QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

- 5. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at twenty dollars where there is a tenement and fifteen dollars where there is a trough service.
- 6. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.
- 7. The provisions of Clauses 3, 4 and 5 of this By-Law shall not apply to any land, tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.




ROAD MAHONEYS ROAD SHIRE OF WHITTLESEA







- 4. No person shall stick bills on the walls of buildings, fences, gates, posts or trees in the parks or cut letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, fences or walls of buildings therein or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.
- 5. (a) No person, except those in the employ of or authorised by the Council, shall bring into the parks any horse or motor cycle for any purpose whatsoever which may create a nuisance to pedestrians or cause damage to the parks or enter plots of ground therein closed for plantation or other purposes.
- (b) No person, except those in the employ of or authorised by the Council, shall bring into the parks any motor vehicle for the purpose of conducting races or any purpose whatsoever which may create a nuisance to pedestrians or cause damage to the parks or enter plots of ground therein closed for plantation or other purposes.
- 6. No person shall bring into the parks any dog, unless led by a chain or cord. No dog shall be allowed in the parks except as afore provided and all dogs except dogs led by a chain or cord, goats, pigs and poultry found in the parks shall be liable to be destroyed and the owner shall make compensation to be recovered before any Justice, for any damage done.
- 7. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the parks any act of indecency; shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the Superintendent of Parks and Gardens or other authorised officer or servant of the Council, or by a Constable and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-Law.
- 8. The Council shall have the power to hold entertainments or performances in the parks and to make a charge for admission thereto.
- 9. The Council shall have the power to let the parks or any part thereof to any club, association or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances or sports and to authorise such club, association or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

- 10. The Council may, from time to time, fix the charges or entrance fee for clubs, associations or persons using or entering in or upon any of the parks or any part thereof.
- 11. No person, except the members of the Council, the Shire Secretary, Shire Engineer and employees of the Council on duty, shall enter that portion of any park in respect of which a charge is made for admission, without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorised by the Council.


