Whereas by Part II. of the Marine Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively and for the regulation of shipping in the same (including the imposition of charges for the use of mooring sites and other facilities):

And that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended or repealed and others substituted in their stead:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, by this Proclamation do hereby amend the Proclamation dated the 13th day of February, 1973, as follows:—

Delete the proviso added at the end of Paragraph (A) of the schedule to Clause 2 and substitute therefor the following:-

"Provided that during the period between the 1st June 1973, and the 30th November, 1973, both dates inclusive, the charges set forth in Paragraph (A) of this schedule shall be reduced by 10 per cent, unless the Governor in Council by prociamation determines otherwise."

Delete the proviso added at the end of Paragraph (C) the schedule to Clause 2 and substitute therefor the of the sche-following:-

"Provided that during the period between the 1st June 1973, and the 30th November, 1973, both dates inclusive, the charges set forth in Paragraph (C) of this schedule shall be reduced by 30 per cent, unless the Governor in Council by proclamation determines otherwise."





SHIRE OF NUMURKAH Measurements in links




MAIN ROAD CANTERBURY ROAD CITY OF RINGWOOD

in feet & inches




MAIN ROAD CANTERBURY ROAD CITY OF RINGWOOD



- In this By-Law, unless the context and subject matter otherwise indicates:

 "the Authority" means the Heywood Sewerage Authority;
 "Stamp" or "Mark" includes a stamp or mark on any article, materials or thing in question or on a seal, tag or label affixed or otherwise attached to or connected with the same or any container thereof;
 "Works" means any works or acceptance for the same of the
 - thereof;
 "Works" means any works or operations for or in connection with the carrying into effect of the purposes or objects of any provisions of the Sewerage Districts Act 1958 or any amendments thereof or of any other Act relating to the Heywood Sewerage Authority whether the same are constructed, maintained or carried out by the Authority or by any other person on behalf of or under agreement with the Authority or by permission or authority of or under the supervision, direction or control of the Authority.
- 2. The stamp or mark hereby prescribed and adopted by the Authority under the authority of the said Act shall be the letters HSA (meaning the Heywood Sewerage Authority) for indicating that any articles, materials or things referred to in the said Act and in this By-Law are duly tested, stamped, marked or authorised by the Authority.
- 3. The said stamp or mark shall be sealed, stamped, marked or impressed or be affixed by tag or label by the Authority alone by its Officers duly authorised or by other persons duly authorised for the purpose upon the articles, materials or things to which the said Act applied.
- 4. The use of the said stamp or mark by any person other than by a person duly authorised by the Authority is prohibited.
- 5. The sale or supply by any person to any other person of any of the above-mentioned articles materials or things which:
 - (a) are stamped or marked otherwise than as hereby prescribed, or

- (b) are not duly tested stamped marked or authorised as hereby prescribed, or
 (c) comprises a component part not comprised in any such article material or thing when stamped or marked.

6. Any person guilty of any contravention of this By-Law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00 in respect of any one such contravention provided however that nothing in this clause contained shall affect the liability of any such person to be prosecuted and punished under any other Act or at Common Law but he shall not be liable to be punished twice for the same offence.




MAIN ROAD BUXTON - MARYSVILLE ROAD SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA Messurements in links.







 - (ii) if a barrier bearing a red sign inscribed in white with the word "Stop" is turned so as to extend partly across the carriageway with the sign facing him; or
 - sign tacing nim; or

 (iii) if a pole bearing a red sign inscribed in white with the word "Stop" is held so as to extend partly across the carriageway with the sign facing him and shall not permit any portion of his vehicle to enter upon the school crossing while any pedestrian is upon it or while any barrier or pole is so turned or held.
- (c) Where there is a stop line on the approach side of a School crossing, any stop made pursuant to the provisions of this By-law shall be made before reaching and as near as practicable to the stop line.
- (d) A driver shall not permit any portion of his vehicle to enter upon a school crossing or to cross any stop line on the approach side of a school crossing if any vehicle headed in the same direction is stopped on the approach side of or upon the school crossing apparently for the purpose of complying with this By-law.
- (e) Any person guilty of a wilful breach of this clause of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$40.
- 3. (a) A person shall not leave a vehicle standing so that any portion of the vehicle is within 60 feet:
 - (i) of a school crossing established on a two-way carriageway;
 - (ii) on the approach side of a school crossing estab-

ished on a one-way carriageway:—
Provided that this Clause shall not apply to a person leaving a vehicle standing in a no-parking area or a parking area as defined in the Road Traffic Regulations 1962.

- (b) Any person guilty of a wilful breach of this clause of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$25.
- 4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Dandenong.
