MENTAL HEALTH ACT 1959.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 24 of the Mental Health Act 1959 (No. 6605), it is provided that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette proclaim one or more buildings or places provided by the State for the treatment of the mentally ill or the intellectually defective or any part of such building or place to be—

- (a) a psychiatric hospital;
- (b) a mental hospital;
- (c) a training centre; or

(d) a repatriation mental hospital;

And whereas by sub-section (3) of Section 24 it is provided that the Governor in Council may by proclamation published in the Government Gazette exempt from all or any of the provisions of Act No. 6605 any specified building forming part of an institution;

And whereas by Proclamation of the Governor in Council made pursuant to sub-section (1) of Section 24 of the Mental Health Act 1959 and dated the twenty-third day of October, 1962, and published in the Government Gazette of the thirty-first day of October, 1962, the buildings or places in the Parish of Boroondara, County of Bourke, indicated by hachure on the plan attached to the said Proclamation dated the twenty-third day of October, 1962, were proclaimed as a mental hospital known as the Mental Hospital, Kew;

And whereas the building known as the Surgical Unit, the south-eastern corner of which is located 315 feet north of the northern boundary of Wills Street and 2090 feet west of the western boundary of Princess Street forms part of the Mental Hospital, Kew;

And whereas it is desired that the building known as the Surgical Unit be exempt from all the provisions of the Mental Health Act 1959 (No. 6605):

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation exempt from all of the provisions of the Mental Health Act 1959 as from the first day of March, 1973, the building known as the Surgical Unit forming part of the Mental Hospital, Kew.






MAIN ROAD WARRNAMBOOL - PENSHURST ROAD

- (b) When the Authority designs work for the owner and the owner then carries out his own work—
 - (1) For plan of drainage a fee of Ten Dollars (\$10) plus Two Dollars Fifty Cents (\$2.50) for each fixture for the first ten (10) fixtures and then One Dollar Fifty Cents (\$1.50) for each control of the contro additional fixture.

For design of a plumbing installation the charge will be computed according to the time occupied thereon by the Authority's Officers at the rate of Five Dollars (\$5) per hour.

- (2) For making and/or examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of Two Dollars (\$2) for each fixture or drain altered or added.
- (3) The fee for the initial visit for the inspection and testing of drains by the Proper Officer is Six Dollars (\$6) for the first twenty (20) fixtures plus Three Dollars (\$3) for each additional ten (10) fixtures in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation, is Four Dollars (\$4).
- (4) The fee for the initial visit for the inspection and testing of plumbing by the Proper Officer is Six Dollars (\$6) for the first ten (10) fixtures plus Three Dollars (\$3) for each additional ten (10) fixtures in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation is Four Dollars (\$4) Dollars (\$4).

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- (5) The fee for the initial visit for the final inspection by the Authority's Engineer is Three Dollars (\$3) for each ten (10) fixtures or part thereof in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation, is Two Dollars (\$2).
- (6) The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work.

The works will not be passed until the installation, together with the amendments ordered, have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.

(c) Where an owner designs and carries out his own

(1) For the supply of a block plan a fee of two Dollars Fifty Cents (\$2.50). For buildings exceeding 4,000 square feet in ground floor area and/or properties exceeding 2 acres in extent an additional fee of One Dollar (\$1) shall be charged for each additional 4,000 square feet or part thereof and/or for each additional 2 acres or part thereof.

(2) The owner shall submit for examination three (3) legible prints of the drainage plan drawn in ink at a scale of forty (40) feet to an inch showing—

(a) Position of all buildings in their correct relation to the boundaries.

(b) The position and depth of the Authority's "point".

(c) The approximate position of all existing and proposed fixtures together with a list of fixtures.

(d) The position of existing drains, if any, and the layout of the proposed drains showing position of inspection openings, disconnector traps, vents, etcetera.

etcetera.

(3) In the case of all buildings of more than one story OR in which it is proposed to instal a combined pipe system the owner shall submit for examination three (3) copies of a typewritten specification and three (3) legible prints of the plumbing plan drawn in ink to a scale of not smaller than eight (8) feet to an inch (with details to a scale of two (2) feet to an inch if required or directed) showing:

(i) plan of each floor including ground floor

n inch if required or directed) showing:—

(i) plan of each floor including ground floor and basements (if any) upon which fixtures are or are proposed to be installed showing clearly the nature and position of all fixtures and the size and arrangements of all soil, waste, combined waste and vent pipes and the position size gradient and approximate depth of all drains. Upon such plans fixtures shall be designated and the various pipe lines shall be delineated as follows:—

Soil Pipes Heavy full line

Heavy full line -Soil Pipes Combined Wastel Full line -

Pipes Waste Pipes

Broken line ----Vents

(ii) The intended use of each room in which a fixture has or is proposed to be installed and of each room which opens directly into a water closet or urinal apartment.

