DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, entitled the *Weights and Measures (Amendment) Act 1972*, No. 8368, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day or successive days to be fixed by proclamation or proclamations of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my proclamation fix Tuesday, the first of May, One thousand nine hundred and seventy three as the day on which Section 6 of the said *Weights and Measures (Amendment) Act 1972* No. 8368 shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventy-three, and in the twenty-second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
