**GRENDA'S BUS SERVICES, 9 Foster-street, Dandenong.** Application for variation of M.O. licence conditions to re-organize services in the general areas served by the following routes:—Route 810 (Springvale-Noble Park), Route 811 (Dandenong-Springvale), Route 812 (Springvale-Southland via Mentone), Route 813 (Mentone-Springvale), Route 818 (Springvale-Glen Waverley), Route 819 (Springvale-Mulgrave), Route 822 (Keysborough-Noble Park), Route 849 (Dandenong-Parkmore Estate) and instead to operate services as follows:—

Route 822 (Keysborough-Noble Park), Route 810 (Springvale-Noble Park), Route 849 (Dandenong-Parkmore Estate). To delete all service.

Route 811 (Dandenong-Springvale-Mentone-Southland). To include the ability to extend the present Route 811 from the corner of Balmoral-avenue and Springvale-road via Springvale and Lower Dandenong roads, Nepean Highway, Balcombe-road and Como-parade west to Mentone Railway Station; then express via Como-parade west, Balcombe-road, Swanston-street and Nepean Highway to Southland Shopping Centre (stand No. 6), returning via the above route reversed to Springvale-road, then via Windsor, Buckingham and Balmoral avenues, Lightwood-road and thence via the above route in reverse. This extension is also to operate from the corner of Lower Dandenong and Southern roads via Southern-road to the Hella Factory.

Route 812 (Dandenong-Parkmore Estate-Mentone-Southland). To delete service between Springvale Railway Station and the corner of Springvale and Lower Dandenong roads and instead to operate from the corner of Springvale and Lower Dandenong roads via Cheltenham, Corrigan and Kingsclere roads, Wahroonga-avenue, Bloomfield-road, Nance-street, Newman-avenue, Stackpoole-street, Chandler-road, Railway-parade, Benga-avenue, Hemming, Robinson, Clow, Thomas and Foster streets to Dandenong Railway Station with the following extensions:—(i) From the corner of Chandler-road and Railway-parade via Chandler and Heather-ton roads, Liege-avenue to Railway-parade, Chandler-road and normal route. (ii) From the corner of Springvale and Cheltenham roads via Springvale-road to Haileybury College, returning via the same route. (iii) From the corner of Corrigan and Cheltenham roads via Corrigan and Athol roads to Southvale Primary School, returning via the same route.

Route 813 (Dandenong-Parkmore Estate-Springvale). To operate from Dandenong Railway Station via Foster, Thomas, Clow, Robinson and Hemming streets, Benga-avenue, Railway-parade, Chandler and Cheltenham roads, Kingsclere-avenue, Corrigan, Athol and Springvale roads, Windsor, Buckingham and Balmoral avenues to Springvale Railway Station. All service as presently defined by Route 813 between Springvale and Mentone Railway Stations to be deleted. The following extensions are to operate:—(i) From the corner of Springvale and Athol roads via Springvale-road, St. James and St. Johns avenues to St. Joseph's School, returning via the same route. (ii) From the corner of Thomas and Clow streets via Clow and McCrae streets to St. Mary's School, returning via Power, New, Foster and McCrae streets to normal route. (iii) From the corner of Railway-parade and Chandler-road via Chandler-road, Heather-ton-road and Liege-avenue to Yarraman Park Primary School.

Route 815 (Dandenong-Noble Park). Forming a new numbered service operating from Dandenong Railway Station via Foster, Thomas, Clow, Robinson and Hemming streets, Benga-avenue, Railway-parade, Chandler and Cheltenham roads, Kingsclere, Bundeena and Wahroonga avenues, Buckley, Noble and Frank streets, Joy-parade and Douglas-street, Noble Park Railway Station, returning via Leonard-avenue, Noble and Buckley streets and above route in reverse. The following extensions are to operate:—(i) From the corner of Buckley and Noble streets via Buckley and Douglas streets to Noble Park Railway Station. (ii) From the corner of Noble and Buckley streets via Noble-street, Corrigan, Athol and Springvale roads, Windsor, Buckingham and Balmoral avenues to Springvale Railway Station.