(iii) Sectional line diagram showing clearly each soil waste combined waste or vent pipe or stack together with their sizes and the positions of all fixtures connected thereto and where required the gradient of the soil waste or combined waste pipes.

(iv) such other, information as the Authority may require.

The work shall not proceed until the owner's specification, if any, and plan(s) have been approved by the Engineer and a copy returned to him with the official endorsement.

(4) For the examination of the Owner's plans and specification a fee of Six Dollars (\$6) for each plan of from one to ten fixtures plus One Dollar Fifty Cents (\$1.50) for each five fixtures over ten.

Where an owner in writing requests the Authority to prepare a design of a plumbing installation only the charge will be computed according to the time occupied thereon by the Authority's officers at the rate of Five Dollars (\$5) per hour.

(5) For examining any alterations or additions to a plan and/or specification previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of One Dollar Fifty Cents (\$1.50) for each fixture or drain altered or added.

antered or added.

(6) The fee for the initial visit for the inspection and testing of drains by the Proper Officer is Six Dollars (\$6) for the first twenty (20) fixtures plus Three Dollars (\$3) for each additional ten (10) fixtures in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation is Four Dollars (\$4).

(7) The fee for the initial visit for the inspection and testing of plumbing by the Proper Officer is Six Dollars (\$6) for the first ten (10) fixtures plus Three Dollars (\$3) for each additional ten (10) fixtures in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation, is Four Dollars (\$4).

(8) The fee for the initial visit for the final inspection by the Authority's Engineer is Three Dollars (\$3) for each ten (10) fixtures or part thereof in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation, is Two Dollars (\$2).

(9) The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work. The works will not be passed until the installation, together with the amendments ordered, have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction satisfaction.

(d) (1) Where an owner has elected one or another of the methods set out in Sub-Sections (a), (b) or (c) above, but subsequently desires to adopt another of such methods, he may do so provided that no contract has been let for the work and that he pays to the Authority the following fees which shall be additional to fees which will become due in respect of the newly adopted method.

(i) Where the change is from the method set out in sub-section (a) an amount equal to 6 per centum of the estimated capital cost of the work.

(ii) Where the change is from the method set out in sub-section (b) the fees prescribed in sub-section (b) 1 and (b) 2.

(iii) Where the change is from the method set out in sub-section (c) the fees prescribed in sub-section (c) 1, (c) 4 and (c) 5."

Section 2 Repeal of Section 44 of By-Law No. 1 of the Mount Eliza Sewerage Authority and substitution of a new Section

For Section 44 of Division 15 of Part 3 of By-Law No. 1 of the Mount Eliza Sewerage Authority there shall be substituted the following Section:

"Section 44 Connection to Sewerage System

The position of the Authority's point of connection to any property shall be located prior to the commencement of any other drain works.

Excavation by machine is prohibited within two (2) feet of the stated position of the connection point.

The first straight pipe in the drain shall have an inspection opening. The vitrifield clay plug at the point of connection to the sewerage system shall not be removed until the drain laying is to commence. The vitrified clay plug shall be carefully removed so as not to damage the socket or allow any water, sand, earth or other prohibited discharge to enter the sewerage system.

Immediately after the removal of the vitrified clay plug at the point of connection, an approved watertight plug shall be inserted in the drain at the first inspection opening and downstream of this opening. This plug shall not be removed until the drain is to be filled with water for testing and no water, sand, earth or other prohibited discharge shall be allowed to enter the sewerage system during testing.

Should the requirements of this section not be complied with, the responsible licence holder for the works shall be liable for such offence, besides any costs or expenses which

may be incurred by the Authority in making good damage attributed to the offence, and to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00; and such penalty shall be recoverable notwithstanding that the Authority may not have chosen to exercise any power given to it by the Act, the Regulations or by the By-Laws to remedy such default."

A resolution for passing this By-Law was agreed to by the Authority at a meeting held on the 4th day of December, 1972.

