. The parks and reserves under the management or control of the Council and all grounds appertaining thereto shall be open from sunrise to sunset in each day of the week.

7.