Route 818 (Springvale-Glen Waverley). To vary the existing service to the following extent:—(i) At Glen Waverley Railway Station to operate a turning procedure via Railway-parade north and Springvale-road to normal route. (ii) To deviate from the corner of Springvale and Wellington roads via Wellington and Nantilla roads to Monash High School, returning to normal route via Nantilla and Dunlop roads to Springvale-road. (iii) To deviate from the corner of Monash-drive and Springvale-road via Monash-drive and Murdoch-avenue to Mazenod College, returning via Kernot-avenue and Monash-drive to normal route. (iv) From the corner of Nantilla and Wellington roads via Wellington, Springvale and Lightwood roads to Springvale Railway Station to service factories in Wellington-road.

Route 819 (Springvale-Mulgrave). To vary existing service by inclusion of the following:—(i) From the corner of Wanda-street and Shaftsbury-avenue via Wanda-street, Wellington-road, Monash-drive and Murdoch-avenue to Mazenod College, returning via Kernot-avenue, Monash-drive and Wanda-street to normal route. (ii) From the corner of Whitworth-avenue and Springvale-road via Whitworth and Parsons avenues, Trevethic and Springvale roads, Windsor and St. Johns avenues to St. Joseph's School and returning via the same route. (iii) From the corner of Sandown and Springvale roads via Springvale-road to Killester College, returning via Springvale-road, Windsor, St. Johns and St. James avenues, Springvale and Sandown roads to normal route. ## VIOLET TOWN WATERWORKS TRUST.

## By-Law No. 3.

*Restriction on the Use of Water.*

The Violet Town Waterworks Trust (hereinafter referred to as the Trust) in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act doth hereby make a By-Law for restricting the use for other than domestic purposes of water supplied by the said Trust within the Violet Town Waterworks District and supplies by special agreement.

1. This By-Law shall apply to and have force throughout the whole of the Violet Town Waterworks District and to supplies by special agreement and shall come into operation at such time or times as the Trust directs by notice published in a newspaper generally circulating within the above-mentioned District and shall cease to have operation at such times as the Trust from time to time directs by a notice so published.

2. Subject to the provisions of Clause 3 of this By-Law no person shall, with water supplied by the Trust—

(a) Water any garden, lawn or other land within the specified area except by means of a hose held in the hand within eighteen inches of the outlet or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand and only between the hours of 5 p.m. and 9 p.m. in the areas and on the days of the week as set out below:—

1.	North of Harry's Creek-road and Murchison-road (Cow-slip Street).	Monday, Thursday and Saturday.
2.	South of Harry's Creek-road and Murchison-road (Cow-slip Street).	Tuesday, Friday and Sunday.

(b) Wash any vehicle of any description whatsoever by means of a hose or other mechanical device;

(c) Water any nature strips;

(d) Fill, add to or cleanse any private swimming pool within the specified area.

3. No person shall, with water supplied by the Trust, water any land comprising public parks, sports grounds, public and club bowling greens and public and club tennis courts within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers except between the hours of 5 p.m. and 9 p.m. on any Wednesday.

4. Any person by whose act or by or in consequence of whose order any water supplied by the Trust is used or consumed or allowed to run, and any person who permits or suffers any such water to be used or consumed or run and the occupier of any premises on or in which any such water is used or consumed or allowed to run in contravention of the provisions of this By-Law shall severally be guilty of a breach of this By-Law.

5. Every person guilty of a breach of this By-Law shall for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding in any case One hundred dollars (\$100) for any breach thereof, and in cases of continuing offence a further penalty not exceeding Ten dollars (\$10) for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

6. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-Law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied to him or for his use and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

The minimum area depth and width of frontage and minimum distance of outer walls from the frontage specified in Column 2 of Table 804 of the Regulations are hereby adopted as the minimum area depth and width of frontage of land and the minimum distance of outer walls from boundaries on which a building of Class I or Class II Occupancy shall be constructed throughout that part of the municipal district set out in the third schedule hereto.
5. In those parts of the municipal district set out in the second schedule hereto—
  - (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of Class I or Class II Occupancy from frontage is hereby specified as twenty-five feet.
  - (b) No person shall construct any building of Class I or Class II Occupancy closer to the frontage of any land than twenty-five feet.

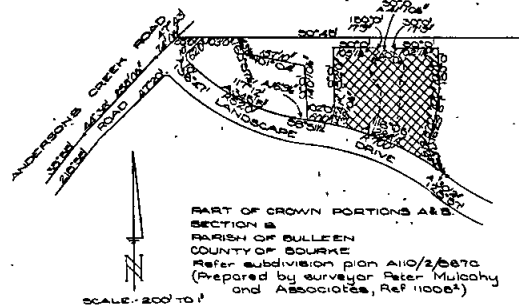