Shrine of Remembrance Site Act 1933, Land Act 1958.
REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE SHRINE OF REMEMBRANCE
RESERVE IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

Whereas by a Crown grant issued in favour of the Shrine of Remembrance Trustees (incorporated by the Shrine of Remembrance Site Act 1933) in respect of the reserve for a site for a monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance in the City of Melbourne it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted shall be maintained and used as and for a site for a monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance and offices and conveniences connected therewith and for no other nurpose whatsoever: And whereas by section 219 of the Land Act 1958 it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved permanently any Crown land for any public purposes whatsoever and has vested such land in trustees it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land with the approval of the Governor in Council to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of that section: And whereas it is expedient to consolidate amend and repromulgate the Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Shrine of Remembrance Reserve: Now therefore the Shrine of Remembrance Trustees do hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Shrine of Remembrance Regulations 1972.
- (2) The regulations made by the Shrine of Remembrance Trustees on the 24th day of March, 1956 and approved by the Governor in Council on the 22nd day of May, 1956, and the regulations made by the said Trustees on the 11th day of June, 1970, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 21st day of July, 1970, are hereby rescinded.
- 2. In these Regulations "Inner Shrine" means that part of the monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance which is contained within the inner walls of the ambulatory and the central feature of which is the Stone of Remembrance.
 - 3. No person shall smoke in the Inner Shrine.
- 4. (1) The Trustees or any person authorized by the Trustees for the purposes of these Regulations may—
 - (a) refuse admission to the Inner Shrine to any person who by reason of his dress, conduct or demeanour—
 - (i) is likely to be offensive to other visitors to the Inner Shrine; or
 - (ii) is disrespectful to the honoured memory of the men and women whose sacrifice and service is commemorated by the Shrine; and
 - (b) require any person who is in the Inner Shrine and who by reason of his dress, conduct or demeanour—...
 - (i) is offensive to other visitors to the Inner Shrine; or

- (ii) is disrespectful to the honoured memory of the men and women whose sacrifice and service is commemorated by the Shrine—
- to leave the Inner Shrine forthwith.
- (2) A person who enters the Inner Shrine after he has been refused admission by the Trustees or by a person authorized in that behalf by the Trustees or who fails or refuses to leave the Inner Shrine after being required to so leave by the said Trustees or by a person authorized as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 5. No person being in the Reserve shall at any time unless he is authorized in writing so to do by the Trustees, sell or offer for sale, or advertise for sale, any article, whether in being or not in being, or carry on any trade or business or offer any services for remuneration.
- 6. (1) No person shall damage, deface or impair or do anything likely to damage, deface or impair any property of the Trustees, whether the monument or the memorial referred to in the Shrine of Remembrance Site Acts or any part thereof or any fixture, erection, structure, building, decoration or other improvement or any part of any such on the Reserve, or obstruct or interfere with any fixture on the Reserve so as to impair its usefulness for the transmission, conveyance, supply or use of water, gas, electricity or other agency or service, or with any drain or sewer thereon.
- (2) The meaning of this Regulation shall not be restricted by any more particular provision or provisions in these Regulations expressed or contained.
- 7. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, flower, fish or bird in the Reserve, or throw any stone or other missile, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottle, orange peel, paper, or litter of any kind, or light fire anywhere in the Reserve, or engage therein in any sport or game.
- 8. No vehicle, motor car, motor cycle, or cycle other than perambulators, go-carts, and children's cycles shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.
- 9. No person shall cause or allow any horse to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, or be ridden or exercised in any part thereof, except on some road (if any) expressly made available by the Trustees for horse traffic.
- 10. (1) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct; and no person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in the Reserve.
- (2) No person shall create or take part in any disturbance in the Reserve.
- 11. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve after he has been lawfully ordered to keep off or to leave the Reserve by any member of the Police Force, or by any person generally or specially authorized by the Trustees to order or keep persons off the Reserve.
- 12. No public meeting, assembly for a fete, picnic, or concert, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, and no public meeting shall take place in the Reserve except within the hours and for the purpose and under the charge of the persons which the Trustees have consented to in writing.
- 13. No person shall stand on or jump on or over any seat, gate, fence, or other structures, or climb any tree in the Reserve, or lie on any seat or lie on the grass in an objectionable attitude or stick bills on anything in the Reserve or cut names, letters or marks on any tree, seat, gate, post, or fence, or write thereon or otherwise deface the same or any property of the Trustees.
- 14: No person shall depasture any cattle, sheep, horse, or other animal in the Reserve.
- 15. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve by or with the authority of the Trustees. shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs, or for other purposes, without the consent of the person having charge thereof.
- 16. Children under the age of 12 years shall not be allowed in the Reserve unless accompanied by and in the direct charge of an adult.
- 17. No person shall offer any chair or seat for hire in the Reserve, or solicit or collect money or other valuable thing therein without permission, in writing, of the Trustees first had and obtained.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provision of section 218 of the Land Act 1958, for each offence be

liable to a penalty of not more than fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars, provided that every person who contravenes any regulation made under the said section for or with respect to prohibiting the depositing and leaving of any unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind on any land to which this section relates shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than two hundred dollars. two hundred dollars.



Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, hereby directs:—

STATEMENT OF PLANNING POLICY No. 6 (LAND USE AND AERODROMES).

Whereas the Town and Country Planning Board on the 5th day of November, 1971, adopted a Statement of Planning Policy a copy of which is annexed hereunder;

And whereas in the preparation of the said Statement the said Board conferred with the State Planning Council;

And whereas a draft of the proposed Statement was submitted to the said Council, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, the Western Port Regional Planning Authority and the Geelong Regional Planning Authority for consideration and comment;

And whereas comments were received from the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, the Western Port Regional Planning Authority and the Geelong Regional Planning Authority and were forwarded to the Minister with the adopted Statement;

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth by this Order approve the said Statement with modifications so that the Statement as modified shall be as set out hereunder, that is to say:

- 1. This is a Statement of Planning Policy under Part I of the Town and Country Planning Act 1961. It applies to the planning of land use in the vicinity of aerodromes. The aerodromes referred to are those owned and operated by the Government or licensed under the Air Navigation Regulations.
 - 2. It is planning policy that-
 - 2.1 All studies, planning and determinations regard-ing the location of new aerodromes and the expansion of existing aerodromes to meet the requirements of air transport shall take

- account of the present and prospective character, amenity, land use and development of any land considered for the purpose, and of surrounding areas.
- 2.2 The location of new aerodromes in areas of greater long term value to the community for other purposes shall be avoided.
- 2.3 The location of aerodromes, the growth they generate, the nature and limits of development in their vicinity and the surface transport system required to serve them shall be planned as an integrated operation.
- 2.4 In the planning of areas in the vicinity of aerodromes:-
 - (a) any new use or development of land which could prejudice the safety or efficiency of the aerodromes shall be precluded; and
 - (b) the detrimental effects arising from air-craft operations shall be taken into account in regulating and limiting the use and development of land.
- 2.5 Any use or development of land, particularly on the surface approaches to any aerodrome, shall be planned to ensure that visual amenity is consistent with the status of the aerodrome.
- 3. The major factors influencing this Statement of Planning Policy are:
 - 3.1 The importance of air transport to the community, and the accelerating demand for it.
 - 3.2 The increasing size of major aerodromes, and the number of aerodromes of all types stimulated by the rapid growth in air traffic and changes in aviation technology.
 - 3.3 The urban growth generated by aerodromes.
 - The magnitude of the surface transport network and operations required to support a major aerodrome.
 - 3.5 The economic importance of ensuring the optimum use of aerodromes.
 - 3.6 The desirability of preserving opportunity for expansion of existing and proposed aerodromes in preference to duplication of airfields with added economic and social cost and community conflicts.
 - 3.7 The need to protect aerodromes from in-compatible developments in their vicinity and against demands for curtailment of operations which such development would engender.
 - 3.8 The need to regulate the use and development of land in the vicinity of aerodromes:—
 - (a) to safeguard the operational safety of aircraft; and
 - (b) to preclude developments inconsistent with the health and welfare of the community.
 - 3.9 The detrimental effects of aircraft operations on land use and development in the vicinity of aerodromes.
 - 3.10 The need to protect areas which are desirable for developments of other descriptions against aerodromes and their inhibiting effects.
- 4. In implementing this Planning Policy special attention shall be given to the following:-
 - Consultation between planning and airport authorities in assessing the need for additional aerodromes or extensions to existing aerodromes.
 - 4.2 Evaluation of the likely influence of additional or extended aerodromes on other development, land use patterns and traffic generation.
 - 4.3 The integration of long-range planning for the location of now aerodromes and aerodrome extensions and planning of the use and development of land in their vicinity, having regard to present, prospective and desirable patterns of urban growth.
 - 4.4 Regulation of the use and development of land to facilitate the safe approach and takeoff of aircraft.
 - 4.5 Assessment, in conjunction with aviation authorities, of the noise levels arising and anticipated from present and prospective aircraft operations in areas affected by aerodromes.

- 4.6 Restriction and regulation of the use and development of land and its reservation or acquisition where appropriate to preclude residential development and to discourage other incompatible uses and developments in areas likely to be affected by high levels of signaff region. aircraft noise.
- 4.7 Securing appropriate changes in land use or land use designation, particularly when redevelopment is contemplated of existing urban areas near to aerodromes which may be exposed to high levels of aircraft noise.
- 4.8 Formulation of standards appropriate to the status of the aerodrome for the location and external appearance of new buildings and the landscaping of approaches to aerodromes.
